Under the powers vested in him by Section I. of Bombay Act No. XI. of 1863, entitled "An Act for taking a Census of the Bombay Presidency," the Honorable the Governor in Council hereby directs that an enumeration be made of the Inhabitants of the Town and Island of Bombay, on Tuesday, the 2nd day of February 1864, under the superintendence and control of the Commissioner of Police.

Enumerators and other subordinate Officers will be appointed, who will leave at each house or place of residence within their respective districts blank returns to be duly filled up and signed by the owner, tenant, or principal occupant of the said house or place of residence, and whose duty it will be to give to those unable to write and fill up the returns for themselves every information and assistance to enable them to do so.

As an accurate Census is essential to the correctness of many useful and important calculations and deductions which form the basis of measures for the improvement of the sanitary condition of the people, and therefore for promoting their health and physical well-being, His Excellency the Governor in Council trusts that the educated and intelligent classes of the Native community will aid and support the Police Commissioner in obtaining the returns duly and correctly filled up, and facilitate his task by explaining to their poorer and ignorant brethren the objects with which the census is taken.

With this view, His Excellency in Council invites the leading residents, in the several localities or districts, into which the Town will be divided for the purposes of enumerations, to place themselves in communication with the Municipal Commissioners and the Police Commissioner for the purpose of carrying out the objects of the Act.

His Excellency the Governor in Council has great pleasure in publishing for general information the following copies and translations of a Proclamation and Akkam issued by his Highness the Nizam, abolishing entirely, within His Highness' territories, the levy of transit duties on all kinds of goods and of all other duties on grain, and withdrawing the existing prohibition against the export of grain into the British territories.

Translation of a Proclamation issued by His Highness the Nizam's Government.

In consequence of the dearness of grain, and with a view to the relief and protection of the people generally, His Highness the Nizam has directed this proclamation to be issued.

Within the dominions of His Highness the Nizam, in the City of Hyderabad, in all Talooks, Surfikhans, Paigah and Dewanee, and in Jagheers both personal and assigned for the payment of Troops (Zaith wo siffath), and in Zemindarees, &c., every description of tax on grain whether it be Thuburtee or Sayer, Hugdaree or Rahdaree, on being brought in or on being taken out, is hereby wholly and entirely abolished.

Also the taxes of Rahdaree and Hugdaree, &c., excepting the Sayer levied on all other goods and articles, whether of produce or manufacture, whether coming in or going out, whether imported into, or exported from, His Highness the Nizam's Country, are entirely abolished and done away with. The practice of granting Dustucks and Takeeds by the Government or by the Jagheerdars, &c., for the exemption of grain and other articles from Rahdaree, &c., and also for the assistance of travellers, which has hitherto prevailed, is hereby put a stop to.

It is directed that the Talookdars, Jagheerdars, and Zamindars, &c. from the dates on which this proclamation may be received by them shall, without any objection or hesitation, carry out these orders by allowing to pass to and fro, without any detention whatever, all kinds of grain, travellers' goods, as well as cattle. They will, on no account, detain for the collection of Rahadree or Hugdaree, &c. grain or any other goods or articles of produce and manufacture of any description.

Regarding the collection of sayer, certain rules will be determined and furnished hereafter, but sayer and thubartee are never to be levied on grain, and no objections are to be raised for the non-presentation of Circar's Dustuks and the Takeeds of the Jagheerdars, &c.

If, from the 1st of Rujjub of the present year, any complaints are received of any infringement of the above orders, from merchants, traders, importers, and travellers, of detention of grain, such punishment, as the circar thinks fit, will be inflicted.

All the above measures have been adopted in concurrence with the Resident of Hyderabad, and if the above orders are not carried out efficiently by the Talookdars, Jagheerdars, Wutondars, &c. the Jagheers will be confiscated by the circar or contingent Troops, and the plea or excuse that their Karkoons or Naibs were careless, will not be entertained.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind, that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

REGULATIONS

OF THE

EIGHTH BOMBAY LAUDABLE SOCIETY.

