> FORT WILLIAM. HOME DEPARTMENT. SEPARATE REVENUE. The 31st December 1817.

RESOLUTION.—The Governor General in Council is pleased to resolve, that Cotton Wool be henceforth exempted from any demand on account of export duty throughout India.

The Governor General in Council is further pleased to resolve that Cotton Wool the produce of any part of the continent of India, be henceforth exempted from any demand on account of Import duty at the Port of Madras, in like manner as this article is now exempt from Import duty at the Port of Bombay, under Section II. of Act II. of 1846.

With the view to prevent disappointment, parties who are in the practice of calling at the Post Office, or of sending for their Overland letters, are reminded that section XXIV of the Post Office rules of 30th August 1837 will be strictly enforced in future; and that no bearing letters will be delivered, except on payment of the Postage.

BY COMMAND OF THE POST MASTER GENERAL, NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.
GENERAL POST OPPICE, MAY 1847.

The Post Master General having been informed by the Court of Drectors of the East India Company, that on and after the first June next, persons in this country may forward private correspondence by the Government Express from Bombay to Calcutta, and Madras; all persons desirous of availing themselves of this privilege will be required to mark upon the covers of their letters the words "by Express from Bombay" and in addition to this special address it will not be necessary that all letters intended to be forwarded by the way of Southampton should be so endorsed as hitherto.

The postage to be charged in India on the delivery of letters sent by this Express, will be, in addition to the ordinary inland rates.

One ropee for every letter not exceeding half

a tola in weight.

Two rupees for every letter above half a tola, but not exceeding one tola in weight. Four rupees for every letter above one tola, but not exceeding two tolas in weight, two

tolas being the maximum weight of letters

to be conveyed by Express.

On Newspapers.—Each newspaper office in Calcutta and Madras will be allowed to receive two newspapers at the ordinary rates of Inland postage, on all other newspapers forwarded by Express, a postage of five rapees each will be charged, and no newspaper will be received for the Express exceeding three tolus in weight.

N. B. - One tola and a quarter is nearly equivalent to half an ounce avoirdupois.

No. 20 of 1848.—The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to republish the following general order by the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India, and to declare its provisions applicable to this Presidency from this date.

#### GENERAL ORDERS BY THE RIGHT HON'BLE THE GOVERNOR GENERAL OF INDIA.

Simla 8th October 1847.

The Right Hon'ble the Governor General having taken into consideration the rules under which officers of mounted corps are at present permitted to select chargers, and the difficulty represented to have been experienced by them in obtaining chargers by private purchase in the market, is pleased to rescind the Regulations published in Government general orders No. 124 of the 26th June 1837, and No. 37 of the 22d January 1847, and to substitute for them the following revised rules which are to have effect from this date.

In modifying the regulations on this subject, the Governor General is desirous of affording the officers of horse artillery and cavalry every facility consistent with the interests of Government, of mounting themselves efficiently from the remounts allotted to corps, under conditions which will be hereafter specified, but with reference to the additional expense now entailed on the State by retaining the horses at the Remount Depot at Kurnaul until they are five years old, whereby their value is considered to be proportionally enhanced, the price to be paid for all Stud-bred Arab or Colonial Remounts is in future to be seven hundred (700) Rupees.

The Governor General having also taken into consideration the necessity for officers attached to light field batteries being mounted on parade, is pleased to extend to them the privilege of selecting chargers from horses, the property of the State. Their selection however, is limited to the remounts which join their batteries and the price to be paid for each, is the maximum price allowed by Government for their purchase, viz : four hundred (400)

Rupees.

I. In the first instance every officer attached and doing duty with a troop of horse artillery or regiment of cavalry will be permitted to select from the remounts of the regiment two horses as chargers, and the medical officers, veterinary surgeons, and riding masters of such corps when permanently attached, one horse of the same description, on the terms hereinafter specified. Selected chargers now in the possession of officers are to come under these regulations.

2. In the same manner every European commissioned officer attached to horse field batteries, will be allowed

to select chargers from the remounts which join their batteries.

3. Horses sent as remounts from the Depôt to complete corps shall be continued to be considered as such for three months from the date of their joining.

