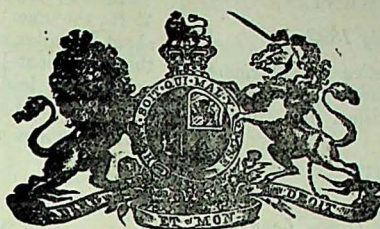

SOUTH AFRICA, WEST COAST, CAPE OF GOOD
HOPE, DASSEN ISLAND LIGHT-HOUSE.

First Order Light.

It is hereby notified that, in accordance with Notices to Mariners dated respectively the 30th July 1891 and 9th March 1893, a Double Flashing Half Minute White Light of the First Order was exhibited from the New Light-house on Dassen Island on the 15th April 1893, and will continue to be shown hereafter. The duration of the Flashes and Eclipses is approximately as follows:—

Flash ...	3 seconds.
Eclipse...	4 seconds.
Flash ...	3 seconds.
Eclipse	20 seconds.

Total 30 seconds = $\frac{1}{2}$ minute.

The light has an elevation of 155 feet above high water level, ordinary spring tides, and is visible in clear weather at a distance of $18\frac{1}{2}$ nautical miles from the Light-house.

Dassen Island lies about $4\frac{3}{4}$ miles off the South West Coast of the Cape Colony, in Latitude $33^{\circ} 26'$ South, and Longitude $18^{\circ} 51'$ East, and it is distant from Cape Town about 33 nautical miles.

CEYLON.—KALKUDA BAY.

A white dome-shaped beacon, with ball on top, visible about 12 miles, has been erected at the extreme end of Vendeloos Point.

Also two masonry guide obelisks, elevation 60 ft., the inner red and the outer white, which in line W. by N. clear the 8 ft. patch of rock lying S. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., 1 mile from the above white beacon.

Also two masonry guide obelisks, elevation 45 ft., the inner red and the outer white, visible about 12 miles, are established at N.-W. corner of the Bay, about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile eastward of the rest-house, and in line lead to the anchorage, where a red buoy is moored about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from the shore.

All previous notices are hereby cancelled and withdrawn."

The Governor General in Council has determined to borrow Three Hundred and Fifty Lakhs of Rupees, being the amount required for the public service.

The following Notification is therefore published:—

THREE AND A HALF PER CENT. LOAN OF 1893-94.

His Excellency the Right Honourable the Governor General in Council has resolved to borrow Three Hundred and Fifty Lakhs of Rupees for the public service in the following manner.

2. Promissory Notes will be issued for the said amount bearing interest at the rate of three and a half per centum per annum payable half-yearly on the 30th day of June and 31st day of December. The notes will be in Form A annexed to this Notification, and they will not be discharged without a previous notice of three months to be published in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Tenders for the whole or any part of the said amount of Rs. 3,50,00,000 will be received by the Comptroller General from this date to noon of Tuesday, the 15th August next. Tenders must be in sums of 500 Rupees or multiples of 500 Rupees.

4. Each tender must be addressed, in the form annexed to this Notification, to the Comptroller General, Calcutta, and enclosed in a closed cover, superscribed “*Tender for the Three and a Half Per Cent. Loan.*” If the tenderer is not resident in India, he must name an agent resident in India to whom an allotment-certificate may be issued if any part of the loan is allotted to such tenderer.¹

(a) Each tender must be accompanied by a receipt from the Head Office of the Bank of Bengal, or Madras, or Bombay, or one of their Branches, or from an officer in charge of some Public Treasury, or by a cheque drawn in favour of the Comptroller General on a Bank in Calcutta, Madras, or Bombay, or by² Government promissory notes, standing in the name of or endorsed to the tenderer or the person making the deposit, for not less than one-hundredth, or, if the tender be for less than Five Lakhs of Rupees, then for not less than one-fiftieth part of the tender.

