No. 4039.—The Governor in Council having been pleased to appoint an elected member as President of the Bulsar Municipality in the Surat Collectorate, Government

Notification No. 2435,* dated 30th June 1885, is hereby amended by cancelling the words “exclusive of the President” in the first of the rules therein contained.

No. 4056.—With reference to Government Notification No. 2607, dated 14th July 1885, the following rules under Section 12 of the Bombay District Municipal Act Amendment Act, 1884, for the Municipal District of Dhárwar in the Dhárwar Collectorate are published for general information:—

Under the provisions of Sections 11 and 12 (a) and (b) of the Bombay District Municipal Act Amendment Act, 1884, the Governor in Council is pleased to direct that the Municipal Commission of Dhárwar in the district of Dhárwar shall consist of twenty-four members and shall be constituted partly by election and partly by nomination by the Commissioner, Southern Division.

The number of elected members of the commission shall be twelve and of those nominated by the Commissioner, Southern Division, shall be twelve, out of whom six may be salaried servants of Government and six shall be non-official private gentlemen.

The Governor in Council is also pleased to direct that “the District Municipal Election Rules” published under Section 12 (c) of Bombay Act II. of 1884, under Government Notification No. 115, dated 14th January 1885, with the amendments of them made by Government Notifications No. 561, dated 17th February 1885, and No. 2597, dated 14th July 1885, shall apply to the said Municipal District of Dhárwar, and in addition thereto to issue the following orders under Rules 2 and 5 (h):—

For electoral purposes the said Municipality of Dhárwar shall divide the municipal district subject to its authority into four wards and determine that the elective commissioners shall be elected

APPENDIX A.

Statement showing the boundaries of each of the four Wards of the Municipal District of Dhárwár formed for the purpose of Municipal elections.

Ward No. I.—To comprise the portion of the native town of Dhárwár proper, lying on the south of the main road leading from the Lal Taláv on the west, through the Line Bázár, Gowlees' Street, Kamankatti Street, and terminating at the Ganachari Math, which shall belong to this ward.

Ward No. II.—To comprise the remaining portion of the native town of Dhárwár proper, lying on the north of the aforesaid main road leading from the Lal Taláv and terminating at the Ganachari Math.

Ward No. III.—To comprise the fort of Dhárwár and all the bungalows and houses situated on the west of the town proper.

No. 4056A.—With reference to Government Notification No. 2607A, dated 14th July 1885, the following rules under Section 12 of the Bombay District Municipal Act Amendment Act, 1884, for the Municipal District of Hubli in the Dhárwár Collectorate are published for general information :—

Under the provisions of Sections 11 and 12 (a) and (b) of the Bombay District Municipal Act Amendment Act, 1884, the Governor in Council is pleased to direct that the Municipal Commission of Hubli in the district of Dhárwár shall consist of twenty-four members and shall be constituted partly by election and partly by nomination by the Commissioner, Southern Division.

The number of elected members of the commission shall be twelve and of those nominated by the Commissioner, Southern Division, shall be twelve, out of whom six may be salaried servants of Government and six shall be non-official private gentlemen.

Ward No. I. bounded—

On the North.—By the boundary of the Municipal District.

On the East.—By the boundary of the Municipal District.

On the West.—By the main road leading from the Government Bungalow and passing between the Travellers' Bungalow and the Subordinate Judge's Court through Dajiba's Peit, Madar lane, Kalādgi street lane, Fort Maidan, Papu Achari lane and joining Kundgol road and along it up to the south boundary of the Municipal District.

Statement showing the boundaries of each of the four Wards of the Municipal District of Byádgi formed for the purpose of Municipal elections.

Ward No. I. bounded—

On the West.—From Dagihaller's house, by the Haveri Agshi Street, and the Khanadsal Street to the north extremity of the village houses at the Musalman Makan.

On the East and South.—From Dagihaller's house, by the Komatger Street, as far as Bázár Street, thence eastwards, by the Bázár Street as far as the Motibenur road to the eastern extremity of the houses.

On the North.—From the Motibenur road on the east, by a road passing to the north of the village houses, as far as the Musalman Makan on the west.

Ward No. II. bounded—

On the West.—By the Komatger Street from Hanmantapa Komati's house to Sugiriapa Wali's house.

On the South.—From Gangapa's house in the Soger Street, by the Soger Street, to the Kánarese School.

On the East.—From the Kánarese School, by Muder Street and Hanmantdevar Street, to the house of Pinjar Kalmani.

On the North.—By the Bázár Street from the house of Pinjar Kalmani to Murigepa Kundgol's house, from thence by the Mathada Street to the Agsaler Virapa's house, thence by the Upasher Street and Shettar Street, to Sanapa Shettar's house.

