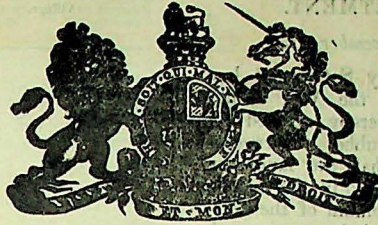

No. 9364.—In exercise of the power conferred by Section 70 of the Indian Forest Act, No. VII of 1878, the Governor in Council proposes to direct that, in lieu of the fines fixed by Section 12 of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871, there shall be levied in the talukas and petha of the Poona District entered in the schedule hereto annexed, in respect of cattle trespassing in the closed portions of the Reserved Forest Kurans mentioned against the talukas, and impounded under Section 69 of the Indian Forest Act, fines at the following rates, viz.:

For each buffalo	One Rupee.
For each horse, mare, gelding, pony, colt, filly, bull, bullock, cow or heifer.	Eight Annas.
For each calf, ass, pig, ram, ewe, sheep, lamb, goat or kid	Four Annas.

No. 9427.—Whereas it appears to the Governor in Council on the report of the District Magistrate, Khándesh, that in the local areas hereinbelow specified, subject to the jurisdiction of the said Magistrate, cattle are habitually allowed to trespass on the land and damage crops or other produce thereon; the Governor in Council proposes to direct, in exercise of the power conferred upon him by Section 12 of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871, as amended by Section 5 (1) of Act I of 1891, that, on and after 1st January 1895, for every head of cattle specified in the scale contained in the first-mentioned section which may be seized within any of the said local areas and impounded in accordance with the provision of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871, as amended by Act I of 1891, the pound-keeper shall levy a fine equal to double the fine mentioned in the scale aforesaid.

2. And in exercise of the power conferred by Section 26 of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871, as amended by Section 8 of Act I. of 1891, the Governor in Council proposes to direct that, with respect to the local areas hereinbelow specified, the first paragraph of the said Section 26 of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871, shall, on and after the date specified in the first paragraph of this Notification, be read as if it had reference to cattle of any kind instead of to pigs only, and as if the words "fifty rupees" were substituted for the words "ten rupees":—

Statement showing particulars pursuant to Rule 5 of the Rules made by the Governor General in Council under Sections 5 and 7 of the Local Authorities Loan Act, 1879.

1. The loan is required for the construction of Water Works for supplying the City of Surat with water. The estimate of the cost of the work is Rs. 8,50,000.
2. The amount which it is proposed to borrow is Rs. 6,00,000 (six lakhs).
3. It is proposed to borrow the said sum on the security of the revenues of the Surat Municipality.
4. The laws under which these revenues are levied are Bombay Acts VI of 1873 and II of 1884.
5. The money will be received between the 1st March 1895 and 31st December 1896. The money will be received in four instalments as under:—
 - 25 per cent. on application.
 - 25 per cent. on allotment.
 - 25 per cent. at each time as may be fixed, not exceeding six months after allotment.
6. The loan is required for a period not exceeding fifty years.
7. Interest will be paid at four per cent. per annum = (Rs. 12,000 + 12,000) = Rs. 24,000 per annum, and a sum of Rs. 4,560 will be annually set aside as a sinking fund at 3½ per cent. and Rs. 15,000 will be required for annual working expenses.
8. The annual receipts and expenditure for the last three years, together with estimates for the future, are submitted in Statements A, B and C. From them it will be seen that, after allowing a liberal margin on both sides of the account, a surplus of Rs. 54,000 may safely be anticipated without counting on a saving of at least Rs. 5,000 per annum on street-watering and irrigation of public park after the construction of the Water Works.
9. There is only one existing prior charge on the funds of the Municipality, viz., a loan of Rupees two lakhs taken up in the open market at 5½ per cent. under the authority conveyed in Government Resolution No. 3583, of 20th September 1889; twenty Promissory Notes of Rs. 500 each are drawn by lot every year and paid off. The balance of the loan now remaining is Rs. 1,60,000.

BY THE COMMISSIONER OF CUSTOMS,
SALT, OPIUM AND A'BKARI.

No. 5566A.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 75 of the Sea Customs Act (VIII of 1878) the Commissioner of Customs, Bombay, is pleased to make the following rules for the landing and clearing at the Port of Bombay of parcels forwarded by Her Majesty's or other mails or by other regular packets and passengers' vessels.

I.—POST PARCELS FROM FOREIGN PORTS OUT
OF INDIA.

(1) *Landing.*

1. In the case of parcels arriving from ports out of India by Parcel Post, the box or boxes containing the parcels shall be labelled "Parcel Post," and as such will be allowed to land and pass either with or separately from the regular mails to the General Post Office, to which they will be conveyed by the Post Office.