At a GENERAL MEETING of the SUBSCRIBERS to the SEVENTH BOMBAY LAUDABLE SOCIETY, held on the 24th instant, at the Office of the Secretaries, it was determined to establish an Eighth Society, in succession to the Seventh, which closes on the 31st instant.

The Eighth Bombay Laudable Society will commence on 1st January 1864, and the following Regulations are published for general information.

REGULATIONS OF THE EIGHTH BOMBAY LAUDABLE SOCIETY.

ARTICLE 1st.—The object of this Association is to provide a Fund for the Insurance of Lives. This Fund is to be portioned into Shares, and an individual may subscribe for a certain number of shares, either on his or her own life, or on the life of any other individual. In the former case, the general estate of the deceased, or such persons as he or she may, by will or assignment, have appointed, shall benefit in the event of a lapse: in the latter, the person who may have subscribed on the life of the deceased shall benefit to the extent of the share subscribed for, unless in either case such shares be especially declared, at the time of subscription, to be for the benefit of any other person or persons, or be subsequently made over, according to the form hereafter prescribed, for the benefit of any other person or persons, in which case such person or persons shall be entitled to benefit in the event of a lapse, and no other.

2nd.—In the case of a person subscribing on the life of another, the party subscribing, and not the party on whose life the subscription is made, shall be considered a Member of the Society, and have a voice in the management of its concerns. Copartners or other bodies of individuals may hold one or more shares jointly on any given life, either for their own benefit or for that of others; but in such case the parties uniting in the subscription shall not be entitled each to a separate voice in the concerns of the Society, but must vote collectively, or by the deputation of one of their number, on all matters thereto relating.

3rd.—The great principle of this Society is the equal division of its accumulated fund among the parties entitled to benefit by lapse of lives subscribed on according to the number of shares which those parties may respectively hold.

4th.—The Eighth Laudable Society shall commence on the 1st January, 1864, and shall close on the 31st December 1869, at midnight.

5th.—Not more than four shares can be subscribed for on any one life, whether those shares be held by one or more individuals.

6th.—Persons shall be at liberty to subscribe for half, quarter, or eighth shares, either on their own lives or on the lives of others, and in case of lapse, the estate of the deceased, or the parties for whose advantage the subscription is declared to be, or who may have become entitled to such advantages by will or assignment, shall benefit by the fund in a like fractional proportion.

7th.—The following are the Rates of Subscription, to be paid half-yearly on each share, half, quarter, and eighth share, according to the ages of the parties whose

8th.—All persons entering the Society between the 1st January and the 30th of June in the year 1864 shall pay, on admission, their half-year's subscription in advance, or for the remaining part thereof, computing the same from the date of their becoming Members until the 1st July 1864, and paying for any number of days less than a month one whole month's subscription. 10th.—Five persons residing in Bombay shall be nominated Directors of the Eighth Laudable Society, whose business it shall be to superintend and control the management of the Funds, to examine the accounts, to decide on all applications for admission, and generally to transact the current business of the Society. The concurrent opinion of three of the five Directors shall be decisive on all matters relating to the concerns of the Society, not at variance with these fundamental Regulations, which can be altered only by a majority of the members residing in Bombay. No question, however, shall be proposed to the members at large without the concurrence of the whole of the Directors. In case of the death or removal from Bombay of any of the Directors, another or others shall be chosen by a majority of the members of the Society then residing in Bombay or by a majority of such members residing in Bombay as may attend at a general meeting to be convened for that purpose. The sum of Fifteen Hundred Rupees annually shall be set apart from the Funds of the Society for distribution among the Directors.

11th.—A meeting of the Directors of the Society shall be convened annually between the 1st of January and 30th April in each year, when a Statement of the Accounts of the Society (duly audited by an Auditor, who shall receive a remuneration of Rs. 100,) shall be laid before them by the Secretaries; and no account which shall once have been submitted to and passed by the Directors at such meeting, not less than three then attending, shall afterwards be called in question, unless for some special and manifest error, to the amount of Five Hundred Rupees or upwards.

