No. 3981.—Exporters of rice from a British district above the Gháts to Marmagoa *via* Castle Rock and the West of India Portuguese Guaranteed Railway for importation at any British Customs Port can obtain a refund of the export duty paid by them on production before the Customs Manager at Castle Rock within two months from the date of export from Castle Rock of a certificate from the officer in charge of the Custom House at the port at which the consignment was imported that the consignment has been re-imported into British territory.

2. An exporter wishing to claim a refund under this Notification must, as soon as his consignment arrives at the port of import, present to the officer in charge of the Custom House, along with the bill of entry or import application prescribed under Section 86 of the Sea Customs Act, a certificate from the Customs Manager at Castle Rock containing a description of the consignment and an acknowledgment of the receipt of the duty.

3. The consignment will then be compared with the entries in those documents specifying its weight and the number and description of the packages containing the rice, and if found to correspond, the officer in charge of the Custom House will endorse on the certificate a declaration that the consignment to which it relates has been passed through the Custom House.

4. No refund can be granted on a portion of a consignment which has broken bulk *en route*.

2. In reckoning the maximum number of passengers, children in arms under 3 years of age shall not be counted. Two children above 3 years, but each under 12 years, shall be counted as one passenger.

3. The driver or attendant shall not demand more than the rate of fare fixed by Government.

4. The horses and bullocks used in the licensed conveyances shall be changed for fresh ones at each of the stages specified, and for that purpose not less than the specified number of horses and bullocks shall be maintained in a fit condition for each conveyance.

5. The driver of each licensed conveyance shall, when plying, keep with him his license and produce the same for the inspection of any Police officer, Magistrate, or passenger when required to do so, with abstract of rules under Act VI of 1863.

6. Each licensed conveyance shall be supplied with two clear burning lights at night time.

7. List of stands and places at which alone public conveyances may stand:—

1 Wathar, 2 Pimpowde, 3 Shirgaon, 4 Wái, 5 Pasarni Plateau, 6 Bhosa, 7 Malcolmpeth.

8. The number of horses and bullocks to be maintained for each class of conveyance plying between Wathar and Mahábaleshvar, and the stages at which changes of fresh animals are to be made, shall be as follows:—
