The following Act is brought up before the Legis-

The following Act is brought up before the Legis-lative Council this day,—Resolved, that the Rules requiring that all Acts shall be brought up for se-cond reading in two months or in three months, from the date of the first reading be suspended in respect to the following Proposed Act, and that it be at once passed into Law, the Assent of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India having been obtained and recorded:

ACT No. XXV. of 1845. An Act for regulating the time of sailing of Ships carrying Emigrants from Madras to Jamaica, British Guiana and Trinidad.

Whereas by Section VIII. Act XXI. of 1844, it

was amongst other things enacted, that no Ship or Vessel carrying Emigrant Laborers to Jamaica, British Guiana, or Trinidad, should sail from Calcutta, Madras, or Bombay, at any other time than between the 30th day, of any September, and the 1st of March payt, thereofter ensuing. of March next, thereafter ensuing.

And whereas the said provision is found to be in-

convenient so far as regards Ships or Vessels carry-

ing Emigrant Laborers from Madras:

It is therefore hereby enacted, that so much of the said Act as is hereinbefore recited be repealed so far as regards such last mentioned Ships or Vessels.

L. It is hereby enacted, that all powers and duties now vested by Law in the Justices of the Peace with respect to granting and withholding Licenses for the sale of Arrack or other Spirituous or Fermented Liquors within the Town of Calcutta, shall from and after the passing of this Act, be vested in and discharged by any person whom the Governor of Bengal may appoint for that purpose.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that the Gover-nor of Bengal shall have authority at all times to regulate the form of Licenses to be granted for the sale of Arrack and other Liquors as aforesaid in the Town of Calcutta, and to vary and add to the terms

and conditions thereof.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that whenever a License to sell Arrack or other Liquors as aforesaid shall be granted under the provisions of this Act, the Officer granting such License shall be authorized to demand, in consideration of the privilege granted, such fee, tax or duty as may from time to

granted, such fee, tax or duty as may from time to time be fixed under the sanction of the Governor of Bengal. And such fee, tax or duty may be made payable in advance, or at such period as may be settled by the Officer granting the License.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Officer granting such License to withhold or recal the same, in case the fee, tax or duty atoresaid be not duly paid according to the conditions upon which such License shall be granted. And any person vending Arrack or other Liquors as aforesaid within the Town of Calcutta, whilst such Licence shall be withheld, or after it shall have been recalled as aforesaid, shall be liable to all the penalties for vending Arrack or other Liquors as aforesaid without a Licence.

II. Provided always that the Magistrates may

at all times recall from such Assistants any depending cases which may have been referred to them under this Act, and which for the more speedy administration of justice or for any other reason, the Magtstrates may deem it proper to determine themselves in the first instance.

And it is hereby further enacted, that all Buisness of what nature or kind soever which the said Supreme Court of Judicature at Fort St. George may or shall have power to transact in Term, it shall in like manner have power to transact out of Term, and that all proceedings whatever before the said Court out of Term, shall be good, valid and effectual in the Law to all intents and purposes as if the said proceeding were had in Term, and that all Rules and Orders of the said Court as to all Judgments, Executions or other Proceedings in Term, shall be applied to all Judgements, Executions, or other Proceedings given, issued or had out of Term, as near as the same can be made applicable thereto, and the said same can be made applicable thereto, and the said Court shall issue such new Rules and Orders as may be necessary for the purpose of giving full effect to the provisions in this Act contained.

es-extensive powers and a concurrent jurisdiction with the Judge of the Zilla, except that he shall not keep a file of Civil suits, but shall transact such Civil business only as he may receive from the Judge of the Zilla.

II. And it is hereby enacted that the Rules and Regulations at present in force, or which may hereinafter be enacted for the guidance of the Judge, shall be equally applicable to the Joint

Judge.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that previous to exercising the functions of his Office, the Joint Judge,
with shall take the oath prescribed for the Judge, with the requisite alteration of designation, or when the oath is dispensed with under Act XXI. of 1837, shall make and subscribe a declaration in writing to

the same effect with such oath.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that the seal of the Joint Judge shall be the same as is used by the

Judge of the Zilla.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the said Governor in Council, with the consent of the said Governor General in Council, whenever the state of Criminal Judicial business may render it expedient, to appoint in any Zilla within the said Territories a Joint Session Judge who shall be vested with co-extensive powers and a concurrent jurisdiction with the Session Judge of the Zilla, except that he shall not receive original complaints, but

cept that he shall not receive original complaints, but shall transact such Criminal business only as he may receive from the Session Judge of the Zilla.

VI. And it is hereby enacted, that the Rules and Regulations at present in force or which may hereafter be enacted for the guidance of the Session Judge, shall be equally applicable to the Joint Session Judge.

VII. And it is hereby enacted the session services of the Session Judge.

VII. And it is hereby enacted, that previous to exercising the functions of his Office, the Joint Session Judge shall take the oath prescribed for the Session Judge with the requisite alteration of designation, or when the oath is dispensed with under Act XXI. of 1837, shall make and subscribe a declaration in writing to the same effect with such
