The Bullocks will be subject to the approval of a Committee of officers at the above stations to be named on the part of the Bombay Government, and are not to be supplied younger than 5 or older than 8 years of age at the time of being supplied, and this rule of age is to govern all cattle that may be required to replace Bullocks lost by death or otherwise.

4th. All the Bullocks furnished by the contractor to be branded in presence of the Committee passing them, with the letters S. F. of one inch in length on the off-hip.

5th. The contractor is to supply and keep up the supply of drivers in the proportion of one to two Bullocks during the contract, at the same term and place with the Bullocks, and to pay their wages during the contract.

6th. The Bullocks and Drivers to be mustered monthly.

7th. The Drivers to be settled with monthly by the contractor and not to be discharged without the permission of the Commissariat officer.

8th. The hire payable to the contractor for the Bullocks and Drivers to be paid to the contractor on the 20th of each month, subject however to the proviso contained in the 21st Clause.

9th. The Bullocks to be fed on the part of the contractor with good Kirbee or Grass, and each Bullock to be allowed daily at least 30 pounds of good dry kirbee or grass or 40 pounds of green, and each Bullock to receive daily (to be supplied by the contractor) when marching 4 pounds of dry gram, and two pounds in camp.

10th. The contracting party or his authorized Agent to attend daily at the Commissariat office to receive orders.

11th. The contractor to be answerable for all losses of Government property conveyed by the said Bullocks.

12th. All casualties of Bullocks by death or otherwise to be replaced forthwith and to be also subject to the approval of such a Committee of officers as already herein particular-

ized, and branded in the same manner as stated in Clause No. 4 of this notification, and the supply of drivers to be kept up as aforesaid during the contract by the contractor.

13th. The Commissariat officer in Scinde will at any time be authorized to submit for the inspection of a committee of officers to be appointed on the part of Government, any Bullocks which he may consider unfit for service, and if condemned, the contractor who is to have an accredited Agent in Scinde is to replace them, should the contractor or his said accredited agent refuse or neglect to do so, or refuse or neglect to replace casualties in the Bullocks or drivers, the Commissariat officers in Scinde or Bombay may do so, and recover the amount paid on that account from the first monthly bills that may become due to the contractor, or the money deposited as security.

14th. The bullocks will be allowed at the discretion of the Commissary General, a respite after any particular heavy duty, should satisfactory reasons be shewn for granting this indulgence.

15th. Every person submitting a tender will be required to lodge with it the sum of Rupees (1000) one thousand in cash, which will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract, should his offer be accepted this sum will be held as in part security for the due performance of the above engagement.

16th. The amount of deposit to be lodged by the contractor to cover any losses Government may sustain by any breach of contract, the damage arising from which the Government is to be allowed at any time to deduct therefrom will be (in addition to the sum of 1,000 Rupees alluded to in the 15th paragraph) Rupees 1000.

17th. BOMBAY CASTLE, 13th OCTOBER 1846.

No. 651 of 1846.—The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to publish the following extract of a dispatch from the Hon'ble Court, and to declare its provisions applicable to Her Majesty's 60th Rifles from the date that regiment was admitted on the establishment of this Presidency.

Extract of a Military letter from the Hon'ble the Court of Directors to the Governor of Bengal No. 47 dated 1st July 1846.

LETTER DATED 31st JULY 1846.—No. 10.
Forward for consideration and orders papers relative to an application from the Officer Commanding Her Majesty's 1st Battalion 60th Rifle Regiment, for the annual allowance of Fifteen Shillings for each effective Rifle, in lieu of the usual contingent allowance grantable under the provisions of the Royal Warrant dated 20th March 1837.

* Viz: between contingent allowance of £36-10 per annum, and 16s for each effective Rifle.

Para. 25.—We approve of the suggestion of the Government of Bombay, that Captains of Companies of Her Majesty's Rifle Regiments should receive on account of the contingent allowance sanctioned by Royal Warrant, the same additional allowance when serving in India, as is authorized in other parts of the world. The amount of this difference* is accordingly to be paid to them in addition to their present allowances when public establishments are not provided for the repair of the arms.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 26th of September 1846.

ACT No. — of 1846.

An Act to declare and enact the competency of the Courts of Nizamut Adawlut and the Courts of Session to punish offences by fine.

Whereas doubts have arisen whether by the existing Law the Courts of Nizamut Adawlut and the Courts of Session within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, have power generally to punish by fine offences for which the Law has not provided any specific punishment:

It is hereby declared and enacted, that it is competent to the said Courts to punish by fine, at the discretion of the Court, any offenders convicted before them of offences, for which the Law has not provided specific punishment, and in default of payment of the fine to sentence the offender to imprisonment with or without labor.

Provided always that the imprisonment to which such offender shall have been so sentenced, shall not exceed seven years in the case of sentences passed by the Courts of Session, or fourteen years in the case of sentences passed by the Nizamut Adawlut.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 26th day of November next.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 26th of September 1846.

ACT No. — of 1846.

An Act for regulating the proceedings in certain cases of distraint for arrears of rent.

It is hereby enacted, in modification of Section 9, Regulation VII. of 1799, Section 9, Regulation V. of 1800, and Clause 2, Section 17, Regulation XXVIII. of 1803, all of the Bengal Code, that if any person not being such a defaulter as is therein mentioned or responsible for him, shall claim as his right property which has been distrained for arrears of rent due from the said defaulter, and shall within 5 days, reckoning from the day after attachment, enter into a bond before the Collector of the Zillah or the Commissioner appointed under Act I. of 1839, with good security binding himself to institute before the Collector within 15 days from the date of such bond, a summary suit against the distrainer and defaulter for the trial of the right, and to restore the property or make good its value in case the claim be disallowed with all costs of suit and damages, the distrainer shall immediately withdraw the attachment.

Provided always and it is hereby enacted, that if the claimant shall not within the said 15 days institute such summary suit, it shall be lawful for the distrainer to recover the value of the property distrained, together with the expences of the attachment, by attachment and sale of the personal property of the claimant, or his surety, or both, unless the claimant shall restore the property, or, if the distrainer prefer it, make good its value.

And it is hereby enacted, that no suit to set aside the summary award of the Collector under this Act, shall be brought after the expiration of one year from the date of such award.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 26th day of November next.
