## Bombay Castle, 20th December 1893.

No. 8056.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 34 of Bombay Act VI of 1863 (an Act for the regulation of public conveyances, &c.) as amended by Bombay Act V of 1887, and in supersession of Government Notification No. 6132, dated the 19th October 1887 (published at page 882 of the Bombay Government Gazette for 1887, Part I), the Governor in Council is pleased to extend the provisions of the said Act to the road leading from Wathar to Mahabaleshvar viā Wái and Pánchgani with effect from the 1st February 1894, and to direct (a) that the duties assigned by the Act to the Commissioner of Police shall be performed by the District Magistrate of Sátára; (b) that all Magistrates of the First and Second Class having jurisdiction over the said road shall exercise the powers conferred by the said Act on Magistrates of Police; and (c) that the balance of the license fees, after all necessary contingent expenses shall have been defrayed therefrom, shall from time to time be paid by the District Magistrate into the Treasury to the credit of Government.

No. 8057.—With reference to Government Notification No. 8056, dated the 20th December 1893, extending the provisions of Bombay Act VI of 1863, as amended by Bombay Act V of 1887, to the road leading from Watkar to Mahabaleshvar via Wai and Panchgani, it is hereby notified for general information that, in exercise of the power conferred by Section 14 of the said Act amended as aforesaid, the District Magistrate of Satara, with the sanction of the Governor in Council, has fixed the following rates for the hire of public conveyances on the said road :-

No. 8058 .- With reference to the foregoing Notifications, the following subsidiary rules made by the District Magistrate of Sátára, with the approval of the Governor in Council, under Section 14 of Bombay Act VI of 1863, are published for general information:—

#### Subsidiary Rules.

<sup>1.</sup> The maximum number of passengers and weight of luggage to be carried by each description of conveyance shall be as follows:

Description of Convoyance.	Annual License Fees.	Number of Passengers includ- ing drivers.	Maximum weight of luggage allowable in addi- tion to full number of passengers.

For each passenger less than the full number, an additional weight of luggage may be added, not exceeding the amount mentioned in column 4.

- 2. In reckoning the maximum number of passengers, children in arms under 3 years of age shall not be counted. Two children above 3 years, but each under 12 years, shall be counted as one passenger.
- 3. The horses and bullocks used in the licensed conveyances shall be changed for fresh ones at each of the stages specified, and for that purpose not less than the specified number of horses and bullocks shall be maintained in a fit condition for each conveyance actually plying. A reserve of licensed carriages may be kept to replace any withdrawn from the road in consequence of accident or for repairs, provided that the number in use at any one time shall not exceed that for which horses or bullocks are provided according to the scale laid down.
- 4. The driver of each licensed conveyance shall, when plying, keep with him his license and produce the same for the inspection of any Police officer, Magistrate, or passenger when required to do so, with abstract of rules under Act VI of 1863.
  - 5. Each licensed conveyance shall be supplied with two clear burning lights at night time.
  - 6. List of stands and places at which alone public conveyances may stand :-
    - 1 Wáthar, 2 Circlevádi, 3 Joshi's well, 4 Wái, 5 Pasarni Plateau, 6 Bhosa, 7 Malcolmpeth.
- 7. The number of horses and bullocks to be maintained for each class of conveyance plying between Wáthar and Mahábaleshvar, and the stages at which changes of fresh animals are to be made, shall be as follows:—

## BY THE COMMISSIONER OF CUSTOMS, SALT, OPIUM AND A'BKA'RI.

No. 6479.—The following rules approved by the Commissioner of Abkári under the provisions of Section 35 of the Abkári Act, 1878, for the management of the Central Distillery at Sátára and for the regulation of the storage, removal and transport of spirits made therein are published for general information:—

Rule I.—The Distillery Inspector shall live on the premises throughout the year in the quarters provided for him, and shall be responsible for the general management of the distillery and for the efficient sanitation of the premises, and also for the Government trees standing thereon. The Distillery Inspector shall open and close the distillery daily in the presence of the officer in charge of the Police guard.

Rule II.—No work shall be carried on in the distillery before sunrise or after sunset or on Sundays, Good Friday, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, or the Queen's Birthday except upon the written permission of the Huzúr Deputy Collector, to whom power to grant this permission has been delegated.

