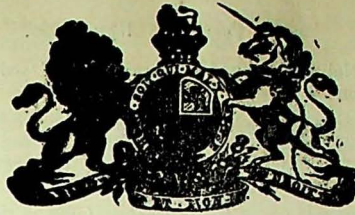

### Government Notifications, Appointments, &c.

#### NOTIFICATIONS.

##### JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.

*Bombay Castle, 30th July 1896.*

No. 5217.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 61 of the Bombay District Police Act, 1890, the Governor in Council is pleased to extend all the provisions of the said section to the village of Bodhan in the Mándvi Táluka of the Surat District.

No. 5300.—Under the provisions of Section 641 of the Code of Civil Procedure, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to exempt Shamsh-ul-ulama Pir Ali Gohar Shah Hussain, Pir of Rohri, from personal appearance in Civil Courts.

## POLITICAL DEPARTMENT.

No. 4859.—The following Notification by the Government of India in the Foreign Department is republished for general information:—

*“ Simla, the 31st July 1896.*

No. 2049-F.

*Extract from the Proceedings of the Government of India in the Foreign Department.*

*Read*—Letter from the Government of the Punjab No. 884, dated the 23rd July 1895 (with enclosures).

*Read again*—Notification by the Government of India in the Foreign Department No. 1682-F., dated the 1st November 1889, and connected papers.

*Read*—Resolution by the Government of India in the Foreign Department, No. 4091-F., dated the 28th October 1895.

OBSERVATION.—The Notification No. 1682-F., dated the 1st November 1889, contains the rules under which permission may be given to British officers and other persons to cross the North-West Frontier of British India. As British troops and officers are now stationed beyond the North-West Frontier of British India in tracts under the political control of the Government of India, it is desirable that similar restrictions should be placed upon the movements of officers and others stationed in such tracts, so as to ensure that they shall not visit places considered unsafe for travellers, without the special permission of the local political authorities and without adequate local arrangements for their protection.

RESOLUTION I.—The Governor-General in Council is accordingly pleased to direct that the Notification No. 1682-F., dated the 1st November 1889, shall be republished for general information, and to order that the rules contained in it shall be held to apply *mutatis mutandis* to all officers and other persons stationed beyond the North-West Frontier of British India in tracts under the political control of the Government of India.

II.—The Resolution No. 4091, dated the 28th October 1895, is hereby cancelled.

No. 1682-F., dated Simla, the 1st November 1889.

NOTIFICATION—By the Government of India, Foreign Department.

*Extract from the Proceedings of the Government of India in the Foreign Department.*

Read the undermentioned papers—

Office memorandum of the Government of India in the Foreign Department No. 2086, dated the 21st October 1865, directing that no person should ever be allowed to go beyond British territory, and more particularly into wild and dangerous tracts without the specific sanction of the Government of India obtained through this Department.

Resolution of the Government of India in the Foreign Department No. 2587-P., dated 21st September 1875, withdrawing the restrictions imposed upon officers of Government desirous of visiting Native States, but declaring that the existing orders, prohibiting persons from visiting countries beyond the frontier of British India, shall remain in force.

A letter from the Quarter Master General in India to the Government of India in the Military Department No. 2552-A, dated the 20th May 1887, stating that in the opinion of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief, the time has now arrived when the regulations, which prevent officers and others from crossing the North-Western Frontier for the purpose of sporting, of travel, or exploration, might with advantage be modified.

A letter from the Government of the Punjab to the Government of India in the Military Department No. 758, dated 21st December 1888, stating that while His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor considers that no general permission to cross the frontier can be given, he agrees that it is desirable to relax the existing rules, and submitting revised rules for adoption.

OBSERVATIONS.—The Viceroy and Governor-General in Council observes that the progress of events during recent years has rendered it desirable that on the North-Western Frontier of India some modification should be made in the orders restricting British officers from visiting countries beyond the border. In parts of the North-Western Frontier, more especially south of the Vihowa Pass, the attitude of the frontier tribes towards the British Government has undergone a considerable change for the better; and though this may not be the case in other parts, it has nevertheless become a matter of necessity that the Government should obtain a fuller knowledge of the country beyond the border, and endeavour to establish closer

relations with its inhabitants. The restrictions hitherto in force cannot yet be wholly withdrawn, as excursions beyond the border will still in many places be attended with risk, but the Governor-General in Council is of opinion that, with proper local precautions and arrangements, much may be done to decrease this risk, and to promote friendly intercourse between British officers and the border tribes.

