JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.

It having come to the notice of Government, that oppressive measures are not unfrequently resorted to in order to procure carriage for the Visitors leaving the Mahableshwur Hills at the commencement of the Rains, the Right Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to prohibit the Superintendent at that Station from furnishing to any individual either Bearers, Helkurries, Tattoos, Bullocks, Carts, &c. that shall not resort or be brought to Malcolm Peit for the express purpose of Hire; and to direct, that the Superintendent severely punish any Servant who may in any neighbouring village use the slightest compulsion to procure carriage, reporting to Government all cases in which he may consider the Master in any way to blame, either for having authorized the proceedings of his Servant, or for not having taken due precautions to prevent them.

2. His Lordship in Council is also pleased to direct, that a similar course be pursued in their respective Districts by the Magistrates in the Konkan and the Resident at Sattara, who should adopt effectual means for enforcing their orders.

POST OFFICE NOTICES.

Notice is hereby given, that under instructions from the Government of India, letters *posted in Bombay* cannot be received for transmission by the Government Expresses despatched hence to Calcutta and Madras on the arrival of the Overland Mails, those Expresses being specially intended for *Europe* letters and intelligence.

In consequence of several complaints recently made, the Post Master General requests the attention of the public to the following extract from Clause VI. of the Post Office Rules, 30th August 1837.

“Newspapers, printed papers or parcels, will not be received bearing postage, unless the sender *shall give his name and address*, in order that the regulated postage may be covered from him in case of such paper or parcel being refused by the party addressed.”

Parties coming to the General Post Office to enquire for letters awaiting their arrival, are requested to make application to the “Dead and Unclaimed Letter Department” in the South wing of the building.

The following Notification by H. M. Post Master General of London, is republished for general information :

BY COMMAND OF THE POST MASTER GENERAL.
NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.

GENERAL POST OFFICE, MAY 1847.

The Post Master General having been informed by the Court of Directors of the East India Company, that on and after the first June next, persons in this country may forward private correspondence by the Government Express from Bombay to Calcutta, and Madras; all persons desirous of availing themselves of this privilege will be required to mark upon the covers of their letters the words “by Express from Bombay,” and in addition to this special address it will not be necessary that all letters intended to be forwarded by the way of Southampton should be so endorsed as hitherto.

The postage to be charged in India on the delivery of letters sent by this Express, will be, in addition to the ordinary inland rates,

One rupee for every letter not exceeding half a tola in weight.

Two rupees for every letter above half a tola, but not exceeding one tola in weight.

Four rupees for every letter above one tola, but not exceeding two tolas in weight, two tolas being the maximum weight of letters to be conveyed by Express.

On Newspapers.—Each newspaper office in Calcutta and Madras will be allowed to receive two newspapers at the ordinary rates of Inland postage; on all other newspapers forwarded by Express, a postage of five rupees each will be charged, and no newspaper will be received for the Express exceeding three tolas in weight.

N. B.—One tola and a quarter is nearly equivalent to half an ounce avoirdupois.

The subjoined extract from Section LIX of the Post Office rules of 30th August 1837, is published for general information :

“Letters which individuals address on their private affairs to any Government officers must be sent post paid.”

Parties addressing the Post Master General or Deputy respecting their private letters and parcels, and superscribing “Service” on such communications, render themselves liable to the penalty prescribed in Section V. Act XX. of 1838.

With the view to prevent disappointment, parties who call at the Post Office to receive Overland letters, or to Post prepaid letters, are reminded, with reference to Sections XXIV and XXXI of the Post Office Rules of 30th August 1837, that letters cannot be delivered except on payment of the postage, and that no change will be given in any case,

The subjoined extract, Section XXVIII. of the Post Office Rules, is published for general information.

“Section XXVIII.—In order to protect as far as possible the Public Mails from the chance of robbery, Officers in charge of Post Offices shall not knowingly receive money, bullion, precious stones, or jewels, for despatch either by Letter or Bhangy post.”

An Act to amend a Clerical Error in Act No. XXV. of 1840.

For remedy of a Clerical Error in Act No. XXV. of 1840, it is enacted as follows :

I. Any person guilty of the offence punishable under Section VII. of Act XXV. of 1840, shall be liable to the punishment therein provided for such offence, on conviction thereof before any Magistrate.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 29th day of September next.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 29th of July 1848.

ACT No. — OF 1848.

An Act for the Safe Custody of Criminal Lunatics.

