CAP. XIV.

An Act to continue until the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of Parliament, the several Acts relating to Insolvent Debtors in India (14th May 1846.)

Whereas an Act was passed in the ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intitled *An Act to provide for the relief of Insolvent Debtors in the East Indies until the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three*: And whereas a certain other Act was passed in the second year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intitled *An Act to continue until the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, an Act of the ninth year of His late Majesty for the relief of Insolvent Debtors in India*, whereby the said first mentioned Act was continued in force until the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six: And whereas a certain other Act was passed in the fifth year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King William the Fourth, intitled *An Act to amend the laws relating to Insolvent Debtors in India*: And

whereas by an Act passed in the Session held in the sixth and seventh years of the Reign of His said late Majesty King William the Fourth, the first mentioned Act, as amended by the last mentioned Act, was continued in force until the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of Parliament: And whereas by an Act passed in the Session held in the Third and Fourth years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, the said first mentioned Act, as amended by the said Act of the Fifth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, was continued in force until the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and

forty-five, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of Parliament: And whereas it is expedient that the said first mentioned Act, as amended by the said Act of the Fifth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, should be further continued: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, that the said Acts of the Ninth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth and the Fifth year of the Reign of King William the Fourth, shall be and the same are hereby continued until the 1st day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and from thence until the end of the then next Session of Parliament.

Alteration of Act. II. And be it enacted, That this Act may be amended or repealed by any Act to be passed in the present Session of Parliament.

Officers Commanding details on board ships are required to furnish without delay on arrival at the Port of debarkation to the Pursers of Ships, a general Indent for spirits issued according to the accompanying form, who will furnish it with his accounts to the Commissariat Officer at such Port, to enable the latter officer to send the usual stoppage list to the Divisional Pay Master for recovery.

With a view to ensure the speedy recovery of stoppages for provisions issued to Native troops, public and private Followers on board the Honorable Company's Steamers and sailing Vessels, the Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to direct, that in future the Officer Commanding Native details, shall, immediately on arrival at the port of disembarkation furnish to the Purser of the vessel a general Indent according to the following form, to enable the latter officer to forward the same as a voucher with his accounts to the Commissariat Officer at the place of debarkation: whenever details are not commanded by a European Officer the general Indent should invariably be framed by the Pursers of the vessels, and transmitted to the Commissariat Officer as above.

The Commissariat Officer shipping the provisions for the voyage should be particular in furnishing the Purser of the vessel on which the detail may be proceeding with every necessary information regarding the number, description of troops and followers, and the scale at which they are to be rationed.

It is to be understood that Provisions on Board Ships or boats are allowed gratis to troops, and such Public Followers when proceeding to or returning from Scinde as are not in the receipt of high rates of pay for special service in Scinde from 1st September 1845; vide G. G. O. Page 236, No. 481, para. 8, dated 1st September last.

Provisions are also allowed gratis to Native Troops and Public Followers when proceeding to or returning from Foreign service as per Jameson's code, Pag 58, Section VII, Art. 83. Aden is considered foreign service.

Officers Commanding details on board ships are required to furnish without delay on arrival at the port of debarkation to the Pursers of Ships, a General Indent for Spirits issued according to the accompanying form, who will furnish it with his accounts to the Commissariat Officer at such port, to enable the latter officer to send the usual Stoppage List to the Divisional Paymaster for recovery.

With a view to ensure the speedy recovery of stoppages for provisions issued to Native troops, public and private Followers on Board the Honorable Company's Steamers and sailing Vessels, the Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to direct, that in future the Officer Commanding Native details shall immediately on arrival at the port of disembarkation, furnish to the Purser of the vessel a General Indent according to the following form, to enable the latter officer to forward the same as a voucher with his accounts to the Commissariat Officer at the place of debarkation; whenever details are not commanded by a European Officer, the General Indent should invariably be framed by the Pursers of the vessels and transmitted the Commissariat Officer as above.

The Commissariat Officer shipping the provisions for the voyage should be particular in furnishing the Purser of the vessel on which the detail may be proceeding, with every necessary information regarding the number description of troops and followers, and the scale at which they are to be rationed.

It is to be understood that provisions on Board Ships or boats are allowed gratis to troops, and such Public Followers when proceeding to or returning from Scinde as are not in the receipt of high rates of pay for special service in Scinde from 1st September 1845, Vide G. G. O. page 236, No. 481, para 8, dated 1st September last.

Provisions are also allowed gratis to Native Troops and Public Followers when proceeding to or returning from foreign service as per Jameson's Code page 58, Section VII, Article 83. Aden is considered foreign service.
