All persons desirous of tendering for the above contract, may, on application at this Office from 10 A. M. until 5 P. M. obtain daily (Sundays excepted) a list of the rates and such other information relating thereto as they may require.

The tenders must specify, both in words and figures the rates per cent below the prices in the list above adverted to, at which they will undertake to furnish the whole of the articles embraced therein, on condition the supplies are to be of a good and unexceptionable quality, and to be made at Sukker as required without any further cost to Government beyond that agreed upon, subject to the approval of the receiving authorities and that they are to be delivered in such number or quantity as may from time to time be demanded by the department requiring them during the existence of the contract.

Every person submitting a tender will be required to lodge with it the sum of Rupees (100) one hundred in cash, which will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract, should his offer be accepted, he must be prepared to furnish a further sum of Rupees (81) eighty-one in cash, making Rupees (181) one hundred and eighty-one, and unexceptionable bonded security to the extent of Rupees (724) seven hundred and twenty-four, which together with the above amount will be held for the due performance of the above engagement.

The contractor will be required to comply immediately with all emergent demands for the articles included in the abovementioned list, and others of less urgency must be complied

with, within the period stated in the requisition notes, in failure thereof the articles or such others as may be required in lieu, will purchased at his risk and loss; and in all such cases an advance of Rupees (30) thirty per cent upon the amount of expences incurred, or a fine of Rupees (50) fifty at the option of the Commissariat Officer at Sukker will be levied as liquidated damages, for each and every such breach of contract as often as the same may occur.

The tenders will be opened at the time already specified in presence of the parties concerned or of such as may be in attendance, but cannot be recorded that are not accompanied with the requisite deposit.

The annual outlay on account of the above contract is estimated at Rupees (3,621-0-0) or thereabouts. All further particulars will be communicated on the receipt and opening of the tenders, and no reasons will be assigned in the event of their rejection.

The following Report of the Board of Conservancy submitted to Government by the Worshipful Bench of Her Majesty's Justices, is published for general information.

Bombay Castle, 21st July 1846,

The Board of Conservancy take the earliest opportunity in their power after the close of the official year, of presenting the Worshipful Bench with the following report of their proceedings, and detailed statement of their receipts and disbursements contemplated by Clause XVII. of the Municipal Act.

2. The Board are of opinion, that the several Appendixes annexed to this Report, will afford the Bench full information upon all matters connected with their receipts and disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund to the 30th April last.

Appendix A. is an account of the actual income and expenditure of the Municipal Fund from 10th June 1845 to 30th April 1846, and of its assets and liabilities under the latter date. It shews,

Appendix B. shews the works which had been sanctioned by the Government thro' the Court of Petty Sessions out of the Old County Fund prior to the 10th June 1845, and which were not completed on the 1st November, (to which date the Board on a former occasion reported their progress.)

Appendix C. shews in like manner, the works which had been sanctioned by the Worshipful Bench out of the Old Assessment Fund; This list is now completed.

Appendix D. shews the works which had been recommended by the Board, approved by the Bench and sanctioned by the Government under the Municipal Act.

Appendix E. shews the repairs also which had been recommended by the Board, and sanctioned by the Bench.

Appendix F. shews the petty works and repairs authorized by the Board under the general permission of the Bench and sanction of the Government.

Appendixes G. H. and I. shew the new works, repairs &c. sanctioned and approved between the 1st November 1845 and the 30th April 1846.

Appendix K. shews all the works, repairs &c. completed during the same time.

3. In their former report the Board drew the attention of the Bench to some of the chief public works which were then in progress, or had been proposed and sanctioned for execution. They now enumerate the following, which have been brought to a final close since 1st November, omitting many of comparatively less importance.

4. the new streets and roads of which the accounts have been closed are.

Several other streets and roads have been widened, and otherwise much improved.

A new well has been sunk in the village of Dharravee and the Buglow Bowree excavated and rebuilt.

5. Of the works completed, or nearly so, but the accounts of which have not been finally closed may be noticed.

The new road at the back of the Byculla Schools.

The improvement of the Oomercarry sewer by the blasting out of a large portion of rock which obstructed its course.

The new road at Mahim; which has opened out a fine approach to Lady Jamestjee's causeway through the Mahim woods.

The conversion of the quarry near the Byculla Tank into a tank for the public use, by the building of wall round its northern side for the purpose of preventing the pollution of its water by cattle.

The large main sewer, draining the Native Town from the verge of the Esplanade at the head of Sheik Memon street to its junction with the Old Town drain at Eslampoora. This most useful work is now completed, as far as the sewer itself is concerned, and appears to answer its intended purpose admirably; two flushing gates have been constructed in the course of it, which have been found to act very well on a recent trial, and will, there is little doubt, have a good effect in keeping the sewer clear. It is hoped, that the operation of this new sewer in drawing off the surplus water of so large a portion of the town, will enable the Board at no distant period to recommend further considerable improvements to the Old Town drain, of a nature similar to the work which next comes under notice, and which will tend much to the health and comfort of the thickly inhabited district of Coombarwada.

The town drain which formerly ran the whole length of Bapoo Khote street open to the air. This drain has been completely arched over and a fine clear road constructed in the place of it, to the great comfort of the inhabitants of this considerable street. The Board think it proper to record in this place the public spirit of Sir Jamsetjee Jeejeebhoy, Mahomed Ally Rogay Esquire, and other native gentlemen of Bombay, to whose liberality it is that the inhabitants of the town are mainly indebted for this great improvement.

The opening made from Syed Abdool Rahimon street, through a block of houses into the Parell Road, which will have the effect of relieving to a great extent, the traffic which now passes through the Kalbadavee road and Sheik Memon street.

The auxiliary drain from the town drain in Coppersmith row to the sewer in Jugjevun Kecka street. This drain now draws off a large portion of the water which used formerly to flow through the other one, but for which its capacity was not adapted.

The deepening of the outer channel of the Love Grove sluices, which has been brought to a close and will, there is little doubt, have a very beneficial effect in carrying off the water from the flats in times to come.

The paving of gullies throughout the town. This most important work, to which allusion was made in the Board's former report, has been steadily persevered in, and it appears that whilst 164 gullies and passages of the total length of 26,797 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet, and an average breadth of 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet, and covering a collective area of nearly 10,000 square yards, have been thoroughly cleaned out, raised to the level of the surrounding streets, and paved with cut stone, at the expense partly of the public and partly of the neighbouring householders, the inhabitants of the town have themselves completed, by means of private subscriptions, but under the Superintendence of the Department, as many as 125 more; of these the Board have not an exact account before them, but they are understood to be of the same average dimensions as those completed at the public expense, and may be estimated therefore to cover an additional area of about 7500 square yards. The effects of this system of improvement can best be understood by contrasting the state of these gullies, after a heavy fall of rain, with the condition of those which have not yet been cleaned and paved.

The market shed burnt down in the late fire, which has been replaced, and opportunity taken otherwise to improve the neighbourhood.

The new pier on piles over the sea at Boree Bunder, now in course of erection for the accommodation of the public scavengers, sweepers &c., with the view of rendering the Beach at Backbay less objectionable than it is at present.

The lining out of several new roads between the Grant and Bellasis Roads and on the flats to the northward of the latter road, the construction of which cannot be entered upon at present.

The cleaning out of the several tanks and wells, which advantage has been taken of the recent dry season to attend to very generally throughout the Island, has been effected at a considerable outlay of the public money. The Baboola Tank may be noticed in particular under this head, from which, as it has not been sufficiently dry on

any previous occasion since 1822, an immense mass of mud and filth has been removed, and measures at the same time have been taken, by the construction of a new drain in the Jail road, to prevent any future influx of foul water. The northern end of this tank has been considerably enlarged and deepened without expense to the public, by allowing free access to the tank for the purpose of quarrying stone, of which a very large quantity has been taken away.

6. Having thus drawn the attention of the Bench to the chief public works upon which the municipal fund has been expended during the past year, the Board submit in Appendix L. a prospective estimate of the income, certain expenditure, and probable balance of the Fund available for its general purposes during the official year ending on the 30th April 1847. From this it will appear that the Board estimate,

7. Out of this sum it will be advisable to retain a considerable amount in hand to meet cases of emergent or unexpected expenditure, or to avail of opportunities for effecting public improvements which may not occur again. The residue it will be the object of the Board to recommend for expenditure during the year upon works of public utility, of these, however, there are more which claim their early consideration than the public funds will suffice to complete for many years to come, or the executive officer can efficiently superintend in one season. The chief of these are an extensive system for draining by means of one or more main sewers, the whole of that district of the Native Town situated between the Kalbadavee Road and Backbay, the construction of several unmade streets, and of tanks for the public use. The cleaning and paving of gullies. The improvement of the head of the Old Town drain near Coppersmith street, and the arching of it over at Coomberwada below the junction of the Erskine and Duncan Roads, with the improvement at the same time of the surrounding localities ; The widening of the Market street road across the Esplanade from the Bazar Gate of the Fort to the head of Sheik Memon and Syed Abdul Rahimon streets, upon which road there is probably more heavy traffic than upon any other on the Island, and besides these, many other works are contemplated, which will tend much to the public comfort and convenience.

8. As the season for carrying on these extensive works is necessarily limited within the space of eight months, or from the early part of October to the end of May, so the period of the monsoon appears to be the fitting time for devising a scheme of laying out the public funds during the ensuing fair season to the best advantage. The Board feel some difficulty, however in determining the works first to be recommended for approval and sanction, whilst they are unaware of the sum which will be at their disposal for these purposes, but as the accompanying estimate is framed on a careful examination of the different heads of income and expenditure, the Board beg that the Worshipful Bench will be so good as to submit it to Government with their request and recommendation, that the Board may be at liberty to consider the estimated surplus amounting, say to Company's Rupees 1,80,000 at their disposal during the current official year, for their guidance in preparing their plans for employing the public money during the ensuing fair season to the best advantage :-
