2. The large measure of success which has attended the efforts of the various Local Committees throughout the country has been very gratifying to the Prince, and I have the instructions of His Royal Highness to request that you will be good enough to convey to the individual members of your Committee the expression of His Royal Highness's high appreciation of their hearty co-operation in his desire to found a fitting National Memorial of the Jubilee of the Queen's reign.

3. The very satisfactory progress which has been made, during the first nine months of organized work, towards ensuring the foundation of the Institute upon such a basis as to allow of the extension of its sphere of usefulness in all the contemplated directions, warrants the sanguine expectation that the amount which has been estimated as necessary for that purpose will be provided within no very distant period.

4.
