#### GENERAL DEPARTMENT.

#### Bombay Castle, 5th August 1896.

No. 3440.—The following rules framed under Section 35 (a) of the Bombay Boiler Inspection Act, 1891, as additions to the rules framed under the said section, for settling the duties of Inspectors \*No. 1877A, at Bombay Government appointed under the said Act, and published in the Notification appointed under the said Act, and published for general information, mentioned in the margin,\* are published for general information, that is to say.—

" Add to Rule 10 of the said Rules.

The constants for plain furnaces 10 per cent:

In cases where the Inspector is satisfied from tests made on the steel from which the boiler has been constructed that it is of a certain tensile strength per square inch, that strength may be substituted for the 47,000 lbs. (allowed for iron plates) in the formula given in Rule 7, but in no case is a greater strength than 32 tons (71,680 lbs.) to be allowed. In other cases, provided there is sufficient proof that the boiler is of steel, a minimum of 27 tons may be used.

Solid steel screwed stays which have not been welded or otherwise worked after heating may be allowed a working stress of 9,000 lbs. per square inch of net section. Steel stays which have been welded or worked in the fire have been found to be unreliable, therefore they should not be passed.

When furnaces are machine made by Messrs. The Leeds Forge Company, of the Fox corrugated or ribbed and Morison suspension types, or by Messrs. John Brown & Co., Sheffield, of the Purves ribbed and grooved type, if they are practically true circles, and the plates not less than the inch, the working pressure is found by the following formula:

$$\frac{\mathbf{C} \times \mathbf{T}}{\mathbf{D}}$$
 = working pressure.

C = 14,000 for Fox's corrugated and Brown's ribbed and grooved furnaces.

C = 13,500 for Morison's suspension furnace.

T = thickness in inches.

D = outside diameter in inches, measured at the bottom of the corrugations when the furnace is of the corrugated or suspension type, or over the plain parts when it is of the ribbed and grooved description.

In Fox's corrugated furnaces the pitch of the corrugations and the length of the plain parts at the ends should not exceed 6 inches, and in Morison's suspension furnaces the pitch should not exceed 8 inches, and the length at the ends 5 inches. In both descriptions of furnaces the depth from top of corrugations outside to bottom of corrugations inside should not be less than 2 inches, and the plates at the ends should not be unduly thinned in the flanging.

The plates of ribbed and grooved furnaces should be formed by rolling, the ribs should not be less than  $1_{10}^{**}$  inches above the plain parts, and the depth of the grooves not more than  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch, the length between the centres of the ribs not over 9 inches, and that of the plain parts at the ends not over 6 inches, and the ends rolled slightly thicker than the plain parts, and not reduced at any part by flanging, &c., below the thickness of the body of the furnace.

If the furnace is rivetted in one or more lengths the case should be submitted for consideration.

When horizontal furnaces of ordinary diameter are constructed of a series of rings welded furnaces made up of flanged rings.

by the following formula, provided the length in inches between the centres of the flanges of the rings is not greater than (120 T - 12), and the flanging is performed at one heat by a suitable flanging machine, and also the conditions which follow the formula are complied with:

$$\frac{9900 \times T}{3 \times D} \left( 5 - \frac{l+12}{60 \times T} \right) = \text{working pressure.}$$

T = thickness of plate in inches.

l = length between centre of flanges in inches.

D = outside diameter of furnace in inches.

The radii of the flanges on the fire side should be about 1½ inches. The depth of the flanges from the fire side should be three times the diameter of the rivet plus 1½ inches, and the thickness of the flanges should be as near the thickness of the body of the plate as practicable. The distance from the edge of the rivet holes to the edge of the flange should not be less than the diameter of the rivet, and the diameter of the rivets at least ¾ inch greater than the thickness of the plate. The depth of the ring between the flanges should be not less than three times the diameter of the rivets, the fire edge of the ring should be about the termination of the curve of flange, and the thickness not less than half the thickness of the furnace plate. Turned rings are such as may be considered a first class method of construction.

The holes in the flanges and rings should be drilled in place if practicable, but if not drilled in place they should be drilled sufficiently small, and afterwards when in place rimered out until the holes are quite fair, the holes should be slightly tapered and the heads of the rivets of moderate size.

After all welding, and after all flanging and heating each ring should be efficiently annealed in one operation.

Compressive stress on tube plates.

A greater compressive stress should not be allowed on tube plates than 10,000 lbs., which is that used in the following formula:

$$\frac{\text{(D-d) T} \times 20,000}{\text{W} \times \text{D}} = \text{working pressure.}$$

D = least horizontal distance between centres of tubes in inches.

d = inside diameter of ordinary tubes in inches.

T = thickness of tube plate in inches.

