NOTIFICATION.

Whereas since the passing of Act VI. of 1848, it having been deemed expedient to frame New Rules for the landing and shipping of Goods at the several Wharfs and Bunders of the Port and Island of Bombay, the Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council has been pleased, under the authority vested in him by Act I. of 1838, to cancel the Rules at present in force for such purpose, and to substitute in their room the following Rules, which shall have effect from the 1st of July next.

RULE I.

The following places are hereby appointed under Act 1. of 1838, to be places for landing and shipping Goods and Merchandize at the Port and Island of Bombay, to the extent and with the limitations noted hereinunder, opposite the name of each place respectively.

1. Town Bunder or For all Goods imported from, or to be exported to, places or ports not belonging to the East India Company, and for all Goods imported, or to be exported, on square rigged Vessels, excepting always such Go ds as are hereinafter specially prohibited,

2. Musjeed Bunder. For all Goods imported from, or to be exported to, places and ports within the dominions of the East India Company, in Country and Coasting Craft, excepting always such Goods as are hereinafter specially prohibited.

3. Arthur Bunder. For all Goods, excepting such as are hereinafter specially prohibited.

4. Apollo Bunder. For landing Cotton and Wool only.

5. Boree Bunder. For landing and shipping Grain, Pulse, Vegetables, Fruit, Salt Fish, and Coals, and no other merchandize.

6. Colee Bunder. For landing and shipping Live Stock, Grain, Pulse, Vegetables, Fruit, Fish, whether salt or fresh, Fishing Nets, Coals, and no other merchandize.

7. Carnae Bunder. Solution of the Bunder. Goods imported from, or to be exported to, ports and places within the East India Company's dominions, in Country and Coasting Craft, excepting such as are hereinafter specially prohibited.—Also for the importation or exportation of all Live Stock, Grain, Fruit, Vegetables, Firewood, Rafters, Bamboos, Tattas, Chunam, Stones for building or ballast, Tiles, Bricks, Country Pottery, Hay, Straw, Charcoal, Coals, and Cotton.

9. Mazagaum Bun-der. Firewood, Coals, Charcoal, and no other merchandize.

10. Tank Bunder. Timber only.

11. Candlee. 12. Seurce. Firewood, Batty, Hay, Straw, Pottery, Tattas, and no other 13. Sion. merchandize.

14. Mahim. All exports and imports, on Country or Coasting Craft, except such as are hereinafter specially prohibited.

Fishing Nets, Firewood, Batty, and Chunam.

16. Chowpatty, 17. Sonapoor. Firewood, Chunam, and Stones only.

RULE II.

4th.—Timber, Rafters, Bamboos, Tattas, Hay, and Straw, may, until further orders, be landed at the Belvidere Bay.

The postage to be charged in India on the delivery of letters sent by this Express, will be, in addition to the ordinary inland rates,

One rupee for every letter not exceeding half a tola in weight.

Two rupees for every letter above half a tola, but not exceeding one tola in weight.

Four rupees for every letter above one tola, but not exceeding two tolas in weight, two tolas being the maximum weight of letters to be conveyed by Express.

On Newspapers.—Each newspaper office in Calcutta and Madras will be allowed to receive two newspapers at the ordinary rates of Inland postage; on all other newspapers forwarded by Express, a postage of five rupees each will be charged, and no newspaper will be received for the Express exceeding three tolas in weight.

N. B .- One tola and a quarter is nearly equivalent . to half an ounce avoirdupois.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 6th of May, 1848.

~ or 1848. ACT No. --

An Act for the appointment of an Administrator General of unrepresented Estates in Bengal and for the regulation of that Office, and for the regulation of the Offices of the Supreme Court of Judicature at Fort William in Bengal.

William in Bengal.