(b) Deposits, not being promissory notes, will, in the case of accepted tenders, be credited proportionally in part payment of the allotment-certificates issued in respect of the tender, and will bear interest for the purpose of clause 14 below from the date of the opening of tenders. When a tender is not accepted

¹ Tenders made in accordance with these instructions will also be received by the Accountants General, Madras and Bombay, on account of the Comptroller General, Calcutta, on the 14th August, and up to 11-20 or 11 o'clock local time respectively (corresponding with 12 o'clock in Calcutta) on the 15th August; provided that—

(a) they are delivered personally or by clerk or messenger at the Accountant General's Office (where a receipt will be given for them);

(b) they are made on printed forms, to be obtained at the same office or at the local Presidency Bank;

(c) each tender is for not less than Rs. 10,000;

(d) that the deposit is either a Promissory Note, or a Treasury Receipt from the Head Office of the local Presidency Bank, or a cheque on a local Bank in Madras or Bombay in favour of the Accountant General, Madras or Bombay, respectively;

(e) that the amount of the tender is made payable either in Calcutta, Madras, or Bombay;

and the Accountant General will return deposits on non-accepted tenders, and will issue allotment-certificates so far as the tenders are payable in Madras or Bombay.

² It is particularly requested that such promissory notes may NOT be endorsed to the Comptroller General.

in full, the deposits, when they are not in the form of promissory notes, will be credited as far as possible proportionately in even tens of rupees in part payment of the allotment-certificates issued in respect of it. If any allotment-certificate is not fully taken up, the deposit credited in respect of it will be forfeited.

- (c) Promissory notes deposited in respect of any accepted tender will be held until all the allotment-certificates issued in respect of the tender are paid up, and will, if the allotment-certificates are not fully taken up, be appropriated by the Government and cancelled; provided that the notes of the $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. loans of 1878 and 1879, advertised for discharge by Notification No. 2985 of this date, may, if the depositors so desire, be credited, as far as possible, proportionately in payment of the allotment-certificates issued in respect of the tender with which they were deposited, the amount so credited, however, bearing interest only from the 14th October 1893 (the interest up to 13th October being paid separately as provided in the above-quoted Notification).

5. The rate at which a tender is made must not contain a fraction of an anna: if a rate containing a fraction of an anna is inserted in any tender, such fraction will be struck out and the tender treated as if the rate did not contain such fraction of an anna.

6. The rate at which each tender is made must be specified in rupees or rupees and annas: a tender in which no rate is thus specified, but a subscription is offered in some other terms—as, for example, at the recorded minimum, or at some specified percentage in addition to the recorded minimum, or at the average of the accepted tenders—will be rejected as null and void.

7. The minimum rate at which tenders will be accepted will be recorded under the signature of the Comptroller General, and, before the tenders are opened, placed upon the table in a sealed envelope, but will not be declared unless some tender is rejected only because it is below the recorded minimum.

8. Tenders will be opened publicly by the Comptroller General at the Treasury Buildings, Calcutta, at noon (Calcutta time) on Tuesday, the 15th August next, and those received under the terms of the footnote under clause 4 will be similarly opened by the Accountant General, Madras, at 11-30 (Madras time), and by the Accountant General, Bombay, at 11 o'clock (Bombay time), on the same day; but the contents of the tenders will not be disclosed otherwise than as provided in clause 10.

9. Tenders at the recorded minimum rate, and at rates above the recorded minimum rate, will be accepted in the order of the rates tendered, beginning with the highest rate; the amount allotted at the lowest rate at which tenders are accepted will be divided amongst those who have tendered at this rate, in proportion, as nearly as may be found convenient, to the amounts of their tenders: provided that no allotment will be issued if the amount distributable on any tender is less than Rs. 500.

10. To each tenderer (or to his agent), whose tender is accepted in whole or in part, such number of allotment-certificates as may be necessary to make up the aggregate amount allotted to him will be issued by the Comptroller General¹ as soon as possible after the 15th August; and an alphabetical list of the names of those to whom such allotment-certificates are issued will be posted, for general information, at the Head Offices of the Banks of Bengal, Madras, and Bombay.

11. If the allotment made on any tender is less than Rs. 3,000, then the whole of the allotment-certificates (after credit of the deposit under clause 4 (b)) will be made payable upon the 26th September.

Otherwise the whole amount of each allotment will be divided into three instalments, as follows:—

Instalment I—As near as convenient to 35 per cent., but not exceeding 35 per cent., payable upon the 29th August:

Instalment II—As near as convenient to 35 per cent., but not exceeding 35 per cent., payable upon the 26th September:

¹ For tenders received by the Accountant General, Madras or Bombay, and payable at those places, the Accountant General will issue the allotment-certificates.

Instalment III—The balance payable upon the 14th October :
and allotment-certificates will be issued for each instalment separately.

But the whole or any part of any accepted tender may be paid at any time after receipt of the allotment-certificates.

BY THE COMMISSIONER OF CUSTOMS, SALT, OPIUM AND A'BKÁRI.

