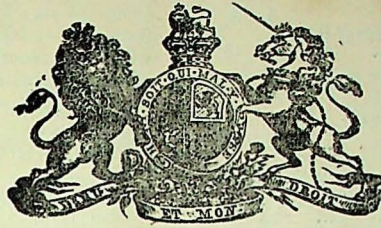

No. 198.—The following draft Notification is published for general information. Persons who

have any objections to urge to it are required to communicate the same in writing to the Chief Secretary to Government, Revenue Department, within one month from the date of the publication of this Notification:—

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 5 of the Opium Act (I of) 1878, the Governor in Council is pleased, with the previous sanction of the Governor General in Council, to direct in modification of the Bombay Opium Rules made under the said section and published in Notification No. 4472A at pages 702 to 715 of the *Bombay Government Gazette* for 1885, Part I, and Notification No. 6292 at page 773 of the *Bombay Government Gazette* for 1892, Part I, as follows, viz.:

(1) To Rule 6 (a) of the said rules there shall be added the words—

“in such quantity as the Collector may fix, which, except in any special case in which the Commissioner may authorise a larger quantity, shall not exceed one Indian seer.”

(2) In the initial paragraph of Form A, “Special License to Medical Practitioner,” appended to the said rules and amended as in Notification No. 6292, at page 773 of the *Bombay Government Gazette* for 1892, Part I, between the words “possession of opium” and “subject,” there shall be inserted the following:—

“in quantity not exceeding”

No. 171.—His Imperial and Royal Highness the Archduke Franz Ferdinand of Austria-Esté, accompanied by His Imperial and Royal Highness the Archduke Leopold of Tuscany, is expected to arrive on board the Ironclad *Kaiserin Elizabeth* in Bombay Harbour at noon on Monday the 16th January 1893. His Imperial and Royal Highness will be received on arrival with all the Naval and Military honours due to his high position.

2. When the *Kaiserin Elizabeth* is signalled from the Light House, three guns will be fired from the saluting battery at an interval of ten seconds each : and as she proceeds to her moorings, His Imperial and Royal Highness will be received with full Naval honours.

3. His Excellency the Governor, attended by his personal staff, will leave the Apollo Bandar at 4-30 P.M., and pay His Imperial and Royal Highness a visit of welcome on board. The Director of the Royal Indian Marine will arrange for the Governor's visit. His Excellency will then return to the Bandar.

4. His Imperial and Royal Highness will leave the *Kaiserin Elizabeth* at 4-55 P.M. on the 16th January under a salute from the Squadron, and will land at the Apollo Bandar

at 5 P.M. The Senior Naval Officer on the Station and the Director of the Royal Indian Marine will arrange in concert for attending His Imperial and Royal Highness as he proceeds from the ship to the Bandar. On the Archduke reaching the shore, a salute of 21 guns will be fired from the saluting battery, and he will be received by His Excellency the Governor attended by his personal staff. A Guard of Honour of Bombay Infantry with Band and Colours will be drawn up at the Bandar head.

5. The following Officials, if present in Bombay, namely His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief and Staff, the Honourable the Chief Justice of Bombay, the Lord Bishop of Bombay, the Judges of Her Majesty's High Court, the Additional Members of the Council of His Excellency the Governor for making Laws and Regulations, the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Bombay, the Roman Catholic Archbishop, the Secretaries to Government, the Brigadier-General Commanding the Bombay District, the Naval Officers commanding any of Her Majesty's ships in harbour, if able to attend on shore, the Municipal Commissioner, all Heads of Departments, Civil and Military, the Sheriff of Bombay, and the Under Secretaries to Government, will attend at the Bandar.

6. The Consular Representatives of Foreign Governments and the President of the Bombay Municipal Corporation are invited to be present on the occasion, and a space marked B will be reserved for them.