4. When two or more officers are to select at the same time, the senior is to have the first choice, but must not be permitted to choose a second horse till his junior or juniors have chosen one.

5. Horses selected as chargers are always to be branded with the mark of the regiment, and entered on the

description roll of the corps when they are delivered over to the selecting officer.

6. No officer is to be allowed to replace his charger from horses the property of the State, unless the animal was duly entered in the "Register of officer's chargers," and only then in the event of such charger having died, been killed in action, captured, stolen, lost, shot, at the recommendation of a station or detachment committee, or have been reported by such a committee unfit for further service from age, vice, disease or permanent unsoundness. In cases where the charger has been reported unfit for further service, without being infectiously diseased, his owner may dispose of him at his discretion.

7. Officers returning from furlough or rejoining from staff employ, are permitted to select chargers as allowed in articles 1 and 2, without reference to their having enjoyed that indulgence before they proceeded to Europe

or were detached on staff employ.

8. Selected chargers may be exchanged between officers of the same corps with the sanction of the commanding officers, or when their full price has been recovered by the Pay Master, may be sold to any officer of the same corps entitled to a choice, the purchaser in that case to stand in the place of such choice, and the seller to be allowed to select another charger.

9. An officer who finds on trial that he has made an unsuitable selection may return the horse to the ranks and select another from the regimental remount, provided his desire to do so be made known to the commanding officer of the corps within three months from the date of selection, and provided the horse to be returned be reported by a regimental committee as sound and fit for the service as when selected.

10. At any time after the lapse of six months, and within twelve, from the date of selection, a charger may with

he permission of the commanding officer of the corps, be returned for the purpose of being placed in the ranks, if seported by a regimental committee to be perfectly fit for the service, but in such case, the officer returning the horse will not be permitted to choose another in his room, and will merely be entitled to receive back from the Pay master the full price or such portion of the price as may have been deducted from his pay and allowances.

In all cases where an officer wishes to select a charger, or to sell, exchange, or place in the ranks a selected, charger, he is to make a written application to the commanding officer of his corps, who when necessary will assemble ble a regimental committee composed of a president, not under the rank of captain, and two subalterns as memhers, the report of proceedings of which are not to be considered complete without his, the commanding officer's

countersignature.

12. When officers are removed from one Brigade of Horse Artillery, regiment of cavalry or Horse Field Battery to another, they may take their selected chargers with them, and the horses so transferred are to be erased

from the register of the one corps, and entered in that of the other.

13. The selected chargers of officers who may retire from the service, proceed on furlough to Europe, he nominated to the general staff, or any other detached permanent employ, or be transferred from the horse to the foot Artillery, or from a Horse Field Battery to the Horse Artillery, are not to be sold or taken out of the regiment, troop, or battery, to which their owners belonged, unless purchasers cannot be found in the corps, and the horses be pronounced by a regimental committee unfit for admission to the ranks, in which cases they may be disposed of at the discretion of their owners.

14. The terms on which chargers, the property of the several classes of officers specified in the foregoing para. are in the first instance to be offered for sale to such officers of the corps as are entitled to select chargers, and in

default of purchasers to be tendered for admission to the ranks, are as follows.

If six years old, full price, and il above six, but not exceeding twelve years, a deduction is to be made at the rate of ten per cent per annum for the period clapsed since the horse attained the age of six years,

Horses whose age exceeds twelve years, are not to be admitted into the ranks, but may be disposed of at the discretion of the owners or their representatives.

15. In the annual return furnished on the 1st of October by officers commanding mounted corps, showing the probable number of horses that will be required to complete each corps, a column will be added in which is to

be inserted the number of chargers required by officers.

16. The price of chargers selected by officers to be realized from their pay and allowances by deputy pay masters in four equal monthly deductions from field officers, captuins and surgeons, and in eight similar deductions from subalterns, assistant surgeons, veterinary surgeons and riding masters; when an officer has occasion to select two horses, double time will be allowed for payment, and in all cases the deductions are to commence with the first issue of pay after the date of selection.

