substance taken out of the water, and in the event of failure to do so within eighteen (18) hours from the receipt of notice by the Dock Superintendent calling upon any such party or parties to take such steps as aforesaid, the master of the said vessel and the party or parties aforesaid shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 100, and the Dock Superintendent may remove such cargo, goods and substance at the expense of such defaulting party or parties as aforesaid and such expenses shall be recovered from such party or parties. In the event of any such cargo, goods or substance being thrown or falling as aforesaid, the master of the said vessel and the party in whose charge the cargo, goods or substance were at the time shall be responsible for all damage which may occur in consequence.