**RESOLUTION.**—The Governor-General in Council is accordingly pleased, in modification of the previous orders on the subject, to issue the following rules. It will be understood that they relate only to the North-Western Frontier of the Punjab:

*Rules.*

I.—Long expeditions into or across foreign territory, or short excursions into disturbed districts, which obviously involve considerable personal risk, should not be undertaken without the previous consent of the Government of India in the Foreign Department.

II.—In cases not covered by Rule I, British officers or other persons desiring to cross the frontier, must lay before the Deputy Commissioner of the frontier district from which they propose to start a clear statement of the route intended, the object of the journey, the time to be spent upon it, the precautions proposed, the dependence, if any, to be placed upon guides or tribal headmen, and the reasons for supposing that the journey can be made with safety.

III.—Applicants should not address the Deputy Commissioner until they have first obtained from superior authority written permission to do so, and this permission must be laid before the Deputy Commissioner when the application is made. It should be obtained, if the applicants are not in the service of Government, from a Secretary to a Local Government; if they are in the Army, from the General Officer Commanding the District in which they are serving; and if they are in the service of Government in any other capacity, from the Head of the Department to which they belong. It must be clearly understood that the permission gives no authority to cross the border until the consent of the Local District Officers has been obtained in the manner prescribed by these rules.

IV.—South of the Vihowa Pass, on receipt of an application in the prescribed form, the Deputy Commissioner may himself allow the applicants to cross the frontier, provided he is satisfied that the risk they will incur is small and that satisfactory arrangements can be made for tribal escort or protection. If he is of opinion that the journey should not be allowed, or is unwilling to take the responsibility of authorising it, he should proceed as described in Rule V.

V.—North of the Vihowa Pass, the Deputy Commissioner on receipt of the application will record his opinion and advice, and forward the papers to the Commissioner of the division for orders.

VI.—The Commissioner of the division can grant permission for the journey to be made when he feels assured that there is no risk, even if there is no stronger reason than the desirability of cultivating intercourse with the tribesmen, and accustoming them to visits by Europeans. If, however, he considers that there is some risk, he should not grant permission without the sanction of the Local Government, unless the risk is, in his opinion, slight, the object sufficient, and the officer proposing to make the expedition trustworthy, and unless delay is likely to prejudice the success of the expedition.

VII.—It should be distinctly understood that permission to cross the frontier under these rules should only be given to persons who are thoroughly trustworthy; who may be relied on not to pass the limits, if any, within which permission to travel is given; who speak the language of the country they propose to visit; and who have some practical experience in dealing with frontier tribes. Ordinarily also permission should not be allowed to these excursions except when it is clearly desirable to obtain information of a practical character.

VIII.—In any case in which a Deputy Commissioner or Commissioner grants permission to any person to cross the frontier under these rules, a report should be sent to the Local Government, by whom it should be forwarded to the Government of India in the Foreign Department for information.

IX.—Nothing in this Resolution will affect the provisions of the Punjab Frontier Crossing Regulation, VII of 1873, or the special rules prescribed for travelling in Kashmir, or will warrant any person in entering the territories of the Amir of Afghanistan without the special permission of the Government of India.

The Punjab Frontier Crossing Regulation, VII of 1873, is herewith republished for general information:

‘Whereas by a Resolution passed by the Secretary of State in Council on the 6th day of October 1870, the provisions of the 33rd of Vict., chapter 3, section I, were declared applicable to the districts of Hazara, Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, Dera Ismail Khan, and Dera Ghazi Khan: And whereas the Lieutenant-Governor of the Punjab has proposed to the Governor-General in Council a draft of the following Regulation, together with the reasons for proposing the same; And whereas the Governor-General in Council has taken such draft and reasons into consideration, and has approved of such draft, and the same has received the Governor-General's assent: In pursuance of the direction contained in the said section, the said draft is now published in the *Gazette of India*, and will be published in the local *Gazette*, and will thereupon have the force of law:

*Regulation.*

1. No person duly warned in the manner hereinafter described shall pass out of British territory across the frontier of the districts of Hazara, Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, Dera Ismail Khan, and Dera Ghazi Khan.