12th.—In the election of Directors, as well as on all other questions relative to the concerns of the Society which may be proposed for the decision of the members at large, a member holding four shares on any one life shall be entitled to three votes, one holding three shares to two votes, and one holding any number of shares less than three to one vote only. Members holding shares on different lives, shall be entitled to the number of votes proportioned to the number of shares which they hold on each life.

13th.—Messrs. W. In the event, however, of a person dying between the dates of his Certificate and Declaration of Health and his admission, and the Insurance on his life was not effected from the date of Certificate and Declaration, the amount of premium paid for such Insurance shall be refunded.

18th.—No subscription on any life shall be considered as entitling the party or parties concerned to benefit by the Society, until the life subscribed on shall have been approved by the Directors, the amount of the first subscription and premium of admission paid, and a Certificate of admission granted under the signature of the Secretaries, agreeably to the form annexed to these Regulations. And if any applicant shall omit to pay the amount of such subscription and premium of admission within two months after the life subscribed on shall have been approved by the Directors, such applicant shall forfeit his claim to be admitted, except on a fresh application, accompanied by a new Certificate and Declaration of Health.

19th.—All subscriptions (except the first, which is to be paid on admission) shall be paid within one month of the time at which they become due. If not paid within that time, a penalty of two per-cent. on the amount of the instalment shall be added, and any Member who shall not have paid his subscription (together with the said penalty) within two months of the day on which his subscription shall have become due, shall be considered to have absolutely and entirely forfeited his share or shares.

20th.—Any Member shall be at liberty at any time to pay up his subscription for the whole unexpired period between the time of such payment and the close of the Society, or for any part thereof; and in the event of a lapse of the life subscribed on, such member or his representatives shall be entitled to receive back any part of the subscription money so paid up which would not have been due at the time of the lapse taking place, forfeiting, however, to the Society all interest which may have intermediately accrued thereon.

21st.—No subsequent increase of shares on any life shall be allowed, except on fresh application, to be again approved of by the Directors, and accompanied by a Certificate and Declaration as above. The subscription on the additional shares to be according to the age of the party at the time of making the new application.

22nd.—Any Member desiring to transfer his interest in any share or shares which he may hold in the Society shall be at liberty to do so by an endorsement to be written on the original Certificate; which endorsement shall not be valid until the Certificate bearing the same shall have been produced to the Secretaries, and the transfer duly registered by them in a general book of registry to be kept in the office of the Society.

23rd.—As often as a sum exceeding Rupees Four Thousand shall be collected, it shall be laid out in the purchase of Government paper, Bank shares, or in Loans secured by a deposit of Government paper, to be granted under the control and authority of the Directors, it being clearly understood that in all cases of Loan the saleable value of the Deposit shall be more than sufficient to cover the sum lent. All public securities purchased for the Society shall be especially endorsed to two or more of the Directors, and the interest only shall be made payable to the Secretaries and Treasurers.

24th.—The person or persons entitled to benefit by the lapse of a life in the Society shall, in making application to the Secretaries in writing, accompanied by such proof of the casualty as may be satisfactory to a majority of the Directors, receive instalments as follows:—At or after the expiration of the first year from the commencement of the Society, at the rate of One Thousand Rupees on each share; at or after the expiration of the second year from the commencement of the Society, at the rate of One Thousand Rupees on each share; at or after the expiration of the third year from the commencement of the Society, at the rate of Two Thousand Rupees on each share—which he or they may have held, or be entitled to on the lapsed life; provided that in the opinion of the Directors, the state of the Funds of the Society will admit of so large payment being made. Should the Directors think, however, that the Funds will not allow of immediate payments of these amounts, then such sum or sums only shall be advanced as they may deem proper, and the balance of the prescribed advance or advances shall be paid so soon as the Directors shall be of opinion that the Funds will safely admit of it.
