Subsidiary Rules.

1. In these Rules-

- (a) Public conveyance means a tonga drawn by one or two horses, a dhamni drawn by one or two bullocks, or a cart drawn by two bullocks.
 - (b) Day means the period from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- 2. No horse shall be used in a licensed conveyance if below 12 hands 2 inches in height.
- 3. The number of passengers excluding the driver and the weight of luggage allowed to be carried in addition to the full number of passengers shall not exceed the limits laid down below:—

In reckoning the maximum number of passengers, children in arms shall not be counted. Two children, not being children in arms but each being under the age of twelve, shall count as one passenger.

- 4. The fares shown in the table are for the use of the conveyance whether the full number of passengers is carried or not.
- 5. If a public conveyance engaged for the day be retained after sunset, the rates per hour for every hour of such retention shall be payable in addition to the rate for the day.
- 6. In any case in which a conveyance is called from the stand or owner's stable to any place distant more than one-fourth of a mile to take up a fare, the driver or owner shall be entitled to charge in accordance with the above rates in addition to the prescribed fare.
- 7. The driver of a tonga or dhamni is not bound to carry in his conveyance any goods other than personal luggage.
- 8. Horses used in a licensed conveyance shall be changed at each of the stages specified below:—
 - (1) Nagarmanoli between Chikodi Road Railway Station and Chikodi.
 - (2) Chikodi.
 - (3) Kuthali between Chikodi and Nipáni.
- 9. An interval of at least four hours shall be allowed to elapse before horses which have been driven one stage are used again and no animal shall be made to do more than two stages in one day
 - 10. All tolls shall be payable by the driver or owner of the conveyance.
- 11. All conveyances shall be supplied with two clear burning lights during the period between three-quarters of an hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise except where there is sufficient moonlight to render such lights unnecessary.
- 12. Licensees of public conveyances shall, when the yearly licenses and numbers are renewed or on any other date appointed, bring their conveyances and animals before the District Superintendent of Police, Belgaum, or any one authorised by him in this behalf for inspection, and shall satisfy him that the conveyances, horses, ponies, bullocks and harness are in all respects in good order and otherwise fit for the purpose intended, and that the drivers are clean, steady and capable.
 - 13. Every driver shall, when engaged in his occupation, be cleanly and decently clothed.
- 14. No owner or attendant of a conveyance shall be compelled to carry less than the maximum number of passengers for less than the rates fixed for the whole conveyance unless the hirer or hirers and the owner or attendant have made a special agreement to that effect at the time of hiring.
- 15. Any licensee wishing to exchange horses or bullocks passed at the annual inspection may be allowed to do so provided an inspection is held of the new animals.
- 16. When the District Superintendent of Police considers that a horse or bullock is unfit to ply, the licensee on receiving an order to that effect shall produce another animal within the period fixed in the said order. In the event of the licensee not complying with this order, the license shall be liable to be revoked. No fee shall be charged in this case for inspection.

No 5717.—In continuation of Government Notification No. 1301, dated 3rd March 1891, published in Part I, page 238, of the Bombay Governmen' Gazette of the 12th March 1891, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to notify that on and after the 1st November 1909 the whole of the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, XI of 1490, not already in force therein, shall extend to the local area contained within the limits of the Poona Suburban Manicipality.

2. The Governor in Council is also pleased to appoint under sub-section (2 of section 6 of the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, XI of 1890, the Ráo Bahádur Ramnarayan Amarchand Veterinary Dispensary at Poona to be an infirmary for the treatment and care of animals in respect of which offences against sub-section 1 of section 6 have been committed.

- The officer forwarding the Memorandum shall date it and forward it under his signature and the receiving officer shall file it in his office under his signature with the date of filing endorsed thereon. The latter officer shall, except in the case of instruments registered by the Taluka or Petha Village Registrar in the exercise of concurrent jurisdiction, transcribe the Memorandum in red ink in his office indexes according to the date of its being filed, in the same manner as entries concerning documents registered in his office.
- In such cases the date of filing the Memorandum shall be written in column 8 of the receiving officer's index entry below the date of registration and reference to Register in the original Registration Office. All such Memoranda sent to a Village Registrar's Office shall be filed in that office for two calendar years, at the end of which period they may, with the sanction of the Registrar conveyed through the Taluka or Petha Village Registrar, be destroyed."

