POST OFFICE NOTICES.

The following extract from the new Post Office ordinance recently passed at the Mauritius, is published for general information.

ART. 22.—The following premiums shall be given to the Masters or Commanders of Vessels bringing Mails or Overland Newspapers to Mauri-

tius under the annexed condition :-

£30 for any vessels touching expressly for the purpose of landing the Overland Post office Mail, upon proof of the vessel having sailed from the Port at which such Mail was taken on board within five days after the arrival thereat of the said mail.

£30 for any vessel bringing the same, upon proof of the vessel having sailed within 48 hours of the arrival of the Muil as above described.

£20 for any vessel upon proof of the vessel baving sailed within five days of the said arrival.

And £10 for any vessel not conveying the last Overland Mail, but bringing an Overland newspaper of the latest date, not already received in the Colony, and which shall be delivered within 80 days after publication, and be made public in the exchange room immediately after the arrival of the said vessel.

In consequence of several complaints recently made, the Post Master General requests the attention of the public to the following extract from Clause VI. of the Post Office Rules, 30th August 1837.

"Newspapers, printed papers or parcels, will, into be received bearing postage, unless the sender shall give his name and address, in order that the regulated postage may be recovered from him in case of such paper or " parcel being refused by the party addressed."

Parties coming to the General Post Office to enquire for letters awaiting their arrival, are requested to make application to the "Dead and Unclaimed letter department" in the South wing of the building.

The following Notification by H. M. Post Master General of London, is republished for general information:

BY COMMAND OF THE POST MASTER GENERAL. NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.

GENERAL POST OFFICE, MAY 1847.

The Post Master General having been informed by the Court of Directors of the East India Company, that on and after the first June next, persons in this country may forward private correspondence by the Government Express from Bombay to Calcutta, and Madras; all persons desirous of availing themselves of this privilege will be required to mark upon the covers of their letters the words "by Express from Bombay," and in addition to this special address it will not be necessary that all letters intended to be forwarded by the way of Southampton should be so endorsed as hitherto.

The postage to be charged in India on the delivery of letters sent by this Express, will be, in addition to the ordinary inland rates,

One ropee for every letter not exceeding half a tola in weight.

Two rupees for every letter above half a tola, but not exceeding one tola in weight.

Four rupees for every letter above one tola, but not exceeding two tolas in weight, two tolas being the maximum weight of letters to be conveyed by Express.

On Newspapers .- Each newspaper office in Calcutta and Madras will be allowed to receive two newspapers at the ordinary rates of Inland postage; on all other newspapers forwarded by Express, a postage of five rapees each will be charged, and no newspaper will be received for the Express exceeding three tolas in weight.

N. B.—One tola and a quarter is nearly equivalent to half an ounce avoirdupois.

" Now we, the undersigned, in exercise of all powers and authorities enabling us in this behalf, do hereby order and direct, that any such privileged person as is named in the said Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, and also every seaman employed abroad in the service of the East India Company, whilst actually employed in the service of such Company, may both send and receive letters, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, by private ships, between any two of Her Majesty's Colonies, whether through the United Kingdom or not, on their own private concerns, in like manner as the privileged persons* mentioned in the said Act,

 Soldiers and Sailors in the service of Her Majesty or of the East India Company. passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present

Majesty, are authorized to send and receive letters, not exceeding half an onnce in weight, on their own private concerns, between the United Kingdom and places beyond the Seas. Provided, that whenever the letters sent or received by any such persons privileged under this warrant shall be conveyed, or intended to be conveyed, by private ships, the gratuities payable by law to the Masters of such vessels, in respect of such letters, shall in all cases be paid to the Post Office in addition to such postage.

RULES passed by the Hon'ble the Governor in Council under date the 28th March 1848.

WHEREAS by Sec: LI of Act I, of 1838, the Governor in Council of Bombay is empowered to establish rules for the anchoring of Coasting and Country Craft in the several Ports of this Presidency; and whereas it is desirable that certain stations should be appointed for the anchoring of coasting and country Craft at the port of Bombay, the Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to pass the following rules to have effect from the 1st day of June next.