Whereas it is expedient to declare what unsoundness of mind excuses the commission of criminal acts, and to provide for the safe custody of persons found to have committed such acts, but acquitted by reason of unsoundness of mind, It is enacted as follows :

I. No person, who does an act which, if done by a person of sound mind, is an offence, shall be acquitted of such offence for unsoundness of mind, unless the Court or Jury, by which he shall be tried, shall find that, by reason of unsoundness of mind, not wilfully caused by himself, he was unconscious and incapable of knowing, at the time of doing the said act, that he was doing an act forbidden by the law of the land.

II. Whenever a person charged with any offence shall be acquitted, because he is within the exception made by the foregoing Section, the Court or Jury shall give a special judgment or verdict, that he did the act charged against him, being then of unsound mind, so as to excuse him according to law.

III. Whenever such special judgment or verdict as aforesaid shall have been given against any person, the Court, before which the trial was had, shall order him to be kept in safe custody, in such place and manner as to the Court shall seem fit, until the pleasure of the Government can be known thereon: and thereupon the Government may order such person to be kept in strict custody for such time and in such manner as to the Government shall seem fit.

IV. In all cases in which, before the passing of this Act, any person has been acquitted of any offence, on the ground of insanity, lunacy, idiocy, or unsoundness of mind, such person may be kept in the same strict custody in which persons may be kept, who shall be hereafter acquitted, for unsoundness of mind.

V. No person against whom any such special judgment or verdict shall have been given, shall be entitled to be discharged out of custody, on being restored to soundness of mind, unless by order and at the discretion of the Government.

VI. Whenever it shall appear to the Government that any person, imprisoned by the sentence of any Court, is of unsound mind, the Government, by a warrant directed to the Keeper of the Prison, which shall set forth the grounds of belief, that such prisoner is of unsound mind, may order the removal of such prisoner to a Lunatic Asylum, or other fit place of safe custody, there to be kept and treated as the Government shall order; and when it shall appear to the Government that such prisoner has become of sound mind, the Government, by a warrant directed to the person having charge of him, shall remand such prisoner to the prison from which he was removed, if then still liable to be kept in custody, or if not, shall order him to be discharged out of custody.

VII. The word 'Government' in this Act shall be taken to mean the Governor, or Governor in Council, or other person or persons administering the Government, of the Presidency or Place where the trial is had.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 29th day of October next.

Act No. — of 1848.

An Act for Restoration of the Jaghire of Bunganapilly.

Whereas, by Act X. of 1843, the administration of justice and collection of the revenue in the districts of Kurnool and Bunganapilly, were vested in an Agent appointed by the Governor of Fort St. George in Council; and it is now deemed expedient to restore the Jagheer of Bunganapilly, to be holden by the Jagheer-dar subject to the same conditions and reservations as heretofore, It is enacted as follows:

I. On the _____ day of _____ the authority of the Agent of the Governor of Fort St. George, appointed under Act X. of 1843, shall cease as to the district of Bunganapilly; and no Agent shall hereafter be appointed for Bunganapilly under that Act.

II. All lawful proceedings of the said Agent and his Assistants before the said _____ day of _____ shall stand good.

III. The Foujdaree Adawlut and Sudder Adawlut shall continue to have and exercise the same jurisdiction respectively, as to criminal trials referred by the Agent before the said _____ day of _____, and as to appeals from any decree made by the Agent, before the said _____ day of _____, as if his authority had not ceased in the said district; and their judgments and orders shall be executed in the same manner.

IV. When the Agent shall have duly accounted to the Governor of Fort St. George in Council, for all monies received and paid by him in his administration of the revenues of the said Jagheer, and shall have received, by order of the said Governor in Council, a discharge in full of all claims against him for such administration, neither he nor any of his Assistants shall be liable to give any further account, or to be questioned for the same or any part thereof in any Court of Justice.

V. Nothing in this Act contained shall be deemed to waive or abate any part of the paramount authority and controul of the East India Company over the said district, or of the Sovereign authority of the British Government.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 29th day of October, 1848.

An Act to extend to the Straits the Act for regulating Coroner's Juries.

Whereas it is expedient to extend the operation of Act No. IV. of 1848, It is enacted as follows:

1. From the First day of December 1848, Act No. IV. of 1848, shall apply to the settlements of Prince of Wales' Island, Singapore and Malacca, and to all inquests held there by any Coroner, or Deputy Coroner, and the word Presidency as used in the said Act shall be taken to mean also the Government of the said Settlements.

Ordered, that the said Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 5th day of November next.