Explanation.—The limit of a four-bullock cart-load shall be taken to be double the quantity set down for a two-bullock cart-load in columns 2, 3, 4 and 5 of this schedule; that of a camel-load shall be taken to be half of a two-bullock cart-load; that of a pack-bullock, tattoo, horse or mule-load shall be taken to be one-twelfth of a two-bullock cart-load; and that of a donkey-load, head-load or back-load shall be taken to be one-twelfth of a two-bullock cart-load. An article imported by two persons by joint labour shall be taken to be one bullock-load, and an article imported by four persons by joint labour shall be taken to be half a two-bullock cart-load; if imported by more than four persons, then it shall be taken to be a full two-bullock cart-load.

No. 1283-p.—The following notification issued by the Government of Madras, Local and Municipal Department, is published for general information:—

"Whereas the Governor in Council is satisfied that there is danger of an outbreak of plague at Hampi in the Hospet taluq of the Bellary district, if pilgrims are permitted to visit that place on the occasion of the ensuing Sri Virupaksheswaraswami Phala Puja festival.

In exercise of the powers delegated to him under the Epidemic Disease Act, 1897, the Governor in Council prohibits pilgrimage to the said festival from the 24th December 1909 to the 2nd January 1910 inclusive.

All persons proceeding to the said festival in contravention of this notification will be turned back."

No. 23.—The following notification by the Government of India in the Department of Commerce and Industry is republished:—

"TELEGRAPHS.

No. 7571-163, dated Simla, the 8th October 1909.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 7 of the Indian Telegraph Act, 1885 (XIII of 1885), the Governor General in Council is pleased to issue the following rules governing the exchange by radio-telegraph of public correspondence between the temporary coast station at Bombay and ships at sea to have effect from the 15th October 1909.

Duration of Service.

1. The service at the temporary coast station at Bombay will be continuous day and night so long as the ship station is within range.

Form and Acceptance of Telegrams.

2. The form and acceptance of telegrams will be in accordance with the rules for Foreign telegrams as given in the rules published in Notification No. 6975—137, dated the 16th September 1909.

Special rules for Radio-telegrams to ships.

- 3. The address of radio-telegrams for ships at sea should be as complete as possible. It must contain the following particulars:
 - (a) Name of addressee (with any further particulars that the sender may consider necessary for identification of the addressee).
 - (b) Name of ship.
 - (c) Name of the coast station from which the radio-telegrams is to be signalled, i.e., Bombay Radio.

Preamble to Radio-telegrams as sent by ship.

4. All radio-telegrams bear the Service Instruction 'Radio' in the preamble.

In radio-telegrams sent by a ship station to the coast station, the date and the time of handing in are omitted. They are included as part of the preamble in radio-telegrams to ships.

5. On retransmission of a radio-telegram from a ship over the ordinary telegraph system, the coast station inserts for office of origin its own name, followed by the name of the ship from which it has been received; and inserts as the time of handing in, the time of receipt from the ship station. The onward transmission of the telegram to the ordinary telegraph system will then be according to the usual form of transmitting Foreign telegrams in India, except that the word 'Radio' must be transmitted in the Service Instructions, and appear on the copy delivered to the addressee at the office of destination.

Charge for Radio-telegrams.

6. The charge for radio-telegrams between any station in India or Burma and the ships that may communicate with the temporary coast station at Bombay will be eight annas a word. Half of this will be the ship station charge and the other half will cover the coast station charge and that for wire transmission in India or Burma.

The charge for a radio-telegram must in every case be prepaid in full by the sender. Radio-telegrams for stations other than in India and Burma will not be accepted by the ship station.

Classes of Telegrams not admitted in the Radio-telegraphic service.

- 7. Certain classes of telegrams which are admitted in the International Telegraph Service cannot be accepted in the Radio-telegraphic service. They are as follows:—
 - (a) Telegrams with prepaid replies,
 - (b) Telegraphic Money Orders,
 - (c) Collated telegrams,
 - (d) Telegrams with acknowledgments of receipt except as regards their transmission over the lines of the ordinary telegraph system,
 - (e) Telegrams 'to follow' the addressee,
 - (f) Paid Service telegrams, except as regards transmission over the ordinary telegraph system,
 - (g) Telegrams to be delivered by Express (i.e., by special messenger) or post.

