Notice

Is hereby given, that sealed Tenders will be received in the Commissariat offices at Bombay, Poona, Belgaum & Ahmednuggur, also at Kurrachee and Hydrabad in Scinde until 2 o'clock P. M. on Thursday the 19th day of November next, for a contract for supplying and continuing the supply of about 400 Draught Bullocks for service with the Army in Scinde for a period of two years, from such date as shall be hereafter fixed on the part of the East India Company, or by the proper authorities. The Bullocks are to be of a superior size and weight, equal to the draught of guns and heavy stores and such other work as they may be required to perform, and to be of the Mysore or Malwa breed.

2nd. All persons desirous of tendering for the above contract, may, on application at the above offices from 10 A. M. until 5 P. M. daily, Sundays excepted, obtain such information relating thereto as they may require, and on a tender being accepted the tenderer will be required to execute a contract under seal in accordance with the stipulation in this notice contained.

3rd. The Bullocks will be subject to the approval of a Committee of officers at the above stations to be named on the part of the Bombay Government, and are not to be supplied younger than 5 or older than 8 years of age at the time of being supplied, and this rule of age is to govern all cattle that may be required to replace Bullocks lost by death or otherwise.

4th. All the Bullocks furnished by the contractor to be branded in presence of the Committee passing them, with the letters S. F. of one inch in length on the off-hip.

5th. The contractor is to supply and keep up the supply of drivers in the proportion of one to two Bullocks during the contract, at the same term and place with the Bullocks, and to pay their wages during the contract.

6th. The Bullocks and Drivers to be mustered monthly.

7th. The Drivers to be settled with monthly by the contractor and not to be discharged without the permission of the Commissariat officer.

8th. The hire payable to the contractor for the Bullocks and Drivers to be paid to the contractor on the 20th of each month, subject however to the proviso contained in the 21st Clause.

9th. The Bullocks to be fed on the part of the contractor with good Kirbee or Grass, and each Bullock to be allowed daily at least 30 pounds of good dry kirbee or grass or 40 pounds of green, and each Bullock to receive daily (to be supplied by the contractor) when marching 4 pounds of dry gram, and two pounds in camp.

10th. The contracting party or his authorized Agent to attend daily at the Commissariat office to receive orders.

11th. The contractor to be answerable for all losses of Government property conveyed by the said Bullocks.

12th. All casualties of Bullocks by death or otherwise to be replaced forthwith and to be also subject to the approval of such a Committee of officers as already herein particularized, and branded in the same manner as stated in Clause No. 4 of this notification, and the supply of drivers to be kept up as aforesaid during the contract by the contractor.

13th. The Commissariat officer in Scinde will at any time be authorized to submit for the inspection of a committee of officers to be appointed on the part of Government, any Bullocks which he may consider unfit for service, and if condemned, the contractor who is to have an accredited Agent in Scinde is to replace them, should the contractor or his said accredited agent refuse or neglect to do so, or refuse or neglect to replace casualties in the Bullocks or drivers, the Commissariat officers in Scinde or Bombay may do so, and recover the amount paid on that account from the first monthly bills that may become due to the contractor, or the money deposited as security.

14th. The bullocks will be allowed at the discretion of the Commissary General, a respite after any particular heavy duty, should satisfactory reasons be shewn for granting this indulgence.

15th. Every person submitting a tender will be required to lodge with it the sum of Rupees (1000) one thousand in cash, which will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract, should his offer be accepted this sum will be held as in part security for the due performance of the above engagement.

16th. The amount of deposit to be lodged by the contractor to cover any losses Government may sustain by any breach of contract, the damage arising from which the Government is to be allowed at any time to deduct therefrom will be (in addition to the sum of 1,000 Rupees alluded to in the 15th paragraph) Rupees 1000.

17th. Should the contractor disobey any orders of the Commissariat officers or others set over him on the part of the said East India Company, he will be liable to be fined at the pleasure of Government not exceeding Rupees (100) one hundred for each offence, and in case of any infringement of the conditions of the deed of agreement, it will be optional with Government to order him to be fined or to put an end to the contract, the amount deposited by the contractor being in the latter case forfeited to the said East India Company.

18th. The tenders will be opened at the time already specified in presence of the parties concerned or of such as may be in attendance, but none can be recorded that are not accompanied with the requisite deposit.

19th. No reason will be assigned for the rejection of any tender.

20th. The contractor will have to supply the required number of cattle and drivers within 3 months from the date of acceptance of his tender, producing them in batches of not less than 50 in number at each time, at the above

stations for the inspection and approval of a committee of officers.

21st. Vessels for conveying the said Bullocks to Scinde are to be provided by Government, and during the passage the cattle as well as their drivers will be fed at the public expense, but no hire of cattle or drivers shall be allowed up to the date of their landing at Kurachee.