2. A warning for the purpose of this Regulation, if addressed to an individual, shall be in writing under the hand of the Commissioner of the division, or of the Magistrate of the district, within which such individual dwells or may be found, and shall be served upon him in such manner as the Local Government may from time to time prescribe; if addressed to a class of persons or to the public generally, the previous sanction of the Governor-General in Council must be obtained, and this warning shall be notified in the *Punjab Government Gazette*, and be otherwise published in such manner as may be directed by the Local Government.

3. Whoever disobeys, or attempts to disobey, or abets, within the meaning of the Indian Penal Code another person in disobeying, or attempting to disobey, the prohibition contained in the first section of this Regulation, shall be punishable with fine not exceeding five hundred rupees.

The provisions of sections sixty-four, sixty-seven, sixty-eight, sixty-nine and seventy of the Indian Penal Code shall apply to all fines imposed under this section.

4. If any person disobeys, or attempts to disobey, or abets, within the meaning of the Indian Penal Code, another person in disobeying, or attempting to disobey the said prohibition, the Local Government may order him to remove to such place under the Government of the Lieutenant-Governor of the Punjab as the Local Government in each case directs.

5. If any person contravenes any such order, the Commissioner of the division or Magistrate of the district within which he is dwelling or may be found, may cause him to be apprehended and detained in custody until he is released upon such conditions as the Local Government thinks fit.

6. If the Commissioner of the division or Magistrate of the district within which any person (whether an European British subject or not) is dwelling or may be found, reasonably suspects that he intends to disobey the prohibition contained in the first section of this Regulation, such Commissioner or Magistrate may require such security for his good behaviour, for a period not exceeding six months, as the Commissioner or Magistrate may deem sufficient.

The provisions of the Code of Criminal Procedure, sections five hundred and seven to five hundred and sixteen (both inclusive) shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to all cases under this section.

- (1) the Municipal districts of
  - (a) the Suburban Municipality of Poona,
  - (b) the Broach City Municipality,
  - (c) the Ahmedabad City Municipality,
  - (d) the Surat City Municipality;
- (2) the Táluka of Bhusával in the Khándesh District; and
- (3) all land between the City of Bombay and any of the aforesaid areas occupied by or acquired for:
  - (a) the G. I. P. Railway, or
  - (b) the B. B. & C. I. Railway for the purposes of such Railway, including not only all land within the fences or other boundary marks indicating the limits of the land appurtenant to such railway, and all lines of rails, sidings and branches worked over for the purposes or in connection with the same, but also all stations, offices, warehouses, workshops, manufactories, compounds, yards, roads, open spaces and other lands whether occupied by buildings or not, used or that may be used for the purposes of or in connection with such railway.

previous sanction of the Governor General in Council, to make the following rules to regulate the granting of licenses to possess or transport petroleum in the Presidency of Bombay:

#### Preliminary.

Interpretation. 1. In these rules,—  
 (1) "the Act" means "The Act." the Petroleum Act, 1886:

(2) "City of Bombay" includes every place "City of Bombay," for the time being within the local limits of the ordinary original civil jurisdiction of the High Court of Judicature at Bombay, and

(3) Words and expressions defined in the Petroleum Act. Words and expressions defined in the Act have the same meaning as in the Act.

(4) Petroleum in bulk means petroleum in any vessel or receptacle having the capacity of 300 gallons or upwards.

2. These rules, so far as they apply to dangerous petroleum, extend to the whole of the Presidency of Bombay, and, so far as they apply to other petroleum, only to those local areas to which the rest of the Act has, for the time being, been extended by a notification of the Governor in Council under section 1, sub-section (3) of the Act.

#### Possession of Petroleum.

3. Licenses for keeping petroleum exceeding five hundred gallons in quantity or dangerous petroleum shall ordinarily be granted only when the premises intended to be used for the storage of such petroleum are separated by a clear open space of not less than twenty feet on every side from any other building, and when they also fulfil the following conditions, namely:—

(a) in the City of Bombay, when the building in which the petroleum is to be stored is constructed of masonry with terraced or iron roof, and with tiled or paved or earthen floors, and when the doorways and openings of the building are built up to a height of not less than two feet above the level of the road or street, or when the floor is sunk at least two feet below the level of the road or street, so that petroleum cannot flow out of the building in case of fire;

(b) outside the City of Bombay, either the conditions specified in clause (a) or the following conditions, namely, when the building in which the petroleum is to be stored is built of brick or earth and no inflammable material has been used in the construction of any portion thereof except the doors; and when the building is surrounded by a wall or earthen embankment not less than four feet high with a trench between such wall or embankment and the building, close to and completely surrounding the building, of sufficient capacity to hold all the petroleum stored and to prevent its escape beyond the limits of the trench in case of fire:

No. 6123A.—The draft hereinbelow contained of rules which it is proposed, when the previous sanction of the Governor General in Council thereto has been obtained, to make under Section 11 of the Petroleum Act, XII of 1886, applicable to the areas noted in the margin\* to which by Notification No. 6123, dated 5th August 1896, the provisions of the said Act other than those relating to dangerous petroleum and to the importation of petroleum have been extended, is published for the information of persons likely to be affected by it, and it is hereby notified that the draft will be taken into consideration on the expiry of one month from the date of this Notification:—

- (b) the Broach City Municipality,
- (c) the Ahmedabad do.
- (d) the Surat do.

- (a) the G. I. P. Railway, or

Railway, for the purposes of such Railway, including not only all land within the fences or other boundary marks indicating the limits of the land appurtenant to such railway, and all lines of rails, sidings and branches worked over for the purposes or in connection with the same, but also all stations, offices, warehouses, workshops, manufactories, compounds, yards, roads, open spaces and other lands whether occupied by buildings or not, used or that may be used for the purposes of or in connection with such railway.

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 11 of the Petroleum Act, XII of 1886, the Governor of Bombay in Council is pleased, with the



(A). Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing rules the Local Government may, in its discretion, and subject to such conditions as it may prescribe, grant a license for the possession of any stated quantity of petroleum in a place specially prepared for the storage of petroleum in bulk in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Local Government. The capacity in gallons shall be conspicuously marked on every storage-tank or other receptacle in such place.

(B). Any tank or receptacle for the storage of petroleum in bulk that may be erected, with the written consent of the Trustees and in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Local Government, on the land vesting in or held by the Trustees of the Port of Bombay shall be deemed to be a place in respect of which a license for the possession of petroleum has been granted under these rules.

(C). Wharves at which petroleum in bulk is to be landed must be notified in the *Government Gazette* under the Sea Customs Act as landing places for non-dangerous petroleum.

Provided that Government or the officer who grants the license (as the case may be) may for special reasons (which, when the license is granted by an officer, shall be recorded by him in writing before he grants the license) dispense with any or all of the said conditions.

4. The licensing-officer, or any police-officer of or above the rank of head-constable, may enter any premises in respect of which a license for the possession of petroleum has been granted for the purpose of inspecting the same, at any time between sunrise and sunset.

5. The licensing-officer, or any police-officer as aforesaid, may require any licensee to show him any of the vessels in which any of the petroleum in his possession is stored or contained, to give him such assistance as he may require for examining the same and to deliver to him a sample from any vessel which he indicates for this purpose on payment of the value of such sample.

The procedure prescribed in section 13 of the Act shall be followed in respect of the testing of any sample so obtained, the licensee being deemed for this purpose a dealer in petroleum.

#### *Transport of Petroleum.*

6. (1) The transport of dangerous petroleum in bulk is absolutely prohibited.

Special license necessary for transport of dangerous petroleum.

(2) No dangerous petroleum shall be transported without a special license.

(3) For the transport of petroleum other than dangerous in quantities exceeding 500 gallons, licenses, either general or special, may be granted.

(4) Licenses for the transport of petroleum otherwise than in bulk shall be granted only if the petroleum to be transported is packed in air-tight tins or other vessels not easily broken, or is contained in bottles securely stopped and carefully packed so as to avoid risk of breakage.

(5) Licenses may be granted for the transport in bulk of petroleum, other than dangerous petroleum,

(a) by rail, if the petroleum is contained in tank-wagons or portable tanks approved by the railway administration over whose line it is intended to transport it,

(b) by steamer or barge if the vessel is certified to be fit for the service by an officer appointed by the Local Government in this behalf,

(c) by carts, if the carts are certified to be fit for such transport by an officer appointed by the Local Government for this purpose,

on such arrangements as may be approved by Government being made for freeing from gas, tanks, railway-wagons, steamers, barges and carts in which petroleum has been stored or carried in bulk.

(6) (a) General licenses for a period of twelve months may be issued for the transport in bulk of petroleum, other than dangerous, by rail, by road or by water, and for the transport of petroleum otherwise than in bulk by cart only. Such licenses shall authorise the holders to transport any petroleum *bond fide* their own property without restriction as to destination or quantity.

