No. 3540.—Whereas it appears to the Governor of Bombay in Council that land is required to be taken by Government at the expense of the Local Funds for a public purpose, viz., for a Mussalman burial ground, in the village of Bailwad, taluka Sampgaon, district Belgaum; it is hereby declared that for the above purpose the plot of land specified below is required within the aforesaid village of Bailwad:—

A piece of land measuring more or less 16 gunthas which forms a portion of the Revision Survey No. 34, bounded on the north by No. 35, on the east by No. 33, on the south by No. 15 and on the west by the boundary between the villages of Bailwad and Chivat-gundi.

This declaration is made under the provisions of Section 6, Act X of 1870, to all whom it may concern, who are hereby warned not to obstruct or interfere with persons employed on the land.

No. 3569.—In exercise of the power conferred by Section 6 of the Bombay A'bkári Act, 1878, the Governor in Council is pleased to empower, within the limits of the Town and Island of Bombay, Gaugers and Clerks of the A'bkári Department employed within the said limits when performing the duties of Inspectors or Sub-Inspectors under the orders of the Collector of Land Revenue, Customs and Opium, Bombay,—

(a) to make the requisitions referred to in Section 33 (b), and

(b) to exercise all the powers conferrable under Sections 36 and 37 of the said Act.

No. 3569 A.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 14 of the Opium Act, 1878, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to authorize, within the limits of the Town and Island of Bombay, the Gaugers and Clerks of the A'bkári Department employed within the said limits when performing the duties of Inspectors or Sub-Inspectors under the orders of the Collector of Land Revenue, Customs and Opium, Bombay, to exercise the powers conferrable under the said section.

No. 3572.—Whereas it appears to the Governor in Council, on the report of the District Magistrate of Belgaum, that in the Cantonment of Belgaum subject to the jurisdiction of the said Magistrate, cattle are habitually allowed to trespass on land and to damage crops or other produce thereon; the Governor in Council proposes to direct, in exercise of the power conferred upon him by Section 12 of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871, as amended by Section 5 (1) of Act I of 1891, that on and after the 1st July 1893, for every head of cattle specified in the scale contained in the first-mentioned section which may be seized within the said local area and impounded in accordance with the provisions of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871, as amended by Act I of 1891, the pound-keeper shall levy a fine equal to double the fine mentioned in the scale aforesaid.

2. And in exercise of the power conferred by Section 26 of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871, as amended by Section 8 of Act I of 1891, the Governor in Council proposes to direct that, with respect to the local area included within the Cantonment of Belgaum, the first paragraph of the said Section 26 of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871, shall, on and after the date specified in the first paragraph of this Notification, be read as if it had reference to cattle of any kind mentioned in the scale aforesaid, instead of to pigs only, and as if the words "fifty rupees" were substituted for the words "ten rupees."

3. All persons who entertain any objections to the above proposals are hereby required to submit the same, with reasons therefor, in writing, to the Chief Secretary to Government, Revenue Department, within one month from the date of the publication of this Notification.

No. 2001-S.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 23 of the Sea Customs Act (VIII of 1878), the Governor General in Council is pleased to exempt from customs duty all guns brought into British India from the French Settlements of Pondicherry, Karikal, or Mahé by residents of any of those settlements being Europeans:

Provided that the guns are covered by a pass issued under the authority of the Government of the settlement from which they are brought, and countersigned by a British Magistrate, certifying that the holders are entitled to carry the guns for sporting purposes.
