Government Notifications, Appointments, &c.

NOTIFICATIONS.

JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.

Bombay Castle, 6th February 1896.

No. 1005.—Whereas it appears to His Excellency the Governor in Council that the conduct of the inhabitants of the village of Ekdara in the táluka of Akola of the Ahmednagar District has so improved that it is no longer necessary to maintain the Police in the said village at an increased strength; but whereas the conduct of the inhabitants of the village of Bhándardara in the same táluka and district has not so improved, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased, in modification of Government Notification No. 5530, dated the 6th August 1895, published at page 883 of the *Bombay Government Gazette* dated the 15th idem, Part I,—

- (a) to direct that the employment in the local area of the village of Ekdara of the additional Police of the strength and cost set forth in the aforesaid Notification be discontinued, and
- (b) to direct that the said additional Police be wholly employed in the local area of the village of Bhándardara in the same táluka and district for the remaining portion of the period for which they were sanctioned by the said Notification, and
- (c) to direct that the entire cost of the additional Police employed from the 1st November 1895 under Notification No. 5530 at *Bombay Government Gazette* for 1895, Part I, page 883, in any part of the disturbed area comprising the said villages of Ekdara and Bhándardara, and under this Notification employed in the village of Bhándardara alone,

shall be defrayed by a rate charged on the inhabitants generally of the said village of Bhāndardara.

No. 14.—The following Notice to Mariners is published for general information with reference to Government Notification No. 7, dated 3rd January 1895:—

“INDIA—BAY OF BENGAL—GULF OF MARTABAN.

BARAGUA FLATS.

Intended Light-Vessel with flashing Red and White Light.

Information has been received from the Port Officer, Rangoon, dated 17th instant, that on or about August 1896, a light will be shown from a light-vessel moored off the south-east corner of Baragua Flats, north-west shore of Gulf of Martaban. Baragua Flats Light-vessel light will be a flashing light of 10,000 candle power, showing a red and white flash alternately every forty-five seconds, each flash being of five seconds' duration and visible in clear weather from a distance of about ten miles.

The light-vessel will be moored in a depth of six fathoms and painted red, with the word 'Baragua' in white letters on each side.

Position—Latitude ... 15° 29' 15" N.
„ Longitude ... 95° 11' 30" E.”

No. 16.—The following Notices to Mariners issued by the Port Officer, Madras, on the 16th January 1896, are published for general information:—

“India—West Coast—Narakal.

Information has been received from the Port Officer, Cochin, that—

(1) The wreck buoy marking the site (approximately) of the hull of the *Sir Henry Havelock* was sunk about December 21st from collision by some vessel unknown.

(2) A wreck buoy (cone painted green with 'wreck' in white letters) has, December 23rd, been again placed in the same position marking approximately the site of the sunken vessel *Sir Henry Havelock*, the bearings (magnetic) are:

Narakal Flagstaff—N. 65° E.
Cochin Light House—S. 45° E.

in 32 feet low water spring tides.

India—East Coast.

Information has been received from the Port Officer, Negapatam, that the masts of a three-masted vessel are visible above water in five fathoms, about two miles off shore and ten miles S. E. from the Port of Velanganni.

2. Endeavours are being made to fix the position of the vessel correctly if possible.”

No. 18.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 8 (1) of the Indian Ports Act, (X of) 1889, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to substitute the following for the first part of No. 65 (relating to sea-going vessels) of the Rules for the Port of Aden, published under Government Notification No. 55, dated 2nd May 1893:—

65. The following places of anchorages have been appointed where vessels referred to in Rules 63 and 64 shall anchor:

For Sea-going Vessels.

All that portion of the outer harbour lying to the north of a line from A'liā through the wreck and west of a line drawn due south from the wreck.”

No. 19.—The following Scale of Tolls and Charges framed by the Trustees of the Port of Karachi, and approved by Government, in supersession of the Scale of Tolls and Charges and Table I of the Charges for Storing, issued under Government Notification No. 30, dated 4th April 1894, is published for general information in accordance with Section 43 of the Karachi Port Trust Act, 1886:—

SCALE OF TOLLS AND CHARGES FOR LANDING AND SHIPPING OF GOODS, AND FOR THE STORING AND REMOVING OF GOODS IN THE 'MANSFIELD' IMPORT YARD.

