NOTIFICATION.

Dated 17th July 1894.

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 8 of the Petroleum Act, XII of 1886, as applied to lands in the territory of His Highness the Nizám of Hyderabad, which are occupied by the Nizám's Guaranteed State Railway Company, by the Great Indian Peninsula Railway, by the Dhond-Manmád Railway, by the Madras Railway respectively (including the lands occupied as stations and out-buildings and for other railway purposes), by Foreign Department Notification No. 1482-I., dated 3rd May 1894, the Resident at Hyderabad is pleased, with the previous sanction of the Governor-General in Council, to make the following rules to regulate the granting of licenses to possess or transport petroleum within the aforesaid lands:—

1. (1) All words and expressions defined in the Act and used in these rules shall have in these rules the meanings assigned to them respectively by the Act, and

(2) For the purposes of these rules "petroleum in bulk" shall be interpreted to mean petroleum in any vessel or receptacle having a capacity of 300 gallons and upwards.

2. Licenses for the possession of petroleum within the lands occupied by railways in His Highness the Nizám's territory shall be granted only when the place intended to be used for the keeping of the petroleum fulfils the following conditions:

(1) the building itself is constructed with stone or brick walls, with terraced, tiled or iron roofs, and with tiled or paved or earthen floors;

(2) the doorways and openings of the building are built up to a height of not less than two feet above the level of the road or street, or the floor is sunk at least two feet below the level of the road or street in such a manner that the petroleum cannot flow out in case of fire; and

(3) the building is separated by a clear open space of twenty feet on every side from any other building: provided that the licensing officer may, for special reasons to be stated in writing, dispense with this condition.

The storage capacity of any building so licensed shall be calculated at the rate of ten gallons for three cubic feet.

3. Notwithstanding anything in Rule 2 and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed in this behalf, a license may be granted for the possession of any stated quantity of petroleum in a place specially prepared for the storage of petroleum in bulk in accordance with specifications and plans approved by the Resident at Hyderabad. The capacity in gallons shall be conspicuously marked on every storage-tank or other receptacle in such place.

4. The licensing officer, or any police officer of or above the rank of head constable appointed by him, may enter any place or premises in respect of which a license for the possession of petroleum has been granted, for the purpose of inspecting the same at any time after sunrise and before sunset.

5. The licensing officer or any police officer as aforesaid may require a sample to be delivered to him from any tank or other receptacle containing petroleum stored in any place or premises in respect of which a license for the possession of petroleum has been granted; the procedure prescribed in sections 9 and 10 of the Act shall apply to any demand for samples made under this rule and to the testing of such samples.

6. (1) Licenses for the transport of petroleum other than dangerous petroleum in quantities exceeding five hundred gallons may be either general or special.

(2) Licenses for the transport of dangerous petroleum shall be special only.

7. (1) General licenses for a period of twelve months may be issued for the transport of petroleum in bulk by rail, by road or by water in Form F, hereto appended. Such licenses shall authorize the holders to transport in bulk any petroleum *bonâ fide* their own property, without restrictions as to destination or quantity. Every such license shall specify the marks and numbers of wagons or carts covered by it, and state that such wagons or carts have been certified or approved under rule 11, clauses (2) and (3). Such licenses shall be granted by the Resident at Hyderabad only.

(2) General licenses for a period of twelve months may be issued also for the transport of petroleum otherwise than in bulk by cart only. Such licenses shall be granted in Form G.

(3) The holder of a general license in Form G shall, with each consignment of petroleum conveyed under cover of his license, issue a pass in Form H appended to these rules, specifying the places from and to which the petroleum is to be conveyed and the quantity of petroleum covered by it. Each pass shall be numbered.

8. Special licenses for the transport of petroleum shall be in force for such period not exceeding six months from the date of the grant of the license as may be specified in the license.

9. Every special license for the transport of petroleum shall specify the places from and to which, respectively, the petroleum is to be conveyed, the quantity of petroleum covered by the license, and the time for which the license is in force; or, in the case of petroleum to be carried in bulk, shall state that the wagon, vessel or cart in which it is to be carried has been approved or certified, as the case may be, as required by sub-rules (2) and (3) of rule 11.