22nd. The contract on its termination shall be renewed for 2 years more should Government deem it advisable to do so. The granting this indulgence will however greatly depend upon the manner in which the contract is performed, whether satisfactory or otherwise.

Notice is hereby given, that by a Treasury Warrant under date 11th September 1845, among other Regulations, certain rates of British Packet Postage have been established upon all Letters, Newspapers and Prices Current, conveyed from Port to Port in the East Indies, China &c. by the new lines of Packet boats recently put in operation under the additional contract made by Her Majesty's Government, with the Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company,

These rates of Packet Postage are as follows.

One Shilling per half ounce for letters, according to the scale of weight now in operation in the united Kingdom.

One Penny for each Newspaper, whether British, Colonial or Foreign, conveyed between any of Her Majesty's Colonies and a Foreign Port, or between any two Foreign Ports.

One Penny for each British or Colonial, printed Price Current, or printed Commercial List conveyed between any of Her Majesty's Colonies.

Two Pence for each printed Price Current or printed Commercial list, whether British, Colonial or Foreign, conveyed between a British Colony and a Foreign Port or between two Foreign Ports.

British or Colonial Newspapers passing by these packets between any of Her Majesty's Colonies will not be liable to any postage for the Sea conveyance.

The prepayment of the British Packet postage on letters, is optional, when conveyed between the Indian Offices of Bombay, Aden, Calcutta, Madras, Penang & Singapore, and the Islands of Ceylon and Hongkong, or between any two of the Indian offices above enumerated; but when dispatched to a Foreign Country or Possession, such as China, Manilla &c, the above postage must be paid in advance at the Despatching Office.

The Postage chargeable on Newspapers and Prices Current and Commercial lists forwarded by these Packet Boats must in all cases be paid in advance.

The public are requested to take notice that by this Warrant, Letters &c. sent from Bombay to Point de Galle for dispatch thence to any Port in India or China, or to any of the settlements to the Eastward by the Peninsular and Oriental Company's Steamers will be liable to the above rate of British packet postage in addition to the postage at present leviable from hence to Galle; and also that when addressed to a Foreign Country or Possession the postage in question, must in all cases be paid in advance at the despatching office

The British Packet postage above referred to, will, till further notice be converted into Indian currency at the rate of two shillings the rupee.

The above arrangement will come into operation in this Presidency on the 1st day of May next.

The 29th August 1846

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 29th of August 1846.

Act No. — of 1846.

An Act to facilitate the execution of the sentences of Courts established by the authority of the Governor General in Council for the administration of Criminal Justice in States or Territories administered by Officers acting under the authority of the East India Company.

1. It is hereby enacted, that within the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company and without the local limits of the jurisdiction of Her Majesty's Courts of Judicature, the several Officers in charge of Jails shall be competent to give effect to any sentence that may be passed by any Court established or that may be established by the authority of the Governor General of India in Council for the administration of Criminal Justice in States or Territories administered by Officers acting under the authority of the East India Company, although such States or Territories are not subject to the Government of any one of the Presidencies of Fort William in Bengal, Fort St. George or Bombay, or are not subject to the operation of the General Regulations.

11. And it is hereby enacted, that a warrant under the Official Seal and Signature of the Officer or Officers exercising Criminal jurisdiction within such States or Territories as aforesaid shall be sufficient authority for holding any prisoner in confinement, or for transmitting any prisoner for transportation beyond Sea, or for inflicting any other punishment prescribed therein.

111. And it is hereby enacted, that if any Officer in charge of a Jail shall entertain any doubt as to the legality of any warrant sent to him for execution

under this Act, or as to the competency of the person or persons whose Official Seal and Signature may be fixed thereto to pass the sentence and issue such warrant, such Officer shall refer the matter to the Government to which he is subject, by whose order on the case such Officer and all other public Officers shall be guided as to the future disposal of the prisoner, and that pending any such reference the prisoner shall be detained in custody in such manner and with such restrictions or mitigations as may be specified in the warrant.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that the provisions of the existing Acts and Regulations, and all other rules in force for the treatment and security of prisoners confined in the said jails, shall apply and be of equal force and effect in the case of prisoners confined therein under this Act as in the case of other prisoners confined therein.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be reconsidered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 29th day of October next.

ACT No. — OF 1846.

An Act to authorize the Governor in Council of Fort St. George, to appoint any Military Officer a Magistrate.

It is hereby enacted, that from and after day of it shall be competent to the Governor in Council of Fort St. George to appoint any Military Officer in the service of the East India Company, a Magistrate or an Assistant Magistrate in one or more Zillahs, and to confer on any Assistant Magistrate, by a special order, any of the powers of a Magistrate, any Law or Regulation to the contrary notwithstanding.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 5th day of December next.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 12th of September 1846:

ACT No. — OF 1846.