17. Should an officer die before the full price of his selected charger has been recovered, the horse if reported by

a committee fit in all respects for the service is to be received into the ranks, and the amount deducted will be refunded by the deputy pay master to the legal representative of the deceased, but if reported unfit for the service, the horse is to be sold under the orders of the commanding officer of the regiment, who from the proceeds of the sale, will remit to the deputy pay muster the sum remaining due to Government, and pay the balance if any to the

person entitled to receive it.

person entitled to receive it.

18. When an officer has selected and been put in possession of a charger he will immediately transmit, in duplicate, a descriptive toll of, and receipt for the horse selected, to the officer commanding the corps, who having countersiened them and caused a transcript of them to be entered in the "Register of officer's chargers" will transmit one copy to the Deputy Pay master within whose circle the corps may be, and the other to the Military Auditor

General.

19. The commanding officer of the corps will then direct the officer in whose abstract the pay and allowances of the individual who selected the charger are drawn, to insert at the foot of each abstract until the necessary de-

ductions shall be completed, a notification to the following effect.

## FORT WILLIAM. HOME DEPARTMENT. LEGISLATIVE.

The 18th December 1847.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 18th of December 1847.

ACT No. - OF 1817.

An Act for preventing the dangers arising from Gun-powder and Fireworks within the limits of the Presi-dency Towns of Calcutta, Madras and Bombay.

I. It is hereby enacted, that the Rule, Ordinance and Regulation passed by the Governor General in Council on the 8th April 1802, and Section II. Act XVIII, of 1811, he repealed.

II. And it's hereby enacted, that if any person (unless licenced as hereinafter provided) shall within the limits of the Presidency Town of Calcutta, Madras or Bombay, manufacture Gunpowder, or have in his possession in any house, shop, warehouse or other building,

at any one time, a greater quantity of Gunpowder for sale or otherwise than ten pounds, he shall, on convic-tion, before a Magistrate of Police, be liable to a for-feiture of all such Gunpowder so manufactured or possessed, together with the vessel or receptacle in which it may be seized, and also to a fine not exceeding in amount the sum of Rupees Five Hundred.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be law-ful for the Chief or Senior Magistrate of Police to grant to any person (whom he shall deem fit and proper) a licence for the manufacture of Gunpowder, or for the sale or keeping in deposit within the limits of the Presidency Town of Calcutta, Madras or Bombay, any quantity of imported or Iudian manufactured Gunany quantity of imported or ludian manufactured Gunpowder not exceeding fifty pounds on such conditions
and subject to such regulations as shall be specified
in the licence and shall be approved of by the local
Government: and any person who shall be guilty of a
breach of any of such conditions and regulations shall,

to a forfeiture of his licence and of all Gunpowder so
manufactured, together with all implements used in

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that no person or persons whatever being a dealer or dealers, or manufacturer or manufacturers of Gunpowder, shall keep at any one time at his or their house, shop, place of manufacture, warehouse or other building, more of the mixed materials required for making Gunpowder than may be sufficient for the manufacture of fifty pounds weight of Gunpowder, and any person or persons who shall be guilty of a breach of this rule shall, on conviction, before a Magistrate of Police, be liable to a forfeiture of his or their licence and of all such to a forfeiture of his or their licence and of all such mixed materials, together with the vessels or recepta-cles in which they may be seized, and also to a fine not exceeding Rupees Two Hundred.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that every such li-cence as is mentioned in Section III. shall be in force for a period of one year only and no longer, but shall be renewable by the said Chief or Senior Magistrate at his discretion on the same or any other terms and at his discretion on the same or any other terms and conditions, to be subject in like manner to the approval of the local Government, and such licence shall also provide for the transit and carrying of Gunpowder from one place to another within the limits of the said Presidency Town of Calcutta, Madras or Bombay, in such manner and in such quantity as shall be deemed advis-able for the safety of the inhabitants and of property within the said Presidency Towns, and every person offending against such provisions shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Rupees Fifty, and every person obtaining such licence as aforesaid, shall pay a fee of Rupees Two for the same to the said Chief or Senior Magistrate to be applied as the fines under this Act.