10. (1) Applications for special licenses for the transport of petroleum otherwise than in bulk shall specify the description and quantity of the petroleum to be transported, the places from and to which, and the route by which, the petroleum is to be conveyed, and the time likely to be occupied in the journey, and shall describe the receptacles in which the petroleum is to be contained.

(2) In the case of applications for licenses for the transport of dangerous petroleum under section 4 of the Act, the application shall also contain the particulars required by sub-section (2) of that section.

(3) Applications for general or special licenses for the transport of petroleum in bulk shall state the marks and numbers of the wagons, or carts to be used under the license, and shall be accompanied by the certificate of the authorities referred to in rule 11, clauses (2) and (3).

11. (1) Licenses for the transport of petroleum otherwise than in bulk shall only be granted if the petroleum to be transported is packed in air-tight tins, air-tight tanks or drums of steel or iron, or other vessels not easily broken or is contained in stoppered bottles carefully packed so as to avoid the risk of breakage.

(2) Licenses for the transport of petroleum other than dangerous petroleum in bulk by railway may be granted if the petroleum is contained in wagons approved by the railway administration over whose line it is proposed to transport it and by the Consulting Engineer for Railways to Government.

(3) Licenses for the transport of petroleum other than dangerous petroleum in bulk by cart may be granted if the cart is certified to be fit for the service by an officer appointed by the Resident at Hyderabad in this behalf.

(4) Such arrangements as may be approved by Government shall be made for freeing from gas tanks, railway wagons and carts in which petroleum has been stored or carried in bulk.

(5) Wagons or carts approved or certified under clause (2) or (3) of this rule shall be marked and numbered by the Consulting Engineer or the certifying officer, as the case may be.

12. It shall be the duty of all police officers to see that the petroleum is carried only by such route as may be specified in the license, and any such officer may stop and inspect any petroleum in transit.

13. Licenses for the possession or transport of dangerous petroleum in quantities exceeding forty gallons and licenses for the possession of petroleum in bulk will be granted, subject to the provisions of Section 4 of the Act in the case of dangerous petroleum, under the signature of the Resident at Hyderabad, on the recommendation of the Railway Magistrate or any Magistrate of the first class.

Applications for such licenses should be made to the Railway Magistrate or such other Magistrate as aforesaid, as the case may be.

14. The following fees shall be charged for licenses under the Act:—

Licenses for the possession of dangerous petroleum :

Provided that no fee shall be levied for licenses granted under the foregoing provisions on any petroleum which is the property of Government.

15. Save in cases to which Section 4 of the Act is applicable, the licensing officer may, in his discretion, grant a license for the possession or transport of such quantity of petroleum as he thinks fit.

16. Every license for the possession of petroleum in any premises shall specify the maximum quantity of petroleum which may be stored in those premises.

17. Licenses for the possession of petroleum shall be in force for one year from the date of the grant of the license: Provided that the licensing officer may, at any time, for good and sufficient reason, cancel a license.

18. Licenses granted under these rules shall be in the forms, and shall have endorsed on them

the conditions, respectively, prescribed for them in the schedule hereto annexed.

Every such license shall, on the breach of any such condition, be liable to be forfeited.

19. Every application for the renewal of a license for the possession of petroleum shall be made in the same manner as an application for an original license.

Every such application shall be made at a date not less than fifteen days before the date on which the original license expires. The same fee shall be charged for the renewal of a license as for a new license.

3. No cask or other receptacle containing petroleum shall be opened, or the oil drawn off, within the building in which the petroleum is stored.

4. No smoking, light or fire in any form shall be permitted at any time within such building.

5. If the licensing officer calls on the holder of the license, by a notice in writing, to execute any repairs of the licensed place which may, in the opinion of such officer, be necessary for the safety of the place, the holder of the license shall execute the repairs within such period, not being less than one week from the date of the receipt of the notice, as may be fixed by the notice.

6. The license-holder is prohibited from delivering any quantity of dangerous petroleum exceeding three gallons to any one who has not a license under Section 4 or Section 5 of the Act, or any less quantity of such petroleum, except in accordance with the conditions of the proviso to Section 5 of the Act as to the vessels in which the petroleum must be contained.