(b) The holder of a general license with each consignment of petroleum conveyed under cover thereof shall issue a pass in Form G appended to these rules, which shall specify the places from and to which the petroleum is to be conveyed and the quantity of petroleum covered by the pass. Each pass shall be numbered and the number of the general license shall be legibly marked on a conspicuous part of the last case on the cart, or in some other conspicuous manner.

(7) Special licenses for the transport of petroleum shall, unless earlier revoked by competent authority, be in force for such period not exceeding six months from the date of the grant thereof as shall be fixed by Government or by the officer who grants the same.

(3) Every special license for the transport of petroleum shall specify the places from and to which respectively the petroleum is to be conveyed, the quantity of petroleum covered by the license and the time for which the license is in force.

7. It shall be the duty of all police-officers to see that petroleum which is being transported under a license is conveyed only in the manner prescribed in the last preceding rule and by such route as is specified in the license; any such officer may stop and inspect any petroleum in transit and, if necessary, require the person in charge of the same to comply with these rules or with any of the conditions of the transport license.

*Grant of Licenses.*

8. Applications under section 5 of the Act for a license to keep or transport dangerous petroleum exceeding forty gallons in quantity shall be submitted in the City of Bombay to the Commissioner of Police, in Aden to the Resident, and elsewhere to the Commissioner of the Division, who will, after inquiry, forward the same with their opinion to Government in the Revenue Department.

If the application is granted, the license, signed by a Secretary to Government, will be forwarded to the applicant through the officer to whom his application was submitted.

9. Applications for licenses to possess or transport petroleum not falling under section 5 of the Act should be made to the officers who are hereinbelow respectively authorized to grant the said licenses, namely:—

10. (1) Applications for licenses for keeping or transporting petroleum shall be in writing.

(2) Applications for licenses for keeping petroleum shall specify—

- (a) the description and quantity of petroleum which the applicant desires to keep;
- (b) the name and position of the premises in which it is proposed to keep the said petroleum, and whether the said premises fulfil the conditions required by rule 3;
- (c) the purpose for which the applicant desires to keep the said petroleum;
- (d) the amount of petroleum, if any, already licensed to be kept in the same premises.

(3) Applications for licenses for transporting petroleum shall specify—

- (e) the description and quantity of petroleum to be transported;
- (f) the places from and to which it is desired to transport the said petroleum;
- (g) the route and means by which it is proposed to convey the same; and
- (h) the kind of vessels in which the petroleum to be transported is contained.

(4) In the case of applications for licenses for the possession or transport of dangerous petroleum under section 5 of the Act, the application shall also contain the particulars required by sub-section (2) of that section.

11. In dealing with any application under section 6 or section 10 of the Act the licensing-officer may, in his discretion, grant a license for the possession or transport of such quantity of petroleum as he thinks fit.

12. Every license for the possession of petroleum shall be in force for one year from the date of the grant thereof.

13. Every application for the renewal of a license for the possession of petroleum shall be made in the same manner as an application for an original license. Every such application shall be made not less than fifteen days before the date on which the original license expires.

Information has been received from the Commissioner of Customs, Salt, Opium and A'bkári, dated 11th instant, that from the 15th July 1896 a light will be exhibited from an iron structure recently erected on Jaigurh headland.

1. Jaigurh Headland light will be a fifth order dioptric fixed white light, elevated 134 feet above the level of the sea and 32 feet above the ground, and visible from seaward in clear weather from a distance of thirteen miles between the bearings of south through east to north.

2. Also, a port light fixed red will be exhibited from the same date from the northern bastion of Jaigurh Port as a guide to vessels making the anchorage.

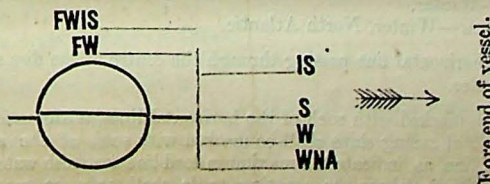
No. 83.—In exercise of the power conferred by Section 40, sub-sections (1) and (2) of the Indian Merchant Shipping Act (VII of 1880), as amended by the Deck and Load Lines Act (XVII of 1891), and with the previous sanction of the Governor General in Council, the Governor in Council is pleased to make the following rules, and notice is hereby given that the rules will be brought into operation on the expiration of three months from the date of their publication :—

*Rules as to Load Line Marks, Seasons, Certificates, Draught of water and Freeboard.*

1. The lines to be used in order to indicate the maximum load line under different circumstances and at different seasons shall be nine inches in length and one inch in thickness, and the maximum load line shall be the upper edge of each of such lines.