VI. And it is hereby enacted, that any Magistrate of Police on credible information laid before him on oath or solemn affirmation that Gunpowder or mixed materials for making the same contrary to the provisions of this Act, are suspected to be stored, kept or possessed by any person or persons, may issue his warrant for searching in the day-time any house, shop, magazine or other building or place in which he has reasonable ground to suspect any Gunpowder to be manufactured, sold or kept, or any boat, carriage, cart or other vehicle in which any Gunpowder or materials for manufacturing the same may be suspected to be carried, or any person or persons suspected of carrying the same contrary to such licence or to the provisions of this Act, and all Gunpowder, or materials for manufacturing the same found on such search shall, together with the vessels or resceptacles in which they may be stored, be immediately seized by such searcher or searchers and brought before a Magistrate of Police with whom the same shall be kept till it shall be adjudged whether the same shall be forfeited.

VII. Provided, that the preceding Sections of this Act shall not extend to any Government magazine, or store or building for the making or deposit of Gunpowder under the authority or for the use of the Government or to any Gunpowder for the use of Her Majesty's Vessels of War, or the Vessels of the Indian Navy or of the East India Company's Marine, or to any other Vessel within the River Hooghly, or the Port Road or Harbour of Madras or Bombay laden with Gunpowder for importation or exportation.

Provided also and it is hereby enacted, that the Governor of Bengal shall be at liberty to auapplications aforesaid, except where the exportation of that the Governor of Bengal shall be at liberty to au-thorize such arrangement to be made by letting or otherwise contracting for the custody of the Magazine, and for the collection and appropriation of the fee which may be charged for Gunpowder stored therein as he may think proper, subject, however, to all the restrictions and rules imposed by this Section of this Act in respect to the removal from the Magazine of Gunpowder therein stored.

IX. And it is hereby enacted, that for every done or omitted to be done contrary to the provisions in the last preceding Section of this Act by the Commander of any Merchant Vessel in the Port of Calcutta the Commander aforesaid shall forfeit the sum of Two Hundred Rupees, and the Collector of Sea Cus-Two Hundred Rupees, and the Collector of Sea Customs is hereby empowered to enforce the said penalty: Provided also and it is hereby enacted, that the Collector shall not grant a Port Clearance for any Vessel in which such penalty shall have been incurred until it shall have been paid. XII. And it is hereby enacted, that all fines, for-feitures and penalties incurred under this Act may be recovered in the form and mode prescribed by Act No. II. of 1839, and shall be paid into the General Treasa-ry for the benefit of the Manierpal Funds.

XIII. And it is hereby enacted and declared, that the words Presidency Town of Calcutta, Madras or Bombay, as used in this Act, shall for the purposes of it be held and deemed to include all places within the local limits of the jurisdiction of Her Majesty's Supreme Court of Julicature at the said Presidency Towns.

The following Act passed by the Governor General of India in Council on the 18th of December 1847, is hereby promulgated for general information.

#### ACT No. XX. OF 1847.

An Act for the encouragement of learning in the Terri-tories subject to the Government of the Esst India Company, by defining and providing for the enforce-ment of the right called Copyright therein.

Whereas doubts may exist whether the right called Copyright can be enforced by the Common Law of England in those parts of Territories subject to the Go-vernment of the East India Company into which the Common Law of England has been introduced:

And whereas doubts may exist whether the said right can be enforced by virtue of the principles of equity and good conscience in the other parts of the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company. And whereas for the encouragement of learning it is desirable that the existence of the said right should be placed beyond doubt, and that the said right should be

made capable of easy enforcement in every part of the said Territories

and Ferritories:

And whereas it is doubtful whether the Act of Parliament 5 and 6, Victoria, C 45, entitled "an Act to amend the Law of Copyright," although such Act extend to every part of the British Dominions, has made appropriate and sufficient provision for the enforcement in every part of the said Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company of the said right by proprietors thereof: and whether the said Act of Parliament has made provision for the artigreguest of Parliament has made provision for the enforcement of

Parliament has made provision for the enforcement of the said right by or against any persons not being subject to the jurisdiction of the Courts established by Her Majesty's Charter.

