I have the honour to request, on behalf of the Municipal Corporation of Karáchi, permission to borrow in the open market, under the authority of the Local Authorities Loan Act of 1879, the sum of 1.—138

Rs. 1,00,000 (one lakh) for the construction of a new Storage Reservoir for supplying water to the Town of Karáchi.

2. The accompanying statements A to I give the particulars required by Rule 6 of the rules relating to loans so raised.

APPENDIX A.

Statement showing particulars pursuant to Rule 5 of the rules published by the Government of India,—vide Notification No. 26, dated 1st January 1889.

I.—The loan is required for the construction of a Storage Reservoir for supplying water to the City of Karáchi. The estimate of the cost of the work is Rs. 1,00,000.

II. The amount which it is proposed to borrow is Rs. 1,00,000.

JII. It is proposed to borrow the said sum on the security of the revenues of the Karachi Municipality.

IV. The laws under which these revenues are levied are Bombay Acts VI of 1873 and II of 1884.

V. The money will be received during the official year 1894-95. The money will be received in four instalments as under, viz.:-

25 per cent. on application.

25 per cent, on allotment.

25 per cent. three months from date of allotment.

25 per cent, six months from date of allotment.

VI. The loan is required for a period not exceeding thirty years.

Interest will be paid half-yearly at 4 per cent. per annum (Rs. 2,000 + 2,000) == Rs. 4,000 per annum, and a sum of Rs. 3,334 will be annually set aside as a Sinking Fund.

VII. The annual receipts and expenditure, &c., of this Municipality for the last three years are submitted in supplementary Statements B to I (annexed), from which it will be seen that the Municipality is in a sound position and quite able to incur the proposed liability. In addition to this the Manager of the North-Western Railway is to pay the Municipality Rs. 4,000 per annum for the right to connect the Railway Main direct with either the new or old Reservoir, and this arrangement has been sanctioned by the Municipality.

VIII. The following are the existing prior charges on the Funds of this Municipality, a detailed statement of which is attached and marked E:—

- (a) Loan of Rs. 1,11,500 sanctioned by Government in 1884, and raised in the open market at 5 per cent. interest, for the extension of Water Works.
- (b) Loan of Rs. 3,00,000 sanctioned by Government in 1886, and raised in the open market at 6 per cent, interest, for the extension of Water Works and other Public Works.
- (c) Loan of Rs. 6,00,000 sanctioned by Government in 1892, and raised in the open market at 4½ per cent. interest, for the construction of the Drainage Works of the City of Karáchi.

APPENDIX G.

Explanation of important variations in Income and Expenditure (comparing Income and Expenditure of 1892-93 with previous year).

INCOME.

A .- MUNICIPAL TAXES.

1. - Octroi.

The income for 1892-93 under this head shows an increase as compared with 1891-92 of Rs. 47,133-5-3.

Of this sum Rs. 26,932 are represented by increased collections on grain over the previous year, but the increase on the average of five preceding years is only Rs. 20,000. The increase of Rs. 11,948 in the collection on grass over previous year was caused to a great extent by an increase in the rate and by stricter measures being adopted to prevent smuggling. Other increases under this head may be taken as normal.

2 .- Tax on Houses and Lands.

The income under this head shows an increase of Rs. 1856-8-11 as compared with the previous year and represents the normal increase of the City.

3 .- Tax on Vehicles and Animals.

An increase under this head of Rs. 1,129-12-10 also represents the normal increase of the City.

C .- REVENUE DERIVED FROM MUNICIPAL PROPERTY AND POWERS APART FROM TAXATION.

1 .- Rent of Lands, Houses, Serais and Dak Bungalows.

Under this head there is an increase of Rs. 1,400-10-0, and the reason given for the preceding increase applies to this also.

2 .- Sale-proceeds of Land and Produce of Land.

The income under this head shows an increase of Rs. 33,385-11-4 as compared with the previous year, and represents an increased demand for building sites, which has continued during the present year and no doubt will continue as the town developes.

9 .- Fines under Municipal and other Acts.

The increase under this head is a fluctuating source of revenue.

D .- GRANTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS FOR GENERAL AND SPECIAL PURPOSES.

1 .- From Government.

The increase under this head is also a fluctuating source of revenue.

EXPENDITURE.

A .- GENERAL ADMINISTRATION AND COLLECTION CHARGES.

2.—Collection of Taxes, including Bonded Warehouses (Establishment, Purchase of Account Paper and Money-Boxes, Books, Repairs to Out-Posts, &c.).

The expenditure under this head shows an increase as compared with the previous year of Rs. 3,132-1-7, and is due to the building of new quarters for Náka Munshis, amounting to Rs. 1,511-2-10, which will not recur, and to permanent establishment having been engaged to act as watchmen and patrols to prevent grass and other dutiable articles being imported without payment of Municipal dues.

4.—Survey of Land.

The increase of expenditure under this head of Rs. 1,355-12-9 is caused by the revision of the City Survey Sheets, Rs. 1,303 of which will not recur.

C .- PUBLIC HEALTH AND CONVENIENCE.

3.—Conservancy, including Road-cleaning, Watering and Latrines.

Under this head there is an increase of Rs. 19,843-7-2, which is almost altogether abnormal, it having been caused by the outbreak of cholera in 1892, and Rs. 12,022 of which is a non-recurring charge.

4.—Hospitals and Dispensaries.

Quarantine Hospital.

Rs. 1,129 represents a grant to Government for the building of a Quarantine Hospital, and will not recur.

9 .- Arboriculture, Public Gardens and Experimental Cultivation.