Ward No. IV.—All the houses in Byádgi to the south and east of a line drawn as follows:—

From Guddapa Kulkarni's backyard, by the Haveri Agshi Katti Street, to Jivaka Simpiger's house, thence by the Soger Street to Adivepa Sankannavar's house, thence by Muder Street and Hanmantdevar Street to the Motibenur road.

Statement showing the boundaries of each of the six Wards of the Municipal District of Háveri formed for the purpose of Municipal elections.

Ward No. I. bounded—

On the West.—By a line drawn from the Hanmantdevar temple on the south to the hond on the north including both sides of the Desaikeri street and parallel to it.

On the South.—By a line from the Hanmantdevar temple to house No. 86 inhabited by Sidapa Bhangy and including both sides of the Shanbhogar street, and from house No. 86 along the north side of the Palledkatti street as far as house No. 513 inhabited by Basapa Agsaler.

On the East.—By a line from house No. 513 including both sides of the Hond street northwards to the hond.

On the North.—By the Háveri hond.

Ward No. II. bounded—

On the West.—By a line from the Hanmantdevar temple to the junction of the Havanur Samasgi and Poona-Harihar roads and thence by the Poona-Harihar road as far as the Hanmantdevar temple which lies to the south side of that road.

On the South.—From the Hanmantdevar temple on the south by the Poona-Harihar road as far as the point where the Havanur-Samasgi road leaves the Poona-Harihar road, including the new dispensary.

On the East.—By a line from the point where the Havanur-Samasgi road leaves the Poona-Harihar road as far as and including house No. 322 inhabited by Mahadapa Nempi, including both sides of Waddar and Halepeti streets.

On the North.—By a line from house No. 322 along the south side of Palledkatti street as far as house No. 356 inhabited by Malapa Surangi, thence from house No. 85 inhabited by Chanvirapa Sangur, to the Hanmantdevar temple, which is at the south end of the Desaikeri street.

Ward No. III. bounded—

On the West.—By a line drawn from the point where the Havanur-Samasgi road leaves the Poona-Harihar road to the Chávdí No. 569, thence by No. 520 to 1005 inhabited by Chanbasapa Shettar, inclusive of these houses.

On the North.—By the road in front of houses No. 1005 and 925, the latter inhabited by Bashetepa Tandur.

On the East.—By a line from house No. 925, including both sides of Myalin Peti street to No. 593, belonging to Bashetepa Tandur, thence by the west side of Aki street to the Havanur-Samasgi road.

On the South.—By the Havanur Samasgi road.

Ward No. IV. bounded—

On the West.—By the east side of the Aki street, from the Havanur-Samasgi road to house No. 709 inhabited by Adivepa Wali inclusive.

On the North.—By a line from house No. 709 to 814 inclusive, the Hanmantdevar temple, including both sides of Court street.

On the East.—By a line drawn from No. 814, south-east to the Havanur-Samasgi road following the boundary of Siddedevpur.

On the South.—By the Havanur-Samasgi road.

Ward No. V. bounded—

On the West.—By a line from house No. 709, but excluding it, to the hond, excluding house No. 925 and including both sides of the Hatturkeri street, from the hond northwards to the north boundary of the Municipal limits.

On the North.—By the north boundary of Háveri Municipal limits.

On the East.—By the western boundary of Siddedevpur village site.

On the South.—By a line from house No. 709 to house No. 814, excluding these and also excluding the north side of Court street.

Ward No. VI.—Contains the whole of the Siddedevpur village site as shown in the Revenue Survey map of that village.

The number of elected members of the commission shall be eight and of those nominated by the Commissioner, Southern Division, shall be eight, out of whom four may be salaried servants of Government and four shall be non-official private gentlemen.

APPENDIX A.

Statement showing the boundaries of each of the eight Wards of the Municipal District of Gadag-Bettigeri formed for the purpose of Municipal elections.

Ward No. I.—Bounded on the north by the northern boundary of the municipal district, which commences from the north-eastern extremity of Survey field No. 458, and passes by the north side of Mr. Robertson's bungalow, and runs along the road leading thence to West's Cotton Press where it joins the Cotton Bázár road. The boundary line then passes

along the Cotton Bázár road up to east side of the house of Police Patel Lingangowda, where, turning northward, it runs along the west side of the Uskina nála as far as the well of the abovenamed Patel, then bends westward, and runs along a foot-path leading to the Vackalgeri lane and the Desaye's fort, and terminates at the south-western extremity of Survey field No. 597.