1. It is therefore hereby enacted, that the Copyright in every book published in the life-time of its author within the said Territories after the passing of the Act of Parliament 3 and 4, Wm. 4, C. 85 entitled "an Act for effecting an arrangement with the East India Company and for the better government of His Majesty's Indian Territories till the 30th day of April 1851," shall

endure for the natural life of such author, and for the further term of seven years commencing at the time of his death and shall be the property of such author and his assigns: Provided always, that if the said term of seven years shall expire before the end of forty-two years from the publication of such book, the Copyright shall in that case endure for such period of forty-two years; and that the Copyright in every book published after the death of its author and after the passing of the Act of Parliament last aforesaid shall endure for the term of forty-two years from the first publication thereof and shall be the property of the proprietor of the author's manuscript, from which such book shall be first published, and his assigns.

II. And whereas it is expedient endure for the natural life of such author, and for the

And whereas it is expedient to provide against the suppression of books of importance to the public: It is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor General in Council on complaint made to them that the proprietor of the Copyright in any book published after the passing of this Act within the said Territories has after the death of its author refused to republish or to allow the republication of the same, and that by reason of such refusal such book may be withheld from the public, to grant a licence to such complainant to publish public, to grant a licence to such complainant to publish such book in such manner and subject to such conditions as they may think fit, and it shall be lawful for such complainant to publish such book according to such licence.

And it is hereby enacted, that a Book of Registry wherein may be registered as hereinafter enacted the proprietorship in the Copyright of books and assignments thereof, and licences affecting such Copyright, shall be kept in the office of the Secretary to the Government of India for the Home Department, and shall at all convenient times be opened to the inspection of any person on payment of Eight Annas for every entry which shall be searched for or inspected in the said book, and that such Officer shall whenever thereunto reasonably required, give a copy of any entry in such book certified ander his hand, to any person requiring the same, on payment to him of the sum of Two Rupees, and such copies so certified shall be received in evidence in all Courts and in all summary proceedings, and shall be prima facie proof of the proprietorship or assignment of Copyright or licence as therein expressed, but subject to be rebutted by other evidence. IV. And it is enacted, that if any person shall wilfully make or cause to be made any false entry in the Registry Book aforesaid, or shall wilfully produce, or cause to be tendered in evidence any paper falsely purporting to be a copy of any entry in the said Book, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanour and shall be punished with imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding three years. shall at all convenient times be opened to the inspection

And it is enacted, that after the passing of this Act, it shall be lawful for the proprietor of Copyright in any book published, after the passing of the said Act of Parllament 3 and 4, Wm. 4, C. 85, to make entry in the Registry Book of the title of such book, the time of the first publication, and the name and place of abode of the publisher thereof, and the name and place of abode of the proprietor of the Copyright of the said book, or of any portion of such Copyright in the form in that behalf given in the Schedule to this Act annexed upon payment of the sum of Two Rupees to the said secretary, and that it shall be lawful for every such registered proprietor to assign his interest or any portion of his interest therein, by making entry in the said Book of Registry of such assignment, and of the name and place of abode of the Assignment, and of the name and place of abode of the Assignment thereof in the form given in that behalf in the said Schedule on payment of the And it is enacted, that after the passing of this en in that behalf in the said Schedule on payment of the en in that benait in the said Schedule on payment of the like sum; and such assignment so entered shall be ef-fectual in Law to all intents and purposes whatsoever without being subject to any stamp or duty, and shall be of the same force and effect as if such assignment

And it is enacted, that if any person shall deem himself aggrieved by any entry made under colour of this Act in the said Book of Registry, it shall be lawful this Act in the said Book of Registry, it shall be lawful for such person to apply by motion to the Supreme Court of Calcutta. or if the Gourt shall not be then sitting to any Judge of such Court sitting in Chambers for an order that such entry may be expunged or varied, and that upon any such application to the said Court, or to a Judge as aforesaid, such Court of Juge shall make such order for expunging, varying or confirming such entry either with or without costs, as to such Court or Judge shall seem just, and the said Secretary shall on the production to him of any such order for expunging or varying any such entry, expunge or vary the same according to the requisitions of such order.