Whereas by an Act of Parliament passed in a Session holden in the 30th and 40th years of the reign of King George III, entitled "An Act for establishing further Regulations for the Government of the British Territories in India, and for the better Administration of Justice within the same," it was amongst other things provided, that from and after the First day of March in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and One, whenever any British Subject should die intestate within either of the Presidencies of Fort William, Fort St. George, or Bombay respectively, or the Territories subordinate to either of the said Presidencies, or to become subordinate thereto, and on the return of the citation issued from the proper Ecclesiastical Court, no next of Kin or Creditor should appear and make out their claim to the Administration of the Effects of the intestate deceased to the satisfaction of the said Court, is should and might be lawful for the Registrar of such Court respectively, and he was thereby required to ap-Court respectively, and he was thereby required to ap-

ply for, and such Court was thereby required and directed to grant such Letters ad Colligenda, or of Administration, as to such Court should seem meet, by virtue whereof such Registrar should collect the assets of the deceased, and should bring them for safe custody into such Court, and account for them regularly in like manner as was then by Law provided in cases where assets were in the lands of any Officer of the Court under or by virtue of the Equitable jurisdiction of any such Court: And whereas by a certain other Act of Parliament passed in the 55th year of the same reign, entitled "An Act to amend so much of an Act of the 39th year of this present Musicky as relates to fixing the limits of of His present Majesty as relates to fixing the limits of the Towns of Calcutta, Madras, and Bombay; and also so much of an Act of the 39th and 40th year of His present Majesty as relates to the granting of Letters of Administration to the Effects of persons dying intestate within the several Presidencies in the East Indies to the Registrar of the Ecclesiastical Courts; and to enable the Governor and Council of the said Presidencies to remove Governor and Council of the said Presidencies to remove persons not being British Subjects and to make provisions for the Judges in the East Indies in certain cases," it was amongst other things provided, that in all cases in which the said Registrar should obtain a grant of Letters of Administration or ad Colligenda bona under the provisions of the Acts enabling and requiring him to apply for the same, the said Registrar should enter into a book to be kept by him for that purpose, separate and distinct accounts of each Estate, and of all such sums of Money, Bonds, and other Securities for Money, Goods, Effects and things, as should come to his hands or to the hands of any persons employed by him, or in trust for him, by virtue of any Letters ad Colligenda, or of Administration granted to him under the authority of the said Act, and likewise of all payments made by him for and on account of the said Estates, and of all debts due by or to the same, specifying the dates of such receipts and payments respectively, which said book should be kept in the Registrar's Office, and should be open for the inspection of all such persons practitioners in the said Courts and others as might have occasion to inspect the Courts and others as might have occasion to inspect the same, at office hours, paying such reasonable fee as might be fixed therefore by the said Courts and no more; and the said Registrar sould twice in every year, that is, on the First day of March and on the Twenty-second day on the First day of March and on the Twenty-second day of October, or on the First day after those days on which their respective Courts should be sitting, exhibit and deliver in open Court, a true and perfect Schedule of all sums of Money, Bonds, or other Securities received on account of each Estate remaining under their charge, together with the payments made thereout and the balances; and also of all Administrations whereof the balances should have been paid over to the persons entitled to the same, since the period of exhibiting the last Schedule, specifying the amount of such balances, and the persons to whom paid, which should be filed of record in the said Courts, and should within fourteen days afterwards be published in the Gazette of the Presidencies within which such Courts are respectively situated, by the within which such Courts are respectively situated, by the within which such Courts are respectively situated, by the said Registrar, who should likewise cause copies thereof in triplicate to be delivered to the Chief Secretary of such Presidency, and the same should be transmitted by the respective Governors at such Presidencies to the Court of Directors of the East India Company, who upon the receipt thereof should cause the same to be published in the London Gazette: And whereas it is desirable to the London Gazette: And whereas it is desirable to disconnect the Administration of such Estates from the Office of Ecclesiastical Registrar of the Supreme Court, and to provide for the Administration of such Estates by the Officer by this Act to be appointed for that purpose, and to extend to that Officer the provisions hereinbefore recited, and to make further provisions for the due Administration of such Estates, It is enacted as follows:

I. All Letters of Administration or ad Colligenda bona granted to the Ecclesiastical Registrar of the Supreme Court, and all Probates granted to such Officer of Wills appointing the Ecclesiastical Registrar of the Supreme Court by that description or him and his successors Executors thereof, and all Estates, Effects, and Interests, vested in the said Ecclesiastical Registrar by virtue thereof, and all books, papers, and documents belonging to him or in his possession, or under his power or control by virtue of such Letters or Probate, shall by virtue and operation of this Act, and without other grant be transferable and shall be forthwith transferred to the Administrator General by this Act created, who shall be to all intents and purposes such Administrator, Executor, or Grantee in his new character of Administrator General as the Ecclesiastical Registrar of the Supreme Court was, and shall have as such Administrator, Executor, or Grantee all the same powers as the said Ecclesiastical Registrar of the Supreme Court was, and shall have as such Administrator, Executor, or Grantee all the same powers as the said Ecclesiastical Registrar of the Supreme Court was, and shall have as such Administrator, Executor, or Grantee all the same powers as the said Ecclesiastical Registrar of the Supreme Court was and shall have as such Administrator, Executor, or Grantee all the same powers as the said Ecclesiastical Registrar of the Supreme Court was and shall have as such Administrator. bona granted to the Ecclesiastical Registrar of the Su-

