“CANTONMENTS.

REGULATIONS.

No. 777, dated Simla, the 13th August 1909.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 26 of the Cantonments Act, 1889 (XIII of 1889), and in modification of the notification of the Government of India in the Military Department, No. 664,† dated the 16th June 1899, as subsequently amended, the Governor General in Council is pleased to direct that the following amendments shall be made to the Cantonment Code, 1899, namely :—

In section 29, sub-section (1), for clause (b) the following shall be substituted :—

‘(b), (i) the payment of a moiety of the salary of the Cantonment Magistrate.

(ii) the payment of such allowances to officers performing the duties of Cantonment Magistrates, as the Commander-in-Chief in India may determine.’

Schedule I, Form 8, (Budget Estimate of Expenditure).—

Under Item 3, General Administration, above ‘Establishment’ the following shall be inserted :—

‘Cantonment Magistrate’.

No. 4347.—The following draft of certain rules, which in exercise of the powers conferred by section 58, sub-sections (2) and (3), of the Pilgrim Ships Act, 1895 (XIV of 1895), and with the previous sanction of the Governor General in Council, it is proposed to make for regulating the disembarkation of pilgrims at the port of Karáchi, is published as required by sub-section (4) of the said section for the information of persons likely to be affected thereby and notice is given that the draft will be taken into consideration by the Governor in Council on or after the 1st day of October 1909.

2. Any objection or suggestion which may be received from any person with respect to the draft before the date fixed aforesaid will be considered by the Governor in Council.

Draft Rules.

1. Pilgrim ships shall (after pratique is granted) if disembarkation can be completed before dark be taken direct to the wharf at Keamari.

2. If disembarkation cannot be completed before dark, or in case of arrival after sunset such ships shall be detained at moorings until the following morning, and shall then proceed direct to the wharf.

3. The pilgrims shall be landed on the wharf for medical inspection and muster.

4. After completion of the medical inspection pilgrims will be subject to the following rules :—

(a) All pilgrims for up-country stations who commence their railway journey at Karáchi will be entrained at the ship's side under the supervision of the Protector of Pilgrims.

(b) Pilgrims proceeding by sea to other ports in the vessel in which they have arrived will be required to re-embark immediately.

(c) Pilgrims desiring to proceed to other ports in any other vessel will be detained under the supervision of the Protector of Pilgrims until such vessel is ready to embark them.

(d) Pilgrims who are residents of Karáchi or who desire to proceed to their homes by land from Karáchi will be allowed to go at once.

5. Any Master of a Pilgrim Ship who commits any breach of rule 2 shall be punished with a fine not exceeding two hundred rupees. Any pilgrim who commits any breach of rule 4 shall be punished with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

No. 4650.—The following draft of certain rules which it is proposed to make for the whole of the Bombay Presidency, except Aden, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 10 of the Bombay Motor-vehicles Act, 1904 (Bom. II of 1904) in supersession of the Motor-vehicles Rules, 1906, as amended from time to time, is published, as required by section 16 of the said Act, for the information of persons likely to be affected thereby, and notice is given that the draft will be taken into consideration by the Governor in Council on or after the 3rd day of September 1909.

Any objection or suggestion which may be received from any person with respect to the draft before the date fixed as aforesaid will be considered by the Governor in Council.

Draft Rules.

I.—Preliminary.

1. (1) These rules may be called the Motor-vehicles Rules, 1906.
- Short title, extent and definition.
- (2) They shall extend to the whole of the Bombay Presidency, except Aden.
- (3) In these rules
- (a) "registering authority" shall mean in Sind the District Magistrate of Karachi and elsewhere the Commissioner of Police for the City of Bombay or the District Superintendent of Police, Poona; and
- (b) "the Act" shall mean the Bombay Motor-vehicles Act, 1904;
- (c) the expression "motor-cycle" means a two, three or four-wheeled cycle propelled by mechanical means, fitted with seats, but without a carriage body and weighing not more than 5 cwt.;
- (d) the expression "heavy motor-vehicle" means a motor-vehicle of two or more tons in weight, unladen;
- (e) the expression "trailer" means any vehicle drawn by or attached to a motor-vehicle;
- (f) the expression "axle weight" means, in relation to an axle of a heavy motor-vehicle or of a trailer, the aggregate weight transmitted to the surface of the road or other base whereon the heavy motor-vehicle or the trailer moves or rests by the several wheels attached to that axle when the heavy motor-vehicle or trailer is loaded;
- (g) the expression "registered axle weight" means, in relation to an axle of a heavy motor-vehicle, the axle weight of that axle as registered by the licensing authorities in pursuance of the rules;