Under this head there is an increase of Rs. 3,172-11-6, which is caused by an ornamental railing having been erected round the Erskine Garden. This expenditure will also not recur.

> Kárwár. Tadri. Kumta. Honávar. Bhatkal.

1. No steamer touching at any of the aforesaid ports shall take in or discharge any passenger unless before beginning to do so and during the whole time that she is doing so there is exhibited at her

fore or main mast, or in some other position in which it can most easily be distinguished, a signal as described below:

(a) Signal between Sunrise and Sunset.

The Rendezvous Flag (blue and white chequers: letter N of the Commercial Code).

(b) Signal between Sunset and Sunrise.

A red light.

- 2. Every such steamer shall anchor before exhibiting any signal required by Rule 1, and shall remain anchored during the whole of the time that it is exhibited, unless the conditions of weather, tide, &c., should be such that the safety of the vessel or of boats approaching it would be thereby endangered.
- 3. No boat shall ply, whether for hire or otherwise, in or from any of the ports specified unless licensed for the purpose by the Collector of Salt Revenue or other officer authorized by him. Licenses shall be issued annually and shall remain in force from the 1st October in one year to 30th September of the year following, but shall be liable at the discretion of the Collector of Salt Revenue to suspension or revocation in case of any breach of these rules or other misconduct on the part of the Licensee or his employés.
- 4. The person in charge of every such boat plying for hire shall be provided by the Licensee with a table of fares to be charged, signed by such Licensee and by the Chief Officer of Customs at the port. Such table of fares shall be shown to any passenger on demand. Any attempt to extort fares in excess of those specified in the said table shall entail forfeiture of the license.
- 5. Every license shall be in the form hereto annexed. It shall be issued to the owner of the boat or his recognized agent, and shall be kept on board when such boat is plying for hire.
- 6. Every license shall specify the registered number of the boat, the port of registry, the name of the owner or agent, and the number of the crew. It shall further specify the number of passengers and the weight of goods which such boat shall be entitled to carry. It shall also prescribe the number of masts, yards, sails, oars, boathooks, poles, fenders and other articles which shall constitute the equipment of the boat.
- 7. In calculating the number of passengers and the weight of goods which a boat shall be allowed to carry, two children, unless they are both in arms, shall be reckoned as equal to one adult, and two Indian maunds weight of goods shall be reckoned as equal to one adult. Children in arms shall not be reckoned.
- S. No boat shall under any circumstances ply, whether for hire or otherwise, without having on board tne full crew and equipment named in the license: provided that if the boat is one propelled by sails as well as oars, it shall be optional to carry the sails, masts and yards.
- 9. Every boat, when actually plying, whether for hire or otherwise, under these rules between sunset and sunrise, shall show a white light above the bows.

- 10. No boat plying, whether for hire or otherwise, under these rules shall in any case go alongside any coasting or ferry steamer until such steamer shall have exhibited a signal, as described below, to signify that she is ready to receive and disembark passengers:
 - (a) Signal between Sunrise and Sunset.

The Rendezvous Flag (blue and white chequers: letter N of the Commercial Code) at the fore or main mast head or other conspicuous position, or

(b) Signal between Sunset and Sunrise.

'A red light in the same position.

- 11. Every license issued under these rules shall be shown on demand to any Customs Officer or to any passenger on board the boat in respect of which it has been issued.
- 12. No such license shall be transferable except with the permission of the Collector of Salt Revenue, and no fee shall be payable in respect of any such license.

Conditions of promotion of Honorary Commissioned Officers to the Provincial Engineer Service of the Public Works Department.

Read-

Government of India, Public Works Department, Resolution No. 1664-G., dated 26th June 1893. Despatch to Her Majesty's Secretary of State for India, No. 331 Financial, dated 11th October 1893. Despatch from Her Majesty's Secretary of State for India, No. 4 Public Works, dated 11th January 1894.

RESOLUTION.—In the orders on question VI referred to in the Resolution cited in the preamble regarding promotions to the Provincial Service of the Engineer Establishment of the Public Works Department, it was stated that orders would issue hereafter regarding the promotion of Honorary Commissioned officers to that service.

Under present rules such officers are on promotion to honorary rank in the army graded as Assistant Engineers in the Public Works Department (vide Public Works Code, Vol. I, Chap. II, paragraph 58), but are counted against the Upper Subordinate Scale, and their pay is regulated by the rules applicable to-military men (Public Works Code, Vol. I, Chap. I, paragraph 13, note 1, and Chap. V, paragraph 41).

The Governor General in Council is hereby pleased, with the concurrence of Her Majesty's Secretary of State for India, to order that Honorary Commissioned officers holding the rank of Deputy Commissary, Assistant Commissary, and Deputy Assistant Commissary shall be eligible for promotion to the Provincial Engineer Establishment, but that on being so promoted at their option, they shall, like Warrant and Non-Commissioned officers below the rank of Deputy Assistant Commissary, be required to resign their military rank under clause (3) of Article 388 of the Civil Service Regulations, and then be permitted to count their departmental service for a civil pension.

On being so promoted, they will be subject to the rules laid down in the Resolutions quoted in the margin, so far as they are applicable, and will draw the difference between the pay of the grade to which they are promoted and the staff No. 2112-G., dated the 19th July 1892, No. 1664-G., dated the 26th June 1893, pay and military allowances previously drawn by them as a personal allowance.

2. It should, however, be clearly pointed out to each officer who may accept promotion on these conditions that his non-departmental army service will not count for pension, and that he forfeits his right to a sterling pension under military rules, and also to a possible pension for his widow.
