MATRICULATION EXAMINATION.

November 18—21, 1867.

1. The Matriculation Examination will be held in the Town Hall, Bombay, commencing on *Monday* the 18th November next.

2. Applications for permission to attend the Examination must be forwarded to the University Registrar at Bombay, on or before Wednesday the 18th September, and the Heads of Colleges and Schools and Private Teachers are requested to apply to the Registrar for printed Forms of Application so soon as they know the number of forms their pupils may probably require.

3. Each Candidate must, on or before the 18th September, pay, through the Head of his College or School, or, if resident in Bombay and not studying at a College or School, directly to the Registrar, the fee of Rupees Five (5), for which a receipt will be given. Receipt Books will be previously forwarded to the Principals of the Poona College and Engineering College, and to those Masters of Schools in the Mofussil who shall have requested to be supplied with Forms of Application.

4. Heads of Colleges and Schools are requested to see that the Candidates enter in the Applications their names with surnames in the English and Vernacular characters. The Jonesian system of spelling the names and surnames of the Candidates should be invariably employed.

No single Order can be granted for a larger sum than Rupees 150.

Applications for the following purposes must be made to the Controller Money Order Office, Bombay, accompanied by a *second fee* in postage stamps of the same amount as the first Commission. Printed forms for such applications, and any information which the Public may require, will be furnished by the Agents:—

1st.—For a duplicate of a lost Money Order.

2nd.—For authority to transfer payment of an Order from one office to another.

3rd.—To stop payment of an Order.

4th.—To correct any error in the name of the remitter or the payee, if due to the applicant.

5th.—To repay the amount to the remitter.

6th.—To renew an Order four months old.

Note.—When the same letter includes application both for stoppage of payment and for repayment to Remitter, only one fee will be required.

Payment of an Order must be obtained before the end of the fourth calendar month after that in which it was issued (for instance, if issued in January it must be paid before the end of May), otherwise a new Order will be necessary, for which a second commission will be charged. And if the Order be not paid before the end of the twelfth calendar month after that in which it was issued (for instance, if issued in January and not paid before the end of the next January), all claim to the Money will be lost.

To prevent delay in payment, or loss of Money Orders, the public are strictly cautioned—

1st.—To take all means to prevent the loss of the Money Order.

2nd.—Never to send the Money Order in the same letter with the information required on payment thereof.

3rd.—To be careful, on taking out a Money Order, to state correctly the name of the person in whose favour it is to be drawn.

4th.—To see that the Name, Address, and occupation of the person taking out the Money Order, are correctly known to the person in whose favour it is drawn; as the payee will, on presenting the Order, have to give full information regarding the remitter.

After once paying a Money Order, by whomsoever presented, the Office will not be liable to any further claim.