W = extreme width of combustion-box in inches from front of tube plate to back of fire-box, or distance between combustion-box tube plates when boiler is double-ended and the box common to the furnaces at both ends.

When full allowance is wished the rivet section, if iron, in the longitudinal seams of cylindrical shells and rivet section.

Plate and rivet section.

shells should, when those seams are lapped, be at least 13 times the net plate section, and if steel rivets are used their section should be at least 23 of the net section of the plate, if the tensile stress of the rivets is not less than 27 tons and not more than 32 tons per square inch. In calculating the working pressure, the percentage strength of the rivets may be found in the usual way by the Board of Trade rules, but in the case of iron rivets the percentages found should be divided by 13, and in the case of steel rivets by 23, the results being the percentages required. If the percentage strength of the rivets by calculation is less than the calculated percentage strength of the plate, calculate the working pressure by both percentages. When using the percentage strength of the plate 4.5 plus the additions suitable for the method of construction as by the rules for iron boilers, may be used as the nominal factor of safety, but when using the percentage strength of the rivets 4.5 may be used as the factor of safety. The less of the two pressures so found is the working pressure to be allowed for the cylindrical portion of the shell, or otherwise in accordance with the formulæ in Appendix.

Add as an Appendix to the said rules.

d = diameter of rivets in inches.

D = inside diameter of boiler in inches.

F = factor of safety for shell plates, as by clause 87 or clause 103.

n = number of rivets in one pitch.

pp = diagonal pitch in inches.

P<sup>n</sup> = diagonal pitch in inches between inner and middle rows of rivets in inches for joint J.

p =greatest pitch of rivets in inches.

r = percentage of plate left between holes in greatest pitch.

R = percentage of rivet section.

R1 = percentage of combined plate and rivet section.

S = tensile strength of material in lbs. per square inch of section.

T = thickness of plate in inches.

T1 = thickness of each butt strap in inches.

% = least value of r, R, R, as the case may be, divided by 100.

When joints are used in boiler construction other than those shown in the attached sketches, or when any of the rivets are pitched less than two diameters apart, the particulars of such joints should be submitted for the consideration of the Senior Inspector.



When the work is first class, such pitches may be adopted so far as safety is concerned, yet in some cases it may be well not to adopt the greatest pitch found by the formula. The maximum pitch should not, however, exceed 10 inches with the thickest plates for boiler shells. If in any case the pitch is found to exceed that arrived at by the foregoing formula, for the particular description of joint and thickness of plate, such pitches should not be passed, but in all cases reported.

Note.—The minimum value of V or V<sup>1</sup> for chain rivetted joints is given as 2d, but  $\frac{4d+1}{2}$  is more desirable.

Draft of proposed amendment of No. 13 of the said Rules under Section 36 of the Indian Steamships Act (VII of 1884).

For No. 13 of the said rules the following shall be substituted, namely:

13. (1) The service required by the regulations to qualify a candidate for examination is to be regarded as referring only (a) to service in the Foreign trade, or (b) to service under a First Class Engineer on voyages extending beyond a distance of 500 miles from the port of departure on board a vessel which is within the meaning of Act I of 1859 a Home-trade ship and which is commanded by a Master holding a foreign-going certificate:

Provided that-

- (i) in computing the length of such service on board a Home-trade ship, all time spent in a port of departure shall be excluded, and
- (ii) no certificate of discharge shall be accepted as conclusive with regard to the duration of such service, unless the time so to be excluded is therein specified.
- Service in the Home or coasting trade must, except in the cases specified in sub-clause (b) of clause (1) of this rule, amount to at least half as much again as that required by the regulations to make up for the time spent in Port, e. g., for every twelve months' service under the regulations, eighteen months' service in the Home or coasting trade will (save in the cases excepted as aforesaid) be required. In computing the length of service under this clause the service will be deemed to have commenced on the date of signing the articles of agreement and to end on the date of discharge.

DERELICT VESSELS (REPORT) ACT, 1896. [59 & 60 VICTORIA, CHAPTER 12.]

An Act for the better reporting of Floating Derelicts.

[2ND JULY, 1896.]

Be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Derelict Vessels (Report) Act, 1896. Short title.

Notice of derelict vessels to be given by Masters to Lloyd's agents,

2. Every master or other person for the time being in command of any British ship, after the passing of this Act, who shall become aware of the exist-

ence on the high seas of any floating derelict vessel, shall notify the same to the Lloyd's agent at his next place of call or arrival, and shall, together with such notification, furnish to the Lloyd's agent all such information as he may possess as to the supposed locality or identity of such derelict vessel, and the date when and place where the same may have been observed by or reported to him, and the Lloyd's agent shall forthwith on rec ipt of such notification and information transmit the same to the secretary of Lloyd's in London.