The Ecclesiastical Registrar at the time of the passing of this Act shall be the first Administrator General, and shall upon the passing of this Act cease to be Ecclesiastical Registrar, and shall as such Administrator General be entitled to receive or retain all Commission to which he was entitled as Ecclesiastical Registrar at the time of the passing of this Act on any such grants as aforesaid aforesaid.

III. The said Administrator General and every succeeding Administrator General shall give Security by Bond to the East India Company, himself for one lac of Rupees, with two or more Sureties jointly and severally for another lac of Rupees, for the due execution of his said Office, and shall not be required by the said Supreme Court to enter into any Administration Bond or to give other Security to that Court on the grant of any such Letters as aforesaid.

IV. The Administrator General shall receive as the remneration for the discharge of his duties as such Administrator General under all such grants of Letters as aforesaid made after the passing of this Act, or on Probates of Wills so granted after the passing of this Act wherein he is named Executor by virtue of his Office, a Commission of three Rupees in the Hundred on each Estate instead of the five per cent. Commission heretofore received by the Ecclesiastical Registrar, and shall defray out of the said Commission of three Rupees in the Hundred, the expences of the necessary Establisment and all other charges to which the said Office may be subject, and shall be entitled instead of the Ecclesiastical Registrar of the said Supreme Court, and is barely required to take out such Administrations and fice may be subject, and shall be entitled instead of the Ecclesiastical Registrar of the said Supreme Court, and is hereby required to take out such Administrations and Letters ad Colligenda as aforesaid in all cases in which by virtue of the said Statutes the Ecclesiastical Registrar of the Supreme Court was at the time of the passive that the said Statute of the passive transfer of the Supreme Court was at the time of the passive transfer of the Supreme Court was at the said Statute of the passive transfer of the Supreme Court was at the said Supreme Court and said Supreme Court was at the said Su ing of this Act so entitled and required, and not other-

On all future vacancies of the Office the Administrator General shall be appointed by the Governor General of India in Council, and shall be one who has either been admitted and is at the time of such appointment an Advocate or an Attorney of the said Supreme Court, or one who is at the time of such appointment qualified to be so admitted.

VI. From and after the passing of this Act the Administrator General shall not as such be deemed to be an Officer of the said Supreme Court, and shall not be

V11. From and after the passing of this Act the Assets belonging to the Estates administered by the said Administrator General shall be kept deposited and invested by such Administrator General in such manner. vested by such Administrator General in such manner

Administrator General shall be kept deposited and revested by such Administrator General in such manner as the Governor General of India in Council shall from time to time by his order in writing direct, which order shall be published in the Calcutta Gazette, and shall be full authority, protection, and indemnification in all Courts whatsoever for such keeping, depositing, and investing, and until such order be made, the Assets in the hands of such Administrator General shall be deposited and kept in the Treasury of the East India Company.

VIII. The provisions above recited of the Act 55th Geo. III. as to the entries in and keeping of the Book or Books in the Office of the Ecclesiastical Registrar, and as to the right of access to and inspection of the said Books and as to the filing of Schedules in the Supreme Court, and as to the transmission of copies of the said Schedules shall be in force as to the Administrator General and his Office instead of the Ecclesiastical Registrar of the said Supreme Court and his Office, and shall be carried into effect in like manner as was by the said trar of the said Supreme Court and his Office, and shall be carried into effect in like manner as was by the said Act of Parliament directed as to the Ecclesiastical Registrar of the said Supreme Court, provided that the fee or fees, if any, directed to be paid for inspection shall be fixed by the Governor General of India in Council and not by the Supreme Court, and shall be notified in the Calcutta Gazette in manner aforesaid.