(h) the expression "weight," in relation to a heavy motor-vehicle or trailer when unladen, means the weight of the vehicle exclusive of the weight of any water, fuel or accumulators used for the purpose of propulsion;

(i) the expression "width," in relation to the tire of a wheel, means the distance measured horizontally and in a straight line across the circumference of the wheel and between the two points in the outer surface of the tire which are farthest apart;

(j) the expression "diameter," in relation to a wheel, means the diameter measured between the two opposite points in the outer surface of the tire which are farthest apart.

II.—Registration.

2. (1) No motor-vehicle shall be used unless it has been first registered by the registering authority, and any motor-vehicle which has been already registered in accordance with any other enactment in force for the time being in any part of British India shall,—

(a) if intended for use in the City of Bombay, be registered within 24 hours, or

(b) if intended for use in any other part of the Bombay Presidency shall be registered within 72 hours:

Provided that no person shall be liable under clause (b) of this rule if he has had no reasonable opportunity of registering the motor-vehicle in accordance therewith.

Provided also that it shall not be necessary to re-register vehicles which have already been registered under the Act.

2) The fee for registration shall be rupees four for motor-cycles and rupees sixteen for all other motor-vehicles. There shall be no fee for registering motor-vehicles which have been already registered under any other enactment in force in British India.

3. (1) The registering authority shall assign a distinguishing number, transfer of ownership, &c. of number to the motor-vehicle and shall record the name and address of the owner.

(2) Numbers assigned to motor-vehicles other than motor-vehicles intended to ply for hire

(a) at Bombay shall be shown in white figures on a black ground,

(b) at Karachi shall be shown in red figures on a white ground, and

(bb) at Poona shall be shown in white figures on a red ground;

(c) the numbers shall be of the following dimensions painted on a plate which shall be rigidly affixed in a conspicuous place on the front and back of the motor and on the back of any vehicle drawn by the motor-vehicle:—

Height of each figure $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches, uniform thickness $\frac{3}{4}$ inch, each figure occupying a space of $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches with 1 inch between each figure, and a margin of $\frac{1}{2}$ inch at the top, bottom and sides of the plate :

Provided that in the case of motor-cycles the figure may not be less than two-thirds of the above dimensions.

Proviso:

(7) No number shall in any way be obscured, or rendered, or allowed to become, not easily discernible at a reasonable distance.

(8) Every transfer of ownership shall forthwith be intimated to the registering authority by the registered owners and for every such transfer the fee shall be rupee one in the case of a motor-cycle and rupees three for any other motor-vehicle.

(4) The registering authority may assign to a manufacturer of, or dealer in, motor-vehicles, on payment of an annual fee of rupees thirty, a general number which, together with a distinguishing alphabetical letter of the same dimensions as the numbers, shall be affixed as laid down in rule (2) (c) to any motor-vehicle when on trial after completion, or when on trial by an intending purchaser. Provided that such motor-vehicle shall not ply or be let for hire unless it has been separately registered under rule 2.

4. (7) Before registering a motor-vehicle, the registering authority shall be satisfied (a) that it is provided with two independent brakes or other means of stoppage in good working order and of such efficiency that the application of either is capable of promptly stopping the motor-vehicle whether going forwards or backwards; (b) if such motor-vehicle is propelled by steam that

i. it is so used as to consume its own smoke as far as practicable, .

ii. its funnel top is fitted with an efficient "spark arrester".

(c) If such motor-vehicle is propelled otherwise than by steam that it is so used that no smoke or visible vapour is emitted therefrom except from any temporary or accidental cause.

