## PROCLAMATION.

BOMBAY TO WIT. By virtue of a precept to me directed, I hereby proclaim and give notice, that the Sessions of Oyer and Terminer and general Gaol Delivery, will be holden before the Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay, at the Court House, on Wednesday the 5th of July next, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders, and other Felonies, Perjuries, Trespasses, and other Crimes and Misdemeanors, had, done, or committed within the Town and Island of Bombay, and the limits thereof, and the Factories subordinate thereto, and also to enquire, hear, and determine, in like manner, all Treasons, Murders, Felonies, Forgeries, Perjuries, Crimes, Extortions, Misdemeanors, Trespasses, Wrongs, Oppressions, had, done, or committed, by any of Her Majesty's British Subjects, in any of the Territories which now are subject to, or dependant upon, the said Government of Bombay, or within any of the Dominions of the Native Princes of India, in alliance with the said Government.

And also, that at the same time and place, will be holden a Session of Admiralty, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders, Piracies, Robberies, Trespasses, Misdemeanors, and other Crimes and Offences, had, done, perpetrated or committed on the High Seas.

And I hereby give notice to all persons bound to prosecute, and give evidence, at the above Sessions, or in any way concerned therein, that they are to attend, at the time and place above mentioned, and not to depart without leave of the Court.

And I hereby give notice to all Justices of the Peace, Coroners, Escheators, and also all Chief Constables and Bailiffs of the Town and Island of Bombay, and the limits thereof, that they be then and there, in their own persons, with their Rolls, Records, Indictments, and other Remembrances, to do those things which to their offices in that behalf appertain to be done. #### POST OFFICE NOTICES.

Notice is hereby given, that under instructions from the Government of India, letters posted in Bombay cannot be received for transmission by the Government Expresses despatched hence to Calcutta and Madras on the arrival of the Overland Mails, those Expresses being specially intended for Europe letters and intelligence.

Notice is hereby given, that the General Post Office will in future be strictly closed on Sundays, except from 6 to 10 A. M. for the delivery of letters, and from 4 to 6 P. M. for the receipt and despatch of letters, or except on the arrival of the Overland Mail.

The receiving house at Bycullah, will henceforth be strictly closed on Sundays.

In consequence of several complaints recently made, the Post Master General requests the attention of the public to the following extract from Clause VI. of the Post Office Rules, 30th August 1837.

"Newspapers, printed papers or parcels, will "not be received bearing postage, unless the sender shall give his name and address, in "order that the regulated postage may be re"covered from him in case of such paper or
"parcel being refused by the party addressed."

The following Notification by H. M. Post Master General of London, is republished for general information:

BY COMMAND OF THE POST MASTER GENERAL. NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.

GENERAL POST OFFICE, MAY 1847.

The Post Master General having been informed by the Court of Directors of the East India Company, that on and after the first June next, persons in this country may forward private correspondence by the Government Express from Bombay to Calcutta, and Madras; all persons desirous of availing themselves of this privilege will be required to mark upon the covers of their letters the words "by Express from Bombay," and in addition to this special address Bombay," it will not be necessary that all letters intended to be forwarded by the way of Southampton should be so endorsed as hitherto.

The postage to be charged in India on the delivery of letters sent by this Express, will be, in addition to the ordinary inland rates,

One rupee for every letter not exceeding half a tola in weight.

Two rupees for every letter above half a tola, but not exceeding one tola in weight.

Four rupees for every letter above one tola, but not exceeding two tolas in weight, two tolas being the maximum weight of letters to be conveyed by Express.

On Newspapers .- Each newspaper office in Calcutta and Madras will be allowed to receive

two newspapers at the ordinary rates of Inland postage; on all other newspapers forwarded by Express, a postage of five rupees each will be charged, and no newspaper will be received for the Express exceeding three tolas in weight.

N. B.—One tola and a quarter is nearly equivalent to half an ounce avoirdupois.

## BY THE RIGHT HONORABLE THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

#### MILITARY DEPARTMENT.

BOMBAY CASTLE, 20TH JUNE 1948.

No. 363 of 1848.—The Right Honorable the Governor in Council has been pleased to cancel the Government General Order of the 5th April 1838, Article 34, Section XXV. Page 338, of Jameson's Code, and to decide that it shall be left optional with parties desirous of making remittances to Europe, to have the deductions from their pay made monthly, or at the close of the quarter before the remittance lists are made up.

#### Bombay Castle, 22nd June 1848.

No. 364 of 1843 .- To obviate doubts and embarrassments which have occasionally arisen from the ambiguity attending some parts of the Regulations which govern the grant of allowances for the temporary exercise of Brigade Commands, the Right Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to direct, that the following rules be adopted from the 1st of August next.

An officer in the temporary command of a Brigade not specially appointed, or not confirmed by Government,

is authorized to draw the allowance of a Cantonment command only, viz. 520 Rupees per mensem.

3. In every case where two or more corps of the line are present in the command, the officer temporarily succeeding to the Brigade will make over the regimental command to the next senior officer present, and draw the full allowances prescribed above. When there are less than two complete corps of the line present, the officer succeeding to the brigade will retain the regimental command, and draw the difference of allowances only, viz. Rupees 120

4. An officer in the temporary command of a brigade, specially appointed, or confirmed by Government on the recommendation of His Excellency the Commander in Chief, is authorized to draw the full allowances of a Brigadier

of the 2nd Class, viz. Rupees 750 per mensem.