An Act to provide for the appointment of Constables and Peace Officers at the Settlements in the Straits.

Whereas by the Letters Patent for the establishing Her Majesty's Court of Judicature at Prince of Wales' Island, Singapore and Malacca, His late Majesty King George the Fourth, amongst other things authorized and empowered the said Court at their General and Quarter Sessions, from time to time to nominate and appoint such persons as the said Court should see fit to be and act as Constables, or to perform the duties performed by Constables

and Subordinate Peace Officers in that part of his United Kingdom called England as nearly as the different religions, customs and manners of the different inhabitants of the said Settlements and places should require or would admit, and His said late Majesty authorized and empowered the said Court to direct that the said Constables and other Subordinate Peace Officers should have and exercise their authority in and over any particular District or Districts, or any particular class or classes, tribe or tribes of the inhabitants of the said Settlements of Prince of Wales' Island, Singapore and Malacca and places, aforesaid as the Court should see fit. And His said late Majesty authorized and empowered the said Court to compel all and every such persons to serve the said Offices to which they shall be appointed in like manner as persons may be compelled to serve the Office of Constable within that part of His United Kingdom called England so far as the religions, customs and manners of such persons would admit, and that before they should enter upon their respective Offices they should respectively take before the said Court the Oath of allegiance, and on Oath will and faithfully to execute the same without favour or partiality, malice or hatred.

And whereas it is expedient that all Constables and Subordinate Peace Officers and other persons appointed to perform the duties of Police should receive pay in remuneration for the performance of their duties.

And whereas by the 13th Section of Act XII. of 1839, it was enacted that out of the Funds collected from the Assessment and Taxes leviable under that Act provision should be made in conformity with such instructions as might from time to time be issued by the Governor of Bengal for the efficient watching, cleansing, lighting and repairing of the Streets and Thoroughfares in the Towns of George Town, Singapore and Malacca, and for the making and repairing of Roads and Bridges, and the effecting of other purposes necessary for the comfort and protection of the inhabitants of the incorporated Settlement therein aforesaid.

And whereas it is expedient that all Constables and Subordinate Peace Officers and other persons appointed to perform duties of Police should be appointed by the authorities from whom they receive their pay and by no other.

It is therefore hereby enacted, that from and after

no Constable or Subordinate Peace Officer or other person appointed to perform duties of Police shall be appointed by the said Court at their General and Quarter Sessions or otherwise; but every Constable and Subordinate Peace Officer and other person appointed to perform duties of Police except the Superintendent of Police shall be appointed by the Governor of Prince of Wales' Island, Singapore and Malacca, and that the Superintendent of Police shall continue to be appointed as heretofore by the Governor of Bengal.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 12th day of November next.

The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to publish for general information, the following extracts from a letter addressed on the 12th ultimo, to the Adjutant General of the Bombay Army, by Lieutenant Colonel Milner of Her Majesty's 94th Regiment, Commanding the troops at Aden, and a Station Order issued by that officer on the 5th ultimo, on the subject of the late advance made upon Aden from the interior, by a hostile force headed by a fanatic named Syud Ismael.

2. In publishing these documents, the Hon'ble the Governor in Council, has much satisfaction in noticing the judicious arrangements made on this occasion for the defence of Aden by Captain S. B. Haines, the Political Agent, and by Lieutenant Colonel H. R. Milner, the Officer Commanding at that Station.

3. The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is also much pleased to observe the steadiness, alacrity and good order evinced on the same occasion by the officers and men of the Military and Naval Services stationed at Aden.

Extract from a letter from Lieutenant Colonel Milner of Her Majesty's 94th Regiment, Commanding the Troops at Aden, to the Adjutant General of the Bombay Army, dated the 12th September 1846.

I have the honor to report for the information of His Excellency the Commander in Chief, in continuation of my letters to your address of the 16th, 26th and 30th ultimo, that no movement on the part of the enemy has taken place since I had last the honor of addressing you on the 30th ultimo.

On the morning of the 7th instant, the reinforcement at the Turkish Wall, as likewise the guards on the heights, were withdrawn, since which time tranquillity has reigned in our neighbourhood, and Aden has resumed its usual state of quietude and monotony.

Upon the receipt of the first communication from the Political Agent dated 2nd ultimo, apprising me of an intended attack upon the place, I issued immediate orders for the works at the Turkish wall and defences on the heights to be inspected, in order that any little defect might be at once remedied. In the performance of this duty I have much pleasure in bringing to the notice of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief the unremitting exertions of the Executive Engineer (Captain Kilner) and the officer commanding the Artillery (Major Hamond,) whose united exertions enable me with confidence to state for His Excellency's information, that in my opinion, Aden never was in a more perfect state to resist an attack of any number of Arabs that might be brought against it.

