The gram to be of unexceptionable quality of the description usually furnished to mounted corps at Poona and Kirkee, and to be delivered free of all expense to Government, beyond the stipulated price, at the Commissariat Stores at the abovementioned stations. In case of disputes as to the quality of the gram tendered the opinion of a committee of officers to decide the point, when if the gram be rejected, the required quantity will be purchased wherever procurable at the risk and loss of the contractor, who will be liable to be fined (50) fifty Rupees or (30) thirty per cent on the amount of the expenses so incurred at the option of the Executive Commissariat Officer.

A supply of not less than 3 months consumption to be kept in the Commissariat Stores at the above stations.

To prevent disputes hereafter, it is to be distinctly understood, that the provisions of the contract are only intended to extend to the demands made at Poona and Kirkee, but in the event of any of the mounted corps moving, it will be optional with the Commissariat officer to take 15 days supply of gram for their use on the march, and the contractor will not be liable for any greater demand.

The biddings to be in the Company's Rupees, and no person will be allowed to tender for the contract unless he previously deposits in this office the sum of (500) five hundred Rupees in cash, which will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract, should his offers be accepted.

Is hereby given, that persons desirous of entering into a contract for supplying fresh Bread, Flour and Rolog, to the European troops and Hospitals at Bombay and Colaba, daily, also to the Commissariat Department, for such purposes as may be required for the term of one year, from the 1st day of June next, may on application at this office from 10 A. M. till 5 P. M. daily (Sundays excepted) obtain a list of the same with rates affixed thereto and such other information as they may require.

The contractor will be required to comply immediately with all emergent demands for the articles comprised in the abovementioned list and others of less urgency, must be met within the period stated in the requisition book, in failure thereof, the articles or such others as may be required in lieu will be purchased at his risk and loss, and in all such cases an advance of Rupees (30) thirty per cent upon the amount of expences incurred or a fine of Rupees (50) fifty at the option of the executive officer will be levied as liquidated damages for each and every such breach of contract, as often as the same may occur.

It is to be distinctly understood that every detail of troops proceeding from the Presidency to the interior whose numerical strength may exceed 7 men is to be accompanied by one or more bakers to provide fresh bread on the line of march to the soldiers, and which baker or bakers are to be provided by the contractor and the bread supplied at the rates indicated in the schedule.

The supply of bread to the troops proceeding to the interior whilst on the march is to commence from the 11th day of June next.

Notice is hereby given, that by a Treasury Warrant under date 11th September 1845, among other Regulations, certain rates of British Packet Postage have been established upon all Letters, Newspapers and Prices Current, conveyed from Port to Port in the East Indies, China &c. by the new lines of Packet boats recently put in operation under the additional contract made by Her Majesty's Government, with the Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company,

These rates of Packet Postage are as follows.

One Shilling per half ounce for letters, according to the scale of weight now in operation in the united Kingdom,

One Penny for each Newspaper, whether British, Colonial or Foreign, conveyed between any of Her Majesty's Colonies and a Foreign Port, or between any two Foreign Ports,

One Penny for each British or Colonial printed Price Current, or printed Commercial List conveyed between any of Her Majesty's Colonies.

Two Pence for each printed Price Current or printed Commercial list, whether British, Colonial or Foreign, conveyed between a British Colony and a Foreign Port, or between two Foreign Ports.

British or Colonial Newspapers passing by these packets between any of Her Majesty's Colonies will not be liable to any postage for the Sea conveyance,

The prepayment of the British Packet postage on letters, is optional, when conveyed between the Indian Offices of Bombay, Aden, Calcutta, Madras, Penang & Singapore, and the Islands of Ceylon and Hongkong, or between any two of the Indian offices above enumerated; but when dispatched to a Foreign Country or Possession, such as China, Manilla &c, the above postage must be paid in advance at the Despatching Office.

The Postage chargeable on Newspapers and Prices Current and Commercial lists forwarded by these Packet Boats must in all cases be paid in advance.

The public are requested to take notice that by this Warrant, Letters &c. sent from Bombay to Point de Galle for dispatch thence to any Port in India or China, or to any of the settlements to the Eastward by the Peninsular and Oriental Company's Steamers will be liable to the above rate of British packet postage in addition to the postage at present leviable from hence to Galle; and also that when addressed to a Foreign Country or Possession the postage in question, must in all cases be paid in advance at the despatching office

The British Packet postage above referred to, will, till further notice be converted into Indian currency at the rate of two shillings the rupee.

The above arrangement will come into operation in this Presidency on the 1st day of May next.
