The Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to publish for general information, the following Extracts from an Ordinance enacted by the Government of Mauritius in 1846, for giving premiums to Commanders of Vessels taking Mails, or Overland Newspapers, to that Settlement.

"Extracts from Ordinance No. 13 of 1846, Concerning Captains of Vessels.

"Article 22d. The following premiums shall be given to the Masters or Commanders of Vessels bringing Mails or Oyerland Newspapers to Mauritius under the annexed conditions :-

"£ 30 for any Vessel touching expressly for the purpose of landing the Overland Post Office Mail, upon proof of the Vessel having sailed from the Port at which such Mail was taken on board, within five days after the arrival thereat of the said Mail.

"£ 30 for any Vessel bringing the same, upon proof of the Vessel having sailed within 48 hours of the arrival of the Mail as above described.

"£ 20 for any Vessel, upon proof of the Vessel having sailed within 5 days of the said arrival.

"And £ 10 for any Vessel not conveying the last Overland Mail, but bringing an Overland Newspaper of the latest date, not already received in the Colony, and which shall be delivered within 80 days after publication, and be made public in the Exchange Room immediately after the arrival of the said vessel.'

POST OFFICE NOTICES.

Notice is hereby given, that under instructions from the Government of India, letters posted in Bombay cannot be received for transmission by the Government Expresses despatched hence to Calcutta and Madras on the arrival of the Overland Mails, those Expresses being specially intended for Europe letters and intelligence.

"Newspapers, printed papers or parcels, will not be received bearing postage, unless the sender shall give his name and address, in "order that the regulated postage may be re-covered from him in case of such paper or " parcel being refused by the party addressed."

Parties coming to the General Post Office to enquire for letters awaiting their arrival, are requested to make application to the "Dead and Unclaimed Letter Department" in the South wing of the building.

The following Notification by H. M. Post Master General of London, is republished for general information :

BY COMMAND OF THE POST MASTER GENERAL. NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.

GENERAL POST OFFICE, MAY 1847.

The Post Master General having been informed by the Court of Directors of the East India Company, that on and after the first June next, persons in this country may forward private correspondence by the Government Express from Bombay to Calcutta, and Madras; all persons desirous of availing themselves of this privilege will be required to mark upon the covers of their letters the words "by Express from Bombay," and in addition to this special address it will not be necessary that all letters intended to be forwarded by the way of Southampton should be so endorsed as hitherto.

The postage to be charged in India on the delivery of letters sent by this Express, will be, in addition to the ordinary inland rates,

One rupee for every letter not exceeding half

a tola in weight.

Two rupees for every letter above half a tola, but not exceeding one tola in weight. Four rupees for every letter above one tola, but not exceeding two tolas in weight, two tolas being the maximum weight of letters

to be conveyed by Express.

On Newspapers.—Each newspaper office in Calcutta and Madras will be allowed to receive two newspapers at the ordinary rates of Inland postage; on all other newspapers forwarded by Express, a postage of five rupees each will be charged, and no newspaper will be received for the Express exceeding three tolas in weight.

N. B.—One tola and a quarter is nearly equivalent to half an ounce avoirdupois.

The subjoined extract from Section LIX of the Post Office rules of 30th August 1837, is published for general information:

" Letters which individuals address on their " private affairs to any Government officers must be sent post paid."

Parties addressing the Post Master General or Deputy respecting their private letters and parcels, and superscribing "Service" on such communications, render themselves liable to the penalty prescribed in Section V. Act XX. of 1838.

Bombay, Genl. Post Office, 21st Dec. 1847.

With the view to prevent disappointment, parties who call at the Post Office to receive Overland letters, or to Post prepaid letters, are reminded, with reference to Sections XXIV and XXXI of the Post Office Rules of 30th August 1837, that letters cannot be delivered except on payment of the postage, and that no change will be given in any case,

The subjoined extract, Section XXVIII. of the Post Office Rules, is published for general information.

"Section XXVIII .- In order to protect as " far as possible the Public Mails from the chance " of robbery, Officers in charge of Post Offices "shall not knowingly receive money, bullion, "precious stones, or jewels, for despatch either by Letter or Bhangy post."

Medical Warrant Officers are not eligible to the benefits of the Invalid Pension Establishment until they have served in the Department 15 years, exclusive of the period passed as Hospital Apprentices, and then only when duly reported by a Medical Committee to be incapable of further effective duty.

3. The cases of Medical Warrant Officers, who, having served less than the period of 15 years above prescribed, may be disabled by wounds, or rendered unfit for further service by disorders contracted, or injuries received, in the execution of their duties, will be specially considered.

