The fees above prescribed are to be charged for every proclamation issued, and for each person to be served with a summons.

2. The fee for the service of every process or for every proclamation not otherwise provided for in the above table shall be 8 annas.

3. When the services of one or more bailiffs or peons are required for a longer period than three days, the party on whose application the process was issued shall, in addition to the fee leviable under the above rules, be required to pay the whole salary of such bailiffs or peons for the whole period in excess of three days. But the time occupied in going to, and returning from, the place at which service of process is to be made shall not be reckoned as a portion of the above period.

Exceptions.

I. The following processes shall be charged for at double the above rates:—

- (1) Warrant for the arrest of a defendant or of a witness.
- (2) Injunction against waste, &c.
- (3) Injunction to restrain from repetition or continuance of breach of contract or wrongful act.
- (4) Order of attachment before judgment of the property of a defendant or of an absconding witness.

II. No fee shall be charged for any process issued by a Court of its own motion.

4. From and after the 1st January 1886, no additional charge will be made by the Courts in Sind on account of mileage.

BY HER MAJESTY'S HIGH COURT OF JUDICATURE.

APPELLATE SIDE.

The Honourable the Chief Justice and Judges are pleased to direct that the following be substituted for para. 48 on page 180 of the High Court Circulars :—

48. Before issuing any commission under Chapter XXV of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1882, the Civil Court shall, as a general rule, order such sum as it thinks reasonable for the expenses of the commission, to be, within a time to be fixed by the Court, paid into Court by the party at whose instance or for whose benefit the commission is issued. In the order appointing a commissioner it shall be stated that a fee not exceeding a sum to be

fixed by the Court will be paid to the commissioner for the execution of the commission. When the commission is executed to the satisfaction of the Court the full sum mentioned shall be paid to the commissioner; but where the commission is not executed at all, or not fully or satisfactorily executed, or the work done turns out to be less than was expected, it will be in the discretion of the Court to direct a smaller amount to be paid or to make any other order in the matter which it thinks just and proper under the circumstances.

Such fees, when the commissioner is a servant of Government in the Judicial Department, are to be credited to Government in accordance with Government Resolution (Revenue Department) No. 7858 of the 28th September 1885.

The Judge of each District should from time to time call for returns of fees so credited to Government on account of the execution by his subordinates of commissions issued under Chapter XXV of the Code of Civil Procedure.
