2. Tenders will be received for any quantity or quantities (within the above limits) of 10 garces each, or upwards. The periods within which the Salt tendered will be delivered must be specified, and if not brought within this period, it will be at the option of the Collector to receive or refuse the Salt.

3. All Tenders received up to the 20th August 1867 will be opened for consideration and disposal on the day following, in the Huzoor Kutcherry, at Calicut, when the parties tendering, or their Agents, are invited to attend.

4. Tenders will afterwards continue to be received for the Salt remaining to be supplied until further notice.

5. Merchants in Bombay desirous of a speedy reply can communicate their Tenders by Telegram, reply prepaid.

6. Salt not pure and of good quality will be rejected. This rule will be strictly enforced.

7. The Tenders must specify in words at length the rate in Rupees per Garce of 120 Indian Maunds.

8. The expenses attendant on the landing, weighing, and storing of the Salt must be defrayed by the parties tendering.

9. The Salt will be received by weight, according to the practice now existing, in the order in which the arrivals are registered at the Salt Depôts.

10. The Collector reserves to himself the right of rejecting any or all of the Tenders that may be received, without assigning any reason for so doing.

11. Tenders to be addressed to the Collector of Malabar, and to be superscribed "Tenders for the supply of Bombay Salt."

12. Parties who may tender for more than 100 Garces will be required to find substantial security for the due fulfilment of their Contracts, should the Collector consider it necessary.

13. Salt brought by merchants whose Tenders have not been previously accepted will be received if the whole quantity has not been previously engaged for, at such prices as may appear to the Collector reasonable, with reference to the prevailing rates in the month.

14. Tenders will be specially received for the supply of a portion of the Salt required at Ponani, Chowghat, and Cochin, up to the 25th instant, and disposed of on that date in preference to subsequent Tenders for those Depôts.

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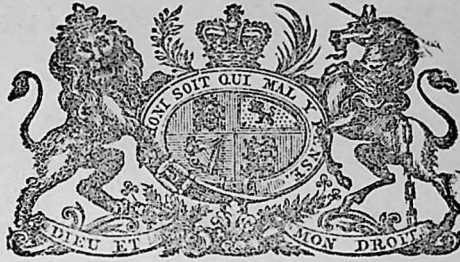

The following letter from G. W. West, Esq., Her Majesty's Consul at Suez, dated the 11th of July, is published for general information :—

‘ Suez, the 11th July 1867.

*To His Excellency the Right Honorable SIR JOHN LAWRENCE, Bart., G.C.B.,
G.C.S.I., Viceroy and Governor General of India.*

EXCELLENCY,

I AM instructed by Her Britannic Majesty's Agent and Consul-General in Egypt to inform your Excellency, that all vessels arriving at Suez unprovided with Bills of Health from ports at which they may touch will be

subjected to quarantine, but passengers and mails may pass through, by quarantine trains, to Alexandria.

The following letter dated 17th ultimo, from the Acting Agent and Consul-General at Alexandria, to the address of His Excellency the Governor of Bombay, is also published for general information :—

"It having come to the knowledge of the Egyptian Sanitary Board, that Steamers arriving from Aden, Bombay, and other ports of the Indian Ocean, are in the habit of coming to this country without regular Bills of Health, the following Regulation was, on the 11th instant, established by the said Board :—

'That, on and after the dates hereinbelow noted, all vessels arriving at Suez from Ports in the Red Sea or Indian Ocean, or from other more distant points, and unprovided with regular Bills of Health, will be treated as vessels coming from infected points—the ordinary measures of quarantine to come into operation, with regard to such arrivals from Aden, or any nearer port, on the 10th of August next; with regard to those from ports beyond Aden and further than Point de Galle, on the 10th of the following month; and from any more distant point, on the 10th of next October.'