4. No Medical Warrant Officer, unless disabled on actual service, will be entitled to the benefits of the grade he may hold at the time of being invalided, unless he shall have served in that grade for three years complete; should he have served a shorter period, he will receive the Pension only of the next inferior grade from which he was promoted, his united service in the two grades amounting together to full three years.

5. Senior Apothecaries, Apothecaries and Stewards, after a service in the Department of 30 years, exclusive of

the period passed as Hospital Apprentices, will be entitled to a Retiring Pension in Europe, at the rate laid down

in the Table for their respective ranks.

6. It has not been deemed necessary to admit Assistant Apothecaries and Assistant Stewards to the benefits of Furlough, or of Retiring Pension in Europe, but should any individual of those grades establish a fair claim to the indulgence, Government will be prepared to give the circumstances of each case a favorable consideration, if brought under its noti e by the Commander in Chief.

7. The Pensions granted under the present Regulation are to be considered inclusive of those which Warrant

Officers are entitled to from Lord Clive's Fund.

2. Native Commissioned, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men, promoted in consequence of vacancies occurring in their respective Corps, are entitled to the Superior Allowances from the date of casualty causing the pro-

motion.
3. When an addition is sanctioned to the established strength of a Corps, or an angmentation of the Army takes place, the men of all grades promoted in consequence are to take rank and be entitled to the Superior Pay and Allowances from the date of the General Order by the Commander in Chief, subsidiary to that of the Government directing the augmentation.

I. Persons of unmixed European parentage only can be enlisted as privates into European Corps, and in this country are not admissible into the ranks, prior to their attaining the age of 18 years, when they may be enlisted on the usual Bounty for three or five years.

11. Persons of mixed parentage, that is, the offspring of a European Father and Native Mother, may be enlisted into European Corps as Drummers or Trumpeters, but are not at any age, or at any period of their service, entitled

to Bounty.

III. Persons of unmixed European parentage enlisting into, or borne on the rolls of European Corps as Drum-III. Persons of unmixed European parentage enlisting into, or borne on the rolls of European Corps as Drummers or Trumpeters, are not at any age, or at any period of their service, while so employed, entitled to Bounty.

IV. Boys of unmixed European parentage, and not under 9 years of age, may be enlisted in European Corps as

half pay Drummers or Trumpeters, to the same extent in number as the full pay Drummers and Trumpeters borne hall pay Drummers or Trumpeters, to the same extent in number as the full pay Drummers and Trumpeters borne on the establishment in each regiment; on attaining the age of 15 years, they will be brought on full pay on vacancies occurring, and on attaining the age of 18 years, are to have the option of enlisting as privates on vacancies occurring (if fit for the ranks), receiving the usual Bounty, of continuing to serve as Drummers or Trumpeters, or of being discharged.

V. Boys of mixed parentage, that is, the offspring of a European Father and Native Mother, and not under 9 years of age, may also be enlisted into European Corps, as half pay Drummers or Trumpeters, under the same rule as Boys of unmixed European Parentage; and on attaining the age of 18 years, are to have the option of continuing to the receiver as Drummers or Trumpeters, for contracted periods of not less than three years or of being discharged.

ing to serve as Drummers or Trumpeters, for contracted periods, of not less than three years, or of being discharged.

Native Corps.

VI. Persons of unmixed European parentage of any age not under 9 years, may be enlisted into Native Corps as Drummers, Fifers, Buglers, Trumpeters or Musicians, for such periods as may be agreed upon with Commanding Officers of Corps by the parties themselves, if not less than 16 years of age, or by their friends with their own consent if below that age; but while serving with Native Corps they are not at any age, or at any period, entitled to Bounty. Boys of this parentage, after attaining the age of 18 years, are to have the option of enlisting into a European corps as privates on vacancies occurring (if fit for the ranks), receiving the usual Bounty, of continuing to serve as Drummers &c. for such further periods as may be agreed upon, or of being discharged. The special sanction of the Commander in Chief is required, on all occasions, to the enlistment into Native Corps of persons of this class.

VII. Persons of mixed parentage, that is, the offspring of a European Father and Native Mother, may be enlisted into Native Corps as Drummers, Fifers, Buglers, Trumpeters, or Privates for unlimited service, or as Musicians, for such periods as may be agreed upon with Commanding Officers, by the parties themselves, if not less than 16 years of age, or by their friends with their own consent, if below that age. Boys of this parentage on attaining the age of 16, are to have the option of enlisting as Drummers, Fifers, Buglers, Trumpeters or Privates for unlimited service. on vacancies occurring, of continuing to serve as Musicians for such further periods as may be agreed upon, or of

The above rules relating to persons of mixed parentage are not to apply to Half Caste Drummers &c. now in the

An Act to provide for the expence of criminal Prosecutions at Bombay.