And it is enacted, that if any person shall after the passing of this Act print or cause to be printed either er for sale or exportation, any book in which there shall be subsisting Copyright without the consent in writing of the proprietor thereof, or shall have in his possession for sale or hire any such book so unlawfully printed without such consent as aforesaid, such offender if he shall have so offended within the local limits of the jushall have so offended within the local limits of the jurisdiction of any of the Courts of Judicature established by Her Majesty's Charter, shall be liable to a special action on the case in such Court, and if he shall have so offended in any other part of the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company to a suit in the Zillah Court within the invisidiation of this base. the Government of the East India Company to a suit in the Zillah Court within the jurisdiction of which he shall have so offended, which shall and may be prosecuted in the same manner in which any other action of damages may be brought and prosecuted there, and if he shall have so offended in any such last-mentioned part of the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company in which there is no Zillah Court, to a suit in the highest local Court exercising original Civil jurisdiction in such part of the said Territories.

And it is hereby enacted, that when any publisher or other person shall within the said Territories before or at the time of the passing of this Act, but after the passing of the said Act of Parliament 3 and 4, Wim. 4, C. 86, have projected, conducted and carried on, or shall hereafter project, conduct or carry on, or be the proprietor of any Encyclopædia, Review, Magazine, Periodical work, or work published in a series of Books or Parts. or any book, whatsoever, and shall have employed or shall employ any persons to compose the same, or any Volumes, Parts, Essays, Articles or Portions, thereof for publication in, or as part of the same, and such Work, Volumes, Parts, Essays, Articles or Portions shall have been, or shall hereafter be composed under such employment on the terms that the Copyright therein shall belong to such Proprietor, Projector, Publisher or Conductor, and paid for by such Proprietor, Projector, Publisher or Conductor, the Copyright in every such Encyclopedia, Review, Magazine, Periodical work, and work published in a series of

Books or Parts, and in every Volume, Part, Essay, Article and Portion so composed and paid for shall be the property of such Proprietor, Projector, Publisher or Conductor who shall enjoy the same rights as if he were the actual author thereof and shall have such term of Copyright therein as is given to the authors of Books by this Act, except only that in the case of Essays, Articles or Portions forming part of and first published in Reviews, Magazines or other Periodical works of a like nature after the term of twenty-eight years from the first publication thereof respectively the right of publishing the same in a separate form shall revert to the author for the remainder of the term given by this Act. Provided always, that during the term of twenty-eight years the said Proprietor, Projector, Publisher or Conductor shall not publish any such Essay, Article or Portion separately or singly without the consent previously obtained of the author thereof or his assigns: Provided also, that nothing herein contained shall alter or affect the right of any person who shall have been or shall be so employed as aforesaid to publish any such his composition in a separate form who by any contract, express or emplied, may have reserved or may hereafter reserve to himself such right, but every author reserving, retaining or having such right shall be entitled to the Copyright in such composition when published in a separate form according to this Act without prejudice to the right of such Proprietor, Projector, Publisher or Conductor as aforesaid.

And it is hereby enacted, that the Proprietor of the Copyright in any Encyclopædia, Review; Magazine, Periodical work, or other work published in a series of Books or Parts shall be entitled to all the benefits of the Registration in the Office of the Secretary to the Government of India for the Home Department, under this Act, on entering in the said Book of Registry the title of such Encyclopædia, Review, Periodical work, or other work published in a series of Books or Parts, the time of the first publication of the first Volume, Number or Part thereof, or of the first Volume, Number or Parts published after the passing of this Act in any such work which shall have been published heretofore, and after the passing of the said Act of Parliament 3 and 4, William 4, C. 85, and the name and place of abode of the Proprietor thereof and of the Publisher thereof when such Publisher shall not also be the Proprietor thereof.

Land it is enacted, that all copies of any Book wherein there shall be Copyright, and of which entry shall have been made in the said Registry Book and which shall have been unlawfully printed without the consent of the Registered Proprietor of such Copyright in writing under his hand first obtained, shall be deemed to be the property of the Proprietor of such Copyright and who shall be registered as such, and such Registered Proprietor shall, after demand thereof in writing, be entitled to sue for and recover the same or damages for

the detention thereof.