cates thereof shall also be laid before the Governor General of India in Council, who shall refer the same to such person or persons as he may from time to time appoint for that purpose to examine such Schedules, and to report to the said Governor General in Council whether they contain the matters by the said Statute directed to be therein respectively inserted, and shall enquire into the truth and correctness of the matters stated in such Schedules so far as regards the receipts and payments therein stated to have been had and made, so as to ascer-

tain whether the same as stated to have been had and made, have in fact been so had and made, and shall also ascertain whether the Books directed by the said Act of Parliament of the 55th Geo III. to be kept in the said Registrar's Office, and by this Act directed to be kept by the Administrator General, are kept as this Act by reference to the said Act of Parliament directs, and whether the same are regularly hear and not active the same are required. by reference to the said Act of Parliament directs, and whether the same are regularly kept and not suffered to fall into arrear, and whether the Assets are duly kept, deposited, and invested in such manner as is by Law prescribed for the investment and custody of such Assets, and the said person or persons to whom such reference is and the said person or persons to whom such reference is made shall have power to summon as well the said Administrator General as any other person or persons whose presence he or they may think necessary to attend him or them from time to time, and to examine the said Administrator General or other party or parties if he shall think fit, on Oath or Solemn Affirmation to be by him or them administered, and to call for all Books, Papers, and Documents which may appear to him or them to be necessary for the purpose of the said reference, and if the said Administrator General or other person or persons when summoned shall neglect or refuse to attend, or to when summoned shall neglect or refuse to attend, or to produce any Books, Papers, or Documents required, or shall attend and refuse to be sworn or make a Solenn Affirmation when by Law an Affirmation may be substituted for an Oath, or shall refuse to be examined, the said person or persons shall certify such neglect or refusal in writing to the Supreme Court of Judicature at Fort William in Bengal, which shall have power to issue and Attachment spirits task Administrator, General on Attachment against such Administrator General or other person or persons for such neglect or refusal as aforesaid, who shall thereupon be punishable in like manner as if such neglect or refusal had been in contempt of the said Supreme Court.

X. If on such reference and examination it shall appear that the said Schedules are correct, and that the pear that the said Schedules are correct, and that the Provisions of the said Acts of Parliament and of this Act have been complied with, the costs and expences of such reference shall be defrayed proportionably by all the Estates, the accounts of which are then under examination, which costs and proportion the person or persons to whom such reference is made shall ascertain, and the said Administrator General shall deduct the sum chargeable to each Estate therefrom, and shall apply the same to the payment of the cost and expences of such refer-

XI. If upon any such reference and examination the XI. If upon any such reference and examination the person or persons to whom the said reference is made shall see reason to believe that the said Schedules do not contain a true and correct account of the matters therein, or which ought to be therein contained, such person or persons shall report accordingly to the Governor General of India in Council, specifying in his or their report the substance of his or their objections thereto, and the said Governor General in Council shall thereupon refer the same to the consideration of the Advocate General of the East India Company in Bengal, whoshall thereupon proceed summarily by petition for an account against the said Administrator General. an account against the said Administrator General, or against a late Administrator General after his removal from office, or against his personal representatives in case of his death, in respect of all or any of the Estates then or formerly under his care as the said Advocate General shall think fit, and shall have power to aybilit interpretarious to the said Administra said Advocate General shall think fit, and shall have power to exhibit interrogatories to the said Administrator General, or other person or persons defendants, who shall be bound to answer the same as fully as if the same had been contained in a Bill filed for the like purpose, and the Court shall have power on any such petition filed, to examine orally the parties before it and all witnesses, or to refer the accounts to be taken in the ordinary way, and the costs of the Advocate General when such are directed to be paid shall be defrayed either by the defendant or defendants in case he or they shall be decreed to pay the costs, or out of the Estates rateably as the said Court shall direct, and the Court shall have power to order the Administrator General, or other person or persons defendants, to receive his or her

shall have power to order the Administrator General, or other person or persons defendants, to receive his or her costs out of the said Estates if it shall think fit.

XII. The said Court shall have power on such petition to make such original and subsequent orders as upon a Bill filed, and such Orders shall have the same effect, and be executed in the same manner as Decretal Orders, and in case any apportionment amongst the several Estates shall become necessary in consequence of any deficiency of funds, the Court shall by one or more such Orders direct in what manner the same is to be made.

