PART I.

Notification.

To have the honour of meeting Their Excellencies the Viceroy and the Countess of Minto, His Excellency the Governor will hold a Reception at Government House, Malabar Point, on Thursday the 18th November 1909, at 9-45 p.m.

2. All Civil, Naval and Military Officers including retired Native Officers of the Indian Army, and Gentlemen, European and Indian, who, together with the ladies of their families, have attended previous Receptions at Government House, Bombay, and who desire to attend this Reception, are requested to send their cards, *not later than the 16th November 1909*, with names and addresses *clearly written* thereon, to the Aide-de-Camp in Waiting, Government House, Kirkee, who will issue the necessary cards to those who are entitled to attend the Reception.

3. Non-official Gentlemen, European and Indian, who have arrived in Bombay since the Reception held at Government House on the 16th February 1909, and who desire, together with the ladies of their families, to attend this Reception, are requested to send in an application by letter addressed to the Military Secretary to His Excellency the Governor, Government House, Kirkee, *not later than Saturday the 13th November 1909*.

4. The letter should state the name, place of residence, and address in Bombay, and the office, rank, profession or occupation of the writer, and should be very legibly written.

5. All Gentlemen entitled to wear uniform will appear in Full Dress. Gentlemen not wearing uniform will appear in Evening Dress.

6. Indian Gentlemen who do not wear European Dress should appear in the dress they wear on high ceremonial occasions. They must either wear boots or shoes of European pattern of black polished or patent leather, or must leave their Native shoes outside.
