No. 2252.—The Governor General in Council is pleased to publish the following Rules under which certificates of age and nationality will be issued to Natives of India who are candidates for the examinations for the Indian Civil Service held in England:

General Rules applicable to all Candidates.

I.—A candidate for admission to compete in England for the Indian Civil Service is required before leaving India to obtain a certificate of age and nationality, signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides; or, should he reside in a Native State, by the highest Political Officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.

Note.—In the case of a candidate who has proceeded to England without obtaining a certificate, the certificate may

be granted to his father or guardian, provided that the latter produces the requisite evidence, and, when making the application, states when the candidate went to England, and where he has been residing during his stay in that country.

II.—In order to obtain a certificate, a candidate is required, if resident in British India, to prove the date and place of his birth before the Magistrate of the district in which his family resides, or, if resident in a Native State, before the Political Officer of the State in which his family resides.

III.—A candidate must, if resident in British India, signify to the Secretary to Government of the Province or the Commissioner of the Division in which his family resides, his desire to compete not less than three months before the date on which he proposes to go to England. If resident within a Native State, he must signify his desire in like manner to the highest Political Officer accredited to the State within which his family resides. The officer to whom the application is made shall forward it for the purpose of enquiry to the Magistrate of the District or Political Officer of the State in which the applicant's family resides.

IV.—The Magistrate or Political Officer to whom such application has been forwarded shall call upon the candidate to appear and give evidence of the date and place of his birth and of his nationality within one month. He will carefully examine into the value of the evidence given, and forward a summary of it, with certified copies of all documents tendered, and his comments and opinion, to the officer who forwarded the application to him for enquiry.

V.—The documentary evidence which a candidate may be expected to produce comprises—

- (a) The horoscope.
- (b) Family books.
- (c) Tradesmen's account books showing entries relating to the birth.
- (d) The record of admission in the registers of the school in which the candidate was educated, and the record of the candidate's age at various periodical school examinations.
- (e) If the candidate is matriculated, a certified copy of his application to the Registrar in Form A.

Oral testimony of persons acquainted with the candidate's family, or otherwise able to give relevant evidence, will also be taken; and the candidate is required to comply, to the best of his power, with any requisition the Magistrate or Political Officer, as the case may be, may make in order to clear up any doubt as to the purport of the documentary proof.

VI.—Any declaration of age made after the application of these rules on the occasion of seeking admission to any university examination, educational institution, or Government office, or otherwise recorded in a formal and deliberate manner, will be taken as conclusive evidence in disproof of the subsequent assertion by the same person that he is of different age to that so declared or recorded.

Rules to apply to Candidates born in Her Majesty's Dominions.

VII.—If the Secretary to Government, Commissioner of a Division, or the highest Political Officer accredited to the State, as the case may be, shall be satisfied by the papers submitted that the candidate has stated the date and place of his birth correctly, he will issue a certificate declaring that the candidate has submitted the proofs of his birth to the Magistrate of the district or the Political Officer of the State, as the case may be, and has satisfied him that he was actually born on or about the date stated by him, viz., the day of 18, at a place within Her Majesty's Dominions. Such certificate shall be given in the following form:

I hereby certify that , who is a candidate for the Indian Civil Service, has submitted the proofs of his birth, and has satisfactorily shown that he was actually born on or about the date stated, viz., the day of 18, at a place within Her Majesty's Dominions.

VIII.—If the Secretary to Government, Commissioner of a Division, or the highest Political Officer accredited to the State, as the case may be, finds reason to disbelieve that the candidate was born on the day or at the place asserted by him, the certificate will be refused, and the candidate will be unable to obtain admission to the competitive examination for the Indian Civil Service.

IX.—Where the date and place of birth have been formally registered in a register kept by any public officer in British India, an extract from the register, duly certified by the proper official, shall be accepted as sufficient proof of the date and place of the birth.

Rules to apply to Candidates not born within Her Majesty's Dominions.

X.—In addition to the particulars required by Rule II, a candidate not born in Her Majesty's Dominions must also prove that he is the son or grandson of a person born in those dominions.