XIII. Every person who having been sworn or having taken a solemn Affirmation under this Act, shall wilfully give false testimony upon any examination authorized by this Act, shall beldeemed guilty of perjury,

and if convicted thereof, shall be liable to fine and im-

and it convicted thereof, shall be liable to fine and imprisonment, or to fine or imprisonment, which imprisonment may be at the discretion of the Court with or without hard labour, and may extend to two years.

XIV. From and after the passing of this Act the Master of the Supreme Court shall, in addition to the duties now performed by him, perform also the duties of Ecclesiastical Equity and Admiralty Registrar, and shall also on the next vacation of the Office of Sworn Clerk perform the duties of that Office.

XV. From and after the passing of this Act the Taxing Office of the Contract of the Cont

From and after the passing of this Act the Taxing Officer of the Supreme Court shall, in addition to the duties of the several Offices now held by him, and on the next vacancy of the several Offices of Examiner in the Insolvent Court and of Attorney for Paupers, discharge also the duties of those Offices.

The following Act, passed by the Governor General of India in Council on the 20th of May, 1848, is hereby promulgated for general information.

ACT No. XI. of 1848.

An Act for the Punishment of Wandering gangs of Thieves and Robbers.

Whereas it is expedient to extend some of the Pro-visions of the Law for the conviction of Thugs and Da-coits to other gangs of Thieves and Robbers, It is enacted as follows:

I. Whosever shall be proved to have belonged either before or after the passing of this Act to any wandering gang of persons, associated for the purposes of theft or robbery, not being a gang of Thugs or Dacoits, shall be punished with imprisonment with hard labour for any term not exceeding seven years.

II. Any person accused of the offence of belonging to any such gang as aforesaid, or of the offence of unlawfully and knowingly receiving or buying property stolen or plundered by any such gang, may be committed by any Magistrate within the Territories of the East India Company, and may be tried by any Court which would have been competent to try him if his offence had been committed within the Zillah where that Court

For better defining the Law as to revision of the sen-tences of Subordinate Criminal Courts.

Whereas it hath been doubted how far Section V. of Regulation IX. 1831, of the Bengal Code, is repealed by Act XXXI. 1841, and it is expedient to remove such doubt, and to establish one rule of proceeding for the revision of the sentences of Subordinate Criminal Courts throughout the Presidencies of Bengal and Ma-

Courts throughout the Presidencies of Bengal and Madras, It is enacted as follows:—

1. So much of Section V. of Regulation IX. 1831, of the Bengal Code, as is now in force, and also Section XXXV. of Act VII. 1843, are repealed.

11. The several Courts of Nizamut Adawlut in the Presidency of Bengal, and of Foujdarce Adawlut in the Presidency of Madras, in any case in which it shall appear to either of them, upon a review of the Abstract Statements or Calendars of prisoners punished without reference, that the sentence passed is one which can. reference, that the sentence passed is one which cannot lawfully be passed on a person convicted of the offence as stated in the Abstract Statement or Calendar, shall require the Judge of the Court in which the conviction was had, to certify under his hand the offence of which the prisoner was convicted, and the sentence passed thereupon; and on the return of such Certification. passed thereupon; and on the return of such Certifi-cate the Gourt of Nizamut Adawlut or Foujdaree Adawlut, as the case may be, shall annul the sentence, if it could not be lawfully passed on a person convicted of such offence, and shall certify to the Court below the sentence or sentences which may lawfully be passed for such offence, and thereupon the Court below shall passed by the court below the c a new sentence according to Law, and shall amend the record in accordance therewith.

record in accordance therewith.

III. The said Courts of Nizamut Adawlut and Foujdarce Adawlut, in any case in which it shall appear to either of them, upon a review of the Abstract Statements or Calendars of prisoners punished without reference that the verdict or judgment was contrary to the evidence, or that the sentence was too severe, may, if they shall think fit, require the Judge of the Court in which the conviction was had, to certify under his hand the offence of which the prisoner was convicted, and the sentence passed thereupon, with the evidence hand the offence of which the prisoner was convicted, and the sentence passed thereupon, with the evidence on which such conviction was had, and any observations which he may be desirous of making in explanation of the verdict, judgment, or sentence; and thereupon the Court of Nizamut Adawhut or Foujdaree Adawhut, as the case may be, may annual such verdict, judgment, and sentence, if the verdict or judgment shall appear to them contrary to the evidence, or mitigate the sentence, if it shall appear to them too severe, and in either case shall certify their proceedings to the Court in which the conviction was had, which shall thereupon make such orders as shall be conformable to the decision of the Court of Nizamut Adawlut or Foujdaree Adawhut, and, if necessary, amend the record in ac-Adawlut, and, if necessary, amend the record in ac-cordance therewith.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 20th May 1848. - OF 1848. ACT No. -

