No. 89.—Under the provisions of Section 42 of the Indian Steam-ships Act, 1884, the Governor in Council is pleased to publish, for the information of persons likely to be affected thereby, the annexed draft of rules proposed to be made under Section 24 of the said Act to regulate the making of surveys of steam-ships at the port of Bombay, and to give notice that the said draft will be taken into consideration on or after the 15th January 1886 :—

Draft.

1. Every application for the survey of a steam-ship at the port of Bombay shall be made between the hours of 10 A.M. and 5 P.M. on any day except Sundays or holidays on a printed sheet in the

form No. 1 hereto annexed, which will be supplied for this purpose at the Port-office, and must be lodged at the Port-office at least three clear days before the day on which it is desired that the survey shall take place.

No application will be attended to, which is not made in conformity with this rule.

2. Upon receipt of an application in the form aforesaid, duly filled in, the Port Officer will, in communication with the surveyors, fix a date and hour at which the survey shall be commenced, and will forward to the applicant an intimation of the date and hour so fixed, together with a list of the requisite preparations for the survey of the steam-ship. The said intimation and list shall be in the form No. 2 hereto annexed.

The Port Officer shall usually arrange for surveys being made in the order in which applications therefor are received.

3. If every part of the steam-ship is not ready for survey at the time so appointed, or if the requisite preparations have not been made in accordance with the list forwarded to the applicant under the last rule, the surveyor may fix some other convenient time for the survey.

If the surveyor is unavoidably prevented from being present at the time fixed, the earliest possible intimation shall be sent to the applicant, and some other time, convenient to the applicant and to the surveyor, shall be fixed for the survey.

With a view to obviate inconvenience and delay, owners and masters, whose vessels are in need of repairs, should communicate with the surveyor, if their vessels have to be surveyed.

5. If a surveyor finds that any defect exists in the hull, machinery or equipments of a steam-ship, he shall, before refusing to give a declaration regarding the ship under section 11 of the Act, address a letter in the form No. 3 hereto annexed to the owner or master of the steam-ship, pointing out such defect and the repairs, &c., necessary to make good the same.

If the surveyor be subsequently informed by the owner or master that the requisite repairs, &c., have been executed, he shall, with the approval of the Port Officer, pay one or more extra visits to the steam-ship, and thereafter either give or refuse a declaration as he shall think proper.

6. Every declaration furnished by a surveyor under section 11 of the Act shall be in the form No. 4 hereto annexed, and shall contain the several particulars therein prescribed.

7. Every such declaration shall be sent, in accordance with section 12 of the Act, by the owner or master to whom it is given to the Port Officer, Bombay.

8. Certificates will be prepared in such form as the Governor General in Council from time to time directs and will be delivered when ready through the Port Officer.

9. The notice to be given under section 13, sub-section (8) of the Act, to the owner or master when a certificate is ready for delivery, shall be given under the signature of the Port Officer, Bombay, in the form No. 5 hereto annexed.

10. The master of any steam-ship, who claims to be exempt from the necessity of obtaining a certificate of survey under section 4 or section 5 of the Act, may obtain a certificate of exemption in the form No. 6 hereto annexed, signed by the Port Officer of any port of survey in which his ship is lying on his making a declaration in writing in one of the forms No. 7 or No. 8 hereto annexed, as the case may be, and satisfying a surveyor of the correctness of the facts stated in such declaration.

11. All correspondence relating to survey of steam-ships should be addressed as follows:—

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12. The duties of a surveyor making a survey shall be regulated by the instructions published in the United Kingdom for the guidance of the surveyors appointed by the Board of Trade, but all references required by those instructions to be made to the Board of Trade and its officers, shall, in the Presidency of Bombay, be made to Government through the Port Officer of Bombay.

13. A fee at the following rates shall be payable for certificates of survey:—

These rates are for certificates which, if not in the meantime cancelled or suspended, will remain in force for one year from the date thereof.