Whereas the fund arising from fines levied by or transmited to the Supreme Court of Bombay which, by an Act of Parliament passed in the 9th Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, are applicable toward the reasonable costs of prosecuting offences and compensating prosecutors, (whether before the said Court or any Justices of the Peace,) is inadequate, and other provision must be made for these purposes, It is engaged as follows: It is enacted as follows:

It is enacted as follows:

I. The Justices of the Peace for the Town and Island of Bombay in Quarter Session assembled shall from time to time prepare tables, of fees to be paid to Counsel and Attornies employed in prosecutions in the said Supreme Court, and of allowances to be made for the costs of prosecuting offenders and of compensating prosecutors and witnesses, in the said Supreme Court, and in the Court of Petty Sessions, and before either of the Magistrates of Police.

II. Every such table shall be submitted for approval to the said Supreme Court, which may alter and amend the same; and every such table, when finally settled and approved by the Supreme Court, shall be published for general information, and shall be binding on all persons.

The fees and allowances, authorized by the 111. The fees and allowances, authorized by the tables in use, for any prosecution in the Supreme Court, shall be taxed by the Deputy Clerk of the Crown, and in the Courtof Petty Sessions by the Clerk of the Peace, and for any proceeding before either Magistrate of Police by the Magistrate's Clerk; and upon the Certificate of the Taxing Officer shall be charged upon and paid out of the Municipal Fund established by Act No. XI. of 1845.

1V. When any allowance is made for attendance before a Justice of the Peace on examination before committal of a prisoner for trial in the Supreme Court or Court of Petty Sessions, the committing Justice shall give to the person entitled thereto a certificate under his hand of the attendance of such person, and of the allowance to which he is entitled, which shall be included in the costs allowed to such person, on the trial and ed in the costs allowed to such person on the trial, and shall not be paid until after the trial, or discharge of the prisoner.

V. In special cases, and for reasons to be openly stated, the Supreme Court and Court of Petty Sessions respectively may make orders for the payment of higher fees and allowances, to any person and in any proceeding in that Court, than are authorized by the tables in use; and thereupon such higher fees and allowances shall be substituted on taxation, and shall be charged upon and paid out of the said Municipal Fund,

VI. In special cases, and for reasons to be openly stated, the Supreme Court, Court of Petty Sessions, and either Magistrate of Police, may disallow the payment of all or any of the said fees and allowances: and thereupon the fees and allowances so disallowed shall be struck out on taxation, and shall not be chargable on the said Municipal Fund.

VII. After the publication of the first table of fees and allowances under this Act, the full amount of all fines levied by the Supreme Court, or Court of Petry Sessions, or either of the Magistrates of Police, and the balance of such fines at that time in the possession of the Accountant General of the Supreme Court, shall be paid, quarterly or otherwise as shall be directed by the Governor of Bombay in Council, to the credit of the said Manicipal Fand, by the Clerk of the Crown, Clerk of the Peace, or other Officer in receipt thereof, and shall be applicable to the general purposes of that fund. that fund.

Resolution.—The Governor General of India in Council resolves, that the following Amended Draft on the subject be published for general information.

ACT No .-- OF 1848.

An Act to provide more effectually for the punishment of offences committed in Foreign States.

Whereas divers Regulations of the Bengal, Madras, and Bombay Codes have been made from time to time for the trial of Native Subjects of the British Government, committing criminal offences beyond the limits of the British Provinces, and it is expedient to make the same more effectual and uniform, It is enacted as fol-

lows:

I. The undermentioned Regulations and parts of

I. The undermentioned Regulations and parts of Regulations are rescinded, that is to say:
Regulation V. of 1809, Regulation VIII. of 1813, Section VI. of Regulation I. and the whole of the Regulation VI. of 1822, and Regulation VIII. of 1829, of the Bengal Code: Regulation II. of 1829, and Regulation XII. of 1832, of the Madras Code: Section IV. of Regulation XI. of 1837, of the Bombay Code; except so far as any of them rescinds any former Regulation.
II. All British subjects, and also all persons in the Civil or Military service of the British Government in India, while actualty in such service, and for six months afterwards, and also all persons who shall have dwelt for six months within the British Territories under the Government of the East India Company, subject to the

vernment of the East India Company, subject to the laws of the said Territories, who shall be found within the said Territories, or who shall be brought within the said Territories, by leave of the Native Prince or State within whose Territory they are found, shall be amenable to the law for all offences committed by them within the Territory of any Native Prince or State; and may be bailed or committed for trial as hereafter provided, on the like evidence as would warrant their being held

be bailed or committed for trial as hereafter provided, on the like evidence as would warrant their being held to bail or committed for the same offence, if it had been committed within the British Territories.