(2) Before registering a heavy motor-vehicle the registering authority shall also satisfy himself that the tires of the wheels of the vehicle, if the tires are not pneumatic, or are not made of a soft or elastic material, are of the dimensions required by the special rules for heavy motor-vehicles, and may also have the weight of the heavy motor-vehicle, and if he thinks necessary, the axle weight of each wheel ascertained in such manner as he may by general or special order direct.

(3) In the case of applications for the registration of motor-vehicles outside the cities of Bombay, Poona and Karachi, the registering authority may accept the certificate of the District Superintendent of Police of the district from which the application is made that the requirements of sub-rule (1) and

where that applies, sub-rule (2) are, in any particular case, in his opinion specially complied with.

5. Where the registering authority at any time after a motor-vehicle has been registered, considers; on the report of any District Superintendent of Police or otherwise, that it has ceased to comply with the requirements of sub-rule (1) of rule 4, or, if the vehicle is a heavy motor-vehicle, any of the special rules for heavy motor-vehicles, or that it has not been maintained in such a condition as to prevent danger to the public, such registering authority may, after notice to the registered owner, direct that the registration be cancelled until such time as the defects are rectified to its satisfaction.

III.—General.

6. A motor-vehicle shall be driven in accordance with the rules of the road which require a vehicle to keep on the left of the road except when passing horses and other vehicles going in the same direction which should be passed on the right, and provided that it should ordinarily pass a tram-car on the left or near side whether it be going in the same or the contrary direction.

7. (1) A motor-vehicle shall not be driven in a public road or place recklessly or negligently or at a speed or in a manner which is likely to endanger human life or to cause hurt or injury to any person or animal or damage to any vehicle or property or which would be otherwise than reasonable and proper having regard to all the circumstances of the case including the nature, condition and use of the road, and to the amount of traffic which is actually on it at the time, or which may reasonably be expected to be on it :

Provided always that under no circumstances shall a motor-vehicle be driven within the limits of the City of Bombay at a greater speed than 15 miles an hour.

Provided also that when passing through or near any road-side village, within such limits as the District Magistrate may indicate by means of notice boards, motor-drivers shall not allow the speed to exceed 6 miles an hour or such higher rate as may be shown on the board.

(2) The speed at which a heavy motor-vehicle is driven on any public road shall not exceed 7 miles an hour.

Provided that—

(a) if the weight of the motor-vehicle unladen exceeds three tons, or

(b) if the registered axle weight of any axle exceeds six tons, or

(c) if the heavy motor-vehicle draw a trailer, the speed shall not exceed five miles an hour.

Provided also that—

If the heavy motor-vehicle has all its wheels fitted with pneumatic tires or with tires of a soft or elastic material, the speed at which the heavy motor-vehicle may be driven on any public road shall not exceed—

- (a) twelve miles an hour where the registered axle weight of any axle does not exceed six tons;
- (b) seven miles an hour where such registered axle weight exceeds six tons.

8. A motor-vehicle shall not be driven in any footway nor shall such be driven in any road or public place where such traffic may,

Prohibition as to use of motor-vehicles on foot-paths in certain localities.

for the time being, be prohibited by the licensing authority.

9. (1) The person in charge of a motor-vehicle shall obey all directions of Police officers posted or stationed at crossings or other places for the regulation of traffic and shall cause the motor-vehicle to stop and to remain stationary so long as may reasonably be necessary

- (a) when requested to do so by any Police officer for the purpose of ascertaining his name and address or for any other reasonable purpose or
- (b) when approaching restive horses or animals or when requested to do so by any person having charge of a restive horse or animal, or
- (c) when an accident occurs to any person or to any animal or vehicle in charge of any person owing to the presence of the motor-vehicle on the road.

(2) The request referred to above may be made by such Police officer or person by putting up his hand as a signal or at night in such a manner as the licensing authority may direct.

(3) The person in charge of a motor-vehicle shall, on request of any Police officer, or on the occurrence of an accident such as is referred to in sub-rule (1) (c) above, on the request of any other person truly state his name and address and the name and place of abode or business of the owner, and shall further render all possible assistance to any person injured, and if there be no Police officer present shall give intimation of the accident at the nearest Police station.