2. The said lines shall be horizontal lines marked on both sides of the ship, extending from and at right angles to a vertical line marked twenty-one inches forward of the centre of the disc. The maximum load line in fresh water shall be marked abaft such vertical line and the maximum load line in salt water shall be marked forward of such vertical line, as shown in the following diagrams :—

*Draft of proposed amendment of No. 13 of the said Rules under Section 36 of the Indian Steamships Act (VII of 1884).*

For No. 13 of the said rules the following shall be substituted, namely :

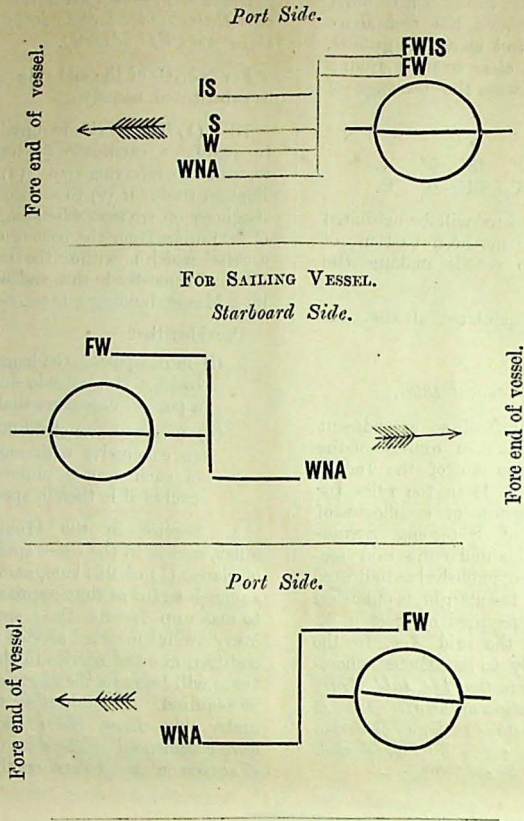
13. (1) The service required by the regulations to qualify a candidate for examination is to be regarded as referring only (a) to service in the Foreign trade, or (b) to service under a First Class Engineer on voyages extending beyond a distance of 500 miles from the port of departure on board a vessel which is within the meaning of Act I of 1859 a Home-trade ship and which is commanded by a Master holding a foreign-going certificate :

Provided that—

(i) in computing the length of such service on board a Home-trade ship, all time spent in a port of departure shall be excluded, and

(ii) no certificate of discharge shall be accepted as conclusive with regard to the duration of such service, unless the time so to be excluded is therein specified.

2. Service in the Home or coasting trade must, except in the cases specified in sub-clause (b) of clause (1) of this rule, amount to at least half as much again as that required by the regulations to make up for the time spent in Port, *e. g.*, for every twelve months' service under the regulations, eighteen months' service in the Home or Coasting trade will (save in the cases excepted as aforesaid) be required. In computing the length of service under this clause the service will be deemed to have commenced on the date of signing the articles of agreement and to end on the date of discharge.



The arrow ( ← ) points in the direction of the vessel's head.

The provisions of the Indian Merchant Shipping Act, 1880, Chapter II, shall have effect as if any such maximum load line were drawn through the centre of the disc.

3. Such maximum load lines shall be as follows, namely :—

- For fresh water Indian summer,
- „ fresh water,
- „ Indian summer (Indian fair weather season),
- „ summer (Indian foul weather season),
- „ winter,
- „ winter, North Atlantic,

and shall be distinguished by initial letters permanently and conspicuously marked opposite such horizontal lines as aforesaid, such initial letters being as follows :—

- F.W.I.S.—Fresh water, Indian summer.
- F.W.—Fresh water.
- I.S.—Indian summer (Indian fair weather season).
- S.—Summer (Indian foul weather season).
- W.—Winter.
- W.N.A.—Winter, North Atlantic.

The upper edge of the horizontal line passing through the centre of the disc shall always indicate the summer freeboard in salt water.

4. Steam-ships shall be marked with such of the horizontal lines as aforesaid as are applicable to the nature of their employment, and sailing ships shall be marked with such of the above-mentioned lines, in addition to the summer load line, as indicate the maximum load line for fresh water and for North Atlantic winter, but sailing ships engaged solely in the coasting trade shall only be marked, in addition to the Indian Summer and summer load line, with the line indicating the maximum load line in fresh water.



