No. 1883.—In accordance with Rule 8 of the Rules prescribed in the Notification by the Government of India in the Department of Finance and Commerce No. 16, dated 1st January 1889, republished in the *Bombay Government Gazette* of the 10th idem, under No. 116, dated 9th idem, Financial Department, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to publish the following application from the Ahmedabad Municipality for permission to raise a loan of Rupees one Lakh under the provisions of the Local Authorities Loans Act of 1879:—

Sir,

We, the President of the Municipality and the Chairman and Members of the Managing Committee, beg to request, as desired in the Government Resolution, dated 28th January 1896, No. 368, that Government will be pleased to allow this Municipality to raise a Loan of Rs. 1,00,000 at an interest of 4½ per cent. per annum repayable in 26 years.

The particulars required under the rules of the Local Authorities Loans Act are as follows:—

- I. The loan is required for the purpose of paying off part of the former loan borrowed from Government for Drainage works in the year 1892. The loan is to be raised by issuing 200 debentures of Rs. 500 each at par to various charitable institutions of public utility specified in the correspondence embodied in the Government Resolution, dated 28th January 1896, No. 368.
- II. The amount of the loan to be raised is Rs. 1,00,000 (one Lakh).
- III. The fund on the security of which it is proposed to raise the loan is the general revenue of the Municipality, and the authority under which the loan is to be raised is the Local Authorities Loans Act II of 1879.
- IV. The laws under which the abovementioned municipal revenue is raised are the District Municipal Act VI of 1873 and the Amendment Act II of 1884.
- V. The dates between which the loan is to be raised will range from 1st July 1896 to 31st December 1896.
- VI. The period for which the loan is required is 26 years. The loan, a part of which is to be repaid, was granted by Government in 1892 for a period of 30 years; and as Government desire that the term of period originally fixed for repayment should not be extended for the new loan, the period for repayment of this loan is fixed for 26 years.
- VII. The statements showing the yearly receipts and expenditure of this Municipality are forwarded herewith.
- VIII. The existing total liability upon the Municipality at the end of 1894-95 is Rs. 12,13,964-5-2, with a sinking fund amounting to Rs. 43,173-7-3; but as the proposed loan is to repay a portion of the existing debt, there will be no difference in the amount of the total liability.
- IX. As this loan is to be repaid in 26 years, a sum of Rs. 4,250 will be required annually to pay interest at 4½ per cent., and a sum of Rs. 2,593 per annum will be set aside for the sinking fund calculated on the basis of 3 per cent. interest.
- X. As this loan of 4½ per cent. is to repay a former loan of 4½ per cent. it is unnecessary to submit any remarks regarding the ability of the Municipality to meet this liability.

We hope all the formalities required for sanctioning the issue of this loan will be duly passed through, so as to allow the Municipality to issue the debentures of this loan as soon after 1st July 1896 as may be practicable.

RESOLUTION—By the Government of India, Public Works Department.

General Rules of 1895 for working open lines of railway in British India administered by the Government.

Read—

Section 47 of the Indian Railways Act, 1890.

Government of India Public Works Department Circular No. 6 Ry., dated 12th March 1895, promulgating certain general rules made under section 47 of the Indian Railways Act, 1890, for the guidance of the public and railway officials employed on open lines of railway in British India administered by the Government, and directing that the administrations of railways not so administered should be invited to move for sanction to the application of the said general rules subject to such modifications as might be considered necessary in each case.

Government of India Public Works Department Circular No. 15 Ry., dated 22nd July 1895, postponing the date of introduction of the general rules referred to above to 1st January 1896.

Government of India Public Works Department Circular No. 19 Ry., dated 9th December 1895, further postponing the date of introduction to 1st July 1896.

Director General of Railways' letter No. 195 T., dated 25th April 1896, and enclosures.

OBSERVATIONS.—Certain railway administrations have proposed modifications in some of the general rules cited in the preamble which were framed under section 47 of the Indian Railways Act, 1890, for the guidance of the public and railway officials employed on open lines of railway in British India administered by the Government, and the Director General of Railways has applied for sanction to adopt the said modifications on State Railways, with certain further amendments.