5. When the allowances of a permanent Brigadier are sanctioned, the same are to be admitted, as fixed for a 2d Class, notwithstanding the predecessor may have been in receipt of allowances as a 1st Class Brigadier,
No. 365 of 1848,—The following order is confirmed:—

An order by Brigadier C, B, James, dated Ahmedabad the 16th May 1848, directing Major Lucas to perform the Commissariat duties, Northern Division of the Army, and Captain Ramsay, the Bazar duties at Ahmedabad,

during the absence of Captain Threshie on sick leave to Bombay.

No. 366 of 1848.—The Right Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to direct, that from and after the 1st August 1848, the Medical Department of the Indian Navy shall be placed under the Superintending Surgeon of the Presidency Division, who will be vested with the same authority, and will exercise the same control over it, as is possessed and exercised by Superintending Surgeons of Divisions over the Civil and Military branches of the Service, subject as these are to the superior control of the Medical Board.

In consequence of the above arrangement, the Right Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to direct, that from and after the above date, the circles of Supermending Surgeons shall be arranged as follows, viz.—

## FORT WILLIAM. HOME DEPARTMENT,

#### LEGISLATIVE.

The following Act passed by the Governor General of India in Council on the 27th of May 1848, is hereby promulgated for general information.

#### Act No. XII. of 1848.

An Act for better defining the jurisdiction of the Calcutta Court of Commissioners for the Recovery of Small Debts.

Whereas the jurisdiction of the Court of Commissioners for the Recovery of Small Debts in and for the Set-tlement of Fort William in Bengal, hath been exercised under colour of a Proclamation made by the Vice President of the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, of the said Presidency, bearing date the 18th day of March 1802, and of another Proclamation made by the

Governor General of the said Presidency in Council, bearing date the 25th day of Sept. 1813, and of another Proclamation made by the Governor General of the said Presidency in Council, bearing date the 29th day of October 1819: And whereas doubts have arisen as to the legality of the said last two Proclamations, and of all that has been done or may hereafter be done in pursuance thereof: And whereas doubts have also arisen whether the powers given to the Commissioners of the said Court by the first of the said Proclamation are by the terms of the said third Proclamation effectually extended to the matters over which jurisdiction is thereby declared to be given to the said Court of Commissioners, and it is expedient to remove such doubts: And whereas the Rules, Orders, and Regulations for the direction of the process and practice of the said Court which have been established in and by the said Court have not been allowed, printed or published as directed by the said first Proclamation, and it is expedient to ratify and confirm the same notwithstanding such omission: And whereas the said Commissioners have been accustomed to sit separately and to form separate Courts sitting at to sit separately and to form separate. Courts sitting at the same time or at different times, and it is also expedient to establish as well prospectively as retrospectively the legality of that practice,—It is enacted as follows:

I. All proceedings heretofore had or hereafter to be had in pursuance of and in conformity with the said Proclamations, or any of them by the said Commissioners,

or any person or persons acting under their authority, shall be deemed to have been, and to be, valid in law to all intents and purposes whatever, and against all

persons and bodies corporate whomso ver-

II. All the powers and authorities declared to be given to the said Commissioners by the said first Proclamation shall extend to and be exercised in respect of and shall be deemed to have heretofore extended to all matters which in and by the said Proclamations, or any of them, the said Commissioners were authorized to hear and determine.

III. All proceedings beretofore had by any Com-missioner or Commissioners of the said Court whilst sitting apart from the others or other of them, or by any person or persons under his or their authority, shall be deemed to have been as valid in law to all intents, and against all persons and bodies corporate whomsoever, as if all the said Commissioners had been sitting together in the said Count of Requests, and such Commis-sioners may henceforth sit either altogether or apart, and may hold one Court or two or three separate Courts sitting at the same time or at different times, in like manner as they have been heretofore accustomed to do.

IV. IV. All rules, orders, forms of procedure and tables of fees now used or established in the said Court shall be deemed to be and to have been from the time of their being first used or established respectively, valid in law to all intents, notwithstanding the omission to procure the allowance by the Supreme Court of Judicature of such of the same as should have been so allowed, and notwithstanding the non-printing and non-publication of such of the same as should have been printed and published.

V. All summonses and other process issued of the said Commissioners, or any of them, whether issued before or after the passing of this Act, shall be deemed the same shall have been made returnable.

THE 10th June, 1848.

The following Act, passed by the Governor General of India in Council on the 10th June 1818, is hereby promulgated for general information.

ACT No. XIII. of 1848.

For limiting the time within which a Suit may be brought to contest the awards of the Revenue Authorities in the Presidency of Bengal.

For the greater security of possessory titles in the Prosidency of Bengal derived from awards made by the Revenue Authorities under Regulation VII. of 1822, Regulation IX. of 1825, and Rguiation IX. of 1833, of the Bengal Code, it is enacted as follows:

1. No suit shall be entertained in any Court for contesting the justice of any award made before the passing of this Act by the Revenue Authorities under any

of the recited Regulations after the expiration of twelve

years from the date of the final award.

II. After the expiration of three years from the passing of this Act, no such suit shall be entertained for contesting the justice of any such award made before the passing of this Act.

III. No such suit shall be entertained for contesting

the justice of any such award made after the passing of this Act, after the expiration of three years from the

date of the final award.