10. Every person driving a motor-vehicle shall have ready and available for immediate use a suitable horn or, in the case of a motor-cycle, a suitable horn or bell, capable of giving audible and sufficient warning of his approach or position, and shall sound the same whenever expedient to prevent danger to any of the public.

11. No person shall drive a motor-vehicle between half an hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise,

Motor-vehicles to carry lamps.

without three lighted lamps of suitable character and illumination affixed thereto, one on either side of the front portion and one at the back of such motor-vehicle, the light at the back having a red glass facing to the rear and a white glass at the side thereby illuminating and rendering the number of the vehicle easily distinguishable:

Provided that acetylene gas lamps shall not be used for the above purpose unless the same are properly hooded or screened to the satisfaction of the registering authority, but such hooding or screening shall not be insisted upon outside the City of Bombay or elsewhere outside any local limits specially notified by the District Magistrate.

Provided also that one lamp shall be sufficient in the case of a motor-cycle.

12. No person shall drive a motor-vehicle (a) unless it is at all times under full control so as to prevent undue interference with passenger or other traffic, and unless it is maintained in such a condition as to prevent danger to the public; (b) if such motor-vehicle is propelled by steam unless

i. it is so used as to consume its own smoke as far as practicable,

ii. its funnel top is fitted with efficient "spark arresters,"

(c) if such motor-vehicle is propelled otherwise than by steam unless it is so used that no smoke or visible vapour is emitted therefrom except from any temporary or accidental cause.

13. No motor-vehicle shall be allowed to stand in any street or public place unattended by a person licensed under section 4, subsection (2), of the Act, unless all reasonable precautions have been taken to ensure that it cannot be put in motion in the absence of the driver, or, if such motor-vehicle is propelled by steam, unless its fires have been extinguished and it has ceased to contain in itself sufficient power to move it.

14. The driver of a motor-vehicle shall not cause the vehicle to travel backwards for a greater distance or time than may be requisite for purposes of safety or in order to turn round.

15. A manufacturer or a dealer in motor-vehicles shall keep a register in such forms as the registering authority may direct showing the name of the driver and the hours and dates on which he was in charge of the vehicle.

Such register shall be open to inspection on the demand of any Police officer of or above the rank of Sub-Inspector.

16. No motor competition, reliability trial, display or exhibition, in which more than 5 motor-vehicles take part, shall be permitted on any public road without the previous sanction of Government,

Motor competition or reliability trials.

IV.—*Special Rules for heavy motor-vehicles.*

17. On every application to a registering authority for the registration of a heavy motor-vehicle and for permission to ply for hire the applicant shall declare

- (a) the weight of the heavy motor-vehicle unladen,
 (b) the axle weight of each axle,
 (c) the diameter of each wheel.

18. Upon receiving from the licensing authority a copy of the entries made in the register relating to a heavy motor-vehicle or trailer, the owner of the motor-vehicle shall cause

- (a) the registered weight of the heavy motor-vehicle or trailer unladen, and
 (b) the registered axle weight of each axle to be printed or otherwise plainly marked in letters not less than one inch in height, and in such a manner as to be legible at a reasonable distance, upon some conspicuous part of the right or off side of every heavy motor-vehicle or trailer.

This rule shall not apply to trailers not exceeding one ton in weight unladen.

19. (i) The axle weight of an axle of a heavy motor-vehicle shall not exceed the registered axle weight.

(ii) The registered maximum axle weight of any axle of a heavy motor-vehicle shall not exceed eight tons and the axle weight of a trailer shall not exceed four tons.

(iii) The sum of the registered axle weights of all the axles of a heavy motor-vehicle shall not exceed 12 tons.

20. The tires of each wheel of a heavy motor-vehicle or trailer, unless the tires are pneumatic or made of a soft or elastic material, shall be smooth and shall, where the tire touches the surface of the road or other base whereon the heavy motor-vehicle moves or rests, be flat, provided that the edges of the tire may be bevelled or rounded to the extent in the case of each edge of not more than half an inch:

Provided also that, if the tire is constructed of separate plates, the plates may be separated by parallel spaces which shall be disposed throughout the outer surface of the tire, so that nowhere shall the aggregate extent of the space or spaces in the course of a straight line drawn horizontally across the circumference of the wheel exceed one-eighth part of the width of the tire.

