The transliteration at present authorised of the names of well-known places, rivers, &c., in Bengal, of vernacular terms frequently used in official correspondence, and of the names of religious festivals, having been reconsidered by the Lieutenant-Governor, the following revised lists, which have been approved by the Government of India, are published for general information and adoption in supersession of the lists published, with the Bengal Government Resolution of 6th March 1874, at pages 530-32, Part I of the *Calcutta Gazette* of the 11th idem. The lists now published

are also intended to supersede so much of the Notifications of 29th May 1876, and 10th December 1877, published, respectively, at pages 535-605, Part I of the *Calcutta Gazette* of 31st May 1876, and page 1686, Part I of the *Calcutta Gazette* of 12th December 1877, as is affected by them.

2. The only names of places of which it is thought desirable to retain, on historical grounds, the accepted spelling, are those in the first list. All other names of places and all technical vernacular terms, which it may be found necessary to use in official letters, should be transliterated on the scientific system. The names of many of the most important places in Bengal will be found in the second list, and the spelling here adopted should be carefully followed in official correspondence. The proper spelling of other less important places will be found in the Civil List, Part XXIXA, and in any other case where doubt may arise, the spelling adopted in Sir W. W. Hunter's "Statistical Account of Bengal" should be followed.