RESOLUTION.—The Governor General in Council having considered the suggestions put forward is pleased, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 47 of the Indian Railways Act, 1890, to approve of the adoption of the amended rules, as set forth in the schedule to this resolution, in place of the corresponding rules, promulgated under Circular No. 6 Ry., dated 12th March 1895, on all lines of railway in British India administered by the Government, and for the time being used for the public carriage of passengers, animals, or goods, and to direct that the said General Rules so modified shall, in supersession of the orders in Circular No. 19 Ry., dated 9th December 1895, come into force on the above mentioned railways from the 1st August 1896, and that their introduction on the railways not administered by Government be postponed until further orders.

The Governor General in Council also desires that the said amended rules may be brought to the notice of the administrations of the several railways not administered by the Government, and that the Agents and Managers of those railways may be invited to submit formal applications for the adoption of the general rules as modified.

ORDER.—Ordered, that this circular, with the schedule annexed, be published under a notification in Part I of the *Gazette of India* as required by section 47, sub-section (3) of the Indian Railways Act, 1890, and that the General Rules as now amended be kept for inspection at railway stations as directed by sub-section (c) of the same section.

Schedule showing modifications of the open line general rules circulated with Government of India Circular
No. 6 Railway, dated 12th March 1896.

PART I.

1. (17) "Authorized officer" means the person who is duly empowered by general or special order of the railway administration, either by name or by office, to issue instructions or to do any other thing of the nature referred to in each case.

NOTE.—Such order shall not empower an authorized officer to depute the power conferred upon him thereby to any other person.

67. The guard or person in charge of a ballast train on any part of the main line outside station limits shall be responsible that the line is cleared and the Station Master advised not less than ten minutes before a train is due. On lines worked on the "Absolute block" system the line must be cleared and the Station Master advised not less than five minutes before a train is due to enter the section from either end.

69. A Fixed or Permanent signal is a signal erected for controlling the movement of trains, and is constructed with one or more semaphore arms, discs or other appliances for use by day and lamps for use by night.

N.B.—A Point Indicator, *vide* rule 73, is not a signal.

70. No Fixed or Permanent signal shall be used unless it is constructed to show "danger" in case of any failure in its connections.

72. (1) Fixed or permanent signals, especially when used as "Distant signals," "Main signals" (otherwise called "Station signals," or "Home signals") and "Starting signals" shall ordinarily be of the semaphore type.

72. (2) Distant signals are signals placed at a considerable distance from the station and shall, except when under the proviso to Rule 101 they are used as stop signals, be distinguished by a notched arm, thus—

72. (7) Distant, Main and Starting signals shall be used only in connection with trains approaching, entering, or leaving stations, respectively, and shall not be used for shunting or for any purpose other than the control of trains as aforesaid.

72. (8) When a Disc signal is used as a Fixed or Permanent signal, a disc, bar or other appliance must be exhibited by day and the lights prescribed in rule 71 by night.

73. Point Indicators are appliances attached to points to show for which road the points are set, and shall be so constructed as to be easily distinguished from Fixed or Permanent signals.

Point indicators will apply to all vehicles, whether forming part of a train or not, passing over the lines to which they refer.

85. (1) Shunting operations shall be controlled either by "Fixed or Permanent signals" specially set apart for the purpose, or by hand signals, or by verbal directions as occasion may require.

85. (4) When after a Main or Distant signal has been lowered to admit a train, it is found necessary to obstruct the line on which the train is to be received, the signal must be replaced at danger, and the train brought to a stand before the obstruction is permitted.

86. (1) Except in case of emergency, Platelayers or other workmen employed on the permanent-way shall not work under the protection of the Fixed or Permanent signals, but must invariably use special signals.

91. (2) Unless this duty is imposed on some other railway servant by the authorized officer, the Station Master shall be held responsible that the signals are not lowered to admit a train until all facing points over which the train will pass are correctly set and secured and trailing points correctly set, and that the line over which the train will pass is free from obstructions.

