Abstract Account of the Poona Municipal Fund

No. 72 OF 1863.

From FRAMJEE NASSERWANJEE, Esquire,

SIR,—I have the honour to forward for submission to Government, an Abstract Account* of the Poona Municipal Fund for the year ending 30th April 1863, as required in paragraph 4 of the Government Circular in the General Department, No. 3314 of the 15th November 1856.

2. This is the fifth Annual Report of the Poona Municipality since its establishment in April 1858.

3. The realisations for the year ending 30th April 1863, together with the balance on that date, amount to Rs. 57,110-5-5, and the disbursements to Rs. 36,858-11-9, leaving a balance at the close of the year of Rs. 20,251-9-8. This sum, after deducting Rs. 2,400-15-1, due on account of deposit and wages to contractors, &c., together with Rs. 15,000-0-0 in Government 5 per cent. securities, deposited at the Civil Treasury, leaves a net balance available for disposal by the Municipality of Rs. 32,850-10-7.

4. Particulars regarding the Receipts and Disbursements are given in the accounts which accompany this report. The realisations for the year 1862-63, together with the balance, compared with the past official year show an increase of Rs. 12,101-1-9. This increase is attributable to the large balance in hand on the 1st May 1862, which was Rs. 10,559-7-11 more than on 1st May 1861.

5. Adverting to the 4th paragraph of the Government Circular quoted above, I have the honour to transmit a copy of Appendix B,* which shows the scheme of taxation sanctioned by Government for the city of Poona as per Government Resolution No. 1411 of the 6th July 1860, and No. 1644 of the 5th December 1861.

6. The following are at present the ordinary sources of income of the Poona Municipality. The collections for two years are given :—

from which it will be observed that there is a trifling increase on account of Toll, of Rs. 322, and a decrease on that of Country Music, &c. of Rs. 216, during the year 1862-63. The decrease on account of Country Music, &c. is in consequence of there being fewer native marriages compared with that of the preceding year. The remaining items credited in the accounts now submitted do not call for any particular remarks, they being receipts of a miscellaneous and not of a permanent nature.

7. The nuisance fines collected under the following enactments :—

1. Act XXI. of 1841,
2. Section 19, Regulation XII. of 1827,
3. Clause 5, Section 7 of Act XXVI. of 1850,

were unconditionally surrendered by Government to the Municipality, as per Resolution No. 1940 of the 13th August 1859, the payment of which was delayed for a considerable time pending a reference to the Collector and Government. It has now, however, been ruled by Government Resolution No. 1506, dated 11th September 1862, "that all future sums levied under Acts specified in the Resolution of the 17th August 1859 will be expended on works to be constructed by the Municipality, subject to the approval of Government and the control in regard to expenditure of the Revenue Commissioner." The money has therefore not been received from the Collector and credited in the accounts. As Act XXI. of 1841, and Section 19, Regulation XII. of 1827 have been superseded by the Penal Code, a reference has been made on the subject to the Collector, who has been requested, if necessary, to refer the matter to Government as to whether nuisance fines collected under the latter Regulation can be claimed by the Municipality.

8. No revenue unauthorised by Government has been collected by the Municipality during the year to which the accounts submitted relate.

9. The expenditure on account of the Establishment sanctioned by Government as per Resolution No. 1411 of the 6th July 1860, amounts to Rs. 4,602 annually, the details of which are given in Appendix A* to the Poona Municipal Rules herewith forwarded. The whole of this sum, however, is not at present expended. The cost of the Establishment employed by the Municipality has in the year under report been within the limits of the authority accorded by Government: the total expenditure being Rs. 4,297-1-0.

10. No remarks are necessary for the item Rs. 2,818-8-2, as the seven items of which it consists sufficiently indicate the expenditure.

11. With reference to the disbursement in the accounts of Rs. 10,608-14-5, I have the honour to state that about 5½ miles of road-way and other works have been repaired, &c. in the city and near the village of Katruj as detailed below. Rs. 7,002-5-11 of this sum are from the Ordinary Repairs Budget of 1862-63, and Rs. 3,606-8-6 from that of 1863-64; but the details of the work done on account of the latter sum are not given here: they will appear in next year's report :—

1. Metal and Moorum spread on roads and consolidated with water and rolling,
2. Side and cross gutters cleared,
3. Side kerbing and slab-stones of roads adjusted, raised, renewed, and replaced,
4. Bridge rails, aqueduct escape doors and city wall bars, repaired and tarred,
5. The parapet walls of bridges and public urinaries repaired and blue-washed,
6. Katruj tank Koombar Veis, and Ambil Ooda flood-gates opened, repaired, tarred, and refixed,
7. Fords and dips repaired,
8. Sand removed from Ambil Ooda,
9. Purbuttie tank aqueduct repaired.

