The gram to be of unexceptionable quality of the deseription usually furnished to this department, and to be delivered free of all expense beyond the stipulated price, into the stores, at Poona or Kirkee, as may be ordered; if the grain tendered is considered objectionable by the Executive Commissariat officer, and is not immediately replaced by the contractor with approved grain, the required quantity will be purchased where-ver procurable, at his risk and loss, and in every such instance he will be liable to be fined (50) fifty Rupees, or 30 per cent on the amount of the expenses so in-curred, at the option of the Executive Commissariat officer; but the contractor will be at liberty to claim to have the rejected grain examined by a committee of officers, whose decision thereon shall be final.

A supply of not less than one month's consumption during the fair season, and of three months during the monsoon, is to be constantly kept in the Commissariat

To prevent disputes hereafter, it is to be distinctly understood, that the provisions of the contract are only intended to extend to demands made at Poona and Kirkee, but in the event of any of the Cavalry, or public camels moving, it will be optional with the Executive, Commissariat officer to take not more than one months grain for their use on the march,

The biddings for the contract will be in the Company's Rupee, and no person will be permitted to bid who has not previously deposited in this office Rupees (3,500) Three thousand five hundred, which sum will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion or refusal on the part of any bidder to execute the necessary deed of contract when required to do so, in the event of his offer being accepted; in which case he must also be prepared to furnish bonded security to the further amount of Company's Rupees (14,000) fourteen thousand, which together with the abovementioned deposit, will be held as a guarantee for due fulfilment of every part of the contract.

On Newspapers .- Each newspaper office in Calcutta and Madras will be allowed to receive two newspapers at the ordinary rates of Inland postage, on all other newspapers forwarded by Express, a postage of five rupees each will be charged, and no newspaper will be received for the Express exceeding three tolas in weight.

ACT No. --- OF 1818.

An Act to prohibit the Officers of the Courts established by Her Majesty's Charter from being concerned in any Commercial dealings or transactions.

1. It is enacted, that no Officer of any of the Courts of Judicature established by Her Majesty's Charter, within the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company, shall directly or indirectly by himself or by any other person or persons for his use or on his behalf accept from any person or persons in any manner or on any account whatsoever, any present, gratuity or reward other than his legal salary and fees and profits of office, nor act as the Manager or Director of or hold any other office in any Bank or Public Company, except as hereinafter excepted, nor carry on or be concerned in any Commercial dealings or transactions whatever in the way of buying and selling any Goods, Wares and Merchandize, or any Shares, or any Bills, Notes, or other valuable Securities, or as agent, factor or broker, or otherwise, either for his own use

or benefit, profit or advantage, or for the benefit or advantage of any other person or persons whatsoever, save and except such dealings as it may be part of the duty of any such Officer by virtue of his office to carry on. orany such officer of any of the said Courts, so as to prevent any Officer of any of the said Courts, so as to prevent any Officer of any of the said Courts, who mry at any time be also a practising Advocate, Attorney, solicitor, or Proctor in any of the said Courts, from taking the usual and accustoned professional fees, gratuities and emolument of Advocates, Attorney's, Solicitors, or Proctors, nor shall this Act be construed so as to extend to any Advocate, Attorney Solicitor, Proctor, Sheriff, Assignee, Receiver or Committee, so far as he may be merely as such held to be for some purposes an Officer or quasi Officer of any of the said Courts, but the persons last aforesaid shall in all respects be subject to the same Law in respect of the matters provide subject to the same Law in respect of the matters provided for in this Act as if this Act had not passed. Provided also that this Act shall not be construed to prevent any Officer of any of the Courts aforesaid from being a Director or Manager, or President or Vice President of, or from holding any office in any Company or Socie-ty established or to be established either for Educa-tional or Charitable purposes, or for the diffusion of knowledge, or for the encouragement and promotion of Science or Art, or of Agriculture, Horticulture, or Manufactures.

II. And it is enacted, that if any Officer of any of the said Courts shall knowingly offend against the provisions of this Act his office shall become thereby vacant, and it shall not be lawful to re-appoint him to the same or to any other office of the said Court.

Whereas the Judges of the Supreme Court at Bombay have from time to time, under the powers vested in them by the Charter

Preamble. powers vested in them by the Charter of Justice, framed divers wholesome rules of procedure by which causes at law of a certain amount have been enabled to be brought before the Judges sitting as a Small Cause Court in a simple and economic manner, to the great benefit of suitors and to the advancement of justice, and it is expedient that the jurisdiction thus exercised should be extended and should include certain causes in Equity and other matters wherein the ends of justice require summary procedure.

And whereas the powers of the Judges do not extend to the framing of rules by which the parties to a suit at law may be made examinable, or be compelled to give discovery on oath as in suits in Equity, and it is expedient that such powers should be conferred, and that a uniform procedure should be framed for the elicitation of the truth in all cases according to the methods which have been found most efficacions in practice.

And whereas it is very desirable that the rules of procedure should enable causes whether at Law or in Equity which do not require a prolonged judicial investigation to be disposed of summarily, and that on the other hand the amplest means should exist for And whereas the powers of the Judges do not extend