110. When a train has been shunted for another train to pass, the side-lamps must be reversed or so disposed as to avoid showing red to a following train.

113. (1) Unless this duty is imposed on some other railway servant by the authorized officer, the Station Master will be responsible that all facing points over which a train will pass are correctly set and secured and trailing points correctly set.

He will be similarly responsible that all safety points and catch sidings, when it is not necessary that they should be opened, are closed and secured against the line which they are intended to protect.

N.B.—Old rules 73 (1) and 73 (2) are amalgamated and recast and become 72 (8), 73 (3) is recast as 73 above, and old rule 91 (2) becomes 91 (3).

142. The Guard in charge of a train must satisfy himself, before the train is despatched from any station and during the journey,—

* * * * *

(c) that the vehicles are in good order and properly coupled up, and if sheeted, that the sheets are properly secured,—

o * * * * o

(f) that the windows of all empty compartments and all lamp-holes are closed.

155. No wagon or truck shall be so loaded as to exceed the maximum gross load on the axles prescribed by the Governor General in Council under the Indian Railways Act, 1890, section 19, sub-section (1), clause (c), or other less load prescribed by the authorized officer.

166. (3) If the Guard or the Station Master has reason to apprehend danger from any such vehicle before it can be inspected by a Carriage and Wagon Examiner, the guard shall consult the driver, and if, after such consultation, he considers it necessary to do so, he shall have the vehicle detached from the train.

187. The Station Master must see that the shunting of trains or the crossing of trains from one line to another is performed only at such times and in such a manner as will not involve danger.

211. Each Inspector of permanent-way or authorized officer must see that all broken or defective rails, chairs, sleepers or other permanent way materials on the length of line under his charge are removed from the road with the least possible delay, and that sound materials are substituted for them.

212. Each Ganger must—

* * * * *

(c) unless that duty is imposed on some other railway servant by the authorized officer, keep the fences thereof in repair.

218. (1) No Inspector of permanent-way or authorized officer shall change or turn a rail or commence any operation which would obstruct the line and necessitate the showing of a danger signal,—

(a) if within station limits,—

until he has obtained the permission of the Station Master and has seen that special signals prescribed in rule 86, clause (2) are clearly exhibited and until all necessary signals have been placed at "danger;" or

(b) if outside station limits,—

until he has seen that—

(i) a "danger" signal has been plainly shown, and

(ii) two detonators have been placed on the line, ten yards apart, at a distance of at least three-quarters of a mile from the place of obstruction, on a double line in the direction from which trains come on the line obstructed, and on a single line in both directions.

(2) In case (a), the signals must, if necessary, be kept at danger as provided in rule 91 (3) until the Station Master has been informed by the Inspector of permanent-way or authorized officer that the line is again clear and safe for traffic.

(3) In either case the Inspector of permanent-way or authorized officer must himself be present at the spot until the line is clear.

224. (1) Ballast shall not be thrown up between the rails higher than rail level and must be thrown as much as possible on the outside of each line or between the two roads.

231. The person in charge of a wagon, truck, lorry, or other impediment causing an obstruction on any line on which a train is expected shall be responsible that the obstruction is removed and the Station Master advised not less than ten minutes before the train is due. On lines worked on the "Absolute block" system the obstruction must be removed and the Station Master advised not less than five minutes before the train is due to enter the section from either end.

PART II.

23. Except as provided in Appendix B, rule 6—VI (a), vehicles loaded with explosives shall be sent only with a goods train, and shall be placed in the rear of the train, but not next the rear brake-van.

Provided that vehicles loaded with ammunition or other explosives belonging to troops may be sent with the train by which the troops travel, but must be placed next behind the front brake-van.

2. Except as is hereinafter (in these rules) otherwise provided, no goods shall be transhipped unless and until—

- a tranship permit covering the same is produced;
- the transhipment fees, if any, payable in respect thereof have been paid;
- an order to let tranship has been obtained in writing on the tranship permit.