An Act for substituting Stamp Duties instead of In-stitution Fees in the Courts of the District Moonsiffs in the Presidency of Madras, and for refunding Stamp Duties on Plaints in certain cases.

Stamp Duties on Plaints in certain cases.

Whereas it is expedient to substitute Stamp Duties for Institution Fees in the Courts of the District Moonsiffs in the Presidency of Madras, and to authorize the return of the whole or part of the Stamp Duties paid on Plaints in all Civil Actions which are dimissed on application of the parties, It is enacted as follows:—

I. Section XVI. and Clause 2, Section LVII. of Regulation VI. of 1816, and Sections IV. and V. of Regulation II. of 1834, of the Madras Code, shall be repealed from the first day of September in this year.

II. From and after the said first day of September, so much of Regulation XIII. 1816, and Section VII. of Regulation VII. 1818, of the Madras Code, as relates to the levying of Stamp Duties instead of Fees on the institution of Civil actions, shall be applicable to the Courts of District Moonsiffs in the Presidency of Madras.

the Courts of District Moonsiffs in the Presidency of Madras.

III. Whenever a suit pending in any Civil Court within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Madras shall be dismissed on application of the parties, the plaintiff shall be entitled to claim from the Court a Certificate, stating the amount of Stamp Duty paid on the Plaint, with specification of the number and endorsement of the paper filed, and whether the suit was dismissed before or after the case was called up, or was on the list of causes ready for hearing.

dismissed before or after the case was called up, or was on the list of causes ready for hearing.

IV. On presenting any such Certificate to the Collector of the District, the plaintiff shall be entitled to receive back half of the said Stamp Duty, if the certificate purports that the suit was dismissed after the case was called up, or was on the list of causes ready for hearing, and if before, the whole of the said Stamp Duty. Provided always there be no exception taken to the paper or endorsement thereon.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 20th day of August next.

The following Act passed by the Governor General of India in Council on the 27th of May 1848, is hereby promulgated for general information.

Act No. XII. of 1848.

An Act for better defining the jurisdiction of the Calcutta Court of Commissioners for the Recovery of Small Debts.

Whereas the jurisdiction of the Court of Commissioners for the Recovery of Small Debts in and for the Settlement of Fort William in Bengal, hath been exercised under colour of a Proclamation made by the Vice President of the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, in Council, with the approval of the Governor General of the said Presidency, bearing date the 18th day of March 1802, and of another Proclamation made by the Governor General of the said Presidency in Council, bearing date the 25th day of Sept. 1813, and of another Proclamation made by the Governor General of the said Presidency in Council, bearing date the 29th day of October 1819: And whereas doubts have arisen as to the legality of the said last two Proclamations, and of

all that has been done or may hereafter be done in pursuance thereof: And whereas doubts have also arisen whether the powers given to the Commissioners of the said Court by the first of the said Proclamations are by the terms of the said third Proclamation effectually exthe terms of the said third Proclamation effectually extended to the matters over which jurisdiction is thereby declared to be given to the said Court of Commissioners, and it is expedient to remove such doubts: And whereas the Rules, Orders, and Regulations for the direction of the process and practice of the said Court which have been established in and by the said Court have not been allowed, printed or published as directed by the said first Proclamation, and it is expedient to ratify and confirm the same notwithstanding such omission: And first Proclamation, and it is expedient to ratify and confirm the same notwithstanding such omission: And whereas the said Commissioners have been accustomed to sit separately and to form separate Courts sitting at the same time or at different times, and it is also expedient to establish as well prospectively as retrospectively the legality of that practice,—It is enacted as follows:

I. All proceedings heretofore had or hereafter to be had in pursuance of and in conformity with the said Proclamations, or any of them by the said Commissioners, or any person or persons acting under their authority, shall be deemed to have been, and to be, valid in law to all intents and purposes whatever, and against all

shall be deemed to have been, and to be, valid in law to all intents and purposes whatever, and against all persons and bodies corporate whomso ver.