No. 7040.—In exercise of the power conferred on him by Section 34 of Bombay Act VI of 1863 (an Act for the regulation of public conveyances, &c.), as amended by Bombay Act V of 1887, the Governor in Council is pleased to extend the provisions of the said Act to the places named in the margin, in the Násik District, with effect from the 1st December 1894, and to direct (a) that the duties assigned by the Act to the Commissioner of Police, Bombay, shall be performed by the District Magistrate of Násik; (b) that the Cantonment Magistrate, Camp Devláli, shall exercise the powers conferred by the said Act on Magistrates of Police; and (c) that the balance of license fees, after all necessary contingent expenses shall have been defrayed therefrom, shall from time to time be paid to the credit of the Cantonment Fund.

No. 7041.—With reference to Government Notifications No. 7040, dated the 19th October 1894, and No. 1837, dated the 4th April 1889, extending the provisions of Bombay Act VI of 1863, as amended by Bombay Act V of 1887, to the places named in the margin, in the Násik District; it is hereby notified for general information that the District Magistrate of Násik as Commissioner of Police has, with the sanction of the Governor in Council, fixed the following rates for the hire of public conveyances in the said places:—

*Subsidiary Rules.*

(1). The fares shown in the table are for single trips only. All return fares in the same tonga (which must be notified to the driver) shall be one-half of the original fare as laid down in the table. Fares for a single trip from any one place to any other within the Cantonment or from one European officer's bungalow to another to be paid at the rate of four annas.

(2). If engaged by time—

For the whole day from 6 A.M. to 6 P.M.—  
Rs. 3-8-0 for Class I Tonga.  
Rs. 2-8-0 for Class II Tonga.

If engaged per hour, annas 8 for a Class I Tonga for the first hour, and four annas for each succeeding hour. Annas 6 for a Class II Tonga for the first hour, and three annas for each succeeding hour.

(3). The rates in Rule 2 do not apply to journeys beyond the Cantonment limits.

(4). For journeys to places not specified in the table, the parties are left to make their own arrangements.

(5). In any case in which a public conveyance is called from a distance exceeding half a mile to take up a fare, two annas shall be paid in addition to the authorized fare.

(6). Tongas are licensed to carry four passengers excluding the driver, children in arms not being considered. Two children above three and under ten years count as one passenger.

(7). Drivers of public conveyances passing along a public road must keep to the left or near side.

(8). A *ghari* passing another, going in the same direction, must pass it on the right or off side.

Whereas there was this day read at the Board certain Rules made on the 13th day of March, 1894, under the Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act, 1890, by the High Court of Judicature at Bombay for regulating the procedure and practice in cases brought before the Court of the Resident at Aden.

Her Majesty, having taken into consideration the said Rules (a copy of which is hereunto annexed), was pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to approve the same.

**Rules for regulating the procedure and practice in cases brought before the Court of the Resident at Aden under the Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act, 1890.**

1. In the construction of these Rules, the following terms shall (if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter) have the respective meanings hereinafter assigned to them; that is to say, 'Judge' shall mean the Political Resident of Aden as defined in the Government of India Act II of 1864.

'Registrar' shall mean the Registrar of the Court of the Resident at Aden.

'Registry' shall mean the office of the said Registrar.

'Názir' shall mean the Názir of the said Court, or other officer who may be appointed to execute the process of the said Court.

'Attorney' shall mean any person entitled by law or the Rule of the Court to practise in Court, or the party himself, if conducting his suit in person.

'Suit' shall mean any suit, action or other proceeding instituted in the said Court in its jurisdiction under the Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act.

'Affidavit' shall, in addition to its ordinary meaning, include a statement in writing on solemn affirmation wherever by law a person may make a solemn affirmation instead of an oath.

2. These rules shall, if previously approved by Her Majesty in Council, come into operation on the first day of January 1895 and shall apply to all suits instituted on and after that day.