Rule III.—In the event of work being done under such permission extra remuneration shall be given to the Distillery Inspector for supervision on the scale sanctioned in Government Resolution No. 6382, dated 29th September 1886, in the Revenue Department, and report should be made to the Collector of each occasion on which such permission is granted.

Rule IV.—The Inspector shall be present on duty at the distillery while the stills are working and while distillation is going on, and he shall be responsible that no spirits are removed from the distillery except under proper authority. In the event of his unavoidable absence from sudden illness or other urgent cause the Huzúr Deputy Collector will make such arrangement as is possible for the temporary conduct of his duty reporting his proceedings to the Collector forthwith. In cases of urgency the Huzúr Deputy Collector may grant casual leave to the Distillery Inspector and shall submit a report to the Collector on each occasion of his having done so.

Rule V.—All liquor drawn during the day shall be tested with the Standard Syke's Hydrometer and the strength thereof ascertained and adjusted to the standard prescribed as soon as it is cool and fit for testing. It shall then be removed to the strong room measured by the brass standard measures supplied by Gövernment and deposited in the yats there.

Rule VI.—The Distillery Inspector shall forward to the Huzúr Deputy Collector daily at 11 A.M. a report in the accompanying form showing—

- (a) the opening balance,
- (b) liquor drawn during the preceding 24 hours,
- (c) liquor issued up to 11 A.M.,
- (d) balance in stock.

Rule VII.—There shall be two locks to the strong room, the keys of one of which shall be kept by the Inspector, of the other by the Contractor or his Agent.

Rule VIII.—To each vat in the strong room shall be affixed a board on which shall be clearly painted—

- (1) the serial number of the vat,
- (2) its full capacity,
- (3) date of testing capacity.

The strong room shall always be kept locked except when it is necessary to open it for the purpose of testing, storing or issuing liquor.

Rule 1X.—No combustibles other than liquor shall be allowed to be stored in the strong room, which must not be entered with an open light.

Rule X.—The Distillery Inspector shall be directly responsible for all accounts, for keeping the Distillery Books and Registers correctly written up to date and for the due performance of all orders issued by the Collector or by the Huzúr Deputy Collector for the management of the distillery.

Rule XI.—Liquor issued under permit should leave the distillery at the same time as the permit.

Rule XII.—As all the work has to stop at sunset, the workmen employed in the distillery may be allowed quarter of an hour to clean themselves and leave the premises. The distillery will then be closed in the presence of the Inspector, who, before leaving it, shall see that the storeroom is duly fastened under his own lock and seal.

Rule XIII.—One dram of liquor may be given to each of the men working at the distillery who may wish it every evening to be drunk on the premises in the presence of the Distillery Inspector.

Rule XIV.—There shall be affixed in the front of the distillery a signboard 4 feet long by 1½ feet broad on which shall be painted in large letters "Government Central Distillery."

Rule XV.—There shall be no admittance to the public to the distillery except on business. Visitors may be admitted to see the distillery on

permits from the Collector, or in his absence from the Huzur Deputy Collector.

Rule XVI.—The following registers and books shall be kept in the distillery and shall be filled in daily after the work of distillation is completed:—

- (1) Material Stock Account (Form A).
- (2) Stock Account of single distilled spirit (Form A-I).
- (3) Account in Form B (Liquor stock).
- (4) · Do. do. C (Register of passes).
- (5) Do. do. D (Gauge book).
- (6) Do. do, E (Monthly account of spirit manufactured and issued).

Rule XVII-(A).—A visitor's book shall be kept and produced whenever an Inspecting Officer shall visit the distillery. Copy of such remarks as he may make shall be forwarded at once to the Collector through the Huzur Deputy Collector.

(B) An Order Book containing such orders as may from time to time be issued by the Collector or by the Huzúr Deputy Collector shall also be kept and shown to Inspecting Officers, in order that they may enter in the visitor's book any suggestions they may have to offer regarding modifications or amplifications of existing orders.

Rule XVIII.—The sentry at the gate shall be regarded as always on duty until he is relieved.

Rule XIX.—The distillery should be carefully inspected at least once each month by the Huzúr Deputy Collector or an Assistant or District Deputy Collector.
