*Channel Reef Buoy replaced in position.*

Information has been received from the Port Officer, Aden, dated 16th instant, that the channel reef buoy in Zeila Roadstead has been replaced in position.

The buoy is painted red, carries a staff with a flat piece of wood painted white, and shows two feet out of the water.”

No. 67.—The following Notice to Mariners, dated 23rd May 1896, received from the Agent to the West of India Portuguese Guaranteed Railway Company, Limited, is published for general information:—

“MORMUGAO HARBOUR.

The red buoy marking Mormugao Rock will, from the 24th May, be temporarily replaced by a black conical buoy. This should be considered a porthand buoy.

2. During the monsoon the rock will not be buoyed, but afterwards a black can buoy will be placed to mark it.

3. The black conical buoy with staff and cage which has hitherto marked the end of the rubble mound as a starboard hand buoy, will at the end of May be permanently replaced by a red conical buoy.

4. The red light at the end of the break-water will be removed during the monsoon.”

No. 68.—In accordance with the provisions of Section 74 of the Bombay Port Trust Act, 18'9, the following additions which the Trustees of the Port of Bombay propose to make to Bye-laws 44 and 46 of the bye-laws for the regulation and management of the Port Trust Docks are published for the information of all persons whom they may concern:—

*Dock Bye-law No. 44.*

The following words are added to Dock Bye-law 44 after the word ‘vessels’ in the second line:

“And also the foremen and other persons engaged in discharging, loading or working cargo.”

*Dock Bye-law No. 46.*

The following words are placed at the end of Dock Bye-law No. 46:

“The foremen shall see, and be severally personally responsible, that the abovementioned precautions for safety are adopted and that the discharging, loading or working of cargo is carried out in accordance with the above directions, and that goods weighing over 1½ tons are not hoisted by the ordinary 30-cwt. dock cranes and that no other lifting gear is used in conjunction with them on any lift.”

I am directed to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. 1437, dated the 9th April 1896, referring for orders the question whether hand-pumps should be treated as water-lifts, and as such be held to be exempt from import duty under No. 13 of Schedule IV of the Indian Tariff Act.

2. I am to say that the words ‘ordinarily used in processes of husbandry, or for the preparation for use or for sale of the products of husbandry,’ in No. 13 of the Tariff Schedule govern the whole of the exemptions specified in that number. The Government of India therefore agree in the opinion of the Government of Madras that hand-pumps not being ordinarily used for such purposes, and also not being ordinarily known as ‘water-lifts,’ are not included in the exemption.”