No. 3562.—The following rules approved by the Commissioner of A'bkári under the provisions of Section 35 of the A'bkári Act, 1878, for the management of the Central Distillery at Dhulia and for the regulation of the storage, removal and transport of spirits made therein are published for general information :—

Rule 1.—The Distillery Inspector shall live on the premises throughout the year in the quarters provided for him and shall be responsible for the general management of the distillery and for the efficient sanitation of the premises.

Rule 2.—No work shall be carried on in the distillery before sunrise or after sunset or on Sundays, Good Friday, Christmas Day, New Year's Day or the Queen's Birthday, except upon the written permission of the Collector. When it is necessary through accident to the machinery or other urgent cause that work should be carried on in the distillery on Sundays, or on holidays, or before sunrise or after sunset on working days, and when the

permission of the Collector cannot be immediately obtained the Distillery Inspector may grant permission on the written requisition of the distillery manager, taking every precaution in the interest of Government by ordering the attendance of the necessary Government supervising establishment, and provided that the rule in preamble to Government Resolution No. 6882 of 29th September 1886 be complied with.

Rule 3.—In the event of work being done under such permission extra remuneration shall be given to the Distillery Inspector for supervision on the scale sanctioned by Government Resolution in the Revenue Department, No. 6882, dated 29th September 1886, and report should be made to the Collector of each occasion on which such permission is granted.

Rule 4.—The Inspector shall be present on duty at the distillery while the stills are working and while distillation is going on, and he shall be responsible that no spirits are removed from the distillery except under proper authority. In the event of his unavoidable absence from sudden illness or other urgent cause, the Assistant Inspector shall take charge, reporting the circumstances to the Collector for orders forthwith.

Rule 5.—All liquor drawn during the day shall on its being received into the receiver inside the strong room be pumped up into the storage vats, measured off with the graduated gauge rods prepared for that purpose, and tested with the standard Syke's hydrometer. The strength must be ascertained and adjusted to the standard prescribed not later than the day following its deposit.

Rule 6.—The Distillery Inspector shall forward to the Huzúr Deputy Collector daily at 11 A.M. a copy of the B Liquor stock account, and shall further submit a weekly report in diary form to the Collector of all that occurs in the distillery.

Rule 7.—There shall be two locks to the strong room, the keys of one of which shall be kept by the Inspector, of the other by the Contractor or his agent.

Rule 8.—To each vat in the strong room shall be affixed a board on which shall be clearly written the quantity of liquor in each vat. The strong room shall always be kept locked except when it is necessary to open it for the purpose of receiving, storing or issuing liquor.

Rule 9.—No combustibles other than liquor shall be allowed to be stored in the strong room, and it must not be entered with an open light.

Rule 10.—The Distillery Inspector shall be directly responsible for all accounts, for keeping the distillery books and registers correctly written up to date, and for the due performance of all orders issued by the Collector for the management of the distillery.

Rule 11.—Liquor issued under permit should leave the distillery at the same time as the permit.

Rule 12.—As all work has to stop at sunset the workmen employed in the distillery may be allowed quarter of an hour to clean themselves and leave the premises. The distillery will then be closed in the presence of the Inspector, who, before leaving it, shall see that the store rooms are duly fastened under his own lock and seal.

Rule 13.—There shall be affixed in front of the distillery a sign-board 4 feet long by 1½ feet broad, on which shall be painted in large letters "Government Central Distillery."

Rule 14.—Without the written permission of the Collector or of the officer in charge there shall be no admittance to the public to the distillery except on business.

Rule 15.—The following registers and books shall be kept in the distillery, and shall be filled in daily on the day after the work of distillation is completed:—

Rule 16 (a).—A visiting book shall be kept and produced whenever an Inspecting Officer shall visit the distillery. Copy of such remarks as he may make shall be forwarded at once to the Collector.

(b) An order book containing such orders as may from time to time be issued by the Collector shall also be kept and shown to the Inspecting Officers, in order that they may enter in the visiting book any suggestions they may have to offer regarding modifications or amplifications of existing orders.

Rule 17.—The sentry at the gate shall be regarded as always on duty until he is relieved.

Rule 18.—The distillery should be carefully inspected at least once in each month by the Huzúr Deputy Collector.

Rule 19.—The distillery shall be visited at least once a month by the Huzúr Deputy Collector or by such Assistant or District Deputy Collector as the Collector may direct to perform this duty.