21. (1) The width of the tire of each wheel of a heavy motor-car or trailer shall be determined by such of the following conditions as may apply to the circumstances of the case; that is to say—

- (a) The width shall in every case be not less than 5 inches, or in the case of a trailer, 3 inches.

(b) The width shall be not less than that number of half inches which is equal to the number of units of registered axle-weight of the axle to which the wheel is attached.

The unit of registered axle-weight shall vary according to the diameter of the wheel, and the rules set forth in the subjoined scale; that is to say—

(i) if the wheel is 3 feet in diameter, the unit of registered axle-weight shall be $7\frac{1}{2}$ cwt.;

(ii) if the wheel exceeds 3 feet in diameter, the unit of registered axle-weight shall be $7\frac{1}{2}$ cwt., with an addition of weight in the proportion of one hundredweight for every 12 inches by which the diameter is increased beyond 3 feet; and in the same proportion for any increase which is greater or less than 12 inches; and

(iii) if the wheel is less than 3 feet in diameter, the unit of registered axle-weight shall be $7\frac{1}{2}$ cwt., with a deduction of weight in the proportion of one hundredweight for every 6 inches by which the diameter is reduced below 3 feet; and in the same proportion for any reduction which is greater or less than 6 inches.

(2) This rule shall not apply to any tire which is pneumatic or which is made of a soft or elastic material, or to trailers not exceeding one ton in weight unladen.

22. The diameter of a wheel of a heavy motor-vehicle or trailer, if the wheel is fitted with a tire which is not pneumatic or is not made of a soft or elastic material, shall be not less than two feet.

23. A heavy motor-vehicle, and any trailer drawn by any such heavy motor-vehicle, may, when measured between its extreme projecting points be of a width not exceeding 8 feet and no heavy motor-vehicle or train made up of a motor-vehicle with one or more trailers attached to it shall be used on any street or road if such motor-vehicle or train exceeds fifty feet in length.

24. Every heavy motor-vehicle and trailer shall be constructed with suitable and sufficient springs between each axle and the frame of the heavy motor-vehicle.

25. (1) A trailer drawn by a heavy motor-vehicle shall have a brake approved by the licensing authority and the trailer shall carry upon it a person competent to apply the brake efficiently, provided that where the brakes upon the motor-vehicle by which the trailer is drawn are so constructed and arranged that neither of them can be used without bringing into action simultaneously the brake attached to the trailer, or if the brake of the trailer can be applied from the motor-vehicle independently of the brakes of the latter, the above conditions may not be complied with.

(2) No heavy motor-vehicle used on any street or road shall have attached to it more than three trailers.

26. A heavy motor-vehicle which is used as a public conveyance shall not draw a trailer.

27. (i) Where the registering authority or elsewhere than in Bombay, Poona and Karáchi, the District Magistrate or the Executive Engineer or a local board or Municipality or Railway Administration affixes or sets up in suitable and conspicuous positions, on each approach to a bridge, forming part of a highway, notices which, as regards all their contents or subject-matter, shall be clearly and distinctly legible and visible by persons approaching the bridge, and which state that the bridge is insufficient to carry a heavy motor-vehicle, the registered axle weight of which exceeds that specified in the said notice board, the owner of any such heavy motor-vehicle shall not cause or suffer the motor-vehicle to be driven, and the person driving or in charge of the motor-vehicle shall not drive the motor-vehicle upon the bridge.

(ii) The owner of a motor-vehicle shall not cause or suffer the motor-vehicle to be driven, the person driving or in charge of the motor-vehicle shall not drive the motor-vehicle, upon a bridge forming part of a highway at any time when another motor-vehicle or a locomotive is on the bridge, the combined weights of which would exceed the carrying capacity of the bridge.

28. The driving wheels of a heavy motor-vehicle shall be cylindrical and smooth-soled, or shod with diagonal cross bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three quarters of an inch in thickness extending the full breadth of the tire, and the space intervening between each such cross-bar shall not exceed three inches.

29. When a heavy motor-vehicle is used on any road or street two persons shall be employed in driving or attending to such vehicle.