*Institution of Suits.*

3. A suit shall be commenced by a plaint according to the provisions of the Code of Civil Procedure.

*Warrants.*

4. If the suit is *in rem*, the attorney may, immediately on the plaint being filed, on filing a Præcipe and an affidavit, take out a warrant for the arrest of the property proceeded against.
5. The affidavit shall set forth the name and description of the property to be arrested and that the claim has not been satisfied.
6. In a suit of necessities and in a suit of wages, the national character of the vessel proceeded against shall be stated in the plaint, and in a wages suit against a foreign vessel, notice of the institution of the suit shall be given to the Consul of the State to which the vessel belongs, if there be one resident in Aden, and a copy of the notice shall be annexed to the plaint.
7. In a suit of restraint, and in a suit of possession, it shall not be necessary to obtain a decree or order of the Court for the issue of the warrant, but the warrant shall be allowed to issue on the requisite affidavit being filed.
8. The judge may in any case allow the warrant to issue though the affidavit or plaint may not contain all the required particulars and, in a suit of wages, may also waive the service of the notice.
9. Every warrant shall be served by the Názir or his Bailiff. The attorney taking out the warrant shall, within two days from the service thereof, file the same in the Registry.
10. In suits *in rem* no service of writ or warrant shall be required when the Attorney of the Defendant agrees to accept service and to give security or to pay money into Court.
11. In suits *in rem* service of summons or warrant against ship, freight or cargo on board is to be effected by nailing or affixing the original writ or warrant for a short time on the main mast or on the single mast of the vessel and on taking off the process, leaving a true copy of it nailed or fixed in its place.
12. If the cargo has been landed or transhipped, service of the writ or warrant to arrest the cargo and freight shall be effected by placing the writ of summons or warrant for a short time on the cargo and on taking off the process by leaving a true copy upon it.
13. If the cargo be in the custody of a person who will not permit access to it, service of the writ or warrant may be made upon the custodian.

*Suits in rem by Default.*

14. After the expiration of five days from the filing of a warrant, if no appearance shall have been entered in the suit, the Attorney of the Plaintiff may cause the suit to be set down for hearing.
15. If, when the suit comes before the Court, the Judge is satisfied that the Plaintiff's claim is well founded he may pronounce for the claim and may order the property to be sold, with or without previous notice, and the proceeds paid into the Registry or may make such order in the premises as he shall think just.

*Entry of Appearance.*

16. An Attorney desiring to enter an appearance in any suit shall file in the Registry a Præcipe, a copy of which shall have been previously served on the adverse Attorney.
17. The Præcipe shall contain the name of the Attorney and an address in Aden, at which it shall be sufficient to leave all instruments and documents in the suit.
18. A party who shall not enter an appearance until after the expiration of three days from the service of the warrant shall pay all costs that may have been occasioned by his default.

*Security.*

19. If security is to be given in the Registry, it shall be given according to the rules and practice of the Court as to security in the case of an attachment before judgment in an ordinary civil suit.

*Releases.*

20. Property arrested by warrant shall only be released under the authority of an instrument issued by the Registrar, to be called a release.
21. An Attorney, at whose instance any property has been arrested, may, before an appearance has been entered, obtain the release thereof by filing a Præcipe to withdraw the warrant.
22. An Attorney may obtain the release of any property by paying into the Registry the sum for which the suit has been instituted.

23. Cargo arrested for the freight only, may be released by an order of the Judge upon proof by affidavit of the value of the freight, and by paying the amount of the freight into the Registry.

24. In a suit of salvage, the value of the property under arrest shall be agreed to, or proved by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Judge, before the property is released.

25. When security shall have been given in the sum in which the suit has been instituted, or such sum shall have been paid into the Registry, and if the suit be one of salvage, the value of the property arrested shall have been proved to the satisfaction of the Judge, the Attorney shall be entitled to a release for the same, unless there be a Caveat against the release thereof outstanding in the "Caveat Release Book."

26. The release, when obtained, shall be left with a Præcipe in the office of the Názir by the Attorney taking out the same, who shall also, at the same time, pay all costs, charges and expenses attending the care and custody of the property whilst under arrest, and the Názir shall thereupon release the property.

*Caveat Release Book.*

27. An Attorney in a suit desiring to prevent the release of any property under arrest shall file in the Registry a Præcipe, and thereupon a Caveat against the release of the property shall be entered in a book to be kept in the Registry called the "Caveat Release Book."

28. A party delaying the release of any property by the entry of a Caveat, shall be liable to be condemned in costs and damages, unless he shall show, to the satisfaction of the Judge, good and sufficient reason for having so done.

*Caveat Warrant Book.*

29. A party desiring to prevent the arrest of any property, may cause a Caveat against the issue of a Warrant for the arrest thereof to be entered in the Registry.

30. For this purpose he shall cause to be filed in the Registry a notice, signed by himself or his Attorney, undertaking to enter an appearance in any suit that may be instituted against the said property, and to give security in such suit in a sum not exceeding an amount to be stated in the notice, or to pay such sum into the Registry, and a Caveat against the issue of a Warrant for the arrest of the property shall thereupon be entered in a book to be kept in the Registry called the "Caveat Warrant Book."

31. An Attorney instituting a suit against any property in respect of which a Caveat has been entered in the Caveat Warrant Book shall, before filing the plaint, serve a copy thereof upon the party on whose behalf the Caveat has been entered, or upon his Attorney.

32. Within three days from the filing of the plaint the party on whose behalf the Caveat has been entered shall, if the sum in which the suit has been instituted does not exceed the amount for which he has undertaken, give security in such sum, or pay the same into the Registry.

33. After the expiration of five days from the filing of the plaint, if the party on whose behalf the Caveat has been entered shall not have given security in such sum, or paid the same into the Registry, the Plaintiff's Attorney may proceed with the suit by default, and have it heard.

34. If, when the suit comes before the Court, it is satisfied that the claim is well-founded, it may pronounce for the amount which appears to be due, and may enforce the payment thereof by order and attachment against the party on whose behalf the Caveat has been entered, and by the arrest of the property, if it then be, or thereafter come, within the jurisdiction of the Court.

35. The preceding rules shall not prevent an Attorney from taking out a Warrant for the arrest of any property, notwithstanding the entry of a Caveat in the "Caveat Warrant Book," but the party at whose instance any property in respect of which a Caveat is entered, shall be arrested, shall be liable to be condemned in costs and damages, unless he shall show, to the satisfaction of the Court, good and sufficient reason for having so done.

*Sales by Order of the Court.*

36. Every sale under the decree of the Court shall, unless the Judge shall otherwise order, be made by the Názir in like manner as a sale of moveable property in execution of a decree in an ordinary civil suit, and the Názir shall be entitled to receive the same fees and poundage as he would be entitled to in such a case.

37. The Názir shall pay into Court the gross proceeds of sale of any property sold by him, and shall, at the same time, bring into the Registry the account of sale, with vouchers in support thereof for taxation by the Court.



38. Any person interested in the proceeds may be heard before the Court on the taxation of the account of expenses.

*Payment of Moneys.*

39. All money paid into Court shall be paid to the Registrar.
40. Money paid into Court shall not be paid out of Court, except in pursuance of an order of the Court.
41. Security for latent demands shall not, unless the Judge shall otherwise order, be required on the payment of money out of Court.
42. An Attorney, desiring to prevent the payment of money out of the Registry, shall file a notice and thereupon a Caveat shall be entered in a book to be kept in the Registry, called the "Caveat Payment Book."

*Motions.*

43. Any appearance, application or act in, or to the said, Court shall be made by a party to a suit, or his Attorney, or his "recognised agent" as defined in Section 37 of the Code of Civil Procedure.

*Præcipes.*

44. Forms of Præcipes required to be filed in the Registry, or the Názir's Office, may be obtained on application in the Registry. They may be varied or altered by the Judge at his discretion.
45. Every Præcipe shall be signed either by the party, or by his Attorney, or by his recognised agent.
46. If a Præcipe be not properly filled up, the Registrar, or the Názir, as the case may be, may refuse to receive the same, or to act thereon.

*Caveats.*

47. A Caveat, whether against the issue of a warrant, the release of property, or the payment of money out of the Registry, shall not remain in force for more than six months from the day of the date thereof.
48. A Caveat may be withdrawn by the party on whose behalf it has been entered, or by his Attorney; but the præcipe to lead the withdrawal thereof shall, save by permission of the Registrar, be signed by the person who signed the Præcipe to lead the entry of the Caveat.
49. Application may be made to the Court by summons to overrule any Caveat.
50. The fees to be taken by the Officers of the Court, and by the Názir, and by Attorneys, shall be regulated by the table of fees sanctioned for proceedings under the Original Jurisdiction of the High Court of Bombay.
51. The forms used in the Admiralty Division of the Supreme Court in England under the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1883, shall be followed as nearly as the circumstances of each case will allow.
52. The other proceedings in suits brought in the said Court in the exercise of its jurisdiction under the Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act, 1890, not provided for by these Rules, shall be regulated by the rules and practice of the said Court in suits brought in it in the exercise of its Ordinary Original Civil Jurisdiction.