111. The Committing Magistrate, immediately and before the trial, shall report every such case to the Government of the Presidency to which he belongs, and shall obey the orders which he shall receive thereon.

1V. The said Government may order the trial to be had before one of the established Courts of Criminal Judicature within the same Presidency, competent to try the person charged for the offence.

V. When the offence is charged to have been committed in the Territory of any Native Prince or State, administered by Officers acting under the authority of the East India Company, in which Territory a Court, competent to try the person charged for the offence, is established with the consent of such Native Prince or State, by authority of the Governor General of India in Council, the Government of the Presidency may order such person to be conveyed in custody, out of the British Territories, for the purpose of delivering him up for trial before such Court

VI. When the person charged is committed, the form of the warrant shall specify the commitment to be until the orders of Government can be received and acted on; when he is bailed, the form of the bail-bond shall be, in the first instance, to appear before the Magistrate on a certain day assigned, allowing reasonable

acted on; when he is bailed, the form of the bail-bond shall be, in the first instance, to appear before the Magistrate on a certain day assigned, allowing reasonable time for receipt of the orders of Government, and on such subsequent days as the Magistrate from time to time shall require; and if Government shall order the person charged to be tried within the Presidency, the Magistrate may cause the bail-bond to be renewed in the usual form, to appear and take his trial at the Court, appointed for the purpose.

VII. In either case, the special order of the Government shall be deemed [full authority, either for the trial and punishment of the person charged within the Bri-

An Act for the Safe Custody of Criminal Lunatics.

Whereas it is expedient to declare what unsoundness

Whereas it is expedient to declare what unsoundness of mind excuses the commission of criminal acts, and to provide for the safe custody of persons found to have committed such acts, but acquitted by reason of unsoundness of mind, It is enacted as follows:

I. No person, who does an act which, if done by a person of sound mind, is an offence, shall be acquitted of such offence for unsoundness of mind, unless the Court or Jury, by which he shall be tried, shall find that, by reason of unsoundness of mind, not wilfully caused by himself, he was unconscious and incapable of knowling, at the time of doing the said act, that he was doing

Initiated, he was unconscious and incapable of knowing, at the time of doing the said act, that he was doing an act forbidden by the law of the land.

II. Whenever a person charged with any offence shall be acquitted, because he is within the exception made by the foregoing Section, the Court or Jury shall give a special judgment or verdict, that he did the act charged against him, being then of unsound mind, so as to excuse him according to law.

III. Whenever such special judgment or verdict as aforesaid shall have been given against any person, the Court, before which the trial was had, shall order him to be kept in safe custody, in such place and manner as to the Court shall seem fit, until the pleasure of the Government can be known thereon: and thereupon the Government may order such person to be kept in strict custody for such time and in such manner as to the Go-

custody for such time and in such manner as to the Government shall seem fit.

IV. In all cases in which, before the passing of this Act, any person has been acquitted of any offence, on the ground of insanity, lunacy, idiocy, or unsoundness of mind, such person may be kept in the same strict custody in which persons may be kept, who shall be hereafter acquitted, for unsoundness of mind.

V. No person against whom any such special judgment or verdict shall have been given, shall be entitled to be discharged out of custody, on being restored to soundness of mind, unless by order and at the discretion of the Government.

of the Government.

VI. Whenever it shall appear to the Government that any person, imprisoned by the sentence of any Court, is of unsound mind, the Government, by a war-

rant directed to the Keeper of the Prison, which shall setforth the grounds of belief, that such prisoner is of unsound mind, may order the removal of such prisoner to a Lunatic Asylum, or other fit place of safe custody, there to be kept and treated as the Government shall order; and when itshall appear to the Government that such prisoner has become of sound mind, the Government, by a warrant directed to the person having charge of him, shall remand such prisoner to the prison from which he was removed, if then still liable to be kept in custody, or if not, shall order him to be discharged out of custody.

VII. The word 'Government' in this Act shall be taken to mean the Governor, or Governor in Council, or other person or persons administering the Government, of the Presidency or Place where the trial is had.
