# PROCEEDINGS OF THE LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT, BOMBAY.

The following Bill, together with the Statement of Objects and Reasons accompanying it, is published in accordance with Rule 22 of the Rules for the conduct of business at Meetings of the Council of His Excellency the Governor of Bombay for making Laws and Regulations:—

#### Bill No. II of 1897.

A Bill to amend the Sind Village Officers Act, 1881, as amended by Bombay Act II of 1888.

WHEREAS it is expedient further to Bo. IV of amend the Sind Village Officers Act, 1881, as amended by Bombay Act II of 1888, in manner hereinafter appearing: It is enacted as follows:—

ing words shall be added "and the cost of establishing and maintaining schools for training them in Survey and Revenue work, and the proportionate cost of the Local Funds establishment in the office of the Accountant General."

3. The Governor in Council may declare that any expenses incurred before the passing of this Act, with the sanction of the Commissioner in Sind, for the training of Probationary Tapedárs in Survey and Revenue work, shall be deemed to have been incurred under the authority of this Act.

## STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of this Bill is further to amend the Sind Village Officers Act, 1881, as amended by Bombay Act II of 1888, so as—

- (1) to include "Probationary Tapedars" among the village officers as defined in the principal Act;
- (2) to legalise the payment, out of the Village Officers' Cess Fund, of the cost of training Probationary Tapedars in Survey and Revenue work, and the proportionate cost of the Local Funds establishment in the office of the Accountant General; and
- (8) to legalise retrospectively the payment of any such expenses which may have been incurred before the passing of this measure.
