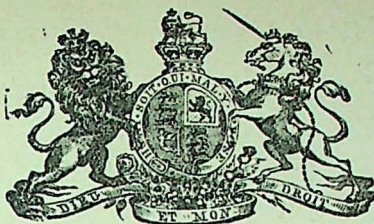

Municipal Commissioner's Office, Bombay, 30th April 1890.

SIR,—I have the honour to request, on behalf of the Municipal Corporation of Bombay, under Act III of 1888, the favour of the sanction of Government to the raising from the public of a loan of Rupees thirty-five lakhs, for the construction of Pawai and other Water Works, Markets, Roads, Stables, Chawls, &c., &c., as per accompanying statement, which gives the particulars required by Rule 5 of the Rules relating to Loans so raised.

Statement showing particulars, pursuant to Rule 5 of the Rules published by the Government of India for the raising of Loans by Local Authorities.

I.—The loan is required for the construction of works as per Statement A attached. The estimate of the cost of the works is Rs. 34,84,524 or say 35 lakhs.

II.—The amount which it is proposed to borrow is Rs. 35 lakhs.

III.—It is proposed to borrow the said sum on the security of the general revenue of the Bombay Municipality, aggregating over 50 lakhs on the average of the three years ending 1888-89 as per supplemental Statement B hereto annexed.

The current year's income, including enhanced Town Duties proposed to be levied to meet extra debt charges, is estimated at Rs. 55,47,300.

IV.—The laws under which funds, duties, taxes, rates, cesses, &c., are levied, received or held are Act IV of 1857 and Bombay Acts VI of 1863, V of 1878 and III of 1888.

V.—It is proposed to raise the loan in the following instalments between July to December 1890:—

1st	...	...	12 lakhs.
2nd	...	...	12 lakhs.
3rd	...	...	11 lakhs.

VI.—The loan is required for a period not exceeding 40 years.

Interest will be paid half-yearly at 5 per cent. per annum (Rs. 87,500 + 87,500 = Rs. 1,75,000 per annum) and a sum of Rs. 29,000 will be annually set aside as a Sinking Fund which, with interest accumulations at 5 per cent., will pay off the whole loan on 1st July 1930 (in not more than 80 instalments).

VII.—The yearly proceeds of each separate source of income are shown in the supplemental Statement B hereto annexed.

VIII.—All expenditure incurred by the Municipality in each of the three years 1886-87, 1887-88 and 1888-89 is shown in supplemental Statement C hereto annexed.

IX.—All existing prior charges upon the funds of the Municipality are shown in the supplemental Statement D hereto annexed.

SIR,—I have the honour to request, on behalf of the Municipal Corporation of Bombay, under Act III of 1888, the favour of the sanction of Government to the raising of a Loan of Rs. 25,00,000 from the public, being a portion of the estimated cost of Tansa Water Works, viz., Rs. 1,23,00,000, full details of which have already been furnished to Government.

The accompanying statement gives the particulars required by Rule 5 of the Rules relating to loans so raised.

Statement showing particulars, pursuant to Rule 5 of the Rules published by the Government of India for the raising of Loans by Local Authorities.

I.—The Loan is required for the construction of a lake in the Tansa Valley and other works incidental to bringing the water from the said lake into Bombay. The estimate of the cost of the work is Rs. 1,23,00,000.

II.—The amount which it is proposed to borrow is Rs. 25,00,000 in addition to 97 lakhs already borrowed with the sanction of the Government of India.

III.—It is proposed to borrow the said sum on the security of the general revenue of the Bombay Municipality, aggregating over 50 lakhs on the average of the three years ending 1888-89 as per supplemental Statement A, hereto annexed.

IV.—The laws under which funds, duties, taxes, rates, cesses, &c., are levied, received or held are Act IV of 1857 and Bombay Acts VI of 1863, V of 1878 and III of 1888.

V.—It is proposed to raise the Loan in three instalments as under :—

VI.—The Loan is required for a period not exceeding 40 or 60 years as may be sanctioned by the Government of India.

It is proposed to make the following arrangements with regard to payment of interest and repayment of Loan, viz.:—

- (a) Rs. 3,70,000 to be set apart annually up to and including 1892, which sum will more than suffice to meet the interest charges on the portions of the loan raised from time to time up to 1892.
- (b) From 1893 the instalment required to meet the interest and Sinking Fund will be Rs. 6,92,000* which will be annually included in the Budget.

Out of this, after paying interest half-yearly on the 1st October and 1st April in each year the balance will either be invested as a Sinking Fund or appropriated to extinguishing a portion of the original loan by buying in Municipal Debentures.

Thus this Loan will be repaid within 40 or 60 years from 1st January 1893, in not more than 80 or 120 instalments as the case may be.

VII.—The yearly proceeds of each separate source of income are shown in the supplemental Statement A, hereto annexed.

VIII.—All expenditure incurred by the Municipality in each of the three last preceding years 1886-87, 1887-88, 1888-89 is shown in supplemental Statement B, hereto annexed.

IX.—All existing prior charges upon the Funds of the Municipality are shown in the supplemental Statement C, hereto annexed.