The Political Agent having at my request placed the gun-boats of the Indian Navy at this station at my disposal, I found them of much service in preventing the Arabs from passing the left field work which at low tide could be easily effected, and for which service I considered it just to convey my thanks to the officers and seamen employed upon this duty, through the senior officer of the Indian Navy.

In concluding this report of the occurrences that have taken place before Aden during the last month, I cannot omit the pleasing duty of bringing to the notice of His Excellency the Commander in Chief the cheerful manner with which all my orders were carried out by my Staff, and every officer under my command. The conduct of the Troops, European and Native, is deserving of the highest praise, it has been most orderly and correct during this long and arduous duty, and notwithstanding they were often times unavoidably exposed to the heat of the sun, they have continued (I am happy to say) to enjoy uninterrupted good health.

I beg to forward a copy of a station order, that I deemed it but justice to the troops composing the force to issue upon the breaking up of this force, and which I trust may meet with His Excellency's approval, as likewise copies of letters (with a return of arms taken on the morning of the 17th) from Captain Taylor 47th Regiment M. N. I. commanding the outpost at the Turkish Wall.

EXTRACT FROM STATION ORDERS,
BY LIEUTENANT COLONEL H. R. MILNER,

Camp Aden, 5th September 1846.

In consequence of a communication received from the Political Agent, the Commandant directs the usual relief of the detachment at the Turkish Wall to take place on Monday the 7th instant.

The reinforcements at the Turkish Wall as likewise the guards now stationed at the Main Pass, Dhurub-El-Hosh, Oroock Point, and No. 3 Post will be withdrawn from that day.

Although the Commandant has not the opportunity on the present occasion in making his report of the occurrences in the front of Aden during the last month, of bringing to the notice of His Excellency the Commander in Chief, any individual act of gallantry, yet he will have the greatest satisfaction in recording his high opinion of the regular and orderly conduct of all under his command, European and Native, during the long period of this very harassing duty.

The Commandant requests the officer Commanding at the Turkish Wall will convey to all at that outpost, officers and men, (European and Native,) his approbation at the alertness evinced by all, at all times, and upon all occasions; he did not fail to observe from his post at Dhurub-El-Hosh, the extreme steadiness of the men upon the morning of the 17th ultimo, when a "futile" attempt at an attack was made at that outpost, not a single shot was heard after the order for cease firing had been sounded, clearly showing that although (as they must have been) in an excited state, they had not forgotten the first duty of soldiers viz. obedience to orders. Had the enemy continued to advance no ammunition would have been carelessly expended and the result must have been decisive.

To the Executive Engineer and Officer Commanding the Artillery the Commandant's best thanks are due for the valuable assistance afforded by them, the former was unremitting in his endeavours to make every weak spot in the defences "impregnable" and the latter to make them equally so by a judicious position of his guns.

To all composing the Aden Field Force, officers and men, Europeans and Natives, the Commandant returns his best thanks for the efficient manner they have carried into effect his orders upon all occasions, during the late threatened attack, and with sincerity assure them that his confidence in them is such, that although a small, but firm and united body of men, he would have no fear for the safety of Aden, even if ten thousand Arabs advanced with the "Syed Ismahell" himself at their head.

The station order dated 3rd ultimo is cancelled, and officers are again permitted to sleep out of Camp, but as it is not unlikely a repetition of the late annoyance may ere long again take place, they are requested to be prepared to return to Camp at the shortest notice.

Officers Commanding native corps will be pleased to have this order read and explained to the men of their respective corps.

Camp Turkish Wall, 17th August 1846.

To,

THE ACTING STAFF OFFICER, ADEN.

SIR,

I have the honor to report for the information of the Officer commanding Aden, that between the hours of 1 and 2 o'clock A. M. a party of the enemy were seen about 200 yards in front of the left Redoubt, 8 or 10 of whom fired into the works before we had time to bring the guns to bear upon them, but the instant we returned the fire they became perfectly silent, and soon after retreated from our sight. The night was too dark to enable me to see the strength of the enemy, but early this morning Lieutenant Mann, reconnoitred the position which the attacking party had occupied, and discovered two men severely wounded, from whom I have heard that their advance party consisted of the one hundred men, and supported by two hundred a little in their rear.

The prisoners were so severely wounded, that I have thought it expedient to send them direct to the Garrison Hospital, a list of the Arms &c. found in the possession of the prisoners is enclosed and sent in charge of the bearer.

A return of the ammunition expended will be forwarded to you as soon as possible.

I have much pleasure in stating that the troops under my command were very alert and steady during the attack.