If the ship's hull, machinery or equipments are stated in the certificate to be sufficient only for a period of less than one year from the date thereof, one-twelfth of the above annual amount shall be payable for each month or fraction of a month comprised in the said period: provided that—

(a) the minimum fee shall be one-fourth of the annual fee;

(b) in the case of a new steam-ship coming under survey for the first time the full annual fee shall be payable, whatever be the nature of the certificate.

14. The fee payable under Rule 13 shall be deemed to cover three visits of a surveyor.

An additional fee at the rate of eight annas for every twenty tons or fraction of twenty tons of the ship's tonnage, but not, in any case, exceeding ten rupees, shall be payable for every extra visit that a surveyor makes, with the approval of the Port Officer, before he is able to grant his declaration.

Sirs,

I have to acknowledge receipt of your application for survey of the above vessel under the Indian Steam-ships Act VII. of 1884 and to acquaint you that a surveyor will proceed on board the vessel at o'clock M. of next the day of 188 .

2. I submit a list of the requisite preparations for the survey, which I request may be made before the day and hour above mentioned so as to prevent loss of the surveyor's time, otherwise it will be necessary for the surveyor to postpone the survey to some other day.

3. I beg to call attention to the provisions of section 10 (2) of the Indian Steam-ships Act, 1884, which is as follows:—

"The owner, master and officers of the Steam-ship shall afford to the Surveyor all reasonable facilities for a Survey, and all such information respecting the Steam-ship and her machinery and equipments, or any part thereof, respectively, as he reasonably requires."

2. Master's Certificate
3. Mates' Certificates
4. Engineers' Certificates
5. Last Passenger Certificate
6. Compass Adjustment Certificate signed by the Master and Mate
7. Boats to be uncovered and ready to lower.
8. Pumps to be rigged in their places.
9. Spare tillar to be shipped in its place.
10. Side lamps, lamp for the mast-head light, and lamp for the anchor light to be on deck ready to be put into their places if necessary.

13. Cartridges, blue lights, rockets, and signal gun to be ready for inspection.
14. Fire hose to be connected and coupled and stretched along the deck. The conductor to be connected.
15. Decks, cabins, steerages, and all other passenger spaces to be clean and clear and in a fit state for measurement.
16. Chain cables (or a portion thereof) to be on deck.
17. A safe and proper ladder for going up and down the holds.
18. *Boilers* to be empty, to be quite cool, and the man and mud hole doors to be off.
19. Furnace bars to be out of each boiler.
20. Furnaces, flues, smoke-boxes, and tube-plates to be swept quite clean.
21. The safety valves and weights to be out of each boiler, and a means to be on board for weighing them.
22. All pipes and cocks at the ship's side to be accessible to the Surveyor.
23. Shaft tunnel to be clean and clear for the proper examination of the plumber blocks, bearings, and stuffing box.

In Rule 7, for the words "public stores" should be substituted the words "Government Medical Stores."

For Rule 25 the following rule should be substituted:—

25. The instruments provided gratuitously by Government on the first establishment of a dispensary cannot be returned into store in exchange for others, nor can any instruments be afterwards obtained from the Government stores except upon payment. Unserviceable instruments which may have been originally obtained by purchase or otherwise from the Government Medical Stores must either be returned into store at the expense of the dispensary to which they belong (in which case a receipt will be granted by the Medical Store-keeper for them) or be destroyed in the presence of the Medical Officer in charge of the dispensary, who should sign a certificate that this has been done.

The contribution should be calculated on all works to be carried out by Public Works Agency in the whole of the District, and should, of course, include the amount debitable to the Educational Section of the Local Board. The two per cent. rate fixed for the scrutiny and audit of the accounts kept by Executive Engineers should be shown separately from the ten per cent. fixed for the supervision and execution of the works.

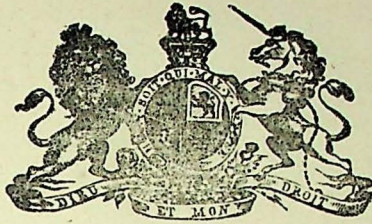