XI.—If the Secretary to Government, Commissioner of a Division, or the highest Political Officer accredited to the State, as the case may be, shall be satisfied by the papers submitted that the candidate has stated the date and place of his birth correctly, and has established the fact that, though born without the limits of Her Majesty's Dominions, he is the son or grandson of a person born in those dominions, he will issue a certificate in the following form:

I hereby certify that , who is a candidate for the Indian Civil Service, has submitted the proofs of his birth, and has satisfactorily shown that he was actually born on or about the date stated, viz., the day of 18, and that he was born at , a place without Her Majesty's Dominions, but that he is the ^{son} grandson of a person born in those dominions.

XII.—If the Secretary to Government, Commissioner of a Division, or the highest Political Officer accredited to the State, as the case may be, finds reason to doubt that the candidate was born on the day asserted by him, or that he is the son or grandson of a person born in Her Majesty's Dominions, the certificate will be re-

fused; and the candidate will be unable to obtain admission to the competitive examination for the Indian Civil Service.

PUBLIC ORDERS BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE under the provisions of Section 77 of Act No. XIII of 1856, sanctioned by the Right Honourable the Governor in Council, to regulate the RELIGIOUS PROCESSIONS during the MUHARRAM, and for the PRESERVATION of the PUBLIC PEACE during the Festival of the MUHARRAM.

1st.—No person may erect or carry about a Táboot, Punja or Dholeeka Punja during the ensuing Muharram except under the authority of a License from the Commissioner of Police.

2nd.—No persons may compose any assemblage or procession connected with any Táboot, Punja or Dholeeka Punja, except a License has been granted to carry such Táboot, Punja or Dholeeka Punja.

3rd.—Licenses to carry Táboots, Panjas or Dholeeka Panjas will be granted to Mahomedans only, and all persons obtaining such Licenses must produce them whenever required by any Magistrate or Officer of Police.

4th.—Every such License-holder will be held responsible for the peaceable behaviour of the persons composing any assemblage or procession connected with his Táboot, Punja or Dholeeka Punja and shall enforce the good behaviour of all such persons, and the above clause shall be deemed to be one of the conditions of the License. In the event of any such persons being guilty of any riotous or disorderly conduct in any such assemblage or procession, the Commissioner of Police may, should he see fit, at once withdraw such License by verbal notification that the same is withdrawn, and all persons composing such assembly or procession shall immediately disperse and shall not reassemble or continue to carry about the Táboot, Punja or Dholeeka Punja belonging thereto.

5th.—No music may be played in any of the streets or thoroughfares of Bombay, except under the authority of a License issued by the Commissioner of Police. The Licensee must comply with all the terms and conditions of his License.

6th.—No procession accompanied by music may parade any of the streets or thoroughfares and no persons may join in or compose any such procession, except a License to play music with such procession has been obtained as mentioned in para. 5.

N.B.—Licenses to play music in the streets and thoroughfares will only be granted for the 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th days of the Muharram, and for no other days.

7th.—No persons may go in procession with Táboots on the last night of the Muharram before 12 o'clock, or continue in procession after 3 o'clock on the following morning, nor on the last day before 1 o'clock P. M., and the ceremony must be concluded by sunset.

8th.—No Táboots may go abreast on the public road, and on meeting, every Táboot is to give way, each keeping to the left. On meeting carriages and horsemen, persons accompanying the Táboots must cease playing music, the Táboots keeping to their left side of the road.

9th.—No procession of the Zool-Junnah or horse through the public streets or roads will be permitted.

10th.—No person may carry a sword, dirk, bludgeon, or other offensive weapon.

11th.—Any persons violating the above rules or behaving in a disorderly manner, or making a disturbance of any kind, will be immediately taken into custody and dealt with according to Law.