30. The cylinder taps of a heavy motor-vehicle propelled by steam shall not be opened within sight of any person riding, driving, leading or in charge of any horse upon the road or street, nor shall the steam be allowed to attain a pressure so as to exceed the limit fixed by the safety valve, so that no steam shall blow off when the vehicle is upon the road or street.

31. No heavy motor-vehicle, or class of heavy motor-vehicles, shall be driven in any street or road wherein such traffic may for the time being be prohibited in Bombay by the Commissioner of Police, in Poona by the District Superintendent of Police, and elsewhere by the District Magistrate.

32. Every applicant for registration of a heavy motor-vehicle shall make a declaration in the form of Schedule D and append it to his application for registration.

V.—Ghát Roads and Hill-stations.

33. The following rules shall be in force on the ghát roads specified in Schedule E which will be revised from time to time as Govern-

ment may prescribe. On all such roads motorists shall proceed with special caution.

34. In the following rules—

“Night” means the period from half an hour after sunset to half an hour before sunrise. The “outside” of the road on a ghát means the side from which the slope of the hill is downwards.

A “ghát” or “ghát road” means a road constructed on a gradient on the side of a mountain or hill. The District Magistrate shall notify by means of large notice boards on the roadside where each ghát begins and ends.

35. No motor-vehicle shall travel by night on any of the ghát roads between Poona and Maháleshwar or on any other ghát road on which with the previous sanction of Government the District Magistrate has prohibited night travelling by notification in the *Government Gazette* and by erecting notice boards at the top or bottom of the hill.

Exception.—Should a motor-vehicle break down on any road on which night travelling is prohibited, the driver, if unable to accomplish his journey before nightfall, may proceed after executing the necessary repairs but shall halt at the first Police Station he comes to after dark and there give his name and the number of his car and a statement of the reasons why he is travelling at that hour, and shall drive with great caution.

36. Motor-vehicles shall, where practicable, pass all animals or vehicles drawn by animals on the outside, in whichever direction such animals may be proceeding.

37. The driver of a motor-vehicle shall, in passing animals, allow as much space as the width of the road permits.

38. For the present until the District Magistrate notifies that the Kelghar ghát between Maháleshwar and Sátára is available for motorists no motor-vehicle shall be driven on it.

39. (1) No person shall drive a motor-vehicle within the limits of Mátherán, or on the ghát road leading from the main road to Mátherán.

(2) No person shall drive a motor-vehicle within the limits of Maháleshwar, except in accordance with the written permission of the Superintendent, who may grant or refuse such permission at his absolute discretion, and may in granting it prescribe such general or special conditions as he thinks fit:

Provided that on first arrival for, or final departure after, a *boná fide* visit to Maháleshwar for the purpose of residence any person may, without such permission, drive, or be conveyed in, a motor-vehicle which is not a vehicle let for hire to or from his residence.

(3) Motor-vehicles let for hire shall not proceed beyond such place as the Superintendent may notify as the depôt for such motor-vehicles at Maháleshwar.

(4) The Superintendent shall notify by means of notice boards on the roadside such roads as

are closed against all motor traffic and no motor-vehicle shall proceed along any road so closed.

VI.—Forms.

40. Every application for a license under section 4, sub-section (2), of the Act shall contain the particulars specified in Schedule A.

41. Every license granted under section 4, sub-section (2), of the Act shall be in the form of Schedule B.

42. Every application for registration shall contain the particulars specified in Schedule C.

43. All notice boards posted at the sides of the roads under these rules or under section 11 of the Act shall be painted red with the notices inscribed in white letters sufficiently large to be easily legible.

“HOME DEPARTMENT.

EXAMINATIONS.

No. 336, dated Simla, the 23rd July 1909.

In supersession of Home Department Notification No. 188, dated the 18th March 1902, the following revised Regulations under which a limited number of members of the Indian Civil Service, and officers of the Indian Army in civil or political employ (whether temporarily or permanently), will be permitted to present themselves for examination in the Russian language while on furlough are, with the approval of His Majesty's Secretary of State for India, published for information:

1. The Civil Service Commissioners will hold examinations in London four times a year, commencing on the third Tuesday in January, July and October, and on that Tuesday in April which first follows after the date on which Easter Sunday falls, for the purpose of examining officers in Russian.