Priority of Messages.

- 8. In the transmission of radio-telegrams priority must be assigned first of all to messages of distress, and then according to the order given in Rule 158 of the rules published in Notification No. 6975-137, dated the 16th September 1909, viz.:—
 - (a) State (or Government) telegrams,
 - (b) Service telegrams,
 - (c) Private telegrams.

Undelivered Radio-telegrams from ships.

9. When, for any reason whatever, a radio-telegram from a ship at sea cannot be delivered to the addressee, the coast station will be informed by the office of destination; and the information must be transmitted, if possible, to the ship of origin. It will then be the duty of the operator on the ship station to compare the address on the original form with that given in the notice of non-delivery, and to send a correcting Service message if he finds any discrepancy. In the absence of any discrepancy, he should inform the sender of the non-delivery of the message and of the reason assigned for it.

Undelivered Radio-telegrams on ships.

10. When a radio-telegram reaching a ship station cannot be delivered, that station informs the office of origin by means of a Service Advice.

Distress Signal.

11. As soon as a station perceives the distress signal, it must suspend all correspondence and must not resume work until it has made sure that the communication consequent on the call for assistance has been completed.

Procedure when Signals become doubtful.

12. When signals become doubtful, it is important that recourse should be had to all possible means for effecting transmission. For this purpose, the radio-telegram is repeated, at the request of the receiving station, but not more than three times. If in spite of this triple transmission, the signals are still unreadable the radio-telegram is cancelled. If an acknowledgment of receiving is not received the transmitting station again calls the receiving station. If no reply is made after three calls, transmission is not continued. If the receiving station, in spite of defective reception, thinks that the radio-telegram may be delivered, it inserts the Service Instruction 'Reception doubtful' at the end of the preamble and sends on the radio-telegram.

Message forms to be preserved.

- 13. The originals of all radio-telegrams handed in on boardship and the documents relating to them must be sent to the Superintendent of Telegraphs, in charge, Central Telegraph Office, Bombay, as soon as convenient. Proper precautions must be taken to ensure the secrecy of the forms in the meantime. In the case of radio-telegrams to be delivered to a person on boardship, a duplicate must be made out at the time of receipt. The ship station will send these duplicates to the Superintendent, in charge, Central Telegraph Office, Bombay, where they will be disposed of as directed in Rule 14.
- 14. The drafts will be retained by the Bombay Office until all questions regarding mutilation, non-delivery, etc., have been disposed of. They will then be sent to the Check Office, where they will be preserved for 12 months reckoned from the month following that of handing in.

Refunds.

Refunds will be governed by Rules 348 to 358 of the rules published in Notification No. 6975-137, dated the 16th September 1909, subject to the reservations given in Rule 10.

CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING BRITISH PORTS.

- (I) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having taken into consideration the fact that circumstances may arise in which it may be necessary, on account of periodical exercises, maneuvres, or otherwise, to forbid all entrance to the Naval Ports at night, this is to give notice that on approaching the shores of Great Britain, or any port of the British Empire, if search lights are observed to be in constant operation, the Naval Ports should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist outside, or that the entrances may be altogether closed.
- (2) If an entrance to a port is closed, three *red* vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.

In this case vessels must either proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

II

EXAMINATION SERVICE.

- (1) In the event of relations becoming strained between this country and any Naval Power, it may become necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter the ports or localities in the United Kingdom and His Majesty's Possessions abroad mentioned at the end of this Notice.
- (2) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (4) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the ports and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor.
- (3) As the institution of the Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, at such times of strained relations, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the above-mentioned flags or_lights, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.
- (4) By day the distinguishing flags of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border) and a blue ensign.

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is closed.

By night the steamer will carry -

- (a) Three red vertical lights if the port is closed.
- (b) Three white vertical lights if the port is open.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

- (5) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any of these ports when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions as to entry given to them by the Examination Steamer. In the absence of any instructions from the Examination Steamer they must proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there.
- (6) In case of fog, Masters of vessels are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the Examination Anchorage itself should be approached with caution.
 - (7) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.