12. For cleaning and repairing main and by-drains in the city of Poona, Rs. 1,067-13-5 were expended during the year under report. The total length cleaned was 23,595 running feet, or 4 miles, 3 furlongs, and 165 yards.

13. Rupees 937-15-8 is the cost incurred in cleaning and repairing the drain on the bank of the river. This drain, from not having been cleaned for several years, was considerably choked, and required much repairs. Ten new wooden trap-doors had to be fixed to it for the purpose of flushing it during the monsoon. The length cleaned and repaired was 3,532 running feet.

14. For surveying and preparing plans for constructing drains in the city on scientific principles, and extending the water supply, Rs. 196-10-8 have been disbursed.

15. Rupees 23-15-3 were expended in repairing Phudkay's aqueduct escape which was found choked, thus preventing the free passage of water.

16. In cleaning the city aqueduct from Katruj tank to Lukudkana, a distance of upwards of 4 miles, Rs. 2,800-0-0 were disbursed. In many places the roots of trees had shot through the aqueduct, which, together with the rubbish that had accumulated had to be removed. The slab covering of the aqueduct which had to be displaced for cleaning it was refixed in lime as before.

17. In laying on water to Nana and Bhowanee Peit, which was under contemplation when the last report was submitted, and to which allusion was made in the 21st paragraph, Rs. 12,126-15-5 have been expended up to the end of the year 1862-63. Two cut-stone cisterns having iron fountains have been erected, and 4,840 running feet of cast-iron piping laid: one-fourth of which is of 2½ inches, and the remainder of 4 inches in diameter. On the line of piping 6 fire-plugs have been fixed, and the Boodwar Peit escape from which the water was laid has been considerably raised.

18. For the remaining items of the debit no remarks appear necessary, the charges being apparent. I may, however, state that two additional fire engines have been purchased for Rs. 2,134-1-5, the two which the Municipality formerly had being found inadequate to the requirements of so large a city as Poona.

19. The accounts for the year under report have been audited agreeably to the Circular of the Revenue Commissioner, S. D., No. 2511 of the 7th October 1862.

1. A Schedule of taxes to be levied on each of the following description of vehicles, &c. entering or going out of the city of Poona.

N.B.—The above rates shall only be levied once a day, or a ticket must be given to clear all gates on the day of issue.

2. Any person shall be entitled to a monthly pass on payment as follows :—

For each carriage, or cart of whatever description having only one pair.....	1 0 0
Do. horse or tattoo, mule, bullock or buffalo.....	0 8 0

3. Tickets issued under Rules 1 and 2 are not transferable, *i.e.* each ticket shall only clear the particular vehicle or animal for which it was issued, and a monthly ticket purchased by one person shall not clear a vehicle, &c. belonging to another.

4. Exemptions from the above taxes shall be allowed in the following cases but in no others :—

1st.—Vehicles and animals in the use of military officers and soldiers on duty.

2nd.—Vehicles and animals belonging to the Municipality, Commissariat, or other Public Department of Government, or in use for the conveyance of military or other Government stores, materials, equipages, or property.

3rd.—Vehicles and animals in use by Police Peons on duty for the conveyance of persons or property in their custody.

4th.—Vehicles and horses employed by the Post Office Department.

5th. Agricultural carts laden with manure passing out of the city to the owner's or hirer's fields and returning empty.

5. A fee of 4 annas per diem for first ten days, of 8 annas per diem for next ten days, and 1 rupee for every day after that period upon all building materials left upon the public thoroughfares, lanes, or streets, however designated, while houses are repairing, constructing, or otherwise.

6. A fee of 1 rupee per diem upon all caste dinners held upon the public thoroughfares, lanes, or streets, to be levied from the dinner-givers.

7. A fee of 4 annas for one yard in breadth per diem upon all booths or platforms erected on the public thoroughfares, lanes, or streets, by parties having marriage or other ceremonies, to be levied from the party having the ceremony.

8. A fee of two annas per diem be levied on bands of music of every description whilst played through the streets.

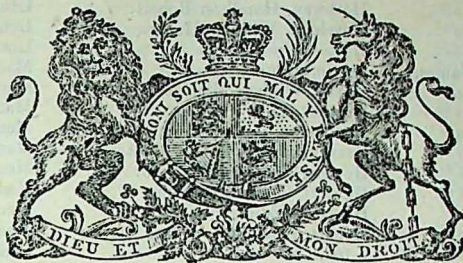