2. The syllabus of the examination is as follows :

3. Officers who obtain 5 of the total marks will be noted in their record of service as 'Passed' in Russian, and those who obtain 8 will be noted as qualified to be 'Interpreters' in Russian.

4. Applications for permission to appear at these examinations must be made to the Government of India in the Home Department—(a) in the case of an officer directly under the Government of India, through the Department in which he is serving; and (b) by an officer under a local Government or Administration, through the local Government or Administration to which he is subordinate. Applications must not be made to the India Office in London.

5. Such permission will be granted only to those members of the Indian Civil Service and officers of the Indian Army in civil or political employ who seem likely to be employed, before their active service comes to an end, in situations where a knowledge of Russian may be of advantage to the State, and to no one who will not be able to attend the preliminary examination, and also the final one, should he proceed to Russia for a course of study, and to return to duty in India, without exceeding the amount of leave which he may have to his credit, or which may be admissible to him if subject to the Leave Rules for the Indian Army. The Government of India reserve to themselves full discretion to grant or withhold permission in any case.

6. Any officer, of not less than three and not more than twelve years' service, who proves his possession of a sufficient elementary knowledge of Russian by obtaining not less than 275 marks (25 of the total) at one of the examinations held by the Civil Service Commissioners, or passes one of the preliminary examinations in Russian held in India, will be permitted to proceed from England to Russia for a further course of study of the Russian language.

7. After passing the elementary test, and receiving permission to proceed to Russia, he must start from England within a fortnight from the date of the India Office letter conveying such permission unless specially authorised to defer his departure. He must on no account start for Russia until he has received a letter of instructions on the subject from the India Office. No officer on leave on medical certificate will be permitted to proceed to Russia under these rules unless reported fit to do so by the India Office Medical Board.

8. On starting for Russia he will be granted an advance of pay not exceeding 35 days' furlough pay and also not exceeding 100*l.* Such advance will only be granted to an officer who draws his furlough pay from the India Office, and will be recovered in instalments spread over eight months after his arrival in Russia.

9. Shortly after his arrival in Russia, he shall report to the India Office his address and the date of his entering Russia. Any subsequent change of his address shall likewise be reported. In the case of an officer of the Indian Army he is required to report himself on arrival to the Military Attaché at St. Petersburg, whether he chooses that city or another as his place of residence.

10. Every officer is expected to present himself for final examination twelve months after passing the elementary test; and of those twelve months at least ten must have been spent in Russia.

11. Two months before his final examination, he shall notify to the India Office the address in England to which his order for examination should be sent by the Civil Service Commissioners.

12. On his return to England he shall report to the India Office in writing his arrival and the date of his crossing the Russian frontier on his return. If he left India on medical certificate, he shall apply for permission to appear before the Medical Board at the India Office. He shall not leave Russia, either temporarily or permanently, earlier than fourteen days before the final examination, without obtaining leave of absence for a definite period from the Under Secretary of State for India.

13. If he succeeds at the final examination in qualifying to be an Interpreter in the Russian language, he shall receive a gratuity of 125*l.* and a further consolidated sum of 32*l.* or 42*l.* in repayment of his travelling expenses to and from St. Petersburg or Moscow, as the case may be. The gratuity of 125*l.* shall be paid only in cases where there has been the full term of residence in Russia for the purposes of study. He will also be granted a free passage from England to India; and will be treated with retrospective effect* as an entitled passenger to England or to Russia when first proceeding there. No grant on account of travelling expenses shall be made to an officer who fails to qualify to be an Interpreter, but he may earn the gratuity and the consolidated sum for travelling expenses if he succeeds at any subsequent examination in qualifying to be an Interpreter, provided he has not more than 12 years' service at the time of re-examination.

14. If he succeeds in passing a further test five years after qualifying as an Interpreter, he will be entitled to a further gratuity of 75*l.* The syllabus of this further test is the same as that of the interpretership examination, with the omission of items 4, 5 and 6. In order to qualify, 80 per cent. of the total marks or 640 must be obtained. The examination will be carried out in India, and officers will be allowed two chances of requalifying, and two only, and in the event of failure at the second attempt, their names will be removed from the list of Russian Interpreters.

