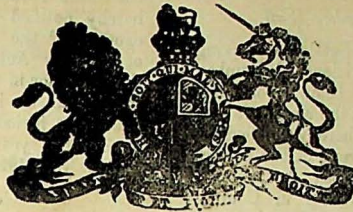

BY DISTRICT MAGISTRATES.