عاشورہ محرم میں تابوت وغیرہ نکالنے اور خلق اللہ کی امنیت کے واسطے سنہ ۱۸۵۶ عیسوی کے ۱۳ اکت کے ۷۷ دفع کی روسے نیچے لکھے ہوئے احکام پولیس کمشنر صاحب نے مقرر فرمائے ہیں اور انکو سرکار جلالہ مدار نواب مستطاب معلی القاب رائیت آنربل گورنر صاحب بہادر در اجلاس کونسل نے منظور فرمایا:—

پہلا—یہ کہ کوئی ایک شخص اس آئے محرم میں پولیس کمشنر صاحب کے پروانہ لے بغیر تابوت پنچہ یا دولے کا پنچہ بناوے اور عام رستے پر پھراوے نہیں دوسرا—یہ کہ کوئی ایک شخص کونسی ایک جمعیت یا گردش بر نسبت کسی ایک تابوت پنچہ یا دولے کے پنچہ کے بغیر حاصل کرنے پروانے کے اکتھی کرے یا اکتھا ہو کر پھرے نہیں

تیسرا—یہ کہ پروانے تابوت پنچہ یا دولے کا پنچہ پھرانے کے لئے فقط مسلمانوں کو دئے جائینگے اور جن شخصوں کو پروانجات مذکور ملے ہوں انکو چاہئے کہ جس وقت کوئی ایک ماسٹریت یا پولیس کا عملدار طلب کرے تو وہ پروانے انکو دکھلائیں

چوتھا—یہ کہ اوپر لکھے ہوئے قسم کا پروانہ لینے والے کے تابوت کے پنچہ کے یا پنچتہ دولے کے باعث جو جماعت اکتھی ہوئے یا اکتھے ہو کر چلے اس جماعت کے آدمیوں میں سے کچھ فتنہ و فساد نہوئے اسباتکی جوابدہی اس پروانے والے پر ہی اور ایسے سب شخصوں کی چال چلن اچھی رہنے کے لئے اسکو بندوبست رکھنا لازم ہے اور فقرہ مذکور پروانیکے شرطوں میں سے ایک شرط ہے ایسا سمجھنا چاہئے اوپر لکھے ہوئے موجب جماعت اکتھی ہوئے یا اکتھے ہو کر چلے تب انہیں سے کوئی آدمی ہنگامہ یا فساد کرے اور پولیسکے کمشنر صاحبکی نظر میں برابر آوے تو اوپر لکھے ہوئے قسم کا پروانہ واپس لیا ہی اسطور کا زبانی حکم دیکر اسکو فوراً واپس لے لینیکا صاحب موصوف کو اختیار ہے اور تمام وہ جماعت جو اسطور سے اکتھی ہو یا اکتھی ہو کر چلتی ہو لازم ہے کہ ترنت متفرق ہو جاوے اور پھر کر اکتھی نہوئے یا اپنے تابوت پنچہ یا دولے کا پنچہ نہ پھراوے

پانچواں—یہ کہ پولیس کمشنر صاحب کے پروانے بغیر بمبئی کے کونسے ایک رستوں میں سے یا گذرگاہ کے ٹھکانوں میں سے کونسے ایک رستے میں یا گذرگاہ کے ٹھکانے میں کوئی قسم کا باجا بجانا نہیں اور پروانے والے کو لازم ہے کہ وہ پروانے کے تمام شروط اور قوانین کے بموجب عمل کرے

چھٹا—یہ کہ کسی رستے یا گذرگاہ کے ٹھکانے میں کوئی ایک جماعت باجے کے ساتھ بجاتے ہوئے جاوے نہیں اور اوپر کے پانچویں دفعے میں بیان کئے ہوئے بموجب پروانہ لئے بغیر اسطور کے جماعت کے ساتھ باجا بجاتے ہوئے کوئی جاوے نہیں یا اس میں شامل نہوئے

اطلاع—محرم کی ۵، ۶، ۷، ۸، ۹ اور ۱۰ تاریخ کو ہی رستے میں اور گذرگاہ کے رستے میں باجے بجانے کے لئے پروانے دئے جائینگے دوسرے دنوں کے لئے پروانے دینے میں نہیں آینگے