On the West.—By the western limits of the municipal district.

On the South.—By the southern limits of the municipal district.

On the East.—By the eastern limits of the municipal district.

Ward No. II.—Bounded on the north by a road which commences at the Chávdí, and passing by the north side of the houses of Dandapa Manvi and Advepa Kustgi terminates at Kalava's temple opposite the well of Police Patel Lingangowda.

On the West.—By the north-western limits of Ward No. I.

On the South.—By the northern boundary of Ward No. I.

On the East.—By a portion of the Main Bázár road from the Chávdí up to the point where the Main Bázár road joins the Cotton Bázár road between the old Municipal Office and the Jumma Masjid.

Ward No. III.—Bounded on the north by the northern limits of the municipal district.

On the West.—By the western limits of the municipal district.

On the South.—By the northern boundary of Ward No. II.

On the East.—By the northern portion of the Main Bázár road commencing at the Chávdí, and passing by the east side of Koti Lingapa's house up to the Sanjiva Hanmant temple, whence it runs northward by the Hombal toll-bar and crosses the railway at the Hombal-Balganur Railway crossing, and terminates at the north-eastern extremity of Survey field No. 615.

Ward No. IV.—Bounded on the north by a small road, the western extremity of which joins the Main Bázár road near Hombal Police Patel Lingangowda's house and the eastern runs into Kágadgar's lane at its northern end near the house of one Jayachari.

On the West.—By the eastern boundary of Wards Nos. II. and III.

On the South.—By the eastern portion of the Cotton Bázár road from the Police Chauki near the Panchar Hond and the Gobbaraddi well up to the old Municipal Office opposite the Jumma Masjid.

On the East.—By the Kágadgar lane, which commences from a point near one Jayachari's house at the north end, and passes along the east side of Dodtamapa Ilger's new house and of the Butcher's gymnasium, and joins the road leading to the dispensary and

thence by the Nálvádavár's lane which passes on the east side of the houses of Basapa Nálvád and Gowri Irapa, and terminates at the Police Chauki opposite the cattle-pound.

Ward No. V.—Bounded on the north by the northern limits of the municipal district.

On the West.—By the eastern boundary of Wards Nos. III. and IV.

On the South.—By a portion of the northern limits of Ward No. I, commencing from the cattle-pound opposite West's Cotton Press and terminating at the corner of Survey field No. 458, and by the southern limits of the municipal district.

On the East.—By a line which commences at the centre of the eastern boundary of Survey field No. 434, passes along the south side of Survey fields Nos. 433, 488, 496, 497 and 499, at which latter it crosses the Pálá-Bádámi road near the Basel Mission premises, and terminates at the north-eastern corner of Survey field No. 16.

Ward No. VI.—Bounded on the north by the northern boundary of the municipal district.

On the West.—By the northern portion of the eastern boundary of Ward No. V.

On the South.—By a line which commences at the south-eastern corner of Survey field No. 189 and passes by Narsapur Toll-bar, along the Bázár street, up to the new Chávdí in Hospet, runs southward as far as Wali Gurbasapa's house, where, turning westward, it passes along the Bára Imám Masjid, and terminates at the north-eastern corner of the premises of the Basel Mission.

On the East.—By the eastern boundary of the municipal district.

Ward No. VII.—Bounded on the north by a portion of the southern boundary of Ward No. VI. from Hemidás Wallabhram's compound wall inclusive, up to the new village Chávdí.

On the West.—By the southern portion of the eastern boundary of Ward No. V.

On the South.—By the southern limits of the municipal district.

On the East.—By a line which commences at the south-western corner of Survey field No. 431, passes by the Sashwihalli well, and Hanmantrao Koudikop and Jambapa Wanul's houses, and thence running by the Chiniwargatti along the side of Kotrapa Kallgand's house inclusive, terminates near Hemidas Wallabhram's house.

Ward No. VIII.—Bounded on the north by a portion of the southern boundary of Ward No. VI. and by a line passing along the Pálá-Bádámi road and terminating at the north-eastern corner of Survey field No. 202.

On the West.—By the eastern boundary of Ward No. VII.

On the South.—By the southern limits of the municipal district.

On the East.—By the eastern limits of the municipal district.

The Governor in Council is also pleased to direct that "the District Municipal Election Rules" published under Section 12 (c) of Bombay Act II. of 1884, under Government Notification No. 115, dated 14th January 1885, with the amendments of them made by Government Notifications No. 561, dated 17th February 1885, and No. 2597, dated 14th July 1885, shall apply to the said Municipal District of Parántij, and in addition thereto to issue the following order :—