3. (1) When it is desired to tranship goods (not being arms and ammunition or explosives or petroleum as defined respectively in the Arms, Explosives and Petroleum Acts), from one steamer to another and the receiving steamer is to start within twenty-four hours of the arrival of the discharging steamer, such transhipment may be effected within the said period with the permission and under the superintendence of the Preventive Officer on board, in anticipation of the production of a tranship permit and of the payment of the transhipment fees, if any, payable in respect thereof; provided that the Agent or Master of the discharging steamer furnishes the said Preventive Officer with a list of all the goods which it is desired so to tranship.

(2) The tranship permit for the goods so transhipped shall be obtained and the transhipment fees, if any, payable in respect thereof shall be

paid immediately after the Import General Manifest has been put in.

4. When goods are discharged for transhipment before entry inwards of the vessel under special pass granted under Section 59 of the Sea Customs Act VIII of 1878, the cargo boats into which such goods have been so discharged shall remain alongside the discharging vessel at ships' risks until either a tranship permit has been produced or a list of such goods has been furnished, as the case may be, to the Preventive Officer on board the discharging vessel.

5. In the case of dutiable goods or goods the importation of which into British India is restricted by any law and the transhipment of which is not subject to any special regulations, leave to tranship to any foreign port on the continent of India or any port in Ceylon, other than a port included in any Customs Union with the British Indian Government, shall not be given unless the goods are to be transhipped into a steamer.

6. When goods which are to be transhipped are temporarily deposited on a wharf or in a shed, the Preventive Officer or Wharfinger shall not allow the removal of the said goods, or any of them, from the wharf or shed without the production of all such documents as are required by these rules.

No. 4339A.—Whereas by the Indian Tariff Act No. III of 1896, Schedule III, No. 1, a special *ad valorem* duty of 5 per cent. is imposed on spirit rendered unfit for human consumption imported into British India, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased, in exercise of the power conferred by Section 155 of the Sea Customs Act, 1878, to make the following rules for ascertaining and determining what spirit imported in the Port of Karachi shall be deemed to have been effectually and permanently so rendered unfit, and for causing such spirit to be so rendered if necessary:—

(1) Whenever an importer makes entry in accordance with Section 86 of the Sea Customs Act of any spirit rendered unfit as aforesaid, he shall state on the Bill of Entry relating thereto whether he claims to import it on payment of the above special duty only or is willing to pay the ordinary rate prescribed by the Indian Tariff Act for spirits, viz., Rs. 6 per Imperial gallon or six quart bottles of the strength of London proof, with a *pro rata* increase or decrease for strengths above or below London proof respectively.

(2) If the ordinary rate of duty is paid, the spirit will be passed in the usual manner. If payment of the special duty only is claimed, the following rules shall be enforced.

(3) If the spirit is imported from the United Kingdom, and the importer produces a certificate signed by a Customs or Excise authority of the United Kingdom, and himself makes a declaration on the face of his Bill of Entry each to the effect that the spirit has been rendered effectually and permanently unfit for human consumption, such spirit may, if the Collector of Customs is satisfied with the certificate produced, and if, upon such examination of the spirit, if any, as he thinks fit to cause to be made by a Customs House Gauger, he is satisfied that the spirit has been so rendered unfit for human consumption, be admitted on payment of the special duty.

(4) If the spirit is imported from a country other than the United Kingdom, or if it is imported from the United Kingdom unaccompanied by a certificate as aforesaid, it shall be examined by a Customs House Gauger, and if upon the report of such Gauger the Collector of Customs shall be satisfied that the spirit has been rendered unfit for human consumption as aforesaid, it shall be admitted on payment of the special duty.

(5) No spirit not admitted on payment of the special duty under Rule 3 or Rule 4 shall be so admitted unless, before it is removed from the Customs House, it is rendered unfit for human consumption on the Customs House premises and in the presence of a Customs House Gauger, by admixing therewith pyroxilic spirit (methylic alcohol) in the proportion of one gallon of pyroxilic spirit to nine gallons of the imported spirit.