5. The said disc, and the lines, or marks, to be used in connection therewith, shall be painted white or yellow on a dark ground, or black on a light ground, and the position of the disc, and of each of the lines, shall, in the case of iron and steel vessels, be permanently marked by centre punch marks, and shall, in the case of wooden vessels, be sunk for their breadths into the planking a depth of not less than one-quarter of an inch.

A diagram showing the distance in feet and inches from the deck line to the centre of the disc and the relative position of the other lines shall be issued with and as a part of the certificate of approval (or alteration) of the load line.

6. Application for a certificate of approval of the position of the disc or any alteration thereof shall be made to the Port Officer of Bombay by the owner or agent in the form marked L.L. 1 in the schedule hereto annexed, and the application shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee. After survey a certificate shall be issued by the Port Officer in duplicate in the form in the schedule hereto annexed, which is applicable to the case; one part shall be delivered to the applicant, and the other part shall be recorded by the Port Officer.

The managing owner, agent or master shall also forthwith, on the delivery to him or his agent of any such certificate as aforesaid, cause the same to be framed and put up in some conspicuous part of the ship so as to be visible to all persons on board the same, and shall cause it to be continued so put up so long as such certificate remains in force and such ship is in use.

On a certificate of approval ceasing to have effect, application shall at once be made by the registered managing owner of the ship for the granting of a new certificate of approval, and the old certificate shall be delivered up to the Government who issued and who shall cancel the same.

7. The master of every British or British Indian ship shall, before she leaves any port in India for the purpose of proceeding to sea, enter in the official log all the particulars stated in the certificate so issued as aforesaid if not previously entered.

8. For the purpose of these rules the following periods shall mean 'Indian summer' (fair weather season), and 'summer,' respectively:—

	Fair Season (Indian Summer.)	Summer.
(a) Bay of Bengal, east of Tuticorin.	15th November to 25th May.	26th May to 14th November.
(b) West Coast: Sind, Bombay and Malabar.	1st September to 25th May.	26th May to 31st August.

The seasons as prescribed should have reference to the 'nature of the voyage' in all cases.

9. The following rules are prescribed with respect to certificates of approval and their duration:—

- (a) As regards iron and steel ships, whether classed or unclassed, and classed wooden ships, the certificate shall cease to have effect if and so soon as the class of the ship (if classed) is either changed or withdrawn, or if and so soon as any deterioration has taken place in the structural condition of the ship, whether classed or unclassed. Such certificate shall be in one of the forms L.L. 2 or L.L. 3 in the schedule hereto, as the case may be.
- (b) As regards unclassed wooden ships which have been opened out for survey, the certificate shall be granted for a fixed time varying with the age and condition of the ship at the expiration of which it shall cease to have effect. Such certificate shall be in the form L.L. 3A in the schedule hereto.
- (c) As regards unclassed wooden ships which have not been opened out for survey, no limit of time shall be imposed in the certificate, which shall be in the form L.L. 3B in the schedule hereto.

10. For the purpose of these regulations the expression 'amidships' shall mean the middle of the length of the load water line as measured from the fore side of the stem to the aft side of the stern post.

Officers entrusted with assignment of Freeboard and the survey of vessels reported to be overladen will be guided by the Tables of Freeboard issued by the Board of Trade and as modified or supplemented by the Board from time to time.

ALL COLLECTORS and TREASURY OFFICERS.

Sir,—As some misapprehension appears to have arisen regarding the intention of this office General letter No. T.A.M.—3161, dated 15th May 1896, I have the honour to state that it was not intended that every Municipality should frame a rule that cheques should be signed by the Secretary and two members of the municipal committee. All that was intended was, that whatever rule was laid down by each Municipality should be communicated to this office, and that if there was no rule already laid down, a rule should be framed by the Municipality and communicated to this office for guidance after it has been duly sanctioned.

2. I have the honour at the same time to draw attention to Rule 12 of the model rules circulated with Government Resolution, General Department, No. 734, dated 14th February 1890, and to state that it appears that, as this model rule has already received the approval of Government, cheques should be signed by the President or by some one to whom he delegates the power by a

written order, and the rule on the subject should therefore, apparently, provide for the duty being performed accordingly.