15. Whether successful or not at the final examination, he shall rejoin in India within two months from the date on which it began, unless his leave or furlough extends beyond that period. If however, his leave has been granted under medical certificate, it will be necessary for him as usual to obtain a certificate that he is in a fit state of health to return to his duty.

16. A member of the Indian Civil Service or a Military Officer subject to the Civil Leave Rules shall be entitled to count as Indian duty for promotion and pension, but not as service for furlough, the period of ten months spent in Russia. The whole time passed in the course of study and until the date of his return to duty in India will be treated as part of the furlough taken, and he will be entitled to the usual furlough pay.

17. A Military Officer in civil employ, but subject to the Leave Rules for the Indian Army, shall be entitled to count as Indian duty for promotion and pension the period spent in Russia, and to draw for such period the equivalent, at the privileged rate of exchange, of the Indian pay and allowances of his rank, and the half staff salary of his substantive appointment; provided that if the sterling amount be less than his leave pay under the Leave Rules for the Indian Army, then leave pay shall be allowed. He will be considered as on leave before arrival in Russia; and from the date of quitting Russia until he rejoins his appointment in India, under the conditions of Regulation 15. The period spent in Russia will not be considered as part of the two years' maximum absence from duty allowable under the Leave Rules for the Indian Army.

18. When an officer who has qualified as an Interpreter in Russian is on leave in England, he may, with the sanction of the Secretary of State for India on the recommendation of the Government of India, be permitted to proceed to Russia to keep up his knowledge of the language; and provided that he remains in Russia at least two months, he will, on his return to London, receive a sum of 32*l.* or 42*l.* in respect of his travelling expenses to and from St. Petersburg or Moscow, as the case may be, and, if desired, he will have his leave extended by two months without prejudice to the advantages accruing under the rules relating to combined leave, if on combined leave.

19. The half-yearly examinations in India are held in January and July, and the names of the officers who are recommended by the Government of India for permission to proceed direct from India to Russia will be communicated to the India Office as soon as the result of the examination is known. The names of the officers who are finally selected will be communicated by the India Office to the Government of India, who will give authority to each officer to take up his

In any of the three cases he will be entitled to receive, after returning to India, his travelling expenses from his station to the port of embarkation before starting for England.

If more than 18 months have elapsed since an officer passed the preliminary test he will be required to undergo a fresh examination before receiving permission to proceed to Russia.

20. The passport of an officer proceeding direct from India to Russia will be issued either by the Governor General of India, or by the Governor of Madras or of Bombay. The necessary *visa* should be procured by the officer at Port Said or any other place on the route where there is an accredited Russian Agent.

Draft Notification.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 6, sub-section (1), of the Indian Ports Act, 1908 (XV of 1908), the Governor in Council is pleased to direct that the following rule shall be added to the rules under the said Act for the control of bulk-oil vessels in the Port of Bombay, published in Government Notification in the Marine Department, No. 100, dated the 13th October 1903 :—

" 11. The discharge of non-dangerous petroleum, not being petroleum in bulk, alongside the wharf will be permitted under the following regulations :—

(a) After the discharge of petroleum in bulk is completed, any vessel requiring, and having received, the permission of the Port Officer to discharge non-dangerous petroleum, not being petroleum in bulk, at the wharf, shall be so moored to the satisfaction of the Port Officer as to be safe for a limited number of lighters to be allowed alongside.

- (b) *Before commencing the discharge of such oil, the bulk oil tanks of the vessel shall be closed and secured.*
- (c) *The number of lighters to be allowed alongside at any one time will be at the discretion of the Port Officer but will in no case exceed two.*
- (d) *No lights or fire in any form will be allowed on board the lighters while lying alongside.*
- (e) *Lighters will not be allowed alongside while petroleum in bulk is being discharged.*
- (f) *Permission to discharge non-dangerous petroleum, not being petroleum in bulk, at the wharf will not be granted if any other vessel requires the berth for the purpose of discharging petroleum in bulk.*
- (g) *Vessels will not be permitted to coal or to take cargo on board while lying at the wharf.*
- (h) *The Master of any vessel discharging under these rules will be held responsible for their due observance."*