(6) The admixing of the spirit must be effected and the requisite pyroxilic spirit must be procured by the importer, or by his agent or authorized servant, at his own expense. Samples of pyroxilic spirit of approved quality will be kept at the Customs House, against which any pyroxilic spirit brought by an importer, or his agent or authorized servant, shall be tested by a Customs House Gauger, before the latter is used under the last

preceding rule. If the latter spirit is not equal to the samples, such additional proportion thereof shall be admixed with the imported spirit as the Collector of Customs shall direct.

(7) When the admixing has been duly effected, the Customs House Gauger, in whose presence it was effected, shall certify to that effect below the importer's Bill of Entry, and the admixed spirit shall thereupon be admitted on payment of the special duty leviable thereon.

(8) If an importer is dissatisfied with the opinion of a Customs House Gauger under any of the foregoing rules, a sample of the spirit in question shall be sent for examination and report to the Chemical Analyser to Government, whose opinion thereupon shall be final.

PUBLIC ORDERS by the Commissioner of Police under the provisions of Section 77 of Act No. XIII of 1856, sanctioned by the Right Honourable the Governor in Council, to regulate the RELIGIOUS PROCESSIONS during the MOHURRAM, and for the PRESERVATION of the PUBLIC PEACE during the Festival of the MOHURRAM.

1st.—No person may erect or carry about a Táboot, Punja or Dholeeka Punja during the ensuing Mohurram, except under the authority of a License from the Commissioner of Police.

2nd.—No person may be a member of any assemblage or procession connected with any Táboot, Punja or Dholeeka Punja, except when License has been granted to carry such Táboot, Punja or Dholeeka Punja.

3rd.—Licenses to carry Táboots, Pujas or Dholeeka Pujas will be granted to Mahomedans only, and all persons obtaining such Licenses must produce them whenever required by any Magistrate or Officer of Police to do so.

4th.—Every such License-holder will be held responsible for the peaceable behaviour of the persons composing any assemblage or procession connected with his Táboot, Punja or Dholeeka Punja, and shall enforce the good behaviour of all such persons, and the above clause shall be deemed to be one of the conditions of the License. In the event of any such persons being guilty of any riotous or disorderly conduct in any such assemblage or procession, the Commissioner of Police may, should he see fit, at once withdraw such License by verbal notification that the same is withdrawn, and all persons composing such assembly or procession shall immediately disperse, and shall not re-assemble or continue to carry about the Táboot, Punja or Dholeeka Punja belonging thereto.

5th.—No music may be played in any of the streets or thoroughfares of Bombay, except under the authority of a License issued by the Commissioner of Police. The Licensee must comply with the terms and conditions of his License.

6th.—No *Mella* or *Swiri* processions connected with any Táboot, Punja or Dholeeka Punja shall be permitted to parade any of the streets or thoroughfares after 2 o'clock A.M.

7th.—No procession accompanied by music may parade any of the streets or thoroughfares and no person may join in or be a member of any such procession, except when a License to play music with such procession has been obtained as mentioned in paragraph 5.

N.B.—Licenses to play music in the streets and thoroughfares will only be granted for the 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th days of the Mohurram, and for no other days.

8th.—No persons may go in procession with Táboots on the last night of the Mohurram before 12 o'clock, or continue in procession after 3 o'clock on the following morning, or on the last day before 1 o'clock P.M., on which day the ceremony must be concluded by sunset.

9th.—Two or more Táboots may not proceed abreast on the public road, and when two Táboots meet, each Táboot must keep to the left to make

way for the other. On meeting carriages and horsemen, persons accompanying the Táboots must cease playing music, the Táboots keeping to their left side of the road.

10th.—No procession of the Zool-Jannah or horse through the public streets or roads will be permitted.

11th.—No person may carry a sword, dirk, bludgeon, or other offensive weapon.

12th.—Any persons violating the above rules or behaving in a disorderly manner, or making a disturbance of any kind, will be immediately taken into custody and dealt with according to law.
