No. 8123.—The following Notification by the Government of India in the Foreign Department is republished for general information :—

“FOREIGN DEPARTMENT.

Port William, the 1st December 1892.

No. 4426-I.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 4 and 5 of the Foreign Jurisdiction and Extradition Act (XXI of 1879) and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, the Governor-General in Council is pleased to apply the provisions, so far as they may be suitable, of Act XXXVI of 1858 (an Act relating to Lunatic Asylums) as amended by Act XVIII of 1886 and Act XX of 1889, to the Cantonment of Secunderabad, the Residency Bazárs at Hyder-

abad, and the lands in the Hyderabad State occupied by His Highness the Nizám's Guaranteed State Railway, the Great Indian Peninsula Railway, the Dhond-Mannad Railway, and the Madras Railway, subject to the modification that for Section 17-A of the said Act XXXVI of 1858 the following shall be substituted, namely :

‘Whereas the Executive Government has not established within its limits any public asylum for the reception and detention of lunatics, the Governor-General in Council may from time to time appoint any asylum in British India to be an asylum to which any Magistrate or Judge exercising jurisdiction within the Cantonment of Secunderabad, the Residency Bazárs at Hyderabad or the lands in the Hyderabad State occupied by His Highness the Nizám's Guaranteed State Railway, the Great Indian Peninsula Railway, the Dhond-Mannad Railway, and the Madras Railway, may send lunatics or any class of lunatics as to an asylum established under this Act for those limits.’

(2) For the purposes of these provisions the Resident at Hyderabad shall be deemed to be the Executive Government.

(3) For the purpose of facilitating the application of these provisions in the said Cantonment, Residency Bazárs and railway lands, any Court therein may construe them with such alterations not affecting the substance as may be necessary or proper to adapt them to the matter before the Court.

The Notification of the Government of India in the Foreign Department No. 3528-I, dated the 24th October 1890, is hereby cancelled.