II. All the powers and authorities declared to be given to the said Commissioners by the said first Proclamation shall extend to and be exercised in respect of and shall be deemed to have heretofore extended to all matters which in and by the said Proclamations, or any of them, the said Commissioners were authorized to hear and determine.

III. All proceedings beretofore had by any Com-missioner or Commissioners of the said Court whilst sit-ting apart from the others or other of them, or by any ting apart from the others or other of them, or by any person or persons under his or their authority, shall be deemed to have been as valid in law to all intents, and against all persons and bodies corporate whomsoever, as if all the said Commissioners had been sitting together in the said Court of Requests, and such Commissioners may henceforth sit either altogether or apart, and may hold one Court or two or three separate Courts sitting at the same time or at different times, in like manner as they have been heretofore accustomed

to do. IV. All rules, orders, forms of procedure and tables offees now used or established in the said Court shall be deemed to be and to have been from the time of their being first used or established respectively, valid in law to all intents, notwithstanding the omission to procure the allowance by the Supreme Court of Judicature of such of the same as should have been so allowed, and notwithstanding the non-printing and non-publication of such of the same as should have been printed and

published V. All V. All summonses and other process issued by the said Commissioners, or any of them, whether issued before or after the passing of this Act, shall be deemed to be valid and effectual in the law on whatsoever day the same shall have been made returnable.

FORT WILLIAM, FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT,

THE 29TH APRIL 1848.

GOVERNMENT AGENCY.

1. In compliance with instructions received from the Hon'ble the Court of Directors, the Right Hon'ble the Governor General in Council is pleased to direct that the following Regulations for conducting the Government Agency business at the several Presidencies, be published for general information.

2. The Governor General in Council has been pleased to authorize the Government Agent at Fort William and the Accountants General and the Sub-Treasurers at Fort St. George and at Bombay for the time being, to act under the responsibility of the Hon'ble East India Company, as Agents for the purposes hereinafter mentioned of the public Creditors of Government whether residing in Europe or elsewhere. The Government Agent at Fort William is also authorized to act as Agent for the purposes hereinafter mentioned to absent Proprietors of Shares in the Capital Stock of the Bank of Bengal, and the Accountants General and the Sub-Treasurers at Fort St. George and at Bombay are also authorized to act as Agents for similar purposes to absent Proprietors of Shares in the Capital Stock respectively of the Bank of Madras and of the Bank of Bombay.

3. The Officers above-mentioned are authorized to receive charge of and to grant receipts in duplicate for any Obligations or Loan Acknowledgments of the Government of India, or for Certificates of Shares in the above-mentioned Banks at their respective Presidencies which the Proprietor may wish to deposit with them, and the Accountant General and the Sub-Treasurer at Fort St. George are also authorized on the application of the Proprietor to receive charge of and to grant receipts in duplicate for Promissory Notes of the Government of Fort St. George issued on account of the Tanjore Debt. No Note or Certificate is to be received in deposit which shall not appear to be made out in the name of or be regularly endorsed to the person depositing it, or on whose account the deposit may be made. Persons desiring to deposit their Government Securities or Bank Share Certificates shall make their applications to the Government Agent at Fort William, or to the Accountant General and Sub-Treasurer at Fort St. George or at Bombay in the Form hereunto subjoined No. 1, and the receipts of those Officers will be given in the Form No. 2.