> 1st. Distinct and separate stations shall from time to time be fixed by the Collector of Customs in communication with the Superintendent of the Indian Navy, and with the sanction of the Honorable the Governor in Council, for anchorage of vessels discharging and those receiving cargo, as also, whenever such an arrangement is considered expedient, for the anchorage of vessels from particular Ports, or having particular cargoes.

> 2nd. All country and coasting Craft on arriving in Bombay Harbour shall take up such berths on their proper anchorage stations, fixed as above provided, as may be pointed out to them by the Custom House authorities.

The following Act is brought up before the Legislative Council this day, the Governor General of India in Council being desirous that no time should be lost in passing the Act.

Resolved -- That the Rules requiring that all Acts of the Governor General of India in Council shall be brought up for second reading in two months, or in three months from the date of the first reading, be sus-pended in respect to the following proposed Act, and that it be at once passed into Law.

ACT No. VII. of 1848.

An Act to except certain free Ports from the operation of Section III., Act No. VI. of 1848, and otherwise to amend that Act.

to amend that Act.

I. In modification of Section III., Act No. VI. of 1848, it is hereby enacted, that the provisions of the said Section shall not apply to Goods exported from any part of the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company, to any of the ports in the Straits of Malacca, or to any of the ports in the Tenasserim Provinces, or to any of the ports in the province of Arrecan, nor to Goods imported from any of those ports into any port of the said Territories.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that no drawback shall be allowed on the re-export of Goods from any port in the Territories, subject to the Government of the East India Company, to any other port in the said Territories, to which the operation of Section III., Act No. VI. of

It is hereby enacted, in modification of the provisions of Sections 9, 10, 11 and 13 of Regulation V. 1812, of the Bengal Code, that if any ryot or tenant of land, upon whom such notice or demand as is specified in the said Sections is to be served, shall have no place of usual residence in the zillah where the land to which such notice or demand has reference is situate, the mode of serving such notice or demand with a jumma wassil baukee shall be by affixing it at the Maal Cutcherry of such land, or other conspicuous place thereon, or at the village Chouree, Choupal, or other conspicuous place in the village. place in the village.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 25th of March 1848.

ACT No -- OF 1848.

An Act to repedl Section IV. of Regulation XI. 1827, of the Bombay Code, and to provide for the trial of Native Subjects of the Bombay Government for offences committed out of the Zillahs of the Bombay Presidency.

Presidency.

I. It is hereby enacted, that from and after the day of Section IV. of Regulation XI. of 1827, of the Bombay Code, is repealed.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that from and after the said day Native Subjects of the Bombay Government when found within the Zillahs subordinate to Bombay or found within some Territory not subordinate to Bombay, and brought into any of the said Zillahs by the permission of the Government of the Territory within which they are so found, shall be amenable to the law for crimes and offences committed by them in places out of the Territories subordinate to the Presidency of Bombay.

111. Provided always and it is hereby enacted, that the Magistrate shall, previously to putting the prisoner upon his trial, make a report of the case to the Governor in Council of Bombay, who may order the trial to take place before some one of the established Courts of Criminal Judicature within any of the said Zillahs competent to try offences of the nature of that charged to have been committed, or before any Court so competent, established by the authority of the Government of Bombay, beyond the said Zillahs.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for

general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 25th day of June next.

Notice is hereby given, that in pursuance of instructions received from the Hon'ble the Court of Directors, Supplies on account of the Home Treasury will continue to be raised during the ensuing official year 1848-49, on the Security of Goods to be hypothecated to the East India Company, and that so far as is at present known, the sum required to be provided in India by the purchase of Bills will be £700,000, liable, however, to such modification or extension as may hereafter be demanded by the exigencies of the Public Service.

Advances of Cash will accordingly be made for this purpose by the Governments of Bengal, Madras, and Bombay, to the extent of 3-4ths of the value of the Goods hypothecated, and the rate of Exchange at which Bills are to be drawn will be 1s. 10d. per Company's Rupee, until further notice. In all other respects the existing terms and conditions of the Advances to be made by the respective Governments will remain in force, and be the same as published in the Calcutta Gazette under date the 1st April 1842.
