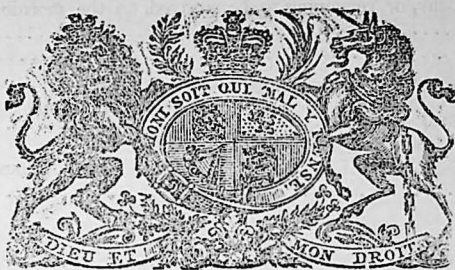

SIR,—With reference to previous correspondence, I have now the honour to submit to His Excellency the Governor in Council this my application for a concession of the right of constructing, upon the term of subsidy, &c., sanctioned by the Secretary of State for Branch Railways, a line of Railway of the standard gauge of 5 feet 6 inches, together with other necessary works appertaining thereto, between NERAD, MUHOONDA, and KUPPERWUNJ, in the Kaira Zillah, Goojerat.

2. Nerad being a Station on the Bombay, Baroda, and Central India Railway, and Kupperwunj a town some 26 miles distant to the north east.
