TREASURY ACCOUNT DEPARTMENT.

From—The ACCOUNTANT GENERAL, BOMBAY;

To—All COLLECTORS and TREASURY OFFICERS.

Bombay, 14th September 1888.

In paragraph 4 (b) of my Circular No. XXVI (T. A. D.), dated 28th August 1888, you were requested to enter the interest paid on Stock Notes discharged by cash payment in the Register of Coupons paid, while in paragraph 5 (d) the interest on notes tendered for conversion was directed to be entered direct in the Cash-book. In modification of these instructions, I have the honour to request that all interest paid on Stock Notes may be entered in the Register of Coupons paid, but in separate value columns, one for coupons that fell due on or before 1st February 1888, a second for interest for the half-year from 1st February to 31st July 1888, paid on notes ten-

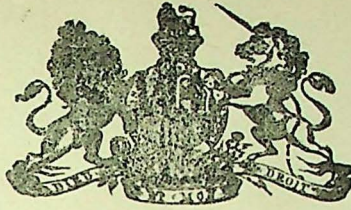
dered for conversion, and a third for interest, for various broken periods from 1st February 1888, paid on notes redeemed by cash payment. The printed numbers of the coupons or notes in respect of which the interest is paid should similarly be entered in separate columns. The prescribed Register of Coupons may be suitably altered by hand for this purpose, the additional value columns being ruled in the space headed "Principal, if renewed."

2. Payments already entered direct in the Cash-book under paragraph 5 (d) should now be entered in the Register.

3. The balances of unissued Stock Notes being returned to the Circle Office, (Assistant Accountant General in charge Currency,) under paragraph 6 of my Circular quoted, a debit for the amount should appear in the monthly plus and minus memorandum, and the closing balances of the memorandum for September 1888 should accordingly be Nil.