XIII. And it is enacted, that if the case be within the jurisdiction of any of the Courts of Judicature established by Her Majesty's Charter, such Registered Proprietor shall be entitled to sue for and recover such copies or damages for the detention thereof in an action of Detinue, from any party who shall detain the same, or to sue for and recover damages for the conversion thereof in an action of Trover, and that if the case be within the jurisdiction of any Zillah Court or other local Court as aforesaid, the Registered Proprietor shall be entitled to sue for and recover such copies or damages for the detention or conversion thereof, in such form as is in use in the said Zillah or other local Courts for the recovery of specific personal property or damages for the detention or conversion thereof.

XIV. And it is enacted, that no Proprietor of Copyright in any book first published after the passing of the said Act of Parliament 3 and 4, Wm. 4, C. 85, shall maintain under the provisions of this Act any action or suit at law or in equity, or any summary proceeding in respect of any infringement of such Copyright unless he shall before commencing such action, suit or proceeding have caused an entry to be made in the Book of Registry at the Office of the said Secretary of such book pursuant to this Act. Provided always, that the omission to make such entry shall not affect the Copyright in any book, nor the right to sue or proceed in respect of the infringement thereof except the right to sue or proceed in respect of the infringement thereof under the provisions of this Act.

Provided always and it is enacted, that nothing in this Act contained shall affect, alter or vary any right subsisting at the time of passing this Act except as herein expressly enacted; and all contracts, agreements and obligations made and entered into before the passing of this Act and all remedies relating thereto, shall remain in full force, any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

The 18th December 1847.

The following Act passed by the Governor General of India in Council on the 18th of December 1817, is hereby promulgated for general information.

#### ACT No. XXI. of 1817.

An Act for the improvement of the Administration of Justice and despatch of Business in the Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay.

I. It is hereby enacted, that from and after the passing of this Act, it shall be lawful for any one of the Judges of the Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay when occasion shall so require to sit apart from the other Judges or Judge, as the case may be, of the same Court for the despatch of the Criminal Business of the said Court, at the same time when the other Judges or

Judge, as the case may be, of the said Court shall be sitting for the despatch of Business in the said Supreme Court, and that all Proceedings whatever so had by and before such Judge, so sitting apart for the purpose aforesaid, shall be good, valid and effectual in the Law to all intents and purposes as fully asif the said Proceedings were had before all the Judges of the said Court sitting as a Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery under the Charter of the said Court.

II. And it is hereby further enacted, that all business of what nature or kindsoever which the said Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay may or shall have power to transact in Term, it shall in like manner have power to transact out of Term, and that all Proceedings whatever before the said Court out of Term, shall be as good, valid and effectual in the Law to all intents and purposes as fully as if the said Proceedings were had in Term; and that all Rules and Orders of the said Court as to all Judgments, Executions or other Proceedings in Term, shall be applicable and shall be applied to all Judgments, Executions or other Proceedings given, issued or had out of Term, as near as the same can be made applicable thereto, and the said Court shall issue such new Rules and Orders as may be necessary for the purpose of giving full effect to the provisions in this Act contained.

#### FORT WILLIAM.

FOREIGN DEPARTMENT; THE 27TH NOVEMBER 1847.

British Consular Agents in Foreign Countries having difficulty in distinguishing between Individuals who have a right to their protection as Subjects of the British Crown and others who claim that protection without any legitimate title to it; and it being considered desirable, in order to obviate as far as possible this difficulty, that British Subjects, proceeding to a Foreign Country, should provide themselves with a document attesting their title to the protection of the British Crown.

The Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council is pleased, under instructions from the Hon'ble the Court of Directors, to notify that British Subjects, Native or European, intending to embark for a Foreign Country, will, on applying at the office (if the place of embarkation be Calcutta) of the Secretary to the Government of India in the Foreign Department, or (if the place of embarkation be Bombay or Madras) at the offices of the Chief Secretaries to Government at Bombay and Madras respectively, be furnished after due enquiry with a certificate attesting their rights to protection as British Subjects. British Subjects, Native or European, intending to embark at any of the Subordinate ports of the different Presidencies, are to apply to such officer at the Port as the Local Government shall have notified to be the proper authority for granting the certificates.