2. In the case of P. and O. Company's parcels from the United Kingdom arriving by the English Mail Steamer or other P. and O. Company's vessel to be made over to the General Post Office, Bombay, for delivery, the boxes or bags containing the parcels shall be marked outside "Indian Parcel Post," and shall be landed under cover of a boat-note signed by an officer of the ship and a Customs officer. After landing, the boat-note shall be sent with the boxes or bags, and the boxes or bags shall be conveyed to the General Post Office in charge of a Customs officer and a representative of the P. and O. Company. The receipt of the boxes or bags at the Post Office shall be acknowledged on the boat-note by a responsible officer of the Post Office, and the boat-note shall then be forwarded to the Customs House for check with the Steamer's Import Manifest in which such boxes or bags shall be entered.

(2) *Clearing.*

3. In the case of parcels arriving by Parcel Post from ports out of India, the Post Office Parcel Bills, and in the case of P. and O. Company's parcels from the United Kingdom made over to the General Post Office for delivery the P. and O. Company's Invoices and the declarations from the senders as to contents, &c., will be forwarded by the Post Master to the Collector of Customs.

4. On receipt at the Customs House, these documents will be made over to an Appraiser for assessment of the goods for duty, for which purpose he shall generally be guided by the particulars as to contents and values given in those documents. He shall, after converting the values of dutiable goods into Indian currency, according to the orders on the subject, enter opposite each such item in the Parcel Bill or Invoice, as the case may be, the amount of duty due on it. He will at the same time mark off on those documents all parcels required to be detained for examination either from want of necessary particulars or for defective description or suspected mis-description or undervaluation of contents, and will then return the documents to the Post Office.

5. The parcels marked off as above on the Parcel Bill or Invoice, as the case may be, shall be

detained by the Post Master for Customs examination, and the rest may be forwarded to their destination at once.

6. As soon as intimation is received from the Post Master that the detained parcels are ready for examination, a Customs Appraiser will proceed to the Post Office for the purpose and after examining the parcels and filling in any details regarding the contents omitted in the Invoices or in the Parcel Bills, he will note at the foot of each of these documents the total amount of duty due under each and sign the note and give the documents to the Post Master.

7. All parcels required to be opened for examination shall be opened and after examination re-closed by a Post Office packer in the presence of the Customs Appraiser and a Post Office official, and the parcels sealed over tape with a Customs House seal.

8. If on examination the contents of any parcel are found to be misdescribed or the value under-stated or to consist of prohibited goods, such parcel shall be detained and reported to the Collector to be dealt with under Section 167 of the Customs Act, and the Post Master shall not allow the parcel to go forward without the Collector's orders.

9. The duties as assessed by the Customs Appraiser and noted in the Parcel Bill or Invoice, as the case may be, will be recovered by the Post Office from the addressees at the time of delivery to them, and the amount due for each month will be forwarded by the Post Master, Bombay, to the Collector at the beginning of the following month with a separate Memorandum in the appended form for the amount due on the parcels by each Steamer. After the correctness of the amounts has been verified by the Customs Appraiser, the money will be paid into the Customs Treasury.

10. A copy of the Parcel Bills or Invoices, as the case may be, relating to the imports for each month shall be forwarded at the beginning of the following month by the Post Master to the Statistical Department of the Customs House for inclusion of such imports in the Trade Returns.

II.—POST PARCELS FROM FOREIGN PORTS IN
INDIA.

11. Parcels arriving by Parcel Post from foreign ports in India may be landed as ordinary mails and conveyed direct to the General Post Office.

12. The Post Master, Bombay, shall detain all such parcels whether addressed to Bombay or any other place in India, and shall give immediate notice of their arrival to the Collector of Customs, and shall not take steps to deliver or forward such parcels to their destination until the arrival of an officer deputed to attend by the Collector.

13. Immediately on receipt of notice from the Post Master, the Collector shall send to the Post Office a Customs Appraiser to determine the amount of Customs duty payable on the parcels.

14. The Customs Appraiser shall examine all such parcels in the presence of the Post Master or other Post Office official deputed for the purpose by the Post Master, and shall enter the result of

his examination and assessment for duty in a register in the appended form. The parcels shall be opened for examination and reclosed by a Post Office official.

15. After completion of examination and assessment the Customs Appraiser shall sign and give an extract from the register to the Post Master as a pass for the parcels. An extract from the

register shall also be sent to the Statistical Department of the Customs House for inclusion of such imports in the Trade Returns.

16. The duty assessed by the Appraiser shall be recovered and paid into the Customs House Treasury in the manner prescribed in Rule 9 of these Rules.
