The Committee is invested with full powers to make all arrangements necessary or advisable to prevent the outbreak or spread of epidemic disease, provided that if it forbids the assembling or dis-persing of pilgrims or visitors to the fair it shall report its action without delay to the District Magistrate, who shall thereon pass such orders as he thinks fit: Provided also that the Committee shall obey all instructions issued to it by the District Magistrate.
