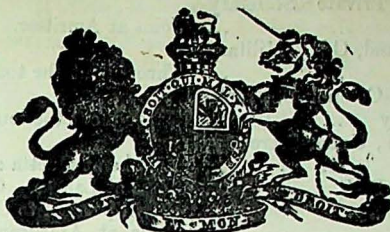

Whereas all outstanding Notes of the following Four per cent. Loans are now under notice of discharge and are liable to be discharged on the dates shown against them, that is to say,—

It is hereby notified that proprietors of any such Notes will be allowed the option of tendering them for transfer to the  $3\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. Loan of 1893-94 on the following terms :—

- (1) The new Note will be of the same amount as the old Note, except in the case of Notes of the Sicca Rupee Loan of 1832-33, in which case the excess over an even hundred of rupees will be paid in cash and the new Note will be issued for the balance only.
- (2) The new Note will bear interest from 31st December 1894.
- (3) Except in the case of the Loans of 1879 and 1842-43, interest will be adjusted to 29th June 1894, inclusive, that is to say—  
*Loans of 1832-33 and 1865.*—By payment of  $10\frac{1}{2}$  annas per cent. in addition to the payment (if any) due and payable on May 1st, 1894.  
*Loan of 1835-36.*—By payment of one rupee per cent. in addition to the payment (if any) due and payable on March 31st, 1894. But if the interest instalment due on September 30th, 1894, has been paid before tender, the tenderer will be required to refund one rupee per cent.  
*Loan of 1854-55.*—No payment after that due and payable on June 30th, 1894, will be made.
- (4) In the case of the Loans of 1879 and 1842-43 interest will be allowed up to their respective half-yearly dates—July 15th, 1894, and July 31st, 1894—and no further adjustment will be required.
- (5) In all cases the tenderer will be required to abandon all claim for interest between the above dates, namely, 29th June, 15th July or 31st July (as the case may be), and 31st December 1894.
- (6) Notes may be tendered for transfer at the Public Debt Office, Bank of Bengal, Calcutta, or at any other Bank (including the Bank of England) or Treasury to which they are for the time being enfaced for payment of interest. Notes so tendered must bear the following endorsement duly signed :—

- (7) The Governor General in Council reserves to himself the right to withdraw this Notification at any time when he deems fit to do so, and he will in any case withdraw it as soon as it is known that the aggregate balance outstanding for discharge is reduced to one krur of rupees.

No. 3310.—In accordance with Rule 9 of the Rules prescribed in the Notification of the Government of India in the Department of Finance and Commerce No. 15, dated 1st January 1889, republished in the *Bombay Government Gazette* of the 10th idem under No. 116, dated 9th idem, Financial Department, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to publish the following application from the Municipal Commissioners of Bándra for the grant of a loan of Rs. 82,000 under the provisions of the Local Authorities Loan Act, 1879 :—

SIR,

We, the undersigned Municipal Commissioners of Bándra in the district of Thána, have the honour, under the provisions of Section 4 of the Local Authorities Loan Act, XI of 1879, to apply to the Government for a loan of Rs. 82,000 only.

2. Conforming to the rules made by the Government of India under Section 5 of the said Act (published at pages 15 and 16 of the *Bombay Government Gazette* of 10th January 1889), we beg to state the following details :—

- (1) The Loan is required to purchase and lay down water mains and to extend the supply of lake water in the Bándra Municipal District estimated to cost Rs. 82,073-8-0.
- (2) The amount of the loan required is Rs. 82,000 only.
- (3) The rates, taxes and revenues of the Bándra Municipality is offered as security for the loan,
- (4) The rates, taxes and revenues of the Municipality are levied, received and held under the Bombay District Municipal Act VI of 1873 and Bombay District Municipal Act Amendment Act II of 1884.
- (5) The loan is required for a period of 30 years and will be required in two equal instalments on the 1st October 1894 and 1st March 1895. It is proposed to repay the loan by equal half-yearly instalments of Rs. 2,503-14-4, including interest, so that the loan shall be paid off in 30 years.
- (6) The said loan of Rs. 82,000 is applied for at the rate of 4½ per cent. per annum.
- (7) A statement (A) showing the Municipal revenue of the Municipality of Bándra for the last three years is attached.
- (8) A statement (B) showing the expenditure, &c., incurred during the last preceding three years is appended.
- (9) There are no existing prior charges upon the sources of income accruing from or upon the property vested in the Municipality of Bándra.

3. It is estimated that if the scheme for the extension of the lake water-supply be carried out, the additional income to the Municipality derived by the sale of water through meter measurement will be amply sufficient to repay the loan by the half-yearly instalments above proposed, without any additional taxation whatever.

4. Lake water has for the last eight years been supplied to the Municipality by the Corporation of the City of Bombay on payment of meter measurement, and the increased supply that the scheme will involve will likewise add to the revenue of the Bombay Municipality. A copy of the existing agreement between the two Municipalities is annexed (C).

5. We desire to add that when the proposed Works are completed, it is not improbable that the Municipality of Bándra will apply for a further small Loan to renew the existing mains of the Municipality.
