3. The further security required is Bonded Security to the amount of Rupees (400) four hundred, subject to the approval of the Civil or Cantonment Authorities or Government Solicitor; and this, together with the amount previously deposited, will be held as a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the Contract.

4. Sealed Tenders for the Contract will be received at this Office on Tuesday the 5th of November 1861, at 11 o'clock precisely. Tenders must specify a percentage above or below the prices exhibited in the above List, at which the supply will be made.

5. 6. 7.