- 4. The Officers above-mentioned will receive the interest on any Government Paper, or the dividend on any Bank Share Certificates which may be deposited with them, and will according to the instructions of the Proprietor either remit the amount of such interest to England in Bills to be drawn on the Hon'ble Court of Directors, if the interest shall be payable in such Bills by the terms of the Loan, or they will pay the amount of such interest or dividend at the Presidency, to any person nominated by the Proprietor to receive such payment. The Government Agent at Fort William will also, according to the instructions of the Proprietor, remit the amount of interest on such Government Paper as may be deposited with him to the Presidencies of Fort St. George or Bombay, by Drafts on the Public Treasuries of those Presidencies or to any of the Stations subordinate to the Presidency of Fort William by Drafts on the Collectors or on the Residents at Delhi or Lucknow according to the rates of exchange at which Government may draw at the time. The Accountant General and the Sub-Treasurer at Fort St. George will also, according to the instructions of the Proprietor, remit the amount of interest or dividend on such Government Paper or Bank Share Certificates as may be deposited with them to any of the Stations subordinate to the Presidency of Fort St. George by Drafts on the Collectors, Commissioners or Residents according to the rates of exchange at which Government may draw at the time. The Accountant General and the Sub-Treasurer at Bombay will also, according to the instructions of the Proprietor, remit the amount of interest on such Government Paper as may be deposited with them by Drafts drawn upon any of the Civil Treasuries subordinate to the Presidency of Bombay according to the rates of exchange at which Government may draw at the time. The instructions as to the manner in which the interest or dividend is to be paid must be made out according to the Forms hereunto subjoined, Nos. 3, 4, and 5, which are adapted to the several cases above specified, and the power of Attorney for drawing the dividends on Bank Share Certificates must be made out according to Form No. 6. The Proprietor will be at liberty to substitute one of these modes of receiving the interest or dividend for the other as often as he shall think fit, provided that the fresh instructions be furnished one month before the day on which the interest may fall due. Persons having more Promissory Notes or Bank Share Certificates than one in deposit may give separate instructions regarding the interest on each Note, or the dividend on each Certificate, but the whole of the interest or dividend on each Note or Certificate must be received in the same manner and at the same time.
- 5. When the Principal of any Government Paper so deposited shall become payable, these above-mentioned Officers will, according to the instructions of the Proprietor, either pay there amount with interest due upon it to such person as may be appointed to receive the payment, or they will re-invest it in any other Loan to which it may be subscribable at the time, or in the purchase of other Obligations or Loan Acknowledgments of the Government of India, or of Shares in the Capital Stock of the Banks above-mentioned at their respective Presidencies in the market at the current price of the day. The Accountant General and the Sub-Treasurer at Fort St. George will also, according to the instructions of the Proprietor, re-invest the amount in the purchase of Promissory Notes granted by the Government of Fort St. George on account of the Tanjore Debt. The instructions for these purposes must be made out according to the Forms hereunto subjoined Nos. 7, 8, and 9, which are adapted to the several cases above specified. The Proprietor may at any time substitute one of these modes of disposing of the Principal for the other, provided that the fresh instructions be furnished one month before the day on which the Principal falls due. Persons having more Notes than one in deposit may give separate instructions regarding each Note, but the whole amount of each Note must be disposed of in the same manner and at the same time.

6. If any Loan be opened by the Government into which the Paper deposited may be receivable, the Officers above-mentioned are authorized to subscribe the Paper so deposited to such Loan upon receiving the instructions of the Proprietors for that purpose, although the Notes may not be in course of payment: instructions for this purpose must be made out according to the Form No. 10.

7. The Officers above-mentioned are authorized to receive remittances in Government Bills only from individuals desiring to purchase the Public Securities or Bank Shares for deposit with them, provided such Bills shall be payable at the General Treasury, or Presidency Pay Office at Fort William if remitted to the Government Agent at Fort William, and at the General Treasuries or Government Agent's Offices at Fort St. George and Bombay if remitted to the Accountants General and the Sub-Treasurers at those Presidencies. The Officers abovementioned are authorized to invest the amount of such remittances according to the instructions of the Proprietor either by subscribing the amount to any Loan which may be open for the receipt of cash or by purchase in the market at the current price of the day. Instructions for the purpose shall be made out according to the Forms hereunto subjoined Nos. 11 and 12.

8. The Officers above-mentioned are further authorized to invest the amount of interest for dividends due on Paper deposited with them in either of the modes mentioned in the last

Clause upon receiving the Proprietor's instructions for that purpose : such instructions must be made out in the Form hereunto subjoined No. 13.

- 9. The same Officers are further authorized at any time on receiving proper authority and instructions from the Proprietor for that purpose to endorse any one or more Promissory Notes or Bank Share Certificates deposited with them as Attorneys of the Owner to such person as he shall direct, or to sell the same on the Owner's account at the current price of the day, and to pay over the proceeds in cash at the General Treasury to such person as the Proprietor may appoint to receive the same, provided that the whole amount of each Note or Bank Share sold shall be payable in one sum and to the same person.