Note.—The rates shown in column I are for goods not claimed and removed from the 'Mansfield' Import Yard within the free days allowed, *vide* Table I of Scale of Charges for Storage, Class X, whether removed by the servants of the Board to the unclaimed warehouse, or lying in the sheds or open.

Column 2 shows the rates for removal and delivery by the servants of the Board of goods which have been unclaimed within the free days, *vide* Table I of Scale of Charges for Storing, Class X, or have been warehoused at request of Consignee or Agent.

Column 3 shows the rent per week or part of a week on goods warehoused at the 'Mansfield' Import Yard Warehouse at request of Consignees or Agents.

The rates shown in column 7 are for goods landed and shipped by others than the servants of the Board, and those in columns 8 and 9 are for goods shipped and landed at the Merewether Pier, Erskine and James Wharves and their extensions.

No. 20.—In accordance with the provisions of Section 74 of the Bombay Port Trust Act, 1879, the following Dock Bye-law which the Trustees of the Port of Bombay propose to make is published for the information of all persons whom it may concern:—

"If any vessel shall discharge upon any wharf or property of the Trust any cargo, goods or substance in such a rotten, putrid, damaged or other condition as to be a nuisance or injurious or dangerous to health in the opinion of the Health Officer of the Port, or if any cargo, goods, or substance discharged from any vessel and lying on a wharf or in a shed or other property belonging to the Trust shall become in such a rotten, putrid or other condition as to be a nuisance or injurious or dangerous to health in the opinion of the Health Officer of the Port, the Docks Superintendent or Traffic Manager may require the consignee thereof or, if the consignee should disclaim, deny or dispute the consignment or decline all re-

sponsibility for the same or, if there should be no consignee, the owner, master or agent of the vessel from which the same had been discharged, to forthwith cause the said cargo, goods or substance to be removed from the property of the Trust, and if such consignee or such master or agent as the case may be, shall, on being so required, refuse or neglect, for the space of eighteen hours after notice, to remove such cargo, goods or substance, then such removal may be effected in such manner as he may think fit by the Docks Superintendent or Traffic Manager, who may if he thinks necessary cause the same to be destroyed, and the said consignee or the said master, owner or agent as the case may be shall, within forty-eight hours after demand in writing, pay to the Board all the costs or expense attending or occasioned by such removal and destruction and of such cleaning, purifying or disinfecting the place of discharge or storage as may be considered desirable, and shall be further liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 100."

No. 516-I.—The following Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council is republished from the *London Gazette* of the 26th November 1895 for general information :

AT THE COURT AT WINDSOR,

THE 21ST DAY OF NOVEMBER 1895.

Present :

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.
LORD PRESIDENT,
LORD PRIVY SEAL,
MARQUESS OF LANSDOWNE.

Whereas by section 18 of the Extradition Act, 1870, it is among other things enacted that, if by any law made after the passing of the said Act by the Legislature of any British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such Possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any Foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, direct that such law or any part thereof shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act;

And whereas by an Act of the Governor-General of India in Council entitled ‘The Extradition (India) Act, 1895,’ it is provided that ‘all powers vested in, and acts authorized or required to be done by, a Police Magistrate or any Justice of the Peace in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals in the United Kingdom under the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, are hereby vested in, and may in British India be exercised and done by, any Presidency Magistrate or District Magistrate in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals under the said Acts.’

And whereas it is further provided by the said Extradition (India) Act, 1895, that the said Act shall come into force on such date as the Governor-General in Council shall, by Notification in the *Gazette of India*, appoint in this behalf, provided that no such date shall be appointed until Her Majesty shall have been pleased by Order in Council to direct that the said Act shall have effect in British India as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870, and such Order shall have been published in the *Gazette of India*.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Acts contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, direct that the said Extradition (India) Act, 1895, shall have effect in British India without modification or alteration as if it were part of the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873.

And the Right Honourable Lord George Hamilton, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
