CONTRACT FOR THE SUPPLY OF MISCELLANEOUS ARTICLES TO THE ORDNANCE DEPARTMENT AT AHMEDABAD.

Persons desirous of entering into a Contract for the supply of such Stores as may be required by the Ordnance Department at Ahmedabad, from the date of the acceptance of the offer to the 31st January 1862, may, on application at this Office, from 10 A. M. till 5 P. M. daily (Sundays excepted), obtain Copies of the Schedule and List of Prices, and such information relating thereto as they may require.

2. No person will be allowed to tender for the Contract unless he deposits in this Office, in Cash or Government Promissory Notes or Bank Shares or other property readily convertible into Cash, with a Memorandum authorising their sale and endorsement by the Secretary of State in Council of India, the sum of Rupees (200) two hundred, which will be forfeited in the event of withdrawal of his offer before the Ordnance Commissary, or other authorised person on his behalf, shall have signified to him, by a notice in writing, his refusal to accept such offer, or in the event of delay, evasion, or refusal on his part to furnish the requisite further Security, and execute the Deed of Contract, when required to do so on his offer being accepted.

3. The further Security required is Bonded Security to the amount of Rupees Eight hundred (800), subject to the approval of the Civil or Cantonment authorities or Government Solicitor; and this, together with the amount previously deposited, will be held as a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the Contract.

4. Sealed tenders for the Contract will be received at this Office on Wednesday the 26th June 1861, at 11 o'clock precisely. Tenders must specify a percentage above or below the prices exhibited in the above List, at which the supply will be made.

5. The articles supplied must be of unexceptionable quality, and according to Muster when such is forthcoming, and of the sort usually supplied, and are to be delivered, at the Ordnance Stores, in good condition, free of all charges beyond the stipulated price, in such quantities as may, from time to time, be demanded, being liable to examination and rejection by the Executive Ordnance Officer, or by a Committee of Officers appointed on the part of Government, in the event of the Contractor being dissatisfied with the decision of the above Officer.

6. In case the said articles or any of them shall be rejected by the Committee so appointed, the said Committee shall not be required to assign or give any reason for such rejection, but the decision of such Committee shall be final and conclusive; and it shall not be competent to the Contractor, his Heirs, Executors, or Administrators, to question such decision in any Court of Law or Equity, or otherwise howsoever.

7. The Contractor must comply immediately with emergent demands, and meet others of less urgency within the periods stated in the Requisitions made upon him; in failure whereof, or if any supply be rejected or condemned by a Committee as aforesaid, the articles, or such others as may be required in lieu thereof, may be at once purchased by this Department, at his risk and cost; and in all such cases thirty (30) per cent. upon the amount of expenses incurred, or a fine not exceeding Rupees (50) fifty, at the option of the Executive Ordnance Officer, may be levied as liquidated damages for each and every such breach of Contract; the condemnation of any article by a Committee may be held to constitute a breach of Contract, whether the rejected articles be replaced by a Contractor or by this Department. In every such case the Contract may be cancelled, at the discretion of the Ordnance Inspector General; and if it be so cancelled, the Cash Deposit, mentioned in paragraph 2 of this Notice, will be forfeited to Government.

8. Any delay, negligence, evasion, or refusal on the part of the Contractor to make supplies or obey orders, or any attempt on his part, or that of his Agents, to pass off articles of an inferior quality in lieu of those he is bound to supply, or any neglect to deliver them at the time and place appointed, will subject him to be fined to the extent of Rupees Twenty-five (25) by the Executive Ordnance Officer; an appeal from his order may be made to the Inspector General, whose decision is to be final; but when any of the penalties provided for in the preceding clause are exacted, no further penalty shall be leviable under this clause.

9. Any party whose offer is accepted must provide Securities, such as shall meet the approval of the Civil or Cantonment Authorities or Government Solicitor, within fifteen days from the date of the acceptance of his offer, or the Contract will be re-sold, and the amount deposited by the party forfeited to Government. No reason will be stated for rejecting any Security offered.

10. Bills for articles supplied under this Contract must be preferred for examination within seven days from the date of the delivery of the same, or the Contractor will forfeit their full value, unless it clearly appears, to the satisfaction of the Inspector General, that the delay was unavoidable. Payment of Bills passed must be claimed within the month following that of the delivery, or the amount will be forfeited to Government.

11. The amount of retrenchments made by the auditing authorities on the Contractor's Bills will be recovered from the first sums payable to him; but in the event of such retrenchments or any portion thereof being remitted, the amount remitted will be refunded immediately on receipt.

12. Any party who, after offering for the Contract, fails to furnish the necessary Security, as provided for in Clauses 3 and 10 of this Notice, will be interdicted from offering on future occasions, unless he produces a document from some person or persons of unexceptionable character and sufficient means, guaranteeing the due finding of the requisite Security and execution by him of the Deed of Contract on his offer being accepted.

13. Persons intending to tender may, on application, see a statement of the actual annual consumption during the past years; but it is to be distinctly understood that supplies must be furnished to any extent required, without reference to such former consumption.

14. No reason will be assigned for the rejection of any Tender.

15. The Deposits for rejected Tenders will be returned at the time of rejection. Securities for accepted Tenders will be cancelled when the last Bill is audited after fulfilment of the Contract.