And if any such master fails to make such a report he shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

- 3. If there shall be no Lloyd's agent at the next place of call or next place of call or arrival, then and in such Letters to be sent to Lloyd's in default of agents. case the notification shall be made and the information furnished by such master or other person as aforesaid, to the Secretary of Lloyd's, London.
- 4. Any information received by the Society of Lloyd's as aforesaid, in Information to be published by Lloyd's. pursuance of this Act, shall be published by the Society forthwith in the same manner and to the same extent as its reports of shipping casualties, and the Society shall also forthwith communicate such information to the Board of Trade.

India who are candidates for the examinations for the Indian Civil Service held in England:

General Rules applicable to all Candidates.

I.—A candidate for admission to compete in England for the Indian Civil Service is required before leaving India to obtain a certificate of age and nationality, signed, should he be a resident in British.India, by the Secretary to Government of the trovince or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides; or, should he reside in a Native State, by the highest Political Officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.

Note.—In the case of a candidate who has proceeded to England without obtaining a certificate, the certificate may be granted to his father or guardian, provided that the latter produces the requisite evidence, and when making the application, states when the candidate went to England, and where he has been residing during his stay in that country.

II.—In order to obtain a certificate, a candidate is required, if resident in British India, to prove the date and place of his birth before the Magistrate of the district in which his family resides, or, if resident in a Native State, before the Political Officer of the State in which his family resides.

III.—A candidate must, if resident in British India, signify to the Secretary to Government of the Province or the Commissioner of the Division in which his family resides his desire to compete not less than three months before the date on which he proposes to go to England. If resident within a Native State, he must signify his desire in like manner to the highest Political Officer accredited to the State within which his family resides. The officer to whom the application is made shall forward it for the purpose of enquiry to the Magistrate of the district or Political Officer of the State in which the applicant's family resides.

IV.—The Magistrate or Political Officer to whom such application has been forwarded shall call upon the candidate to appear and give evidence of the date and place of his birth and of his nationality within one month. He will carefully examine into the value of the evidence given, and forward a summary of it, with certified copies of all documents tendered, and his comments and opinion, to the officer who forwarded the application to him for enquiry.

V.—The documentary evidence which a candidate may be expected to produce comprises—

- (a) -The horoscope.
- (b)-Family books.
- (c)—Tradesmen's account books showing entries relating to the birth.
- (d)—The record of admission in the registers of the school in which the candidate was educated and the record of the candidate's age at various periodical school examinations.
- (e)—If the candidate is matriculated, a certified copy of his application to the Registrar in Form A.

Oral testimony of persons acquainted with the candidate's family or otherwise able to give relevant evidence will also be taken; and the candidate is required to comply, to the best of his power, with any requisition the Magistrate or Political Officer, as the case may be, may make in order to clear up any doubt as to the perport of the documentary proof.

VI.—Any declaration of age made after the application of these rules on the occasion of seeking admission to any University examination, educational institution, or Government office, or otherwise recorded in a formal and deliberate manner, will be taken as conclusive evidence in disproof of the subsequent assertion by the same person that he is of different age to that so declared or recorded.

#### Rules to apply to Candidates born in Her Majesty's Dominions.

VII.—If the Secretary to Government, Commissioner of a Division, or the highest Political Officer accredited to the State, as the case may be, shall be satisfied by the papers submitted that the candidate has stated the date and place of his birth correctly, he will issue a certificate declaring that the candidate has submitted the proofs of his birth to the Magistrate of the district or the Political Officer of the State, as the case may be, and has satisfied him that he was actually born on or about the date stated by him, viz., the day of

VIII.—If the Secretary to Government, Commissioner of a Division, or the highest Political Officer accredited to the State, as the case may be, finds reason to disbelieve that the candidate was born on the day or at the place asserted by him, the certificate will be refused, and the candidate will be unable to obtain admission to the competitive examination for the Indian Civil Service.

1X.—Where the date and place of birth have been formally registered in a register kept by any public officer in British India, an extract from the register duly certified by the proper official shall be accepted as sufficient proof of the date and place of the birth.

Rules to apply to Candidates not born within Her Majesty's Dominions.

X.—In addition to the particulars required by Rule II, a candidate not born in Her Majesty's Dominions must also prove that he is the son or grandson of a person born in those Dominions.

XI.—If the Secretary to Government, Commissioner of a Division, or the highest Political Officer accredited to the State, as the case may be, shall be satisfied by the papers submitted that the candidate has stated the date and place of his birth correctly and has established the fact that though oorn without the limits of Her Majesty's Dominions he is the son or grandson of a person born in those Dominions, he will issue a certificate in the following form:
